Inflation Over 210% Makes Mission Finances Difficult . . . Working In 6 Cities In Southern Brazil . . . Several Saved . . . Tremendous Importance of Transportation Ministry Catholic Church Fights The Work

Garca, Sao Paulo, Brazil
June 22, 1984
"The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want."
Under any and all conditions this is the affirmation of the one who trusts in Christ. During the last year inflation in Brazil was over 210%. Minimum salary rose 100%. Some shoes that cost \$9 nine months ago are costing \$25. Mission outreach certainly becomes more difficult under such conditions. Your prayers and support are needed.

Our work here in the southern part of Brazil is reaching six cities and towns. In three the work is progressing and in the others it is not. Attendance is growing in Duartina and this month there were five or six professions of faith.

The night attendance in the Garca church has

grown, especially adult attendance. Last Sunday night there were nine persons who made professions of faith. Six were adults. Three persons have made professions of faith in their homes. These have attended the services also.

Our transportation ministry is being blessed of the Lord. Many adults are attending the night services. It might interest you to know that when there is an attendance of 200 in Sunday School there are only two families present who possess automobiles. When a night service has 125 persons present there will not be more than two families who come in cars. Reason: The people do not have cars.

At present there is an organized effort on the part of the Catholic church to stop children from coming to our church. They are pressuring the people like you would not believe. The opposing forces have never worked harder here in Garca than at the present. And by God's grace we are trying to give them plenty to do. Your prayers and your financial support are needed.

Greetings from the land of eternal summer! We thank the Lord for the opportunity that he has given us of being here in Manaus, involved in the work of the 14th of December Baptist Church.

We arrived in Manaus on May 5, at 3 o'clock in the morning. At the airport, we were met by Mom and Dad, plus several other members from the church. That evening, something very special occurred to me. I became officially engaged to Saleth Gomes Nunes, a senior at the University of the Amazonas, and a faithful member of New Bethany Baptist Church. We plan to get married next Spring here in Manaus. Please pray for us as we seek the Lord's will in our lives.

Since I've been here, I've had the privilege of preaching in several churches here in Manaus and in the interior: 14th of December Baptist Church, Rev. Harold Bratcher, pastor; Chapada Baptist Church, Miguel Ibrnon, pastor; New Bethany Baptist Church, presently without a pastor; Faith Baptist Church, Oseas Rodrigues da Silva, pastor; New Jerusalem Baptist Mission Parana da Eva, Edgiberto da Silva Ribeiro, evangelist; and Zion Baptist Church, Manacupuru, Pedro Santarem, evangelist.

Next Sunday, we are to be with Brother Francisco Freitas and the Compensa Baptist Church. We have also been invited to preach at Ebenezer Baptist Church, Dom Pedro Baptist Church, Peniel Baptist Church, and Gethsemane Baptist Church.

Presently, we are working with the mission launch, trying to get it ready for a river journey during the first two weeks of July. We are replacing several rotten boards and broken pieces of glass. To keep the launch in a safe running condition, regular maintenance must be kept. We certainly appreciate any offerings designated towards this.

This has been an uneventful month for us here. Our attendance has stayed about the same as it was last month with some decrease due to much sickness among our people. We are having now about forty in Sunday School and in our Sunday evening services about fifty-five to sixty people present. In Sunday School we are studying the book of Acts and I'm writing lessons for the adult class. I find that this helps the people a lot. For our Bible study on Wednesday night we have been teaching on the Life and Teachings of Christ and then we have a time of prayer.

Last night I was invited to preach at Faith Baptist Church. The church was packed with people with many standing for lack of places to sit. Pastor Candido seems to be doing good with the church

there and the people seem to love him a lot. They are very good to him. When they go to the store to buy their food many of them buy items for him also. They have also bought him a car to use in the work.

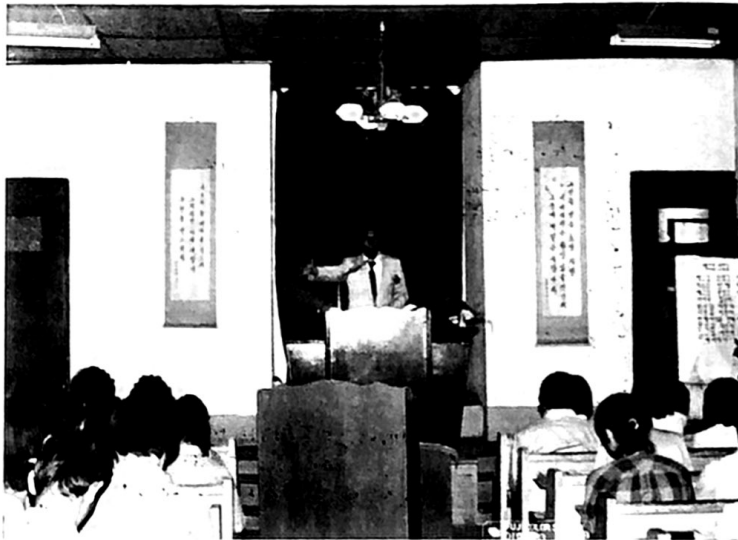

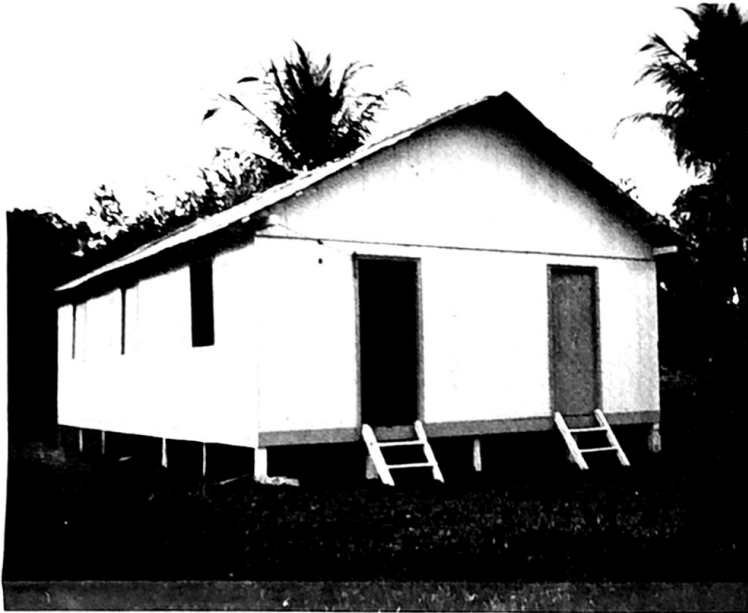

Many Saved . . . 39 Baptized . . . Over 700 In 55th Anniversary Service . . . Report On Works Visited During The Month . . . Mechanical Hindrances

June 11, 1984
For almost three months we have been having people saved in every Sunday service at First Baptist Church. We have even had several saved in our Wednesday night services, which are used mostly for teaching doctrine. Last month alone we had over 20 people to be saved. We had not had a baptism service yet this year, so on one Sunday night I was privileged to baptize 39. Monica and Andrew were among those baptized.

On May 12 our church had her 55th anniversary. The special service was held on Saturday night. There were over 700 people in attendance. On the same night the church licensed 13 of our preachers. We had never done this before, so many of these are our already experienced men who have been serving for some time. It is great to know however that besides these 13 we have sent out five others to work in other churches. Best of all though we had 3 more people trusting Christ in the anniversary service.

During the same month, among all the other excitement, I performed a wedding and a funeral. There were many people to hear God's Word for the first time in both of these services. The funeral was for a young man from our Church who was in an auto accident. There were many of his classmates in the service. In all there were over 600 people to attend.

I have been able to visit the following churches

this month: Mourapiranga, Lagoinha, Faith, and Mancio Lima. The church at Mourapiranga is rather weak at this time, so I went to visit them twice on Sunday mornings. I was with the church at Lagoinha on a Wednesday and both services on a Sunday. They are still doing pretty good. They are not quite as excited as they have been, but their Pastor, Brother Wilson, is a hard worker and is doing a good job. He just came back from an 8 day trip to the Rio Liberdade. They have two congregations in that direction. Both groups have built their own buildings. I visited the church at Japiim on a Sunday night. They asked me to baptize 9 candidates for them.

Our men have been out and busy. It has been very difficult though. Two of our outboard motors had gear failure within a week. We don't know why and are all quite disappointed. This week end we spent as much on gasoline as with the outboards and still had to go in canoes and rent them besides. It also takes 3 or 4 times more time and effort. An estimate from the parts store says these parts will cost over \$1,000.00. Pray for our preachers and our work in this difficult time.

Beverly is in the States at this time for some minor surgery and to visit her folks. The children are all here with me. We have been spending a lot of our time working at camp. We are all staying very busy and having a lot of fun. Bev should be back next week and we are all excited about that.
