The Story Of Some Young Missionaries From Garca Brazil . . . Thirty Professions Of Faith . . . Eight Years Of Blessing . . . Your Help Needed For Future

Dear Brethren,
Garca, Sao Paulo, Brazil
August 10, 1984

On July 22, Alta and I left Garca, after the Sunday night services, with seven young people from the Garca church to spend a week in the city of Cornelio Procopio. The bus was loaded with baggage, extra blankets, winter clothing, boxes of equipment, enthusiasm, snacks and goodies for the trip. All the equipment for the week's work was on board: overhead projector with transparencies of Bible stories prepared and drawn by some of the young people, tables, invitations, tripods, flannelgraph boards, blackboards, music instruments.

Not only was the material to be used on board, our program of work and visitation was also with us. We would arrive about 1:30 in the morning, sleep until 8:00 a.m. At 8:00 a.m. two or three would be with me at the radio station to participate in the morning broadcast. At eight-thirty we would have breakfast and then be out to visit until noon.

Best of all seemed to be the fact that all of the young people, with the exception on one, had been saved and baptized in the work here in Garca. Let me tell you a little about each one. Ricardo Fujikawa, is of Japanese descent and was the first to trust Christ in his family. He is talented in music and very dedicated to what he does. Renate and Rose Mari are of German descent. They lost their two brothers and father when the car they were in ran into a river. Hudson is the son of Helena, our adopted daughter. Hudson's father and older brother were killed in the same auto accident about four years ago. Rosily is the daughter of a Methodist family. When she was saved in our church and was baptized there was no small

stir. Luciana is the oldest child of four in the first complete family to be members of the church here. Carlos is the oldest of the group, 19 years of age, but the youngest christian.

It was a cold howling wind which met us as we got off the bus in Cornelio. On Monday afternoon there were 52 young people present at 2:30 for Bible School. There over 100 the next three days and 95 on the last day. Our night services had 35 the first night and then rose to over 75 and 80 for the remainder of the week.

During the week there were over thirty persons who made professions of faith. Everyone worked without stopping during the entire week. After the night services on Friday night we loaded and returned to Garca. During the week our bus was used to bring the young people to the afternoon Bible School and the adults and families at night.

At the end of eight years here in Sao Paulo there are now permanent works in two States, four large cities, two smaller cities reached with bus ministry. Three cities have permanent buildings and one has a rented building. As you all know, I am sure, all funds for buildings have to be raised by the missionary and must be designated for that particular project. Some money has been borrowed from the Regular Fund and this has to be repaid as is possible. Presently, the New Works for which I am responsible owe the Regular Fund \$4,130. With all properties clear in the new works this is the only indebtedness. Would you like to help us liquidate this amount so we could feel free to begin work in another State? The work will go forward, new works will be started. How efficiently they will be done and how soon they can be done, in a large part, depends on your help.

How long has it been since you personally gave a special offering to reach new places with the Gospel for the glory of God?

This semester, for the first time, the Lexington Baptist College is starting a Missions Major. I am excited to see what God is going to do through this needed program.



Report On Various Works . . . Several Saved . . . Needs For The Works Listed . . . Looking To Begin New Work In Pucallpa

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
Greetings in Jesus name once again. We trust the Lord's blessings continue to abide with each of you. Anita, the children and I are all in good health and continue to be blessed.

All of the works here continue about the same. La Iglesia de Libertad and their good pastor continue to do a good job. La Iglesia de Gracia in San Fernando are still doing well also. The mission in Tournavista is growing little by little. I baptized two in San Juan last month and ask your prayers for this work. They are not very many but they are faithful in attendance. However, they are lacking a great deal in doctrinal teaching and have never been taught to sing the hymns properly; as a result, the services are very disorganized. It takes three hours to reach this church over a road that really beats our car badly. After every trip I have car repairs. We can help this work in a better way if we had a little equipment. We could use a small portable generator that cost about \$400.00 here. We could use a small electric piano or organ (portable), or an accordion if someone has one to donate. Also, a portable P.A. System which cost around \$200.00 here. We can certainly

continue to work without these things, but I believe we could do a much better job with them. These things we can also use in the other works that we are helping. The church on the Ucayali River in the Pueblo of San Francisco is doing real well at this time. They have had several to return to the church in reconciliation and they have eight to baptize at this time. I will be baptizing two of these this coming Sunday. The others are awaiting legal papers so they can be legally married. One material request for this church: Pastor Adolfo Saurino has acquired a giant log and is in the process of making a large boat that will carry around thirty people. However, we need a motor to use for this boat. He has asked me if I would help in this and I said yes. A suitable motor for this type of boat will cost about \$400.00 here. Will you help me help them? This boat will be used to bring others from pueblos up and down the river to the church services in San Francisco. I guess we could call it a "River Bus". The boat will be ready soon and we need the motor; pray about it!

We are looking for suitable property to start another work here in another section of Pucallpa. If the Lord continues to bless soon we will be working in a new work. The equipment mentioned above will be used in this work also. Please pray about these things and help if you can, God will bless you for it. Until next month, may God continue to bless each one.

On the 24th of July the 14th of December Baptist Church celebrated the 24th anniversary of her organization. We had some 380 people present that night. Our annual report showed that we gained by baptism 34 - by letter and restoration 13. Total - 47. Our losses were 78 by exclusion six by letter and one by death for a total of 85. Thus we had a net loss of 38, reducing our membership from 704 to 666. Pray for us that the church will this year show a net gain and not a net loss.

This last Sunday was observed as "Youth Day." We had 483 present in Sunday School - The largest attendance since I became pastor this time - the last of April.

We rejoice to report that Marie is still improving. She is, Doctor's orders, to continue taking three kinds of medicine and her daily exercises. Pray for her complete healing.

This time, however, let me share the lives of some very special people - my family. Wanda, who shares all of these victories with me, works as principal of our kindergarten and works along with me with young marrieds, and most of all is mother to our three children.

Leigh Anne, our oldest daughter, is now almost ten years old. Leigh trusted the Lord when she was five years of age. She studies in American school in the morning and in Brazilian school in the afternoon. She also helps in the preschool department in one of our Sunday schools.

Judson, who is seven years old, also trusted the Lord when he was five. Judson, as well as the girls, speaks Portuguese fluently and has learned to speak English fairly well this last year. He studies in American school.

Michelle just turned five in July. Here's the great blessing of the month. One Sunday night when I had closed the invitation and was dismissing the service, Michelle went to her mother at the organ and said, "Mom, I wanted to tell Daddy that I accepted Jesus. She had been asking questions for a few weeks, getting the ideas of her sin, what that had to do with Christ's death, and how to trust Him. She made a very clear profession of faith and I baptized her a week later. She studies kindergarten here at our school and is learning to speak English.

Porto Velho update - A group of fifteen youth from Tabernacle Baptist Church, trained in personal evangelism, raised money and went to Porto Velho three weeks ago. Our newest mission was started there in July. Over a ten day period, they saw near seventy people trust Christ as savior. Seventeen of these were baptized before they returned to Manaus. The new mission now has over fifty baptized members.

Since our last letter we have had our Thanksgiving Conference; it was really great.

We brought the benches from Zion Baptist and used every Sunday school Bench and borrowed chairs and still many had to stand.

People had to sleep on benches and some on the floor but I believe everyone enjoyed the conference.

Brothers Sheridan Stanton and family, Paul Mulling and wife, Fortunato and family, his tow brothers and their families plus three families from Tingo Maria all slept up on the second floor with us.

I have been sick for over a month. I have bronchitis plus a severe ear infection caused by a fungus in my ears. I went back to Lima last week and the doctor says as soon as the sinus infection and the

As soon as possible we will be working on the building in Progresso. We have not been able to get there because of the terrorists. Yesterday 500 soldiers arrived in Tingo Maria and 300 more are to arrive today. They will be trying to clear out the terrorists while the special police will be fighting the drug traffic there and the rest of the jungle where the terrorists and drug traffic are.

Things have changed some since we came home in January. Before we could fly directly from Miami to Iquitos, we now have to go from Miami to the Grand Caymans Island and from there to Lima, Peru and the next day to Iquitos. A simple four and a half hour flight has been turned into a two day ordeal. Anyone want to go? We have had some problems in working out shipping arrangements for the tools and equipment that we are taking back but I think now that has been worked out. We will have to pay about \$2,000.00 for shipping charges and have borrowed

Dear Friends,
Another month has gone past so quickly. We hope each one is doing well and being blessed of the Lord. The family and I are all doing well and continue to be blessed. The Lord is so good to us. Three weeks ago we had the great privilege of baptizing seven into the church at San Francisco on the River.

There are five more adults still waiting until they can be legally married. The work there is growing. The other churches continue about the same. We returned from Huanuco a few days ago. While there we had a good conference with Brethren from several Baptist Churches around Peru. I was asked to speak during the week on the Subject of "The Holy Spirit". It was a real blessing to have had a part in this conference and to have had some time with the Crains.

I've not been able to go to San Juan in a while due to car problems. I'm doing good to drive around town right now and can't take any trips in the car until I get it corrected. Pray about the car situation, it is going to cost several hundred dollars to get it fixed.

I have several possible buildings that we have located for the new Mission site and Bible Institute. Once we acquire a building then we are going to need money to build benches and tables. Will you help? We

would like to have a piano or accordion to help in the services. A portable P.A. system would also be a big help. There are many things needed and so little time. Souls are passing into eternity every second without Christ. The Saints in the Churches here need to be taught the Word of God in a systematic, and intensive level. We need your help here in Peru. Anita and I thank each one of you for your prayers and support and ask that you continue to do so. May the Lord continue to bless as you remain faithful to Him.
