## Four Trips During The Month . . . 29 Professions At Chavinillo And Good Attendance . . . Obtain Land At Progresso . . . Report On Pucallpa Trip

Dear Brethren,  
Greetings again from the Andes Mts. of Peru. S.A. This has been another busy month. After our Thanksgiving conference here in Huanuco we have made four trips.

Our first trip was to Lima where I saw the doctor about my car and said good-bye to our friend and brother, Philip Prather. Philip touched our doorbell Aug. 12 and it was a glad surprise.

Our second trip was to Chavinillo where we have our new work. We had over 100 our first service and since that time we have averaged over 75. We have rented a small house and 75 is all we can get inside. Also, close to Chavinillo there are several small villages and we are now having services in two of them each week. We have had 29 professions of faith in Chavinillo and several want to be baptized. Brother Juan Castro is working in Chavinillo and we plan to move him and his wife there next week. Chavinillo is about 4 hrs. drive from Huanuco.

Also, we made two trips to Progresso. Progresso is about 7 and a half hours drive from Huanuco. The last two hours is very rough. We drove to Progresso to buy the house and two lots and when we arrived in Progresso they told us the Alcalde (Mayor) had gone to Tingo Maria so, we had to come back again as he was the only person who could sign the transfer of the property. Finally, we got that done and the owner of the land gave us another large tract of ground in the contract. In all we have 2220 square meters. We bought the house and land for \$926.00.

Our fourth trip was to Pucallpa for the anniversary of Faith Baptist Church. Very little was said about the faithful service of Del and Ada Mayfield. So, as the services went on I thought of them and thanked God that they had left their footprints in the sand. We enjoyed being with the Stantons and having fellowship with them. While in Pucallpa I visited the other Baptist churches we have there.

Remember me as I travel and have to leave my family here in Huanuco. The rest of this month and next will be many more miles to travel and preach.

Aren't you glad that you were born in America, that God has saved you, and that you are joyfully on your way to Heaven? God's goodness is so abundant that many times we tend to overlook it.

From the time you receive this letter, there will be about one more month of school remaining in this school year. The school year in Brazil runs from February through November. Recently, in the High School, we had a great Evangelistic Rally. About 70 of our students were saved. These are growing rapidly and seeing their spiritual growth is exciting. A number of these have been baptized, but some have been unable to get baptized due to opposition by their parents.

We have also received very good news from the new work started this year in the city of Porto Velho. They have just concluded a series of evangelistic meetings and had 3 or 4 saved. Brother Candido, one of our Seminary graduates who pastors in the state of Mato Grosso, was the evangelist. There were already 55 baptized believers in this new work. You may recall that it was in this work that we had such difficulty in late spring and early summer because of malaria. Besides those who have been saved and baptized in this work, there are a few who have come by letter. We thank God for this very obvious growth and solid base at this new work (only 4 months old).

Here at our home church, we continue to train the Seminary students. We have expanded our church ministries in a number of areas. We are excited about the expansion to our home church as well as the additional training that is being received by our Seminary students. We recently had a camp for couples only. The results were very good. The growth of the adult segment of our church in recent weeks and months has been phenomenal. We thank God for this numerical and spiritual growth.

We have also had a couple of marriages and several deaths during this past month. These are reminders that life goes on and that time is running out. We thank God that He has placed us here to serve and to be a part of the great Ministry of Reconciliation. I hope that you are as excited about what God is doing here as we are. Don't forget to thank the Lord.

One of the greatest immediate needs is to pay off the property that we have purchased next door to the church. We desperately need the room for expansion. The price was \$21,000. Will you help?

We do thank God for each of you who have a part in this ministry. Without you we could not continue. Not that God is unable but that God has chosen to work through you. May the Lord richly bless you. Pray for us as we minister for the Lord in Brazil.

## Report On Camps . . . Several Saved . . . Work At Guajara Improving . . . Inflation Pressing On The Work

In September we held 2 camps. The first was held the first week of the month for Christians. During this camp we taught w courses on personal evangelism and one on door to door visitation. Having our new pastor Brother gilmar and 2 of our seminary students, Joao and Manuel, back from Manaus to help, made this camp one of the most efficient we have ever had. The last week of the month we took a larger group, including many lost folks, to camp. The main thrust of this last camp was for our people to witness to their lost friends that they invited.

We now have about 15 people working in our visitation program again. They are doing a good job. Attendance here at First Baptist has been over 300 the last few Sundays. Last Sunday we had 330. I don't know exactly how many were saved this month, since I was away quite a bit. I do know that there were 6 saved in both services Sunday.

The work at Guajara has been improving. A few more have been saved and attendance has been in the 70's. The other works are also doing well.

I have been to visit the congregation at Pentecostes again. In fact I tried to go there 3 times before I finally made it. This village can not be reached by river in the dry season and is difficult to reach in the rainy season. It is a little easier by road in the dry season, but not much. They have a preacher there, who came from Barao some years ago. Lord willing next month we will organize the new Church there.

Our church has taken on the support of another worker this month. Brother Joao, who just came back from seminary in Manaus, will be working full time in 2 areas. On each full weekend, Friday, Saturday and Sunday, he will be working at Rodrigues Alves to try to rejuvenate that church which is very weak right now. On week days he will be working with young converts.

Just last month we took on a full time pastor. This month we have put on another new worker. We also help our seminary students monthly. Besides these new loads our church buys a fair portion of the fuel for the mission work. Inflation continues to hover around 200% and our national debt is perhaps the largest of the developing nations. We have not been able to finish our building. In fact we have not been able to build more pews, which we need desperately. We are going for missions though!

Most of you know that we have a private, Christian school here in Pucallpa, and it takes a lot of time and energy to keep it running. I personally beg your prayers for this great work of which I have charge. This year alone we have close to four hundred and fifty students and at times it seems like four Million.

We appreciate your prayers for the Faith Baptist Church here in Pucallpa. It looks as though things will be improving soon. There are still many problems and we continue to ask your prayers for this church. We have a great God and In Him we are trusting!

The Brethren at San Francisco are still preparing the boat to use as our "River Bus". However at this time I have not received word of the first offering sent to help in this project. The people living in the river villages are lost souls that need to hear the precious gospel of Jesus; we have people willing to go and preach, but we are short the means to go. Won't you please help us in this? Also I've not received word about any offerings sent to help get the new work started in town. What can I say? except that the field is white unto harvest here in Peru, won't you help? May our Lord bless each one for your help and your prayers. Greetings from the Andes mountains. In my last letter I had been sick for several weeks but, thank the Lord I am much better now.

The first of October I was in Pucallpa with the Stantons and while I was there I had some car trouble, but, finally got it fixed until I could get back to Huanuco.

After getting back from Pucallpa we had to go to Lima to get our carns renewed for two years. We had a terrible time as most of the offices in Lima were on strike. It took us ten (10) days of standing in line every day to get this done. We are thankful that is now over and we have two years before we have to do it again.

CHAVILILLO - The work in Chavilillo is doing great. We have 36 to baptize as soon as I can set a date to go back there. We plan to go this Friday but we will not have time to announce the baptism and get all the people together. Brother Juan Castro is working there and is doing a very good job.

PAUCAR - is a small town about one hour and a half from Huanuco and we have several to baptize there. We have the promise of the town and we hope to start building soon as they meet in a small room of a believer's house. This is where the Brother works that walks four and a half hours to study in our Institute.

PROGRESSO - we have bought the house and land there and we hope to get back there as soon as possible to start the building.
