Interest in the work of B.F.M. is growing in E.M.B.C.
Back in 1978 we were giving \$50.00 per month and a \$200.00 special offering for Thanksgiving. Our attendance and finances were steadily dropping and we were virtually insolvent financially... things looked very bleak.

Early in 1979 we began to seriously emphasize missions. In addition to our \$50.00 monthly we encouraged special monthly offerings despite our financial plight. Things got better and we had a \$3,000.00 plus offering at Thanksgiving with the attendance and offerings looking better also.

Early in 1980 we doubled our monthly giving up to \$100.00 per month and set a goal for Thanksgiving of \$10,000.00... a goal well beyond all our ability to achieve. We were elated at taking in \$13,050.00 for B.F.M. at Thanksgiving with \$1,000.00 extra for the regular church offering that day and both attendance and finances looking still better for our church.

Early in 1981 we again doubled our regular giving up to \$200.00 per month and doubled our Thanksgiving goal to \$20,000.00. However, after hearing of the great needs at the spring conference in Lexington, we again doubled our regular giving to \$400.00 per month and will maintain it if the Lord enables.

Everyone here recognizes the emphasis upon missions and setting goals by faith have been a blessing to the church. Our finances and attendance has turned upward. Early this year we had a really all-out effort to get everyone out to hear Paul Hatcher and the best we could do was 12 adult members out for Sunday morning, plus friends. Months later, April 5th, when we returned from the Lexington conference, with no special effort we had 12 adult members present for Sunday morning; and now, last Sunday, June 7, we had 15 adult members present Sunday morning and 8 for the evening service.

Dear Brethren,

I am often asked "are you glad you are home," to which I respond, "I am not home, I miss the foreign field." Friends, I am in the States, prayerfully to be used by the Holy Spirit to help each of you to see that the need for getting the Gospel

out is urgent. Over 200 countries will no longer permit a regular, evangelistic, church planting missionary in. Far over one-fifth of the world is now under Communistic control and another 15 per-cent are under the Islamic Faith, not to speak of the other isms and cults by the scores. With the need so great, yet, less than one-third of the church members give and show a concern for missions. I am told over and over; "Brother Carver, I realize the need is great but I do not see how we can do anymore." Think about it, could you not give just 1 per-cent more and let that be for missions?

I am open for appointments, so if you would like me to come just call or write to me at the above address. I shall not attempt to endocrinate your people, that is the pastor's job. I only wish to encourage you and challenge you for the cause of Christ and souls that are perishing, some thirty million each year and the greater majority of them have never heard.

I received a good report from Pastor Cheong and the Shin Nae Baptist Church at Seoul, Korea. Also Pastor Excrupolo gave the report from the Open "Bible" Baptist Church of Sta. Maria (St. Mary) Philippines, they had had five additions since I left there the twelfth of May. Several of the missionary brethren have written this past month. Here is a quote

from one of these soldiers of the cross; "as to the needs, you are aware of the cost to operate a car. I want to continue the river trips." He is simply saying that because of lack of funds that he is really not able to get the job done (no expense money, etc.). What a cry and what a challenge for us to really get involved.

This past month I have been in churches in North Carolina, Kentucky and W. Va., thanks to each for your concern, fellowship and offerings.

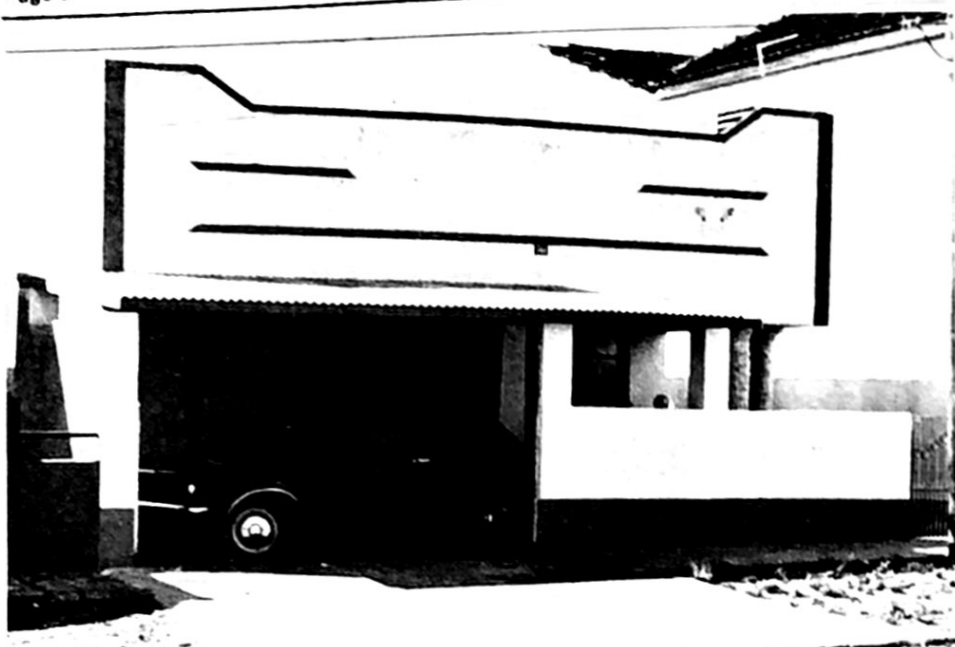

Church Celebrates 52nd Anniversary In New Building . . . Paul Hatcher Comes For Service . . . Over 1200 People Inside And Two Streets Full Outside . . . Largest Crowd In Largest Baptist Church Building In The State . . . Church Gave \$2,722.00 Offerings . . . Conference With Nine Professions Of Faith

Dear Brethren,
May 12th was First Baptist Church's 52nd anniversary. For the past two months everyone here has been working day and night in preparation for the special service. We were able to get much more done on the new building that we had thought possible. We got the roof on and the floors and windows installed as planned but we also plastered several walls, painted the auditorium and did the floors as well. When all of this was ready we brought Brother Paul Hatcher from Manaus to speak the anniversary. The members handed out three thousand invitation. I handed out over 5 special invitations to the merchants and authorities of the city. When 7:30 p.m. rolled around on May 12th our brand new 5874 square foot building was already to small. We have no way of knowing exactly how many people came out. We do know that there were well over 1,200 inside the building. The building was literally packed. The building is on the corner of two wide avenues and these were filled with people

who came but couldn't get in, or for that matter even close to the doors. Among the multitude were all of the main authorities and merchants. Many people heard the Gospel for the first time. One Catholic man said he never saw that many people in the cathedral of his religion. One thing is certain: it was a historic service. This was the largest crowd to attend a Baptist service indoors of the largest Baptist church building in the state. We are also quite sure that our offering was a record for Baptist work in the Acre. You may recall that I mentioned the Church having a goal of Cr\$100,000.00. I kept hinting at twice that though. God gave us even more: Cr\$223,258.00. This is the same as \$2,722.00 in U.S. currency. The service had a great impact and the shock waves are still moving through the city.

The weekend was used for a short conference with Brother Paul doing the preaching. There were 9 saved and 6 other decisions. The final service was held with 365 people and plenty of room to spare. However, we could never have had the same amount in the old building.

It has all been just great. Rejoice with us. In my next letter I'll tell you what is happening in the other phases of our work.

Dear Brethren,
I have been here in Garca for two weeks now where I am trying to take care of John Hatcher's works. The weather here is ideal and I am just about to the point to where I can find my way around. The people have been very nice to me and cooperate in every way they can. Since the Girls are in music classes my family did not come with me. But perhaps will come next month at which time they will be on vacation from classes. It isn't easy for me to come into a strange city not knowing anyone to try to take over and not be lonely, especially when my family is not with me, but I have not had much time to be lonely. Sunday night, after having services in three different cities that afternoon and night, the VW van locked up

in two gears at once stopping in the middle of the street like I had run into a brick wall. We had to push it for a block to get it to where it could be left over night. I got it out of the shop yesterday at the cost of \$135.00.

I left one of the brethren of the church in charge of the work in Varzea Grande and Betty informs me that so far things are going pretty well with attendance holding up to normal. Brother Turner is helping also as I tried to do for him. The brother that I left in charge told Betty that he liked to preach, but it is a big responsibility. I have a lot of confidence in him that he will do a good job. I have never asked him to do anything that he refused to try and he has been a blessing to us for several years.

Please pray for me that while I am here I will take care of the work in such a way that when Brother Hatcher returns he will not find things in worse shape than he left them. It isn't easy to fill his shoes, even though he has small feet.

Dear Brethren,

We have been busy this month preaching, teaching, praying and moving. It almost seems that we were never away from our work here. On Wednesday night I have been going to Brother Creiglow's church to take care of the services there in his absence. Thursday night we have our mid-week services, Friday night I have a Bible study with some of the young people of the church and Saturday night we have a prayer meeting. Sunday of course we have our regular services.

Our services are being attended well by the members and we are having some visitors from time to time. We have one to baptize but

have not been able to do this as there has been a lack of water in our area of town. I'm hoping to get the baptistry filled this week so we baptize this coming Sunday.

The Lord has blessed us with a house since writing last time. We were able to rent another house from the same people that owned the first house I wrote about last month and they decided to let us have the house indefinitely. We are about a mile and half from our work. We got moved about 2 weeks ago and are now settled in.

I have been suffering with a bad ear infection for the last 2 weeks. I got better for a few days and then it came back. Today I plan on going to the doctor as I also have a bad cold and feeling bad in general. The rest of the family also are with colds at this time.

We are presently having our first cool spell. This morning it was 60 degrees which is cold for here.
