Heart Checkup Is Good . . . Conference In Pucallpa . . . Plan To Start New Work In Acamayo Soon . . . Need Help In This

Dear Brethren,

Since my last mission letter that I wrote while in Pucallpa waiting for the van and motorcycles to arrive, many things have happened here in Peru. After waiting ten days for the boat to arrive I had to return to Huanuco and then a trip to Lima to see my heart specialist. He said I was doing very well with the treatment for angina. I only have to go back to see him every two months.

While I was in Pucallpa I preached to the students of the Baptist school where Brother Sheridan Stanton is the Director. I enjoyed my stay with the Stantons.

Back in Huanuco I preached for the Zion Baptist Church and the Baptist Church here in Huanuco.

Aug. 4th, we left Huanuco with our family and three other families to attend the Thanksgiving Conference in Pucallpa. We arrived after ten hours of dusty driving. While in Pucallpa I preached five times

at the conference. In the morning services I preached twice on the Vocation of the ministry, where I preached one message on the calling of the ministry and another on the responsibility of the ministry. I also preached three nights where the services were evangelistic. Each day I would go to the port to see if the boat had arrived. Finally Aug. 13 we left Pucallpa returning to Huanuco, Brother Douglas Gasque, wife Jan, sons Kevin, Brandon, and Kerry and two daughters Jessica and Sara. During the conference we all (9) stayed with the Stantons.

I called Pucallpa yesterday and they say the boat will arrive tomorrow morning. So, I will be leaving by bus at noon today to arrive about midnight tonight. I plan to go to Pucallpa, drive the van back to Huanuco and send the motorcycles by truck. While Brother Gasque and his family are here we will visit Chavinillo where we hope to get the brethren started on the adobe walls for the church building. In case my last letter did not get through we bought a lot in Chavinillo 12 meters by 12 meters about 39 feet square. They are now meeting in a room about 10 by 12 feet square with about 70 people coming. Also, we plan to go to Acamayo to look for a lot to start a new work. Please designate offerings to Crains New Works in Peru.

Greetings from Pucallpa in Jesus name. Hope all is well back home with each one. We've had a really good month this past month.

We started out the month with a two week school vacation. During the vacation we had the annual conference here in Pucallpa. Each year we have a conference in one of the cities where Baptist Faith Missions has a work. Last year it was in Huanuco. This year the Faith Baptist Church hosted the meeting and did a good job. We saw many professions of faith and many rededications. Faith Baptist Church baptized twelve the following Sunday. Brother Doug Gasque was a real blessing to the brethren here. He was able to help motivate them in a visitation program; the result of which the church had over four hundred in Sunday School. It was a blessing to see so many of the children in Sunday School. Although two weeks later the church was back to normal it did see as a result of all the work an increase of around 15.

We really enjoyed having the Gasques and the Crains in our home for the week of the conference.

After the conference I took the family on a small trip for a week to rest. We enjoyed the trip but we all came home sick with the flu and stayed in bed for several days. Joshua particularly ran a high fever for several days which had us worried but the Lord Blessed and it passed. We are all feeling better now and about back to normal. We appreciate so much your prayers for us. The children have started back into studying for this year and seem to be doing well and enjoying it.

We've not heard any word yet of any offerings designated for our new work in Yarina Cocha. We have property available to us but no money to buy. It will cost around \$6,000.00 to buy some land and build a simple building. Won't you please help us. This area has one Catholic church and two pentecostal groups meeting that we know of. The opportunity is before us and the rainy season starts in a few months. The time is now to act. We're anxious to get a permanent work established out there. We know it's the Lord's will for us to start a work there and we invite you to have a part with us. Remember the Pucallpa Baptist School in your prayers also. The new government seems to be more organized than the last one but it also has put some more restrictions on us. Please pray and continue your support of this great work of the Lord. May the Lord continue to bless until next month.

Dear Brethren,

We at long last got settled into our home with everything in order to live at least almost a normal life. I was just getting into the routine of teaching the church on christian responsibility when one of our oldest members became ill once again and had to be put into the hospital. For ten days we spent much of our time with him and his family as we fought a losing battle trying to keep him alive. On the day before we were to leave for the States we lost the battle and Helio de Oliveira went to be with the Lord. While he lay in state in the church I preached two long sermons to overflow crowds while the family put on a great display of how a christian should conduct themselves at the loss of a loved one. We heard some very good comments from the lost world in this regard and I told this family that I was proud of them.

Due to Helio's death we had to reschedule our

After a busy week of getting ready, on Saturday at 2:00 P.M. we helped take care of the business for which we came to the States and that was the marriage of our last daughter, Arlene to David Allen Bradley. They left on their honeymoon and on Monday Betty and I went to Ohio to visit my mother. On Wednesday we started our trip back to Brazil stopping off in Hiddenite, N.C. to speak to the Berea Baptist Church where our Son-in-law, Brother Karl Moyers is pastor. Just after I got up to preach David and Arlene walked in and we were very happy to see them. They spent the night with us. Tomorrow David and Arlene will return to Lexington and Betty and I will continue our return trip to Brazil.

We want to thank all who have helped us so much these past few days. By the time most of you read this we should be a long time back in Brazil. We ask you all to pray for us and the work there.

Dear Brethren,

We greet you in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ. We have had a busy month with much happening. Not all has been pleasant, but we remember Rom. 8:28. Our new daughter Michelle has been very sick. She has had two minor surgeries today. But it is not too serious. We desire your prayers as we battle to save her life.

Also, Ursula isn't feeling well. Much of her problem is due to overwork. Pray that the Lord will give her grace. We are into our fourth year and are beginning to feel fatigue and the wear and tear of the life here. It is indeed an honor to suffer for Christ's sake. Our little problems are nothing compared to what our Lord bore for us.

I've had a lot of car trouble this month. But we made two trips to the works in the interior. We attended a service at the Sao Mateus Church and at the Mission in Anajatuba. At the work in Anajatuba they are building a house for the worker. He presently lives in the two small Sunday School rooms that we built last year there while he works on the house. We

are trying to arrange all the works so there is a dwelling for the worker. We have with much difficulty been able to build two S.S. rooms onto the back of the church here in town. If we had the money we could put a dwelling on top of the Sunday School rooms. The mother church will soon be the only one of our 5 works that does not have a house for the worker. She could have had, but has tried to look after the missions instead of just considering herself.

We pray every day that the papers for Brother Bean's visa will come through. I don't know what the hold-up is. But the Lord is in control of the situation.

We had a young man saved at our church this past Sunday. Our church has been going through a dry spell. So this made us truly rejoice. Remember Dorothy Henderson who had surgery last week. She has been dismissed from the hospital, but remains in Sao Paulo at this time. God bless all of you.
