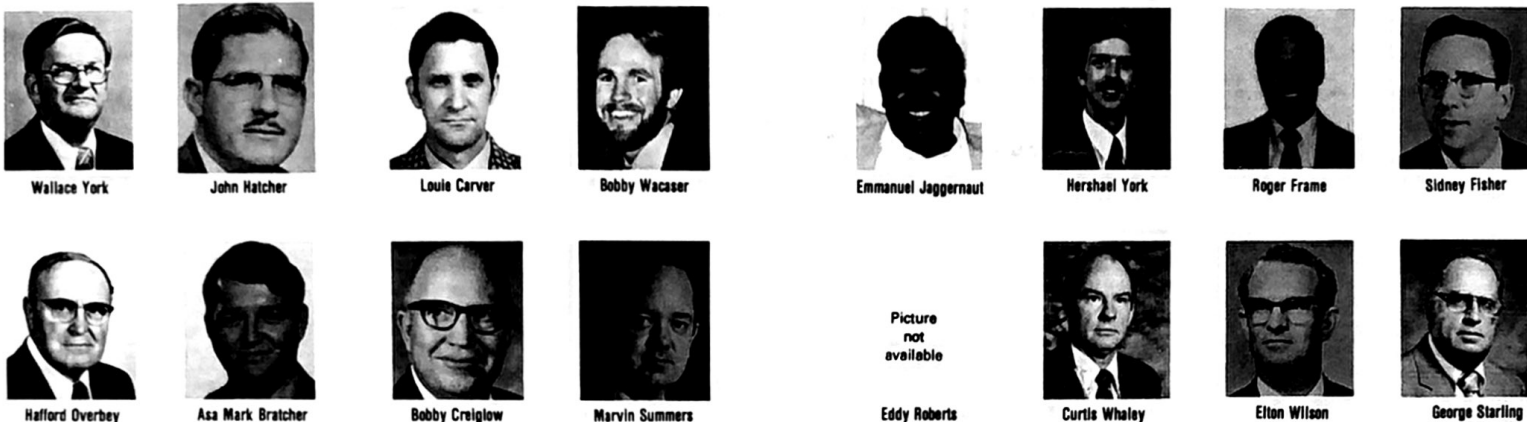

In a couple of months our annual Thanksgiving Conference will be here. Our slogan of EVEN MORE IN EIGHTY-FOUR has been a reality as a whole; thanks to God and to you through whom He has given.

### Eight Baptized And Five Awaiting Baptism . . . Two New Workers . . . The Economic Condition In Brazil And The Need For Help To Build

Dear Brethren,  
September 7, 1984  
This has been a good month. We baptized 3 into our church. The church at Sao Mateus baptized 5 and have another 5 awaiting baptism. They have on their own built a small house behind the church for a parsonage. The present pastor has his own house. But he is 75 years old and will soon be leaving, perhaps in another year.

We have a new worker in Anajatuba. He receives an offering from the church and also works. My tithe and offerings are used in the mission work of the church and the church pays its own expenses for water, lights, tracts, etc. Brethren, people here have an extremely hard time just to eat at times. I don't know how they endure it at times. The economy here is in a mess. Inflation is over 200% and wages increase only 90%. They are electing a new president here. They hope he will be able to turn things around. But the Lord only can do that. Our job here is to preach the gospel that offers a way out and a way in. Pray for us that we will be able to reach many souls.

We have a new worker also at the new mission in Anil. He seems to be gaining the confidence of the people. Brethren, the time has come for me to renew my appeal to you for help. We are needing to get started on the church building there. We have a small dwelling house and a lot next to it. We are holding services in the front room of the house. With your help we want to build a church building before coming home on furlough. We plan to come home in about two years. It takes about a year to build if we do it with the believers helping and a minimum of hired help. We would like to leave that work with a building and organized into a church, the Lord willing. We don't know how long we'll be able to stay in this area with Ursula's health problems. Help us in this as the Lord leads. We want to leave the work with the possibility of carrying on by itself. It will have a small house for a worker and he can get employment here in town. The same is not true in the country works.

We are praying the Lord will lay it on someone's heart to come work here. I believe we may have to leave here after this term because of health problems. The doctor has consistently recommended this to Ursula. With the Lord's help we want to hold on until someone comes. The presence of an American missionary is of utmost importance. Our Tithe and offerings actually are the mainstay of the work here financially. Most working men here are presently making about \$40 per month. Even when the

members tithe it does not create much financial capacity. This is the reason we have to have help in building and in the expense of carrying the gospel to new places.

We want to thank all of you for your faithful support. Without it we could not be here. May the Lord bless all of you.

## Observed Great Changes In Brazil During 30 Years . . . Coming Home For Furlough

Dear Friends,  
Alta and I are now into our 30th year in Brazil. God be praised for His marvelous works. When our family arrived in Manaus in 1955 there were 80,000 persons living there. Now the population has increased to about 800,000. Brazil has grown in this proportion in almost all areas. The State of Sao Paulo, where we now live, has 20 million inhabitants. In spite of her external debt and high inflation (250%) Brazil is a great country. She is so great in potential that the Vatican considers her as one of the greatest sources of revenue. Communism also knows the value of Brazil

and continues to make its bid. Of all the countries with doors open to the Gospel none offers the potential of Brazil. Brazil, 120 million population; who will give to help us? who will come to preach?

The Lord willing, Alta and I will be seeing some of you at least during the months of October and November. Our date of arrival in the States is October 4th. During October 9th through 12th we will be with the Emmanuel Baptist Church in Evansville, Indiana. The OUTREACH CONFERENCE of the Emmanuel Church is October 9th through 12th. Some of you we will see at the Thanksgiving Missionary Conference in Warren and Dearborn, Michigan.

Friends, the days go by speedily; our work is great; our financial resources are small; the workers are indeed scarce. Your financial help will help us reach more places and more people.

missions of the Zion Baptist Church in the interior goes well. Last night we travelled for nine hours on the Mission Launch "Assa da Fe," to Bom Intento - Manaquiri. There with Pastor Joao Jose Dias I preached the first anniversary service of the Lamb's Wife Baptist Church. I am teaching an Old Testament course on Tuesdays and Thursdays - 19:10-20:30 to some twenty students at the "Faculdade." Each of the Sundays of this month we have had over 400 in Sunday Bible School.

Now for the news that it seems that we must classify as not so good, perhaps. After missing the services at the 14th of December Baptist Church for around three years - we finally, after repeated visits, persuaded Dona Esmeralda Ferreira Sousa to come back. She came three Sundays in a row and then, it seems, committed suicide. The cause was problems in her home. We also have lost these days some eight by exclusion.

Rejoice with us and weep with us and pray for us. Also, pray for, help and use our sons, Asa Mark (wife and daughter) and Stephen - all in Lexington, KY. They both can be contacted at the address - same address - and telephone number.

May the Lord lead us all is our prayer.

## Four Trips During The Month . . . 29 Professions Of Faith In Chavinillo . . . Able To get Building And Land At Progresso

Dear Brethren,  
Greetings again from the Andes Mountains of Peru, S.A.

This has been another busy month. After our Thanksgiving conference here in Huanuco we have made four trips.

Our first trip was to Lima where I saw the doctor about my ear and said goodbye to our friend and brother, Philip Prather. Phillip touched our door bell August 12 and it was a glad surprise.

Our second trip was to Chavinillo where we have our new work. We had over 100 our first service and since that time we have averaged over 75. We have rented a small house and 75 is all we can get inside. Also, close to Chavinillo there are several small villages and we are now having services in two of them each week. We have had 29 professions of faith in Chavinillo and several want to be baptized. Brother Juan Castro is working in Chavinillo and we plan to move him and his wife there next week. Chavinillo is about 4 hours drive from Huanuco.

Also, we made two trips to Progresso. Progresso is about seven and a half hours drive from Huanuco. The last two hours are very rough. We drove to

Progresso to buy the house and two lots and when we arrived in Progresso they told us the Alcaldo (Mayor) had gone to Tingo Maria so, we had to come back again as he was the only person who could sign the transfer of the property. Finally, we got that done and the owner of the land gave us another large tract of ground in the contract. In all we have 2220 square meters. We bought the house and land for \$926.00.

Our fourth trip was to Pucallpa for the anniversary of Faith Baptist Church. Very little was said about the faithful service of Del and Ada Mayfield. So, as the services went on I thought of them and thanked God that they had left their footprints in the sand. We enjoyed being with the Stantons and having fellowship with them. While in Pucallpa I visited the other Baptist churches we have there.

Remember me as I travel and have to leave my family here in Huanuco. The rest of this month and next will be many more miles to travel and preach.

 Since writing last month we have had our worse cold spell of this winter. It caught everyone by surprise and we about froze. Over six thousand head of cattle perished here in the state of Mato Grosso from the cold. The cold came on the weekend and so as a result we had our lowest number of people in Sunday Morning Services since returning to the field in 1981. There were only 18 people present that Sunday in the morning. Now things are back to normal and our attendance has come back up.  
 We are having a visitation campaign at this time in order to encourage the people to invite others to the services. This past Sunday we had first time visitors in both services with promises that they would come again. We are trying for 60 people in the morning services by the end of this month.  
 The man we reported saved last month has not been faithful and his wife has just about quit coming also. We visited her and found out that her husband is giving lots of problems at home. We have not been able to see him but we plan to. Pray for him as the devil is after him to join an organization that would keep him out of the church, since we will not baptise

We have been having our "coldest" weather this past week. For the last few days we have had bright blue skies, totally cloudless. The temperatures are in the lower 60's at night and lower 80's in the daytime. It has been a real treat to us. Don't you wish you could serve the Lord in paradise?
