Dear Brethren,
"Attempt great things for God; expect great things from God." These words were spoken by God's man, William Carey, that Baptist from England who labored in India from 1793 until promoted home to glory in 1834.

We started and ended 1983 with, if not the greatest, one of the greatest months for that month in the history of Baptist Faith Missions.

We MUST break the 1983 record again in 1984. Let's all live what John Eliot, who labored in the U.S.A. among the Indians from approximately 1646 til the 1670's: "We must not sit down and look for miracles, be up and doing."

Glad to hear of the good Thanksgiving Conference. We rejoice and thank the Lord for the offerings given during the month of November.

We spent the week-end of Nov. 26th and the 27th with the Resaco do Pesqueiro mission near Manacapuru. The mission is out of the Zion Baptist Church of Manacapuru. The mission was celebrating its fifth anniversary. Moises Ferreira Lima is the Pastor.

The next week-end I once again preached three times. This time at the Zion Baptist Church of Manacapuru. The attendance was much smaller at all three services than at the mission. Please pray for the church.

Tuesday night, December 6th I gave the final test in Old Testament at the "Faculdade Batista de Teologia do Amazonas."

At noon on Friday, Dec. 9th, Mrs. Bratcher and I left Manaus on a passenger boat. We traveled for

Busses Used To Help Bring 680 To Service . . . 50 Professions Of Faith . . . Attendance Up In All Places Except Duartina . . . Married 39 Years

Dear Friends,

Today was a special day. God's goodness is beyond understanding. Three of our new

busses covered the city of Garca and two other cities. One bus in two trips brought 302 persons, the other two brought nearly 150 each. 680 person heard the Gospel and at least 50 persons made professions of faith.

Attendance is up in all places except Duartina. As soon as the construction is finished there we will increase efforts there. This week the men and I made pews for an additional 250 persons here in Garca. In January a new bus route will be begun in our fourth new work. Today, 107 persons came to services from the city of

Vera Cruz, and an additional 12 from Jafa, on our newest bus route. To build a building and supply a worker in the city of Vera Cruz and Jafa would be impossible at present. It would take a long time to reach 107 persons if we were to rent a building and have services in the afternoon or at night during the week.

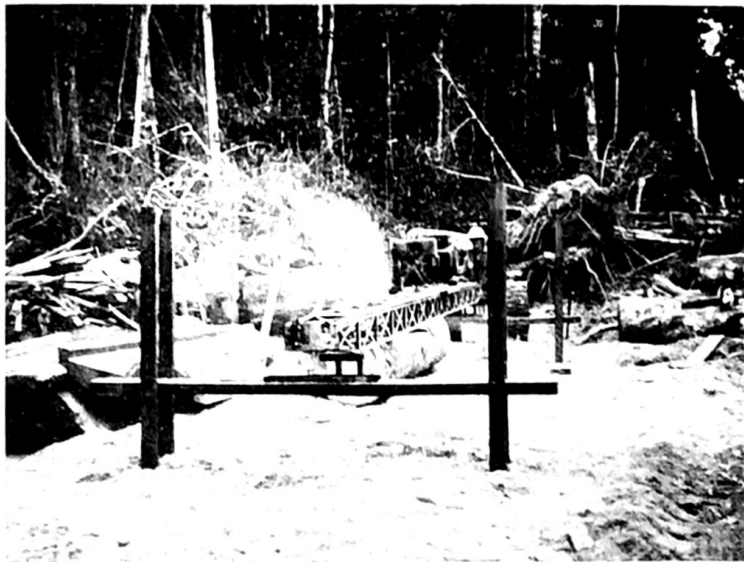
A large brick building has been rented for a bus garage. It will hold the four busses we have and perhaps another four. Praise the Lord! On December 20th Alta and I celebrate our 39th wedding anniversary. On the night of the 25th we will fly to Manaus to visit with our children and grandchildren. It will be the first time we could return to Manaus together since we moved to Sao Paulo eight years ago.

We ask you to give us prayers and financial support for 1984. May God make it the greatest year of expansion since we have been in Brazil.

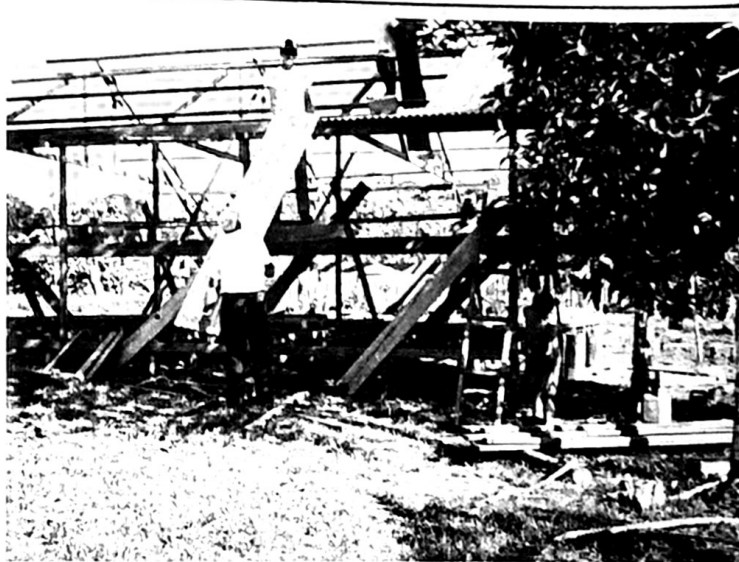

The Rise Of The Rivers Help . . . Many Places Reached On The Rivers . . . Several Saved . . . Andrew Saved . . . Bad News From Rodrigues Alves

Cruzeiro do Sul, Acre
December 9, 1983

The rivers have started to come up and this has given us more mobility in parts of the work that had been difficult to reach in the severe dry spell this year. With the exception of the road to Lagoinha, all the other roads are in good shape. This all means that my preachers and I have been going more than ever.

I took three of our men with me to visit the new works at Moju and Valquiere. We divided into 2 groups (we also had 2 laymen with us) and spent 3 days with the 2 congregations. There are 10 believers at Moju and 19 at Valquiere. Most of these are adults. Most still need to be legally married in order to be baptized, but we are working on that. The folks at Valquiere are getting ready to build their own place to meet. They want to start at the beginning of the year. I have also been back to visit the brethren at Calvary. Their crowds are still growing and they have had several people saved. We are working on the plans for their new building and construction should begin next week.

Our preachers have been to many of the churches this month and have still kept up their work in the missions. They have visited the following churches: Mourapiranga, Maita, Mancio Lima, Colonia, Rodrigues Alves and Sacado. They also went to

Barao to visit the few Christians who still live there. The report was encouraging. It could be that the work there may be revived. On the same trip they stopped at a village that had not been reached yet. There were 10 people saved in the first service! Other places that they have worked this month: Assis Brasil, Pentecostes, Uniao, Guajara, and Tapiri.

This has been a good month for us here at First Baptist. We have had several saved, including my son Andrew. We have had some coming back after grave problems. The church also took up a special offering to buy a 16 mm projector, which should be a useful tool in and out of town. Seven of our young people graduated from high school this month and some of these will be going on to Manaus soon to the seminary.

There is one item of bad news this month. The pastor of the church at Rodrigues Alves has resigned and become a Presbyterian. He did not resign until he had almost killed the work. The remainder has asked us to help. We will have to send men weekly and I will need to go more often now. We all believe that this holds a blessing in disguise though. The man who had pastored had cancelled the Wednesday and Saturday services over a year ago and had driven away many of the most faithful members by his crude way of "counseling". It is also obvious that he is not doctrinally sound. Our men have been there twice this week and the reports are good as can be expected at this time.

May God bless you all. Pray for this work and us.

I am remembering as I write these lines that tonight the Thanksgiving Conference begins. May the Lord bless!

Saturday, October 22nd performed the wedding ceremony for Jose Pereira da Silva and Miria Araujo da Silva at the Gerezim Baptist Church. The bride is the daughter of Pastor and Mrs. Enos Ibernora da Silva. On October 29th I performed two weddings at the Zion Baptist Church, Manacapuru. On November 16th, two weddings at the Costa de Sao Jose de Amatori Baptist Mission. On Sunday night, October 23rd preached at the Gerezim Baptist Church.

Each Tuesday and Thursday I will be lecturing from the Old Testament at the "Faculdade Batista do Amazonas." At the end of this month we will be on vacation until the first of March.

On October 26 and 27 it was our privilege to have dinner with Pastor Wallace York who spent some days in Brazil.

Sunday afternoon I participated with nine other Baptist pastors in the pre-ordination of Wanderley Melo Rodrigues. I led in the examination. He is the assistant pastor of the Chapada Baptist Church.

October 28th-30th - week-end revival at the Zion Baptist Church, Manacapuru. Sunday morning I baptized nine and one was received by restoration.

November 11-16 we spent with the mission at Costa de Sao Jose de Amatori. The last night, the 15th, I preached to 97 at the school house in Colonia de Amatori. There was 1 rededication made and I asked for baptism. The trip to Amatori was made in the Mission launch. We give thanks to the Lord for you who gave for us to have the launch.

Saturday night and Sunday we spent with the First Baptist Church of Iranduba. Iranduba is a recent village that still lacks water and electricity. We had 58 in Sunday School. Marivaldo Alves Natario is the pastor.

Thus, brethren, we have shared with you our work and labors here in the Amazonas. Any Sunday that we are not preaching elsewhere we are at the 14th of December Baptist Church helping Asa Mark. Also, I make as many visits for the 14th Church as possible.

Please continue to give to the regular fund and to the "Bratcher Building." If enough is given to the Bratcher Building, several buildings we can help to

give to as there are still several of the churches and missions that need to build or rebuild.

May the Lord's richest blessings be upon you as our prayer.

Huanuco, Peru S.A.
December 23 1983

This has been a real busy month with all the rain storms and land slides all over Peru. Also, the terrorists are very active here in the mountains. Several thousand people have been killed.

The Stanton's came to visit us for Thanksgiving and we had a good time with them for several days. When they started to return to Pucallpa there was national bus strike going on so I drove them back to Pucallpa. We had a good trip back to Pucallpa but after that it was

a terrible experience. I drove the Stanton's to the airport in Pucallpa for their return trip to Iquitos and while I was helping them with their luggage and tickets someone broke into the truck and stole my documents and about fifty dollars. After spending two days at the police office reporting the robbery we started back to Huanuco and had to wait 3 days and nights because of land slides.

I had to sleep in the truck and eat when the people brought food to sell. I left Pucallpa Thursday afternoon and arrived back in Huanuco Monday morning at 2 a.m.

The following Thursday I left Huanuco to teach in our Bible Institute in Tingo Maria and again I had to sleep all night because of another land slide only five minutes from Tingo Maria. I taught my classes and returned back to Huanuco to find that the next morning there would be a demonstration against the US for the trouble in Granada.

December 12-13th we closed out our first semester here in Huanuco and December 15-16th we finished our semester in Tingo Maria. We have had a good semester at both places.

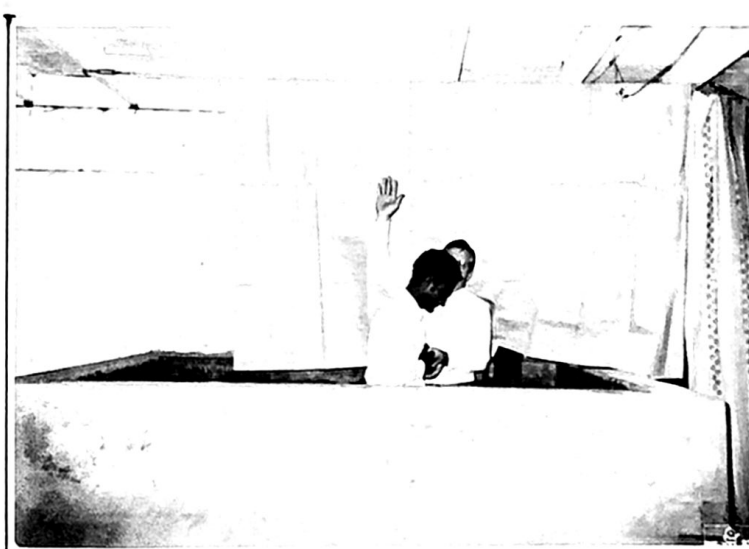
December 17th we drove to San Juan and stayed at the mission house Saturday night and I preached Sunday morning for the church there. The brethren were encouraged because there had not been a missionary to preach for them since 1980. But, I assured them that they would not be forgotten. We had dinner with the family that takes care of the farm (about 70 acres).

After dinner we drove to Pucallpa arriving in time for the evening service where I preached to a good crowd of folks at the Faith Baptist Church.

The Stanton's thought they would be in the house by the time that we arrived here but we are still painting and fixing things where they may be able to move in by Monday.

Last night I preached the graduation message to about 500 people, at the school in Pucallpa. We ask every one to consider our needs here in Huanuco. We need to finish the roof and 13 rooms for the institute and Sunday school. For \$300.00 we can finish a room ready to use with door, plastered walls, cement floors windows and lights installed. We appreciate your prayers and support that make our ministry here in Peru possible.
