Directions To Grace Baptist Church, 2920 Beaver Valley Road, Fairborn, Ohio

From the north on I-75 to I-70. Go east on I-70 9 1/2 miles to I-675 (the only way you can go) six miles to exit 20 which is Dayton-Yellow Springs Road (well marked on large signs) at end of exit ramp turn left and go one mile to Beaver Valley Road. Turn left on Beaver Valley Road one mile to the church's driveway and turn left and up the hill to church parking lot.

From the North on I-71 to I-70. Go west on I-70 to I-675 and south on I-675 the same as above directions.

From east to west on I-70, exit onto I-675 and then same as directions above.

From the south on I-75 take Route 4 Exit in Dayton.

From Route 4 take Route 444 Exit.

From Route 444 turn right on Dayton-Yellow Springs Road.

From Dayton-Yellow Springs Road turn right on Beaver Valley road.

From Beaver Valley Road turn left at the church sign and mailbox.

New Work In Porto Velho Going Well With Fifty Seven Members . . . Many Professions Of Faith In Boa Vista And Manaus . . . Purchase Property Next To Tabernacle Baptist Church . . . Need Help To Pay Off Loan . . . Michelle Saved And Baptized

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, July 29, 1984

The past months have been extremely busy ones. I have spent much of my time in Porto Velho, the capital of a neighboring state where Tabernacle Baptist Church just established a work. Due to various setbacks, the initial work took longer than originally planned, but we are already seeing evidence of the Lord's hand at work.

The new work at Porto Velho now has fifty-seven baptized members. During the last 10 days, David Hatcher co-ordinated a special evangelistic outreach resulting in 70 professions of faith. This work was performed by 15 youth workers who traveled to Porto Velho financed by their own efforts. Please continue to pray for this work.

During the first part of this month, a 10-day evangelistic campaign at the young church in Boa Vista yielded 100 professions of faith. I spent three days in this campaign and the remainder of the work was carried on by 4 Seminary students.

Here in Manaus, the Tabernacle Baptist Church and Seminary students have been carrying on a number of special services in various outlying areas of town. We have seen 150 saved through these special services. We have also begun establishing home Bible studies in various parts of town to help develop young Christians more quickly. These special programs are being led by Seminary students. I am very excited about the impact of all these ministries.

An additional blessing this month has been the purchase of property neighboring our present church property. This plot which has been greatly needed for expansion was purchased for \$23,000.00. Three years ago the owner was asking \$63,000.00. The church and school had been trying to buy this property for 20 years. Once again, God provides!

The purchase of the above mentioned property required a short-term loan of \$21,000.00. Perhaps the Lord would lead you or your church to designate a special offering toward meeting this need. I believe

that the evidence of God's blessings that we have already shared with you indicate that your offerings will bear fruit.

And now, I would like to share the greatest blessing I have received this month. Our youngest daughter, Michelle, was saved and baptized this month. We are profoundly grateful to God for saving all three of our children.

God is Good!!

We thank the Lord for all of you who so faithfully give to make this work possible. Great is your reward in Heaven!

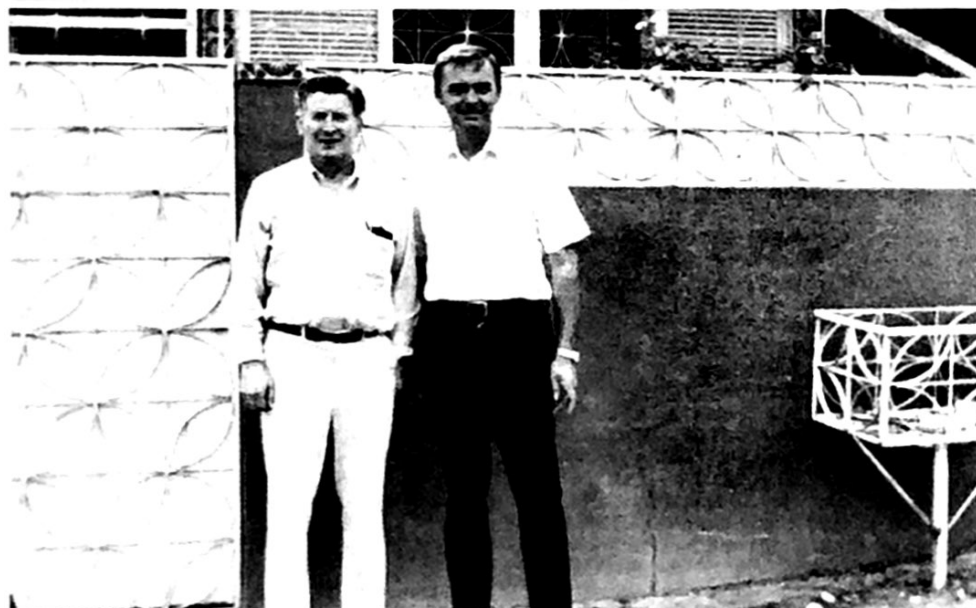

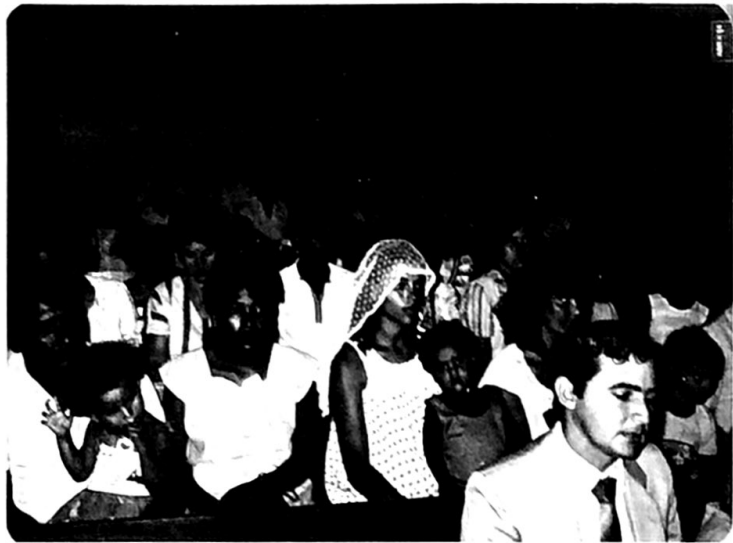

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior. The past month has been an extremely busy month for us here in Pucallpa. We were very privileged to have a group of twelve visitors from Kentucky. Brother and Sister Kenneth White, Brother and Sister Phillip Prather and family, and Brother and Sister Alex Hensley, all from the Ashland Avenue Baptist Church in Lexington. Also, with the group was Pastor Richard Adams of the Lynams Creek Baptist in Beattyville, and three others from the church there. They brought us some very much needed items for the mission work here. A hearty thanks to each one that had a part, especially the Ashland Avenue Baptist Church which purchased most of the equipment. The group was a real blessing to us and we hope that they received a blessing by being with us and by seeing a part of our mission work here.

We had good services in the Mission work in Tournavista this past month. We took the group from Lexington out to our work on the river the 17th. They

were a real blessing to the people there and we had one saved and one man rededicated his life to the Lord and asked to be reinstated into the church. We have several to baptize in this work now. We took a trip to a new site in the jungle to acquire property to start a new mission work in the next year. This site is under construction now, being planned for a new city about four hours from Pucallpa. There are only two houses in the area at this time and we should receive approval in six to eight months to receive our property. Pray about this work for the future; we will need help in construction. We traveled to Aucayacu on the ninth and had a service with them on Sunday morning the 10th. One was saved and eight came forward rededicating their lives to the Lord. We made plans to return to Aucayacu for a Revival meeting. On the 24th we went to San Juan and preached in the morning and two came forward wanting to be baptized and join the church. We baptised two after the service in the Rio Chio. After this we drove on to Aucayacu to start the revival meeting. We had more and more visitors each night. No one was saved during the meeting but the gospel was preached each night to many for the first time.

We appreciate each one for your prayers and support. Until next month, may God continue to bless as you remain faithful to Him.

Dear Brethren,

During the past few weeks I have been able to get out to visit the works in the interior more than last month, while Bev was away. I was with the church at Lagoinha twice. The church is doing well. They had a little trouble at the congregation at Campinas. The brethren there are very young believers and a charismatic had been trying to move in. The pastor, Brother Wilson, helped them to solve the problem. I also visited Calvary Baptist. The church there is still doing fine. A few more have been saved. Besides these 2 churches I was at two of our congregations, one older, one very new. The newer one is at Sao Domingos. There have been several professions of faith. The most recent to be saved was the patriarch of the village. This man built the Catholic chapel there. Since many have been saved the priest has already taken his god. The priest did not come back to hold their annual carnival this year. It even looks like that chapel may become our meeting

place! I went just last week to visit the congregation at Pentecostes. If you are wondering about the name of this place, it is the name of a large stream where the village is located. Since the Jeep was being used by some of our other preachers I had to go on my motorcycle. It rained for 2 hours on several kilometers of that already muddy and hilly road. It was extremely difficult to persuade the bike to stay with me and keep going. The trip was worth it though. The services were well attended and one lady was saved.

The work here in town is doing pretty good too. Just last Sunday there were 3 more professions of faith. Our largest crowd for Sunday School this month was 269. The open air services which our preachers hold in several locations around town are producing some results. There were at least 2 people saved in services that I attended. Sometimes there are 2 or 3 of these meetings going on simultaneously in as many different locations. I don't attend many of these services, but when I do the men try to get me to preach. I don't though, because I want this to continue to be their ministry.

May God bless you all. Thanks to all who support this work with your prayers and possessions.

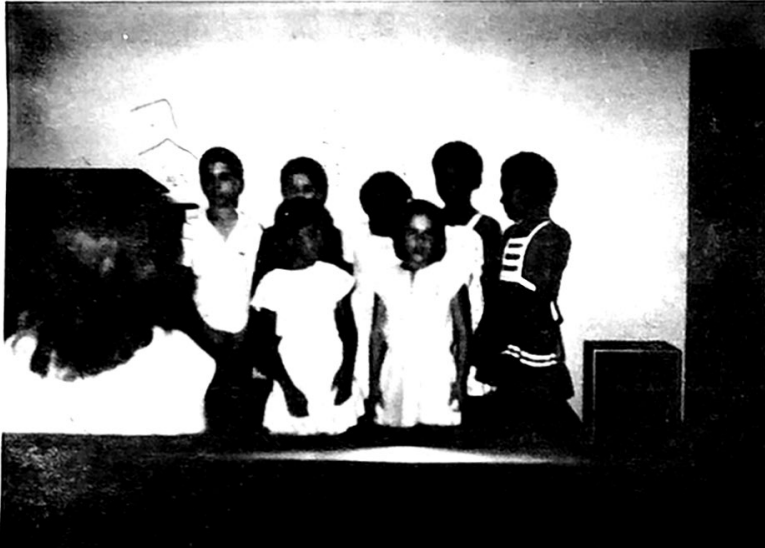

We want to thank all of you who are praying for Mrs. Bratcher's recovery from her heart attack last month. Marie is better but is still taking three kinds of medicine daily - walking twenty minutes each morning - doing less house work and less eating all because of the doctor's orders. Continue to pray for her recovery.

The Lord continues to bless us here in the "land of eternal summer." Sunday, July 15th marked the end of twenty-five years of service for the Lord as B.F.M. missionaries here in "Brasil." We praise the Lord for his goodness and grace without which we would never have been able to continue on during these 25 years.

The work continues at about the same pace at the 14th of December Baptist Church. Sunday, the 8th we had 464 in Sunday Bible School - the largest attendance in several weeks. Our Sunday night attendance is running less than half of our Sunday School attendance. Pray for Dona Maria Ferreira Lima, 73 years old, who is still in a state of shock after being hit by a car, crossing a street, on her way home after services on Sunday night, July 1st.

Stephen is still with us. I've asked him to complete this letter with a brief report of his trip to the interior this month.

new building at the New Jerusalem mission in November - the Lord willing.
