When I read this, my thoughts were; "surely we must get the Hendersons to the Philippines soon. The country is now open but with Communism and the Muslims becoming stronger, how much longer will the country be open to the Gospel?" Can we stand still and let this happen? It would take but a mere \$10.00 monthly support from each of the bread earner readers of this letter to support, not just the Hendersons to Philippines but also the Beans to Brazil.

I just returned from the Philippines and Korea the 25th of July. Brother Adams and Jonathan were at the airport to meet me when the plane arrived at 11:00 p.m. on July the fourth. The Adams and I went to the city of Tarlac where we talked with the city's mayor, the district judge and the country clerk. They all assured me that they would welcome the Hendersons to their city. The Province of Tarlac is populated with approximately 800,000 people. There appears to be about four Baptist works in the area.

Jonathan accompanied me to Sta. Mary the Sunday in the Philippines for the entire day. I spoke three times and showed the World Evangelism overhead transparencies. A great day with sixteen making various moves. Brother Lemuel Tamon is doing a great work there now.

Was with Brother Adams and his church on a Wednesday evening where we had good attendance and several moves were made for the Lord there.

Brother Wayne Howard, Dr. Seo Ku Lee and several other brothers and sisters met me at the airport in Seoul. Brother Howard permitted me to stay with him, his wife and children were in the states for a few weeks. Brother Howard is always very gracious and helpful; a good sound missionary.

The work in Korea is not without its problems. Please pray for the Faith Church and Dr. Lee, her pastor. The building was lowered by Dr. Lee's former helper and some other persons. Despite the heartache and hardship that this worked on them, they forgave them, organized them into an independent body and

gave them what money (approx. \$5,000.00) that they had received from their building fund. This was their money not from America. Now the Faith Church is left with, virtually no building, and their treasury drained. Despite all this they said: "we're going to do a work for the Lord."

The seven day seminar went well in Korea. My subject was; "Building N.T. Churches," (not buildings). Those in attendance appeared to have been enthused and determined to get the job done for the Lord.

All five of the works that were started during our stay in Korea are still in existence. In fact, I had the privilege of speaking at each and there were moves made in each. A total of over eighty (80's) made some type of a public decision for the Lord. A highlight was a very high class business man with who we visited on a Sunday afternoon. He and his wife a follower of Buddha, attended the services that evening at the First Baptist of Kai Pyoung and both made professions of faith along with eight other people for other reasons.

On July the 27th at our mother church, the Ashland Avenue Baptist Church here in Lexington, Pamela, our eldest daughter was married. Dr. Falwell flew down and he and I performed the ceremony. Pamela's husband, Dan Snyder, works with the Life-Long Learning of the Liberty University and his parents are also professors in the school. Dan is saved, dedicated and a Baptist as well as having been reared on the mission field. His parents were missionaries to Africa for many years. Pray for Dan and Pam.

Many of you came through strongly again for B.F.M. Founder's Month. We only missed our goal for the month by \$3,296.54. However, passed our offerings for the same period of last year by: \$1,721.88. THANK YOU.

Please let me know if I may be of help to you in your missions endeavors. If you've questions about B.F.M., feel free to ask. Many have been misinformed. We want you to know the truth about the mission or any of the missionaries.

Directions To Grace Baptist Church, 2920 Beaver Valley Road, Fairborn, Ohio

From the north on I-75 to I-70. Go east on I-70 9 1/2 miles to I-675 (the only way you can go) six miles to exit 20 which is Dayton-Yellow Springs Road (well marked on large signs) at end of exit ramp turn left and go one mile to Beaver Valley Road. Turn left on Beaver Valley Road one mile to the church's driveway and turn left and up the hill to church parking lot.

From the North on I-71 to I-70. Go west on I-70 to I-675 and south on I-675 the same as above directions.

From east to west on I-70, exit onto I-675 and then same as directions above.

From the south on I-75 take Route 4 Exit in Dayton.

From exit 4 take Route 444 Exit.

From Route 444 turn right on Dayton-Yellow Springs Road.

From Dayton-Yellow Springs Road turn right on Beaver Valley Road.

From Beaver Valley Road turn left at the church sign and mailbox.



Works In Huanuco And Tingo Going Well . . . Generator Stolen . . . Waiting In Pucallpa For Equipment . . . Soon To Start Building For Zion Church

Dear Brethren,

The work has been going well here in the departamento (State) of Huanuco. The two churches in Huanuco have had several professions of faith and have baptized several. The mission out of Zion Church has been baptizing quite regularly.

The Church in Tingo Maria has been in a spirit of revival for several weeks, the church has had several baptisms and some are getting married legally so they can be baptized.

Here in Peru the post office has been on strike about two months. Two weeks ago the terrorists blew up the telephone and telegraph towers in Huanuco. So we have no way of communicating with other cities in Peru and the outside world.

In my last letter I was telling about the work in Chavinillo and at the time I was writing that letter we were being robbed of our generator there in Chavinillo. They broke the lock and took the generator plus several things that belonged to the mission pastor.

Brother Gasque informed me that our van and motorcycles have arrived in Iquitos so, I went to Iquitos to assemble two of the motorcycles and get the others ready to ship to Pucallpa. As usual things did not go as we had planned and I was two weeks in

Iquitos waiting for the papers from the customs office.

After arriving back in Huanuco a man came from Chavinillo to sell us a lot to build a building in Chavinillo. We are buying a lot 12 meters by 12 meters and we hope to start building soon. We plan to start on the building for Zion Church after the Thanksgiving Conference in Pucallpa which will be August 5-12. I am supposed to preach five times during the conference - three messages on the "Calling of the Ministry" and two evangelistic messages at night.

While I was in Iquitos I preached for the Mission at Santa Tomas, the Esperanza Church and twice for the First Baptist Church.

In Huanuco I preached twice at the anniversary of the Zion Baptist Church and the Lord blessed the last Sunday night with over twenty (20) coming forward, some to receive Christ and others to live closer to the Lord.

I am writing this letter from Pucallpa where I have been waiting for the boat to arrive from Iquitos, it is one week late today. There is a missionary who is supposed to leave today to the states and we hope he will take our letters and mail them in the USA. All the family are doing well, Melissa will be studying in the 7th grade in August. We plan to start two new missions next month. We thank all who give and pray to make our ministry here in Peru possible.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings once again in the wonderful name of Jesus. I hope this letter finds each one enjoying the Lord's richest blessings. He is so good to us. I realize it's been some time since you've heard from the Stantons; but there is a good reason.

The postal system of Peru has been on strike for months and is still on strike at this time. We've not received any mail of any kind for over two months and we're sure that our mail has not been delivered.

Two weeks ago the terrorists destroyed a communication tower and now we can't even call outside of Pucallpa or send a telegram. To make life more exciting, the electric plant here lost all but one of its motors and now we have electric about two days a week. We praise the Lord that we do have communication by Ham Radio, and that we have a portable diesel generator to help with the lights. We have much to be thankful for. This letter is being mailed for us by another missionary that is going home on furlough. The Lord always knows best and seems to always work things out for us.

Anita, the kids and I are all in good health and persevering. The hours are long and the weather is hot, but the Lord has a work for us to do and we consider it a privilege to have a part in the Master's business. The school is going well. We're preparing for the two week school vacation at this time. We thank the Lord for each of you that has a part in helping us with the Pucallpa Baptist School in designated funds. Please continue to support and encourage others to help.

The Bible Institute is doing well. We have classes three nights a week for two hours a night. We have about forty students in all that study regularly. Pray for them also that we can be effective in preparing workers for the Lord's Service.

The Grace Baptist Church in San Fernando is doing really well these days. They are growing and have baptized five within two months. The Liberty

Baptist Church in Arneal is about the same; not growing but not losing either. The Faith Baptist Church here next to the school is about the same also. They have many good, faithful, Brothers and Sisters in the church but the pastor has a very bad attitude. He needs your prayers.

Now that the Bible Institute is going well our next and most important goal is the start of a new Mission work. We came to the field of Peru for the purpose of starting a Bible Institute and new Mission works. We spent the first year learning the language and building. We've spent the last year working with the works here in Pucallpa that are already established and putting the School in order. Also we got the Bible Institute started and running smoothly. So now we have the greatest and grandest task and certainly the most important; that of starting a new mission work. The Lord receives glory through the church and His church takes priority over schools and Institutes. We have an area located where we want to get started. It is in a section called Yarina Cocha. The road there was finished last week (asphalted) and many are moving in that direction. The've prohibited industry to go there so it is strictly a residential section: Just right for a new Mission work. We have no definite piece of property located at this time but any piece of land we buy and build on will cost less than \$6,000.00 or more. Now for the big question!!! Is there a church or churches back home that will help us get this new work going. We have willing workers to help us and the burning desire to go, and the authority. We're expecting great things from God, please help us and have a part in this new work of the Lord.

It's been a pleasure to have Brother Crain with us again this week. He's waiting on a boat from Iquitos that has his new van and motorcycles. The boat is a week late and we're starting to wonder if its going to make it or not. Many will be glad to hear (and maybe a few sad) that I have shaved my beard. Anita is certainly GLAD. No more news until next time. Please remember to pray for us and help us in the new work if you can. May the Lord continue to bless each one.

Very Difficult Time Getting To Brazil . . . Arrived Safely And Begun Preaching . . . Many Thanks To All

Dear Brethren,

We forgot that the month of July is vacation month for Latin America and that means that everyone that is able would be traveling somewhere. We were to leave on July 19, but when I called the airlines for our reservations they told me that they were already booked for a week ahead and since we were traveling on half-fare Clergy Pass we would be put on stand-by for the following week. We were to accompany the Harold Bratchers and he suggested we go to Miami on Monday in hope of getting on the flight that night. We agreed to go along, but I confess that I had no hope of getting on that flight. We arrived in Miami at 11:30 a.m., unloaded our mountain of baggage in front of the airlines ticket counter and got the sad news that they were still booked up for over a week, but was told to come back at 2:00 p.m. to talk to the manager. Perhaps he could help us. Since our visas would run out before there would be an opening I spent the next two hours searching out other possibilities with other airlines and found out that with about 3 times the cost we could get into Brazil within the next three days and if the original airline failed us I was prepared to pay it to keep from losing our permanent visas. When we returned to talk to the manager at 2:00 p.m. he looked at the list of passengers and said it is full up, but he would put us on the stand-by list and that we might just get to go and to come back at 7:00 p.m. At that time we were told to come back at 8:00 p.m. Well we had no other place to go, so we continued sitting on

our baggage waiting for them to call us and at the same time wondering where we would spend the night since a hotel room was \$85.00 per night. All four of us had been praying, but without much faith by this time. To our surprise, just 15 minutes before boarding time our names were called and we were on our way leaving some 20 to 30 others still standing by. We had one of the best trips ever from Miami to Brazil and no trouble whatsoever getting through customs. We had almost no sleep Sunday & Monday nights, so I spent most of Tuesday sleeping. Tonight, after almost two years out of Brazil, I preached again in Portuguese thinking I might have some difficulty, but it went very well, I thought. I preached for Asa Mark Bratcher in the 14th of December Baptist Church.

It was difficult saying good bye to Arlene at the airport in Cincinnati, but we went through it and after we were gone she returned to Lexington with Brother Steve Bratcher and his wife in the van of Lexington Baptist College that he had borrowed to take us to the airport.

We want to thank all of you who have been such a blessing to us through the years and especially these past two years. I could not mention all, even if I tried. Space will not permit and I am sure I would miss some, so I will just say, "Thank you all so much."

In the last couple of months the family and I have done quite a bit of traveling. In June I was privileged to hold a couple of revival meetings with two fine churches. One of these meetings was with the Glade Creek Baptist Church in Summersville, West Virginia. The pastor there is an old friend of mine, Jim Rader. We really did enjoy being with the Raders and being in the homes of quite a few of the members. The church set apart a special time to hear the report of our work and see the slides. It was an unusual time and a great pleasure to me to see how interested and how involved the folks got in this service. The other revival meeting was with the Faith Baptist Church of Wauseon, Ohio. Brother Dan Walborn is pastor there. Although Dan and I were just mere acquaintances, we got to know each other better and had some great fellowship. The presentation of the work was made on Sunday afternoon after lunch, but even so the folks really responded well. Neither of

these churches support our work financially at this time, but we believe that they soon will be.

We have visited many of our faithful supporting churches also in the past two months. We have been in churches in West Virginia, Kentucky, Ohio, Michigan and Mississippi. It is difficult to convey the needs of the work in a sermon though. I believe that most of our folks know whether I know or do not know how to preach. All of our folks hear good preaching from our pastors. I feel that I get out of touch and I'm sure that most people do not have the feel for what is going on in Brazil. We do have some needs to be met at this time. We are spending only five or six months here then we will be going back to Brazil for at least another four years. This is the only time that I have to present what has been done and what needs to be done. If the saints don't know of the needs they can't fill them. Let me express my gratitude to one church who handles this problem in, what I feel, is the ideal fashion. The Addyston Baptist Church, Rex Hensley pastor, told me to present the work then questioned me on how they could help and began to do so immediately. This took only about one hour of everyone's time. This is fantastic! Thanks!

Pray for us and the work. Find out about our needs and help us. God bless all of you and many thanks to all.
