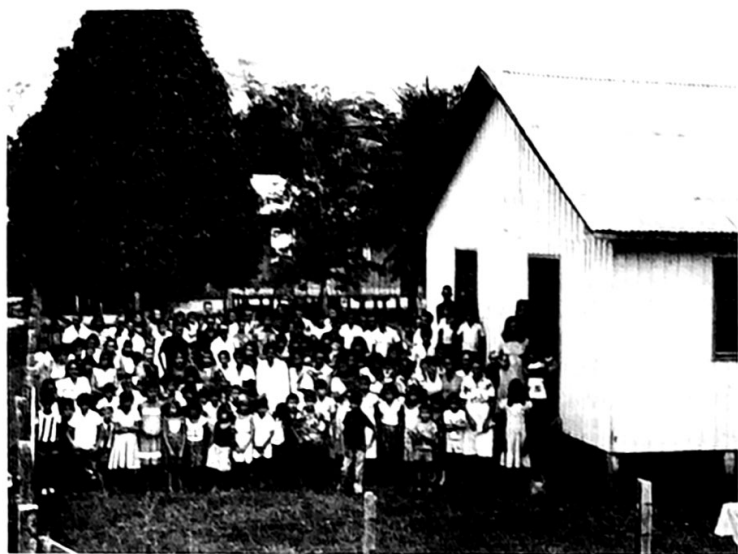

Many Saved In Many Of The Works . . . Special Service In The Plaza Leads To 24 Professions Of Faith . . . 28 Saved At Miraflores . . . Keep Praying

Dear Brethren,
This past month the Lord has blessed us in many ways. We have seen souls saved in many of the works and others now seeking to hear the Gospel more than ever before. The following is an example, but don't mistake this for an every day occurrence. Four nights conference in the Third Baptist Church was conducted with services in the afternoon in the plaza with hundreds of souls who came out in the open-air service to hear the Gospel. After the services in the plaza each afternoon, the people were invited to attend the regular night services in the church building and many did so and the Lord worked a work of Grace in many hearts and during the four days services there were 24 professions of faith in

Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. Also in the mission at Miraflores, which is up the Amazon River about 3 hours by speed boat and then change to a smaller log boat with peque-peque 16 H.P. to go up a creek for another 8 hours to reach the village, there were 28 saved and baptized as a result of recent services there. These were not the product of one or two days work, but the result of many days of praying, visitation, dedication and self sacrifice on the part of everyone involved. Miraflores is a mission work of the Tamshiyacu Baptist Church on the Amazon River. The mission at Santo Tomas is also growing with some new people now coming for services, mostly young people. Keep praying for us and all the works here in Peru that we will continue to see souls saved. We are looking forward to the Stantons arriving on the 28th of this month also. Give as the Lord leads you to help us here in these works. May the Lord ever bless you.

Greetings:

Unless things fail to run as planned, the Stantons plan to leave for Peru on April 28. This is almost a miracle. You have been willing to let God use you to bring it to pass.

As you can see in the financial statement on the back of the Mission Sheet, we are sending the Stantons by faith. However, no later than Sunday Night some dear people told me that they were going to help make up the \$5.00 monthly "Faith Promise Warriors for Peru." I am sure many of you will come through yet.

Often other missionaries, especially those who do deputation, ask me how much our supporting churches average giving per missionary family. You possibly have wondered too. A brief break-down just may give you answers. If your church gives to the general fund:

- \$10.00 a month then you are giving .77 monthly per missionary family.
- \$25.00 a month then you are giving 1.92 monthly per missionary family.
- \$50.00 a month then you are giving 3.85 monthly per missionary family.
- \$100.00 a month then you are giving 7.69 monthly per missionary family.
- \$200.00 a month then you are giving 15.38 monthly per missionary family.
- \$300.00 a month then you are giving 23.08 monthly per missionary family.
- \$500.00 a month then you are giving 38.46 monthly per missionary family.
- \$1,000.00 a month then you are giving 76.92 monthly per missionary family.

The average church giving into the general fund in the last mission sheet per missionary family was: \$14.08. We thank God for you. My deputation missionary friends say they will average between \$25.00 and \$50.00 monthly from their supporting churches. You see, you are getting a bargain in your B.F.M. Missionaries.

The question often comes up: "I would like to have more of a part in the mission work of B.F.M. but due to limited finances, how can I?"

Chances are, you own properties that you have not considered "giveable assets." Besides gifts of outright cash, there is an abundance of non-cash properties which can be used to make highly valued gifts to charitable organizations. Many of the plans of giving are: Stocks & bonds; notes & leases; mortgages; land contracts; livestock; life insurance; crops; real estate; business inventories; antiques; jewelry; royalties; art work; collections of value and the list could go on and on.

I would be happy to discuss this with you personally or as a church. Too, we now have a slide presentation on wills that you might like to view.

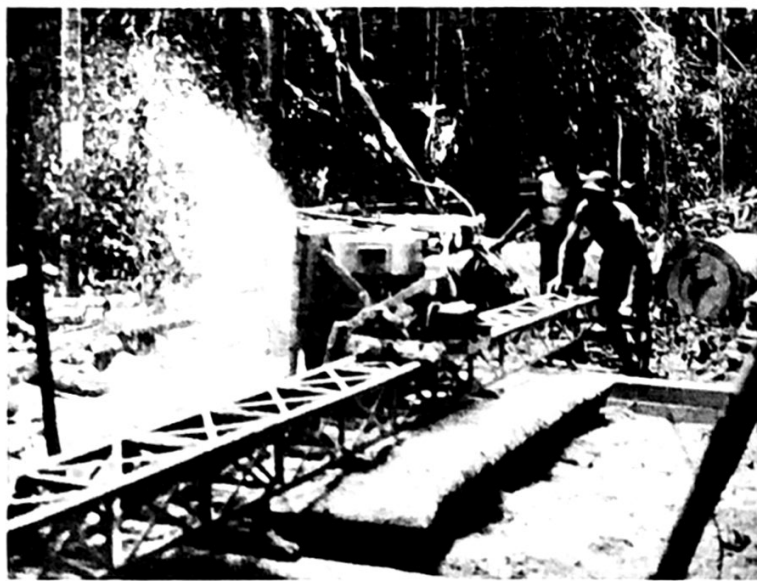

At this time I am in the States taking care of a medical problem. Two doctors in Brazil advised me to do something for my skin to avoid possible skin cancer in the future. The doctors and friends recommended the U.S. as the best place to go. I arrived here almost weeks ago and went to a doctor who specializes in treating this kind of problem. I am now concluding my treatment and tomorrow will be on my way back to Brazil. The Lord has blessed wonderfully as usual. The doctor did not charge for any of the visits and at the end gave me over \$300.00 worth of medications and

People Saved In The Church And Mission In Sao Luis . . . People Saved In Mission Almost Every Service . . . Need Help To Pay For The Building . . . Good Report From Anajatuba . . . Planning Now For New Mission

Dear Brethren,

We are still being blessed with some being saved and also one or two falling by the wayside.

All in all we have been very pleased with the work here in Sao Luis this month. We have had professions of faith both in the church and in the mission. Nearly every time we go to the mission someone makes a profession of faith. Up to now nearly all who have made professions there are teenagers. They are the church of tomorrow. We sent a brother to Anajatuba this month for a week. He came back with a good report. A man in his 80's was saved as well as a woman in her 70's. We thank the Lord for these precious souls. Our people at our church seem to be growing in the word. We are having to be patient with them. Most of them are new or untried converts. They have many problems and much adversity. But most of our members are faithful in their attendance.

We appreciate those of you who have prayed and others who have given toward our new mission here in town. Please don't forget this work. We owe around \$1800 yet on this. It is in a great location and has, besides a small auditorium which is already in use, also living quarters for the worker and his family. The whole thing cost less than \$4000. It was God given and several souls have already been saved there. Help us liquidate this debt. We have led the church here to go in debt and buy yet another lot in a place about 5 miles from town that has a new housing project for poor people. It is a place that has 5000 houses (30,000 people) and as yet not an organized Baptist church. We are not asking for help at this time on this. Our church must first make 33 monthly payments of CR \$14,000 before we can start to build. Pray for us as we take this step. Our monthly offering is very low. Yet we want the people here to learn to give and be involved in mission work.

My father asked me to thank all who are or who have written to him words of encouragement during this difficult time he is having with sickness. We appreciate so much that you have responded to this request. I just received word that my mother is also in the hospital. We are thankful they are saved and safe! God bless all until next month.

Landslides Hinder Trip . . . Several Saved . . . Long Hours Of Work On The Building . . . Work At Aucayacu Doing Well . . . \$2,000 Needed To Finish The Roof

Dear Brethren,

Since I wrote my last letter I have had some experiences that I will never forget.

I had to go to Lima to start our work on our visas and I could not get space on the plane so I started to drive to Lima by highway. I took two brethren with me because of the rain and landslides. We were two hours away from Lima and we were informed that the bridge was washed away at Chosica. We had to return and go another route that all the trucks were using. I drove 5 hours going up in a circle until I arrived at the top which was 16,000 feet. It took me five hours to go back down the other side, only to find another landslide. We had to wait 19 hours before the road was open again. We were 36 hours arriving in Lima from Huanuco. Usually it takes 10 hours by highway. We had to wait 8 days before we were able to come back to Huanuco which took 22 hours without stopping. Over two hundred people died in landslides, two buses were completely covered and many people were never found.

I have been blessed with opportunities to preach and several have been saved and others have come forward in the services for baptism and others getting their lives right with the Lord.

I have been preaching on tithing and giving to support the Lord's work and the Lord has blessed in this.

We have been working long hours on the building here in Huanuco and I believe that we will be able to move into our apartment by the middle of next week.

We are also working on the second floor pouring cement and gravel to finish the roof to stop the water damage to the auditorium. We plan to start at 4:00 a.m. Saturday, April 23. We have to finish all the roof before we can start our Institute. We have over thirty students that are ready to start studying, plus we will have an Institute in Tingo Maria and another in Aucayacu.

The work in Aucayacu is growing in number and the people are tithing and the work looks good. There are many problems here in Huanuco and I can only advise and try to stay out of the picture. Pray for the brethren here in Huanuco. They called the deacon as pastor and he was called by a 51 percent of the votes. He accepted the call but with 49 percent against him I do not know how it will work out.

We hope to have the roof poured all around the building in three weeks and then we will start our Bible Institute.

We need \$2,000.00 now to finish the roof. Will you help us. Without this new roof the plaster will keep falling in the auditorium and it will cost more to repair. Those who plan to come this spring need to call Faucett Air Lines to get the best price possible. Let me know and I will work on it from this end also. We will have plenty of room, beds, etc. so YOU ALL COME.

We had not talked to Mike and his family for almost two years, so one night we decided to call them



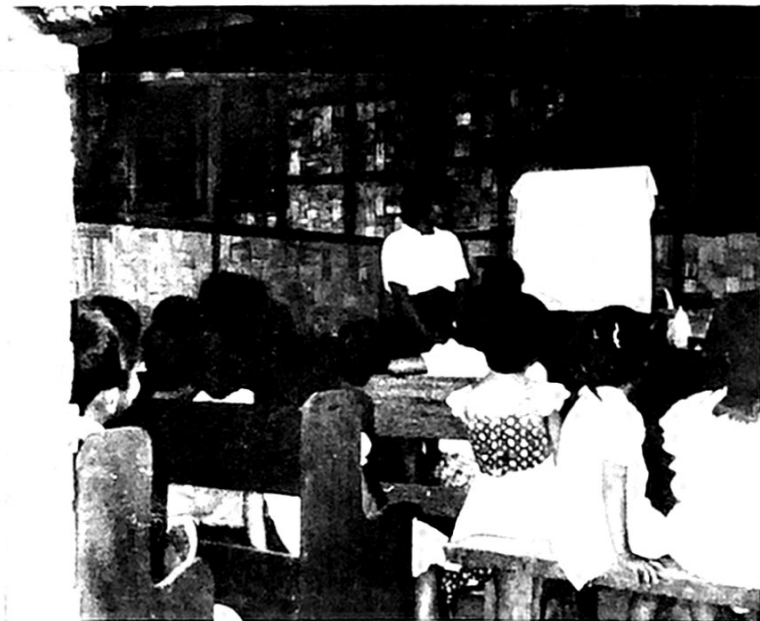
