Some have asked about our furlough policy. It is: (1.) New Missionaries spend 3 years on the field and then receive a 1 year furlough. (2.) After the first 3 year term the missionary stays 4 years on the field and then receives a 1 year furlough. (3.) Transportation is paid and a house is provided to live in while home for those mentioned in points 1 and 2. (4.) If a missionary wants to come home sooner than a house is not provided nor transportation paid. If a mission house is vacant then he can live in it provided it doesn't interfere with the regular furlough house schedule. (5.) the furlough year runs from July 1 to June 30. (6.) If a person decides to only stay a few months or any time less than the full year then the time not used for furlough does not accumulate for future use. (7.) Emergency stays in the U.S.A. will be decided on a case by case basis as far as paying transportation and housing. If a missionary can not leave the field according to the schedule then it will be treated as an emergency. This policy was agreed on by all missionaries and Directors

One of the greatest ways to help our missionaries is by recommending them. Churches and individuals you know may not know about our missionaries. They may even be looking for sound faithful missionaries. If you give them a *Mission Sheet* and a word of recommendation it may lead to their support of our missionaries and the sending out of new missionaries. Help by prayer, giving and recommending.

Car Fund

Give to help our missionaries have a car. Those who have a good car now won't have one in a year or two or three. We need to give regularly toward this so there will be money when they need a new car. Some need one now. Give to the Car Fund in general or for the car fund of a specific missionary.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
Greetings in Jesus name once again from Pucallpa. The Lord has really been blessing us recently in many ways. Our

Christian school here of which I have charge had its first High School graduation a few weeks ago. There were four students out of the eleven that graduated that have been in our school since kindergarten. I organized a special graduation program for the students and preached to them during the ceremony.

The next day one of the young ladies that graduated and also that had been with the school since its beginning came by our house and asked to talk with us. I witnessed to her personally and she trusted the Lord here in our living room. Her name is Gina Carbajal Torres. Please pray for her. I could only think of the great missionary vision of Brother and Sister Del Mayfield when they started the school many years ago. It started small with only the first few grades, but today it is complete with all grades from kindergarten through High School. I am expecting close to five hundred students next year. Please pray for the Pucallpa Baptist School. We have such an opportunity to reach so many with the gospel with this school. I teach religion classes and preach every Friday in Chapel services. Please pray for our next school year which begins in April. There are alot of repairs and renovations to be done before the opening. Maybe someone would like to designate a special offering to the school in memory of Brother Mayfield. It would be a great way to pay tribute to the memory of a great missionary and man of God that is well remembered and loved here in Pucallpa. The several churches here in Pucallpa and the school are living testimonies of his years of faithful service on the mission field. Think about it and give as the Lord leads. Gina is only one example of so many that have been taught the work of God and touched by the saving gospel as a result of the school. Surely Brother Mayfield is rejoicing in heaven today each time one of these little ones trust the Lord.

I preached last Sunday at the Iglesia Bautista de Gracia, and at the invitation I had ten young people to come forward. They ranged in age from seventeen to seven and all claiming Christ as their Savior. I believe about half of them are really aware of what they are doing, but you never can tell about the others, only the Lord knows. Anyway, we are certainly rejoicing over these. Pray for these young people that they will be used of the Lord in that church. By the way this church was also organized by Brother Mayfield in 1976, and it's still going on today.

The log boat to make our 'river bus' is now ready for the finishing touches. I got word from my parents, who are visiting at this moment with us, that a faithful, christian couple in the States is donating the money to buy a new motor for the boat. I knew that our Lord was going to provide for this need. I didn't

know how, but I knew He would and He did!! Praise the Lord. I hope soon this boat will be bringing people in to the work at San Francisco on the river where they can hear the wonderful, saving gospel of our Lord. The other churches and works here in Pucallpa are all doing well. With the rain that we have the attendance is down in most, but this is always the case at this time of the year. Pray for the works here.

After walking for about a month due to the car being broken down, I have lost some more weight. Sometimes we don't appreciate the things we have until they're taken away from us. I have been able to get the car fixed due to my parents being able to bring me some much needed parts. We're back driving again and soon I will be going back out to San Juan and work with the folks there some more. Let me say thanks again to each one that has had a part in our work here in Pucallpa with your offerings and prayers. It has been such a blessing for Anita, the children and me to have my parents, Ralph and Virginia Stanton, with us for the holiday season. We have had a wonderful time with them, only too short.

We'll close for now asking that each one continue to pray for us in the work here and be sure to mark your offerings for "The Pucallpa School" in memory of Brother Mayfield if the Lord leads you to do so. May God continue to bless each one.

A Great Storm On The River . . . Many Baptized . . . Good Attendance . . . Plans To Build At New Jerusalem . . . Appeal For Help

Manaus, Amazonas
January 15, 1985

On Thursday, December 20th, Mrs. Bratcher and I left Manaus, with four of the Church and the pilot of the launch. We left at 8:30 a.m. and had a good trip until around 10:30 a.m. when we ran into a storm. During the next three hours we felt that the storm had run into us! The boat rocked and rolled. We sang and prayed and I held on to the bench! At 14:20 we ate dinner. That night I preached to 37 at our mission at Novo Remanso. The next day we celebrated the fourth anniversary of the New Jerusalem Baptist Mission. The first part of the service was held on the inside of the building - the sermon was preached by me on the outside to an estimated 200 people present. That afternoon I baptized four. Our return trip the next day was very pleasant and calm.

Sunday, December 30th we were blessed at both services at the 14th of December Baptist Church. Missionary John Hatcher preached at the morning service. Sunday night we had three hundred and seven present. I baptized 18 and one was received by letter and two members made rededications. The next night we held our watchnight service. Almost 400 people were present to greet the new year with us.

We had good services last Sunday with 395 in Sunday School and two professions of faith after the message. Sunday night we had close to 200 and two rededications.

This month of January is Stewardship month in our church. Pray for us that we'll reach our Cr. \$10,000,000 (ten million cruzeiros) budget or goal for each month. In dollars this is almost three thousand dollars.

Last month we made an appeal to help us build a new building at the New Jerusalem Baptist Mission. We are expecting Stephen M. Bratcher, Deacon David Dickerson of Lexington and with them a group of builders. They should arrive around the fifth of February, the Lord willing. If it should please you to do so, send an offering designated for the New Jerusalem building to the treasurer of B.F.M., James Hamilton.

We thank you for giving to Baptist Faith Missions - designated and undesignated offerings - during 1984. May we all give more during 1985. May the Lord bless those of us on the field and those that will soon, the Lord willing, be serving here in Brazil or in other countries.

Many Trips For The Work . . . Many Trials . . . Truck Damaged . . . Death Of A Loved One . . . Facing An Operation . . . Threats By Terrorists And Priest . . . But Many Blessings

Dear Brethren,

Greetings again from the Andes mountains. Since our last letter many things have

happened here in our part of Peru, S.A. December 1st we drove to Pucallpa from Melissa to finish a week of studies, while there we stayed with the Stantons and I preached for the Faith Baptist Church in Pucallpa. After Melissa finished we left the truck with Sheridan to use as his car was being repaired.

December 8th we went to Iquitos to pick up our radio equipment and while there we were with the Gasques and I helped lay brick for the new building in Santa Tomas. I also preached for Brother Gasque in Santa Tomas one Sunday a.m. The following Sunday I preached for the Esperanza Baptist Church and the same night for the First Baptist Church in Iquitos.

December 17th we arrived back in Pucallpa to find that a young man from Pucallpa had wrecked our truck, hitting a cement electrical pole. The front end, bumper, hood, radiator and grill were all smashed in. The grill is in small pieces and now the radiator has to be replaced. We had to wait nine days in Pucallpa. We left December 24 and after driving over an hour the truck began to heat up and I had to get a truck to pull us back to Pucallpa. Finally December 25th about 2:00 p.m. we left for Tingo Maria with diesel fuel still leaking and oil leaking from the valve cover. By stopping every hour and putting in more oil and diesel fuel we arrived in Tingo Maria late the same night. The brethren told us that more people (8) were killed near Tingo Maria the night before.

December 26th we finally arrived in the late afternoon in Huanuco and it was good to be back home.

December 27th my wife received a telegram from our daughter Wanda Malo telling that her sister Mary Evelyn Insko had died, gone to be with the Lord December 26, 2 a.m.

December 31st I preached to a large crowd, both churches here in Huanuco had a service together and asked me to preach. I was the only speaker, but, with a lot of singing from both Baptist Churches. I preached some things we should not forget, and finally what we should forget, our sins when confessed, our failures, our hurts and injuries that come when we serve the Lord. Twenty six people came forward on a simple

invitation and all our hearts were blessed. The following morning (New Years day) I left Huanuco driving nine hours to arrive in Lima before dark. After dropping off the brethren that went with me in several parts of Lima was 10:30 p.m. before I parked the truck and headed for bed for a much needed rest.

January 2, 1985 I started looking for a place to have the automatic transmission rebuilt, so, for ten days Brother Alberto Fabian and I spent our time looking for parts and checking on the mechanics. While I was in Lima I also had a new windshield installed. None of this could be done in Huanuco as there is no place that rebuilds automatic transmissions. The last of this month I have to take the truck back to the mechanic in Lima as the transmission is not right yet. While I am there I will have an operation on my right ear to close a hole caused by a fungus. I have now lost 72 percent of my hearing in my right ear and the specialist says that most of that will come back when the hole is closed in my ear. While in Lima I must have a new radiator core replaced to keep the truck from heating up. The radiator will cost \$125.00. The transmission and windshield cost \$666.00 and I expect the operation over \$300.00 plus I will have to stay in Lima two weeks as an out patient for the ear specialist to check and be sure the ear is healing right before I return to Huanuco.

The road is now open to Progresso so, Monday, January 21st I will leave with about 10 men to put the roof on the building in Progresso.

Today we have completed 2 years here in the Andes, traveled 32 thousand miles, worn out two sets of tires and shock absorbers and now on the third set, but, God has surely blessed in the midst of all the problems. The terrorists have threatened our work (Zion Baptist) saying we must cease services or they will burn the building down. The Priest at Paucar and the people have raised up against us saying they will meet us with rocks and poles if we try to come back across the bridge into Paucar. So far the work is at a standstill as we have to meet further back down the road in a small home.

In Chavinillo the Lord is blessing in a great way. Cesar Tello that I mentioned in another letter has been saved so I have another trip to make real soon back to Chavinillo. Brethren, pray for us and remember to help us with our truck expenses. The truck still has no grill and is not painted yet.

Cruzeiro do Sul, Acre

January 2, 1985

Most people start the new year excited about their hopes and dreams. I just started tired. The past six weeks have been even fuller than before. Work just keeps building up and no relief in sight.

I have visited four of our churches and one congregation recently. Some of our preachers and I helped the church at Maita hold a week long revival meeting. Besides helping the members, there were 6 saved. The theme all week long was love. The night that I spoke there were some brethren who had not spoken to one another for years who were hugging and making things right. I visited Faith Baptist Church last month. It had been almost six months since my last visit. The church is doing very well under Pastor Francisco. Also in December I went to visit the church at Barao and our congregation at Sao Domingos. There were 2 more saved at Sao Domingos and I baptized Brother Damiao, The local patriarch. The visit to Barao was great. Most of the members there are Indians of the Poianaus tribe. The pastor, Brother Mario, is also the tribal chief. The government has been putting the pressure on for

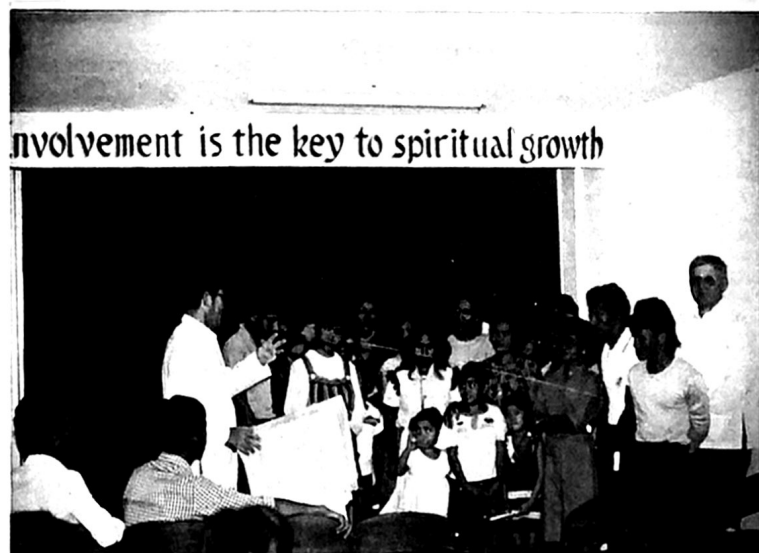
him to preserve tribal customs. Besides their language the only unique custom that is being preserved is a tribal dance and the consumption of large quantities of manioc liquor. I had a good long talk with Brother Mario and although he had been too involved in tribal custom, he had already concluded that is true nationality is above. Last week I visited the church at Lagoinha. They are doing well. Brother Wilson, the pastor, is continuing the work with their four mission points. He baptized 10 at Campinas recently. By the way, all 4 missions have built their own buildings to meet in.

The work here also requires me to do many odd jobs. I don't usually mention these in my letters, but I will this time so that you can better understand the whole job. I spent over 4 days working on the Jeep and panel truck. I also did regular maintenance on the brakes of the diesel pickup that we use at camp. I repaired the engine to the power plant at camp, mowed over 12 acres, repaired plumbing, lighting, reworked (to no avail) our amplifier system as well as many other little jobs. I built 9 more pews, that we have been needing for ages. One week was spent on outboard motor repair. We are still a long way from the specialized missions that some places enjoy. But then what would I do if things were specialized here?

IN THE CHURCH:

Our men traveled by bus and boat to the city of Porto Velho and built a new church building in a neighborhood that had not a fundamental work. Then our youth raised their own money to travel there and put on a 10-day evangelistic campaign, leaving behind 55 baptized adult believers.

Our own adult base here in Manaus was strengthened as we saw 180 adults baptized at our main church, Tabernacle Baptist.

Our ladies are busy and growing spiritually as they teach and disciple the children in 49 auxiliary Sunday School classes all over our city.

Our youth themselves further developed the youth camp by building four new latrines, a new shower and bath facility, and finishing the dormitory. We had two youth camps, and the number of our regular youth grew to 280.

IN THE SCHOOL:

The youth from Tabernacle put on an evangelistic campaign and 87 of the high school

students accepted the Lord as their Savior. Six months later, 35 of these are still very active and growing in their on-campus discipleship groups, in spite of much parental opposition.

IN THE SEMINARY:

Twelve students completed their course and are actively involved in leading weekly Bible study and fellowship groups of adults, and leading these adults in evangelizing their neighborhoods. We call each of these neighborhood groups a "nucleus".

There are 21 new students who are currently studying intensively (right now is Brazil's summer vacation time - a perfect time for intensive Bible study.)

IN OUR FAMILY:

My wife, Wanda, and I are working very closely with the young married couples of our church, and we have them into our home every Saturday night for a study on marriage and the family. (An area that desperately needs attention in this country.)

My brother, David, and his wife, Pennie, are heavily involved in the youth ministry of the church, and in the Seminary. They did three Youth Conferences this year - in the city of Porto Velho, with Mike Creiglow in Cruzeiro do Sul, and here in our high school in Manaus.

My children, Leigh Ann and Judson are doing well in school, and seem to have completely adjusted to attending both American and Brazilian schools.

My youngest daughter, Michelle, learned to read this year, and most importantly, she accepted the Lord into her heart and life and was baptized!

Looking back at 1984, who could doubt that our God is the one True God, and who could resist responding to His love? But there are still thousands in this city and in this country who are bound in darkness. They have no light. That's why we're here. Pray that 1985 will be a year of light for many more Brazilians.
