Dear Brethren,

We have nothing spectacular to report to you this month. We have preached, prayed, and labored every day in the vineyard of the Lord. Except for a three day trip, we have been in Manaus the entire month. On Tuesday night, October 13th we held services in a home of a member at kilometre 78 on the Manaus-Itacoatira highway. The next night we held services at kilometre 182.

During almost two weeks, we had visitors in our home - Brother Francisco Ribeiro, Filho from the New Jerusalem mission, Parana da Eva, spent two nights with us after being released from the hospital where he received treatment for snake bite. Sr. Manuel Silva, his wife, Dona Cleude dos Santos Silva and daughters were among our guests. Sr. Manuel is now the father of nine girls. Eva Enice dos Santos Silva was born Monday, October 26th.

On November the 2nd a group of us from the 14th of December Baptist Church held two services in the St. John the Baptist Cemetery-first at Joel Bratcher's grave and then at E.A. Nelson's grave. That night we suffered a defeat at the Suburb of Saint Lazarus Baptist Church. I've already written concerning some problems of that church. When we arrived there that night, who should be sitting at the desk already chosen by the church as moderator, etc. of the ordination council but Antonio Barroso, now a Pentecostal pastor. I protested, before the service began, and asked permission to speak to the church - was refused and asked to leave. Two days later, at my request, the 14th of December Baptist Church withdrew fellowship from that church. Pray for that church that she will return to the Lord.

If you write us and we don't respond, write again please. Only this last week we received notice that a church had written us in June. We still haven't received the letter. The Lord willing we'll be coming to the States on furlough around the first of May. Continue to pray for us and give to Baptist Faith Missions.

Hafford H. Overbey Honored At The Thanksgiving Conference

When we arrived at Twelve-Ryan Baptist Church Monday afternoon November 23, 1981, Pastor Wallace York and members of the Church had several surprises for us. First, there was a large banner on the wall in the Annex where we ate, with the words: FORTY YEARS HONORING "MR. MISSIONS" EXECUTIVE SECRETARY OF BFM. Then, while we were eating I was called to a table to see a special large cake with the same words on the icing on top of the cake, to have my picture taken with the cake. But that was not all. After I preached on Tuesday night I was told to remain on the platform, and Pastor Sidney Fisher, President of BFM had many nice words to say, then I was presented with a plaque engraved with the words: "HAFFORD H. OVERBEY, 'MR. MISSIONS' IN RECOGNITION OF FORTY YEARS OF FAITHFUL AND SACRIFICIAL SERVICES AND LEADERSHIP AS EXECUTIVE SECRETARY OF BAPTIST FAITH MISSIONS. BAPTIST FAITH MISSIONS BEGAN IN 1942 WHEN ONE MAN, HAFFORD H. OVERBEY, HAD A BURDEN AND A VISION FOR FOREIGN MISSION WORK IN BRAZIL. FROM THAT BEGINNING, THE WORK HAS GROWN UNDER HIS LEADERSHIP AND NOW MULTITUDES SHARE HIS BURDEN AND VISION FOR CARRYING OUT THE GREAT COMMISSION OF JESUS CHRIST. PRESENTED BY THE DIRECTORS AND SUPPORTERS OF BAPTIST FAITH MISSIONS AT THE 27th ANNUAL THANKSGIVING CONFERENCE, NOVEMBER 24, 1981."

Next, I was presented with another plaque engraved with the words: HAFFORD H. OVERBEY IN HONOR OF 40 YEARS AS EXECUTIVE SECRETARY OF BAPTIST FAITH MISSIONS from all of BFM Missionaries. Next was a large framed portrait of myself painted by Pastor James Hamilton. Next was a telegram from all my children. Then my wife and all the missionaries came and formed a line at the front and the people came to greet us with hand shakes, embraces and tears of joy. This was all a complete surprise to us. Many thanks to Pastor Wallace York and the Twelve-Ryan Baptist Church, that I love so dearly, and to all who support Baptist Faith Missions. It was a great day in my life, and I am looking forward to a greater day and hope to hear my Lord say "Well done good and faithful servant; thou hast been faithful over a few things, I will make thee ruler over many things; enter thou into the joy of thy Lord."

Dear Brethren,

There isn't much news around here this month, either at home or at church. Things are pretty much routine.

We did get started on the repair work of the Kombi that I mentioned in my letter last month. It should be finished within a week and we hope to start on the bus also this week. Both were needing extensive repairs.

We are working on our discipline problem and this month we had to exclude four from our fellowship. Several others are pending and we are waiting to see how they conduct themselves after our visits to their homes.

We have had only one or two professions of faith this month and one came requesting baptism. We have been having many lost people in our Sunday services and last Sunday night we had 111 in the service with seven first time visitors.

It seems like in our Faith-Promise plan of giving our promise has been much stronger than our faith. In the first two months we have only received about half

Dear Brethren,
Here goes another monthly report on the dividends of your missionary investment. The results of your investments have had good returns; everything points to higher dividends in the immediate future. This may be the time to sacrifice and invest all you can-time may be short.

Dividend No. 1 - On November 8th the 35th person from the new works of Garca and Galia was baptized. He is a young man 24 years old, who finished College last year. He is to be married on the 12th of December to a young lady saved and baptized here in Garca about two years ago.

Dividend No. 2 - With the marriage of these two, Claudinei and Beth, a new Baptist family will be established from the results of the Gospel here in Garca.

Dividend No. 3 - There have been more positive results from visits made in Duartina the last three weeks than ever before. The number of persons attending the services is growing with highs of 40-45.

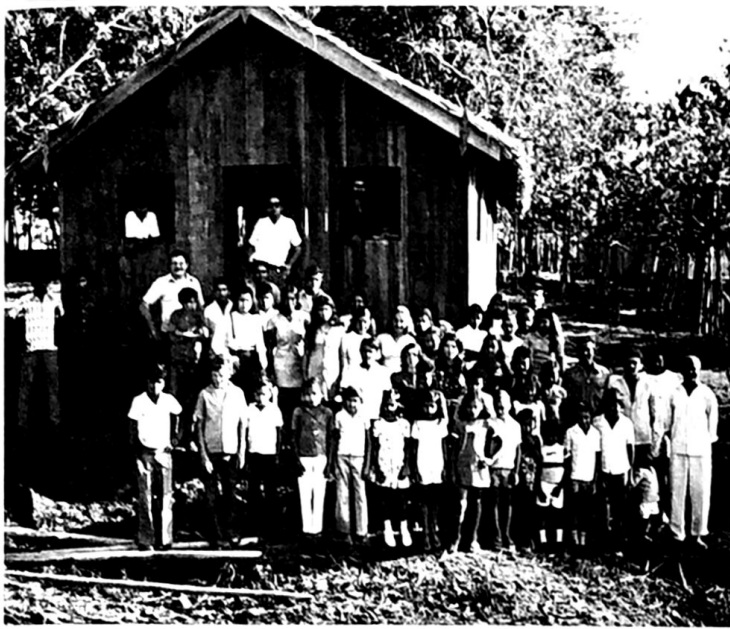
Dividend No. 4 - On November 3, God saved an Arab land owner. Several factors contributed to his conversion. Two years ago he began listening to our radio program (no longer broadcasting because station refused to sell us time when we returned). This man comes from a very traditional catholic family. There are dozens of priests in their ancestry. God disturbed his soul with family problems and administrative problems in his work. The second important factor was the lady I baptized last month along with her daughter. This lady is an unwed mother who was converted about four years ago in our services in Galia. (It was dona Alta who led her to the Lord.) She works as a maid in the house of this man's father. Her transformed life, her interest in the Bible, and her faithful testimony God used to bring this man to services to hear the Bible. He attended for over a month and brought His Bible and studied it every time. Finally, the burden became too great, and on Tuesday morning, about 10:00 a.m., a voice called into my study at the church, "Brother John, are you there?" The Man was at the end of himself and stated, "I have driven here because I must make peace with God and trust Christ as Saviour." He lives in Galia and drove to Garca. He surrendered to Christ; the change was evident. After talking for a few minutes I said, "I am going to pray and then you pray and thank God for saving you, if you would like." He prayed his first prayer to his Heavenly Father, and what a prayer! To hear the heart of a man, wealthy, educated, and traditionally accepted, being poured out in such humility is indeed a rare occasion. In part of his prayer he said, "And Lord, thank You for Cida, (the lady who works in his father's house) I thought she was just an ignorant poor person who knew nothing about spiritual things, but she was the one who knew and I was the ignorant one . . ." He prayed, the tears flowing from his eyes, and finally lifted his head and said, "I do not have anymore words."

There is one more possible dividend but I cannot know about the purchase of the large property until Tuesday, and this letter will be far away.

Back In Iquitos From Hospital In Lima, Peru . . . Surgery Successful . . . Must Rest Three To Four Weeks . . . Church Broken Into And P.A. System Stolen . . . Needs For Car And Medical Expenses

Dear Brethren,
As you were advised in the last Mission Sheets, I left Iquitos on October 29 taking Jan to Lima, Peru for medical attention. We have just arrived

home again and are very pleased with the results of our trip. As you know we made a trip to the states early this year for this same problem and were told before coming back that she was in perfect health. We knew that wasn't so but we didn't know what else to do. She became so sick that after a brief stay in the hospital here in Iquitos with no results, that I was afraid that without better medical attention that she was going to die. As a result, I took her to the hospital in Lima where they had found the problem after the first examination and determined what must be done to resolve it. She had surgery to lift and support the bladder which had fallen to the point that it was resting on the bowel causing constant pain, infection and diarrhea. She will

have to rest now for the next 3 or 4 weeks but is feeling much better. We sincerely thank each one who has been praying for us and we desire that you continue doing so.

All the works here are doing good with souls being saved and the churches growing in knowledge of GOD'S WORD.

We did have a problem in the First Church this month. The day before my wife and I arrived from Lima, someone entered and stole the P.A. System. The saddest part is it had to be someone whom we had trusted.

There is still a great need for the Gospel to go out here in Peru. I plead with you to give to missions in the coming days and months in a way that you have never done before and put yourself in your giving. We still have need for car and medical expenses. The cost here are rising rapidly each day and the money we receive will not buy half of what it would when we first came here a year and a half ago.
