Greetings,

The following recently caught my attention. "Where independent missionaries must raise their own support. Studies show it requires a minimum of 1/5 (20%) of their time (usually) more) to promote, raise and handle funds for their support." In addition, seldom does one (now-a-days) get sufficient support raised in less than two years, usually longer.

I am not being critical. I feel for the brethren. I'm simply saying that this is a long, drawn out and expensive, tiring way to do the job. Where do we find an example in God's Word that shows the precise way to gain the needed support?

We are not OPPOSED to this method. I just believe there is a quicker, more economical and yet Biblical way. When you support missionaries or a missionary, through Baptist Faith Missions, 100% of the money is used in missions and as you wish it to be used. Each, B.F.M. Missionary, is authorized by a LOCAL N.T. BAPTIST CHURCH when he goes. Each missionary continues to do his mission by the AUTHORITY of a Local N.T. type of a church.

Right now the Wacasers are waiting (still financially supporting themselves) to go to Brazil. Hopefully their paper work will all be taken care of so that they'll be on the field of God's calling within a month or so.

The George Beans: over fifteen (15) years as a missionary to Brazil, are working on their official paper work. He is still pastoring. As soon as their paper work is completed and you as God's People get the funds in they will be on their way to the field of service.

The John Hendersons are awaiting to go to the Philippines. This is a man with over ten years pastoral experience. A proven man, a God called man. He is still supporting himself. However, he can be ready and on the field within a month or so. That is if you and I as God's People will come through with the needed support. Let's get him there soon. Just today, I read the following: "American diplomats fear overall instability could open the door for another Iran." Talking about the Philippines. Can we afford to wait?

There are many easy and simple ways to finance these families and to have them (all three families) to their fields of service, within the next two to three months. Simply stating a couple of the ways: 1. One-

thousand of you who are reading this paper, committing yourselves to but \$10.00 each on a monthly basis. 2 Each of the supporting churches (Noticed I said each) increasing your monthly giving to B.F.M. by but one-percent JUST 1%. Is the need and lost souls and the work of God that imrotant???

Word From Korea And The Philippines

Pastor Park (Pak) of the Kyoung Ban Baptist Church of Kai Pyoung, Korea wrote and sent some pictures. He stated that he had baptized 29 last month. The water was icy and there were several inches of snow on the ground when they were baptized. This dear brother needs to be supported on the field and I've no money to do it with.

Pastor Lemuel Tamon of the Open "Bible," Baptist Church of Saint Mary in the Philippines, stated that they had had 16 professions of faith and had baptized 10 with 7 more regaining the assurance of their salvation. This young man has faced some trying situations. He really needs your prayers.

In addition to these was with: Pastor John King and the Dean Road Baptist Church of Union Park, Florida and the annual missions conference of the South Side Baptist Church and Dr. George Starling of Winter Haven, Florida.

Thanks to each of you who have permitted me to have had a part in your services.

Four More Saved . . . Sister Draper's Health Improves . . . Brother Turner Holds A Meeting . . . House Of Ill - Repute Comes To An End

Dear Brethren, March 12, 1985

We greet you in the Name above every name. We are happy to report that this has been another good month. We have had 4 more saved since our last report. We have changed workers at the Anil mission. We have a brother working there temporarily while we prayerfully find another worker. The work is much better now. We had an excellent vacation Bible school there this past month. Also, we had a good one at our church too. Much is happening here with us as usual. I'm happy to report that Ursula's health continues to be much improved. She is hard at work teaching the lady's class at church. Melody has started back to Brazilian school. She is busy with math, etc.

We had the privilege to have Brother Richard Turner here with us last week to bring a weekend revival at the church. Also, he was able to visit and preach at all 5 of our works here. We are expecting to open 2 or maybe 3 works this year in this State. We hope to also organize at least one into a New Testament church. I believe our church here is the most missionary for its size I've ever seen. We don't have money, but we do have the power of God working in our midst. I hope that we will have the wisdom to carry on the work in the proper way. We desperately need brother Bean here right now. I am working 15 hour days most of the time. I've lost a little weight since the first of the year due to the work load. But I am not complaining! We are rejoicing in the victories over Satan and in the great way the Lord is working with us.

Let me tell you an interesting story about God's working in one missionary's life. There was once a work opened up by a church here on the same street as a Dance Hall and House of ill-repute. The people who lived on the street next to the night club were in constant fear for their lives because every weekend someone died or was shot or cut up there. The missionary often went by and with a heavy heart watched the evil men there laugh at the believers who walked by. One day the owner of the night club became sick of being mixed up in such a dirty business and put the "House of Satan" up for sale. The missionary bought a paper and saw it for sale. He went the same day and immediately put down the downpayment to buy it. When it became public many people rejoiced and 4 prostitutes and a bartender were out of a job. A Baptist church became the owner of a night club. The Pastor personally took a rock and broke the big red light which called foolish young men to their doom. If this sounds dramatic, the 4 buildings, 2 large open buildings, sound equipment, freezer, 40 chairs, 15 tables, 4 fans, desk, record

player, stove, 3 beds, cases of bottles, plus 900 sq meters of land cost the grand total of \$1500.00 (One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars). I personally know who this happened to. It happened to me! I just picked up the deed today! Rejoice with us. Pray for us also. We didn't have the \$1500. We had to spend our funds that we use to maintain the new works. If anyone would like to help us on this, it would be appreciated. But we don't want anyone to take away from any approved project to do it. Ours is not the only work worthy of your prayers and support. If necessary we can go it alone on this. Our God is great! I didn't know how great until we decided to give our all to the work of the Lord. We now have a place to start a Christian school, a Bible Institute, and a place for our workers who come in from the interior to stay while in town. As the man at the deed office said, you folks didn't buy anything. It was given to you at that price.

Please excuse my dramatics, but my cup is running over! May the Lord bless all of you.

Dear Brethren,

This past month has been a month of blessings and trials. We have asked for you to pray and we believe you have. The first thing that I hate to mention is that Brother Pedro who has pastored the work in Aucayacu fell into sin and has resigned the church as pastor. I hope to do all I possibly can to save their marriage. Pray for them and the Church.

Last month we went to Progreso (13) from Huanuco and Tingo Maria and worked three days on the building. Since then over forty people have been killed and many others missing, all from Tingo Maria to Progreso and further in the jungle.

Jan. 28th I went to Lima for my ear operation which was supposed to have been a simple operation. I was two and a half hours in the operating room and five days in the hospital. I was in Lima a total of 17 days. The doctor wanted me to stay longer but I was concerned about Elizabeth and Melissa so, finally he gave me permission to go to Huanuco and come back in a week. I found all well at home and souls are being saved in all the churches and missions.

Cruzeiro do Sul, Acre March 29, 1985

Dear Brethren, Last month we had a five day camp. Getting everyone there was a real adventure this time of year. It didn't rain until after the camp was finished, so we couldn't have had a better time. We had a large group of young adults and another large group of intermediates. Most of our teaching was directed to the saved, but some of our young folks took along lost friends and this gave us a great opportunity to witness to some who had never heard. The camp also helped revive some of our young people who had cooled down of late.

For the past six weeks I have been on the rivers and roads trying to visit as many of our churches and congregations as possible. I went to visit the church at Lagoinha once more. They are doing a very good job. Besides the work around the home church they are

also working at three other places on the road and one congregation on the Liberdade River. Brother Wilson and his preachers have done a good job at all these villages. Three of the four missions have built their own buildings. I visited one of these works, the larger of the four, at Campinas. The congregation at Campinas has over 100 believers already. We had over 80 present for a week day service. They also have four men who are preaching already. These men are not quite ready to handle the pastorate yet. Consequently, we have not organized the mission into an independent church yet.

One Sunday I went to visit the church at Maita. This was an un-announced visit, but was a real blessing. The pastor, Brother Valdir, and five of their preachers were up the Moa River for a two week missionary journey. The associate pastor, Brother Oseias, and four other preachers were home taking care of the work. The church there always enjoys good attendance. The Sunday I was there we had well over 100. It is common for them to have over 130.

One week later I went to visit the church at Mourapianga. It was a very rainy day and it wasn't much of a visit. Things are a little slow there right now. The pastor, Brother Bandeira, is only able to be there once every two weeks. One of our preachers, Brother Edson Damaceno, has been working pretty close to them, trying to lift them up.

A couple of Sundays ago I visited the churches of Mancio Lima. First Baptist is in Jappim and Calvary is about three miles down the road at Colonia. Both churches are doing fine. The pastor of Calvary, Brother Joao, has just been appointed interim pastor of this community of eight thousand.

This round of visits was concluded by a Sunday and Wednesday visit to Faith Baptist Church here in Cruzeiro do Sul. The church continues to progress.

Of course we have continued to be busy at First Baptist. Our men have continued to travel every where. We held our monthly preachers planning session, and made other contacts with other preachers and pastors at this time. The best was a good time with Brother Ozias, pastor of the new church at Pentecostes. They have begun the construction of their building. Our last Sunday at home was spent with our home church. We had 338 in Sunday School. In the evening service we had even more. We would have had quite a few more, but it rained and we didn't have lights. Nevertheless we had one young man to be saved.

Now we are on our way to visit many of you in the States. Looking forward to seeing you soon. May God bless you richly.

I have some school business to take care of there. I will return from Chimbote to Lima in order to receive my family once again in the Lima Airport. We have quite a bit of traveling to do this month and we ask for your prayers.

All the works are doing well. I baptized two this past month into the Igreja Batista de Gracia, in San Fernando. They are a young man and young woman that trusted the Lord a few weeks prior to their baptism as I preached for the Church there. There was also another teenage girl that trusted the Lord at the Igreja Batista de la Libertad here in Pucallpa last week when I preached for them. So we praise the Lord for all the good things that have happened for us here this past month.

To us it is home; it is the country and people we love. It is the country we desire to see bowed in adoration and submission to the Lord Jesus. For a country whose people are 95% idolaters, and 50% of these are spiritualists, the Gospel has brought great changes in the 100 years it has been here. It is the greatest catholic nation in the world. Brazil's value is seen in the tremendous bid communism is making to win her to its ranks. What a wonderful and challenging place to live and work.

Here in southern Brazil our work in 5 cities continues. This month has been a busy one. Radio

Program in Corneilo continues on a daily basis. The building in Corneilo Procopio is in the process of being remodeled with new doors and windows. All done except the installations of window glass and painting.

The church here in Garca began classes and work in its CENTER OF EVANGELISM AND THEOLOGY STUDIES. This is the beginning of a study center for the work in southern Brazil. The first week of study were lectures by Dr. David Hatcher, on The Philosophy of Christ. About 30 persons enrolled in the course.

Another phase of the Center is studies and courses by video. All of the first lectures were taped on video. This means they can be presented in many places by means of TV and an assistant. Plans are to try to record by tape, video, slides and filmstrips a complete course in Evangelism and Theology that can be used in every church desiring to use the material.
