Since last letter I spent three weeks in Peru, South America. The plane left Lexington, Ky. on the morning of April 26 at seven. We landed back in Lexington on the evening of May 15, at ten.

In my opinion, this was a very profitable trip. During the trip I was privileged to either teach, lecture or preach some eighteen (18) times. With but one exception, between five and twenty people responded publicly to the message of God's Word. It is wonderful to see the evidence of the working of the Holy Spirit.

Both the Gasque and Stanton families were very gracious while I was with them. They're doing a great job. Then too, the Lord has His faithful natives who are dedicated to Him and His calling for them. Brother Crain was not in Huanaco. He has been having some physical problems as well as the on going of his mother-in-law. They need your prayers and especially at this time.

Since arriving back in the States I've been privileged to have been with: Pastor Richard Adams and the Lyman's Creek Baptist Church of Beattyville, Kentucky. Have also been with the Emmaus Rd. Baptist Church and Pastor Roger Frame of Craigsville, West Virginia. These were both Mission Conferences and of top quality. DON'T TELL ME THAT A SMALL CHURCH (number wise) CAN'T HAVE A GREAT CONFERENCE! Both of these did.

REMEMBER! I stand ready and willing to help you in any way, whether in a single service, a conference, a revival or whatever, just let me know.

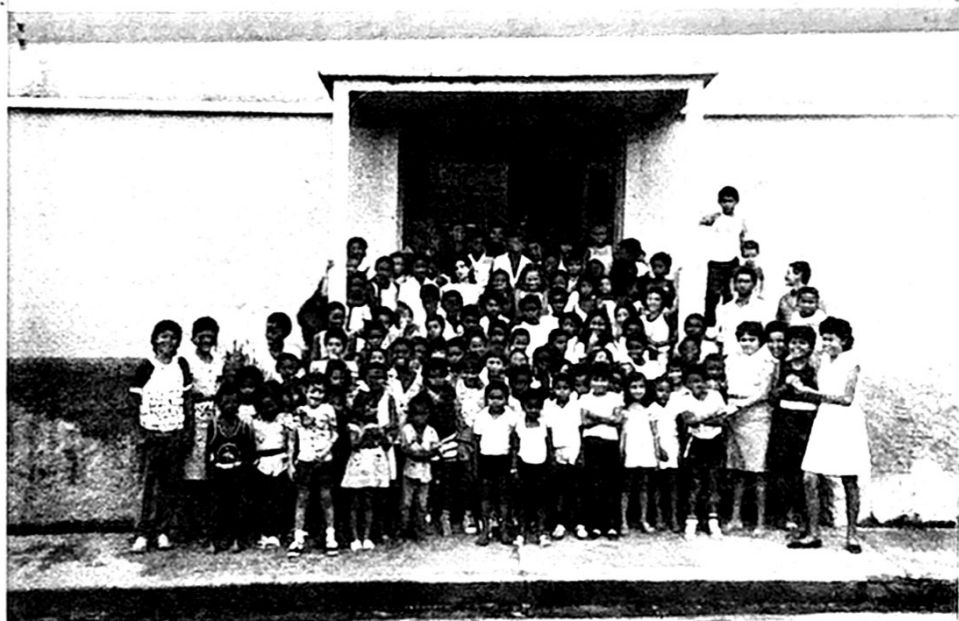

There were about 50 Baptist Churches in the central Philippines, all pastored by Filipino pastors, which had a conference which emphasized Baptist History. The *Trail of Blood* was used for this study. The response was very good. These churches are facing very difficult times and wanted to be encouraged from the Bible and the faithful example of our forefathers. Remember them in prayer.

After the conference in the central Philippines the work of Brother Adams' was visited in the northern Philippines. He is doing a good work. Brother Carver's work was also visited and it is going well. These brethren have done a good work.

Also, the work started by Brother Kenneth Overbey in the early sixties was visited. While stationed at Clark field in the military service he worked under the authority of a Baptist church there and with a young Filipino preacher started a mission which was organized into a Baptist church and is going very well today.

Then in May we don't have the exact number of those who made professions of faith in the interior where our missionaries work every week. Attendance has continued to be good in spite of the prolonged rainy season. In fact Brother Gilmar told me that the building was packed on our anniversary. This means that there were well over 600 in that service.

## Story Of Barral . . . How You Can Help Barral

### TIMELINE OF A YOUTH SNATCHED BY GOD

This youth's name is Barral (pronounced Ba-how). He is 20 years old. Before 1984, Barral lived his life without meaning or purpose . . .

1982 - He dropped out of school and immersed himself in drugs and alcohol.

- Went by himself on trips all over South America to try to find himself and the meaning of life.

1983 - Came home to Manaus without the answer he had been looking for and took a job in an auto body shop. While working one day, his body was terribly burned in a gasoline fire. His life has lost all purpose for living with nowhere to go but up. Was invited to attend church by Gerson Pago (now pastor of Tabernacle's daughter church in Boa Vista). Heard the Gospel and finally found what he had been searching for - the Lord!

1984 - In February, Barral decided to make his life count for the Lord and made the decision to serve the Lord to the most of his capability. Entered Tabernacle's seminary and began studying for a pastoral ministry. November - began working as a nucleus pastor in the same neighborhood where his bus route had been.

1985 - Through his personal witnessing and discipling there have been 70 adults saved and baptized to date. He makes his living by doing oil paintings and selling them.

- The families in his nucleus provide most of his meals.

- A lady in his nucleus has loaned Barral the empty house of one of her relatives to live in. Barral lives by faith and God is using his paintings and the love of people that he pastors to supply his needs.

Future - Barral plans to go to Columbia as a missionary.

How can you pray for Barral?

1. He needs to keep growing in the Lord, receiving more wisdom and strength in resisting temptations.

2. His nucleus is now too large for the home where it meets. It needs to be divided. Barral needs wisdom as he trains other laborers to fill these leadership rolls.

3. Barral needs a Godly wife.

4. Barral's family is unsaved.

Dear Christian friends, Barral's life is a miracle. If you are saved, then your life is a miracle too. Have you ever sat down and written out the timeline of your life? Have you thought recently about where the Lord has brought you from? Our God is good, isn't He?

Dear Brethren, Lexington, Ky. May 27, 1985

On Friday night, April 19th, I preached to some 43 people present at the Cesa Baptist Mission in a new suburb of Manaus. The Lord blessed us with some eight professions of faith. We praise the Lord.

On Saturday morning, April 20th, our son Stephen arrived from the States. He was with us until the 5th of May. On the 4th of May I performed the wedding ceremony of Stephen and Saleth Gomes Nunes before several hundred people.

The day of Stephen's arrival was also the day that a group of us from the 14th of December Baptist Church made a trip by bus to "Colonia de Aleixo" some few miles from Manaus. There we visited the Chapot Prevost Hospital and then we held services at the Canaan Baptist Church. The members of this church bear in their bodies the marks of leprosy. Pastor Pedro is blind as well.

Sunday night - April 21st - after services, news reached us by telephone of the death of the president elect of Brasil - Senhor Tancredo Neves. I had preached that morning preparing our hearts for that sad event.

Sunday April 28th was indeed a blessed day at the church. I baptized twelve new believers and then that night we observed the Lord's supper. Our average attendance is Sunday School for the month of April was 488.

On Thursday night the 2nd of May I taught my Old Testament Class for the last time this semester at the "Faculdade Batista de Teologia do Amazonas" due to our trip to the U.S.A.

Sunday, May 5th was our last day as pastor of the church. The Lord blessed in both services. After the evening service we went to the Airport. The four of us (Marie, I, Stephen and Saleth) journeyed together from Manaus to Miami. There we parted company. They went to Lexington, we to

Jacksonville, Florida. Asa Mark, Lucy and Marcia met us at the Airport. We visited with them until the following Monday. On Friday we attended the graduation exercises of the Luther Rice Seminary. Congratulations, Asa Mark for having graduated! On the 13th we bade them farewell to return to Manaus.

The next morning we began our trip in Asa Mark's car to Kentucky. We arrived the next day at noon at Marie's parents' house - Mr. & Mrs. Sherman Moore of Richmond, Ky. We visited with them until Sunday morning, the 19th. We attended the revival services at Newby Baptist Church.

Sunday, May 19th I preached at both services at the Ashland Avenue Baptist Church, Lexington, Ky. where Dr. Ross Range is pastor. Wednesday afternoon of that week, traveled with Dr. Louie Carver to West Virginia. On Thursday and Friday mornings I preached at the annual Missionary Conference of the Emmaus Road Baptist Church, Craigsville, W. Va. where Roger Frame is the pastor. Yesterday we visited and I preached at both services at the Landmark Baptist Church, Winchester, Ky. Jimmy L. Muncie is the pastor.

We are staying in the home of Dr. & Mrs. George W. Phillips of Lexington, Ky. Dr. Phillips is pastor of the Pinkard Baptist Church. They visited us in Manaus in July of 1983.

Pray for us as we visit the churches in this area during the month of June. The Lord willing we'll return to Manaus before the 15th of July.

Pray for Asa Mark as he again serves the Saviour as pastor of the 14th of Dec. Baptist Church.

To everyone of you who have been so kind to us since we arrived in the U.S.A. we say "thank you" and "obrigado." Pray for us. Tomorrow Marie is to have a check up at the Lexington Clinic.

## Brazil Passing Through A Great Time Of Change . . . Many Problems Face This Nation . . . But Great Opportunities To Preach The Gospel

Garca, Sao Paulo, Brazil May 15, 1985

Dear Friends, Brazil is passing through a period of change politically, economically, and spiritually. The first president elected in twenty years was submitted to emergency surgery two days before he was to take office. Vice-president Sarney was sworn in and assumed the leadership of the nation as vice-president. One month later the President died and the country experienced one of the most traumatic experiences in its history.

For over thirty days the radio stations and TV carried the almost hourly reports of the president-elect's condition. In Belo Horizonte, capital of Minas Gerais, where the president-elect had been a popular governor, five people were trampled to death by the frantic multitude as it pushed through a large iron gate to view his body.

At the end of forty days of the new president the nation is plagued with strikes from all areas, including the airlines and the postal system. However, in general, the protests and strikes have been very peaceable with no violence. Floods in the northeast have replaced the seven-year drought causing 300,000 persons to leave their homes.

And, as usual, the Roman Catholic church knows how to take advantage of every situation, politically, socially, and religiously. There is no doubt as to the value of Brazil to the Roman church. She is the greatest catholic nation in the world. She puts pressures on the politicians, her priests agitate the strikes, and her seven sacraments enslave her adepts from the cradle to the grave.

Yet, in spite of all this, the miracle of God is: the doors of liberty to preach the Gospel are wide open, as in no other nation on the earth. To enter these doors we need godly capable laborers, equipment, and finances. When Jonah preached to Ninivah he probably did not realize that his message, bringing the Ninivites to repentance, secured the safety of his people for forty years. The security of America is not in her military defense, rather it is in the hands of Him who does not slumber nor sleep.
