Five Busy Weeks In Korea And The Philippines . . . Both Works Are Encouraging . . . Challenge Concerning New Missionaries . . At Two Conferences In Indiana And West Virginia

After almost five weeks in Korea and the Philippines, I arrived back the evening of September 9th. The trip was tiresome, hard work, but without question, of God. It would have been great if you could have been great if you could have been din any and all minds.

While in the Philippines, aside from speaking in a meeting as well as asthe Biblical work being done would have been cleared in any and all minds.

While in the Philippines, aside from speaking in the church that I had organized: I also had the privilege of speaking in a meeting as well as a seminary at Brother Adams' mission. Several made public desicisons for salvation, baptisms and prayer requests, etc.

Questions and Answers

What authority do the missionaries of Baptist Faith Mission Have?

Each missionary was sent out under the authority of a New Testament Baptist Church and has continued to work under the authority of the same kind of church. Only New Testament Baptist Churches have authority from the Lord to carry out the great commission.

The missionary does not always continue to work under the authority of the same church that sent him out. Usually when a Baptist Church is organized on the mission field, the missionary will feel led of the Lord to become a member of it and then work under its authority. Each New Testament Baptist Church has full authority whether in our country or in another country. No Baptist Church has more authority than another Baptist Church.

Just as in our country a pastor may be authorized by one church to work for the Lord and then may be called to another church which he joins and then that church authorizes his work for the Lord. For scriptural and practical reasons if a man is working for the Lord in one general area it is generally best to be a member of a New Testament Baptist Church there if there is one there. He can take the Lord Supper vote, and be disciplined and work under its authority easier in a church in that area than one serveral thousand miles away.

Only one church gives authority to a missionary to do his work but several different churches may help support him. Paul was authorized to do his work by the church at Antioch but other churches helped in his support at times. The Philippian church sent offerings to help in his work.

For example, Brother Dana Adams was authorized to work in the Philippines by the South Lexington Baptist Church of Lexington, Kentucky, the church which I pastor. The only authority he had to go to the mission field was from our church but many have helped our church support him for which we thank the Lord. This is true of each of the missionaries of Baptist Faith Missions. Each is authorized by one church but not the same church but all are supported by many churches.

Each Director of Baptist Faith Missions has church





Dear Brethren, September 17, 1982
This month's letter is written to you from the tropically heated city of Manaus. And one sure thing is: the heating system here has not lost its force. It is great to be with our three children and their families, a rare privilege for us. And, of course I am getting to spoil our grandson, Odalizinho, whom I had not seen. He is now five months old. Alta was not able to make the trip with me. She stayed with the stuff and is seeing that the services are cared for.

If all goes according to plans, our radio broadcast will begin on October 4th, in the State of Parana, in the city of Cornelio Procopio. Our broadcast will be daily, Monday through Saturday, ten minutes each day. This will be the initial step in establishing Baptist churches in one more State in Brazil. The city has about 70 thousand inhabitants.

The Broadcast should reach out to another five or six smaller cities. In the new city there is a large building and lot

smaller cities.

In the new city there is a large building and lot with seating capacity for 700 persons. The building and ground measure 65'x 98' each. This property is in the very center of the city. We are asking the Lord to give us this property so there will be immediate facilities for meetings, permanent growth, and in order to save months and added expenses in building. Pray for this property to be given us, if it be the Lord's will.

In rereading the first part of this letter, I see the real reason for being in Manaus was not mentioned. During these two weeks I am teaching an intensified course on the Holy Spirit and the book of Acts. There are 25 seminary students in the class. Please do not cease to pray for God to raise up faithful preachers and pastors for the work here.

Finally, our thanks to each of you who have prayed and given to help in the purchase of the large building in Garca. Our attendance remains high and this month there were several young persons who


