



Greetings once again in the name of Jesus from Peru. Hope everything there is going well for everyone. The family and 1 are well and in good health. The work on the house and property here continues daily. There is going

health. The work on the house and property here continues daily. There is still a lot more to do but I hope to finish in another month or so. We do appreciate each one that has given toward our building fund and hope that more will take on this project to help us.

We plan to start our Bible Institute the first of April. The people in the churches here seem to be getting anxious to get started, but I know that once the routine of daily study gets started that a lot of the enthusiasm will wear away. But please remember to pray for the churches here, because they are in such need of encouragement and teaching of God's Word. Please remember the Baptist Book translation Fund, in order that we can have good teaching materials for our Institute.

I visit the different churches each week and preach and teach. Last Sunday I went with one of the men from our home church here on a river trip to visit the church in the village of San Fransisco. He said he knew exactly where the village was located. Well, he did know where the village was but he didn't know hwere to get off on the bank. As a result of this lack of knowledge we got off in the wrong spot and had to

wade through a swamp about twenty yards with water up to our thighs. I believe there were more mosquitos in that twenty yards of swamp than anywhere else in Peru: they were quite sufficient. That was the first time I can ever remember preaching with water in my boots, and I've been preaching for twelve years now. However, we had a good service and the folks there were just great. We had lunch with the pasto: and then went down to wait for a boat back hon. .: We waited until dark and decided that no boats were coming. So we went back and had services again with the church that night and then slept under a mosquito net on the floor in the Pastor's house. Five-thirty the next morning we got a boat back and arrived at the house at eight just in time to let the workers in and start work. I hope to add this church at San Fransisco to my itenerary of visiting churches. This means that I will be going there every fifth or sixth Sunday. There are numerous small villages on the river within one or two hours of Pucallpa that have no type of church at all. There is a great need to reach these people with the gospel of Jesus. Maybe in the near future we could obtain a small boat and work these villages with some of our national preachers. Maybe someone has a boat and motor in good shape and would be willing to donate it to the work here. We could arrange shipping. Anyway, it's something to pray about. Right now we have plenty to keep us busy but if God supplies this need of a boat then we will certainly make time to go and preach to these people.
