Dear Friends,
Garca, Sao Paulo
June 14, 1983
Today, I want to tell you a true story. After reading it I hope you will want to pray and share the expenses of reaching the lost.

Sunday morning. It has been a short night, and as usual I awoke after thinking about the Lord's day: running the three bus routes, my Sunday School class, the sermon for 150 young people and praying no child would be hurt or lost.

Church starts at 9:00 a.m. At seven we are dressed, breakfast almost ready, and materials laid out that have to be taken. At seven forty-five we leave the house. Alta stays at the church getting things in order, dividing out drawings and material for the classes and I head for the bus garage to begin the first route at eight ten.

As I said, Sunday school begins at nine. Our first load arrives at church at ten minutes until nine . . . 60 to 80 persons. While these sing, the bus heads out for the second load. At nine ten, the second load of 80 to 90 climb off the bus, and we head out for the third load. At nine twenty, the third bus full of people is unloaded. Twenty minutes late - no problem - we just start at nine-twenty and no time is lost.

Getting people out to hear the Word of God makes the Devil mad. And it makes the Devil's slaves mad. On June 5th, a group of 30 children were waiting for our bus to take them to Sunday School. Suddenly, the Friar (Catholic priest) appeared in his rustling robes and "ate the group of children out." He bawled

them out for not going to the Catholic church and then he spoke about how wicked Mrs. Hatcher and I were and how evil our church was. One 18 year old boy was there and heard it. Having never been to our church, he was so curious he came and attended the entire morning service.

The next week the friar called a meeting of the mothers and "let them have it" for letting their children come to our church. He called us "the robbers of children" and told the mothers that we were robbing their children. Last Saturday a mother who was present at the friar's meeting, told me the details, when I visited in her home. Her son and three grandchildren attend our Sunday School.

"The priest said awful things about you and your church," she told me. Her son is also studying catechism for first communion. I asked her if she had taken a look at her son's catechism book. She replied, "No." I said, "You ought to for it is teaching your son communism." She asked her son to go in the house and get the book, but he called out later that he could not find it.

Yes, the friar calls us "robbers of children." And, the truth is, we are. Our purpose is to rob them from sin, from drunkenness, from prostitution, from idolatry, from unhappiness, from hell. It is not an easy job but we have One who goes with us to bind up "the strong man" of the house while we get the children.

That great missionary of by-gone-days; a missionary to China from 1853 until 1902, who in 1887 prayed for 100 missionaries and got them in one year. James Hudson Taylor once said: "Foreign missionaries are but scaffolding around a rising building soon to be transferred for use in other places."

Dear Brethren,
As I mentioned in my last letter we were to go on a trip looking for a place to start a new work after furlough and we were to go as a family, but Arlene decided that she did not want to go, so we left her with the family of the new pastor, Betty, Arlene and I made our first stop in Garca, Sao Paulo to spend the week-end with the John Hatchers and since the Hatchers were going to Cuiaba to help in the ordination of our new pastor Arlene decided she wanted to stay with them to visit with her friends in Garca and then return to Varzea Grande with the Hatchers. Betty and I made the rest of the 5,300 kilometre trip alone. This was the first time the girls had been separated for any length of time and we think it was good for all of us. Our trip was not extensive as we had planned for several reasons, but we think, after visiting some fifteen cities in the State of Minas Gerais all of which are in need of several Baptist works there was no need to look any farther as one or more of these will be our goal for our

next term. The trip was made with no big problems and we all were glad to be reunited as a family again. For the past four days we have been happy to have in our home Brother and Sister John Hatcher along with a member of their church, Brother Paul Hatcher and his children, and the new pastor and his family making a total of fifteen people. The new pastor is filling his position very well. Last Sunday they went to double services in the morning and there were 530 present in S.S. We ordained the pastor that afternoon and there were around 100 present at that service. At night the house was once again packed out with 243 present. Brother Turner also came over to help us with the ordination service. During these services there were several professions of faith and several asking for baptism, so things are looking great.

I am now trying to sell my car and as soon as that is taken care of we will store our furniture, or at least what the new pastor will not be using, and then we will go to Cruzeiro do Sul to visit the work and Mike and his family. My next letter should be written from there.

We are still working on the building and plan to start our Bible Institute the first of August. We will be teaching Introduction of the Old Testament, Introduction to the New Testament, Baptist Doctrine, Learning how to teach, Sunday school Administration, Preparation and delivery of sermons and music. We will have an Institute here

and in Tingo Maria and an Extension in Aucayacu. While I am writing this letter my wife is busy preparing my suit case so I can leave in time to preach in Aucayacu tonight. I will preach from Wednesday through Sunday and back to Huanuco to continue on the building. Things are beginning to shape up and we will be able to teach and preach and get new works started.

We plan to organize the mission across the river from Huanuco into an Independent Baptist Church July 3rd. The people at the mission have chosen their new name. The Lord willing they will be called Iglesia Bautista Sion. In English "Zion Baptist Church". I have been working with them and we have found a lot and we hope to help them buy it this week. We need \$400.00 to complete the contract. Please pray about this and ask the Lord to lead you so these people will have a bigger place to meet. They are now meeting in the home of one of the members and there is no place to sit. Thank you again for all the cards and prayers in the death of our daughter.

PROGRESS REPORT June 1983

1. Only 3 payments to be made on the large building in Garca.
2. Attendance average in Garca for May was 250.
3. Attendance has doubled in Galia with a high day of 60 in May.
4. Attendance in Duartina Mission is up, also.
5. New work in Cornelio Procopio has a growing Sunday School. On May 8th there were 69 in Sunday School and 75 present at night service.

Would you consciously be responsible for hindering people from hearing about Jesus Christ and the eternal life He offers?

Four men brought one paralyzed man to Jesus for healing. Jesus did not disappoint them. He saw their faith.

Had they left their friend in his helpless condition without carrying to Jesus do you not think they would have been guilty of consciously depriving him of God's blessing?

Here are five actual cases about bringing people to hear about Jesus. After reading about these cases you be the judge and make an honest judgement as to whether the method of work is justified or not. If you judge it to be, please help us with your financial support.

Case No. 1 - In Garca, after five years of work our Sunday School attendance averaged about 50. After buying an old Volks station wagon to use, our attendance rose to 125. With one rented bus making three trips each Sunday morning the attendance has gradually risen to 250 in May. Most bus companies will not rent for this type of service.

Case No. 2 - The new work in Boa Vista was begun in January, 1983, by the Tabernacle Baptist Church. Three Seminary students are working there. They were given one bus by the Tabernacle Baptist

Church. In four months their attendance is almost 300 average, they have baptized more than any other new work, and this month they put their pastor on full time salary.

Case No. 3 - Galia Church was started the same time as Garca. Two young Seminary students are now directing this work, and also the mission in Duartina. Their attendance in each place is between 50 and 60 as mentioned above. With one bus the attendance in Galia would soon reach 150 or more.

Case No. 4 - The new work in Cornelio Procopio has reached an attendance of 50-60. This work is also being conducted by Seminary students. This city is large (70,000). The Lord has given us a large building and seating for 300 people. With one bus the attendance would increase to 250 within a month.

Case No. 5 - The Tabernacle Baptist Church in Manaus has an average of above 1,500 persons per Sunday. Manaus is a city of 750,000 population. This large attendance is brought in on 10 busses.

In every case where a bus is well used it will bring in an average of 150-250 per Sunday. Doing the job on foot with more hours will bring in an average of 40-60.

Our cause is reaching people with the Gospel. In places with low salaries, large families, and few automobiles, busses become a moral responsibility. To do less is to fail.

After 27 years on the mission field there is no doubt in my mind: The two greatest assets for a new mission work is a large permanent building and a large bus. These can only be acquired with designated funds. What is your decision? Does Jesus see our faith?

Dear Brethren,

On Wednesday night, May 18th and again on Wednesday night, May 25th, I led prayer meeting at the Zion Baptist Church. The pastor, Altair de Oliveira Rodrigues was not present either time due to his studies. On May 22nd I preached Sunday morning at the 14th of December Baptist Church. On Sunday night I preached and showed the slides at the Chapada Baptist Church where Miguel Ibernou da Cruz is the pastor.

On Sunday May 29th I preached at both services at the 14th of December Baptist Church. At the business meeting that day, the church agreed to my suggestion that Asa Mark continue on as pastor at least until the end of this year and that I be pastor-evangelist of the church.

Wednesday night at 6:00, June 1st, Mrs. Bratcher & I found ourselves with Pastor Jose Francisco da Silva on our way to Codajas. We arrived there the next day at around 2:00 p.m. That night we began a revival at the mission of the 25th of December Baptist Church. All of the services were held in Codajas except on Sunday morning the 5th when we

crossed the river and held services with 34 present at the church. After the services I baptized two. During the revival there were two professions of faith and two rededications. Eleizer Moreira Nunes has served as the pastor of the church for years. He is a faithful layman. Pray for him because in January of this year his wife died leaving him with ten children ranging in age from 20 to three years of age - all still at home with him.

The last service at Codajas I preached at the Codajas Baptist Church to more than 200 people present. The pastor is Jose Ribamar de Sa Bogea.

This morning the three of us arrived back in Manaus. Mrs. Bratcher & I will be leaving again Saturday for an eight day meeting at the New Jerusalem Baptist Mission - Parana da Eva - Amazonas River.

Brethren, pray for us and give to the regular fund and to the Bratcher building. We will soon be needing to do some more building. We may be asking for money to buy a boat if not we will be renting boats which is very expensive.

May the Lord's richest blessings be upon you is our prayer.
