Dear Brethren,
I am glad to be able to report that on the 20th Marie had another heart examination. The doctor reports that her heart condition is stable. He suspended her medicines but she is to continue her daily 30 minute walk.

On Sunday morning, Sept. 22nd, we had 72 present in Sunday Bible School at the Mauzinho Mission of the 14th of December Baptist Church, setting a new attendance record. That night I preached (Asa Mark preached at the Chapada Baptist Church) at the Church.
Each Tuesday and Thursday night finds me teaching Old Testament at the "Faculdade Batista de Teologia do Amazonas."

Wednesday night, the 25th, we were blessed by the presence of Brother and Mrs. Bobby Creiglow with us at Mauzinho - not only by their presence but also by his message.

At 17:00 (5:00p.m.) on the 28th Marie and I arrived at Mauzinho expecting to perform the wedding ceremonies for two couples. We learned that one

of the grooms' mother and three others were hurt in an automobile accident. They were on their way to attend the weddings! Marie stayed there and I took the groom to the First Aid Station at the hospital. There I prayed with and comforted the ones hurt in the wreck. After more than an hour at the hospital, I returned to Mauza and performed the wedding of the other couple. The next Saturday we married the second couple.

The other Sundays our attendance was 34, 52, and 44.

Yesterday, Richard Johnson - age 28 - arrived to be with us some 10 days. He is from the San Jacinto Baptist Church, Amarillo, Texas. We will be leaving tomorrow to visit some of our missions in the interior.

Thus the work goes on. We pray that the Lord will bless at the coming Thanksgiving Conference. May the Lord give us a record offering. Please give to the regular fund and to the S.O.S. Marazinho fund. If you give more than enough for the needs of the Mauza Mission we will use the rest for the completion of the new building at the New Jerusalem Mission - Parana da Eva. Our needs are many. Pray for us.

In USA Because Of Medical Problems Of Wanda And Judson . . . Reports On Preaching Engagements During The Month . . . Outreach Seminar A Great Blessing

Dear Friends,

The month of October has been spent in the United States, in order to deal with some health needs of the family. My wife, Wanda, and son, Judson, are with me; the two girls, Leigh Anne and Michelle, are in Brazil with their uncle and aunt, David and Pennie. Wanda had been having severe muscular pain which often disabled her to move about. The diagnosis was Fibrous Myalgia, and is successfully being treated. Our son Judson developed a limp and pain in his left leg. After x-rays it was diagnosed to be Legg Calve Perthes (a condition in which, due to lack of circulation of blood in the leg bone - femur, - the bone degenerates.) The treatment is a long one, approximately two to four years. Judson is now in traction. As you know, it is hard for an 8 year old to stay immobilized on his back, pray for him and us that God will use this to enrich all of our lives.

I had the opportunity to visit and speak at the Bill Rice Ranch, and share about my life in missions. The occasion was Dr. Cathy Rice's womens retreat. I also supplied for Pastor Louis Maple at East Main Baptist Church, Chicago.

The highlight of this trip was to participate in the Emmanuel Baptist Church's (Evansville, Indiana) OUTREACH SEMINAR. This was a great time of sharing and exchanging ideas related to church growth and ministry expansion. "For waging war you need guidance, and for victory many advisors." Proverbs 24:6. We are in a spiritual warfare, and need to mutually learn to build strong growing churches to win the spiritual war. The obvious result of growing churches is more to give for missions, LABORERS and RESOURCES. Hope you will plan to attend

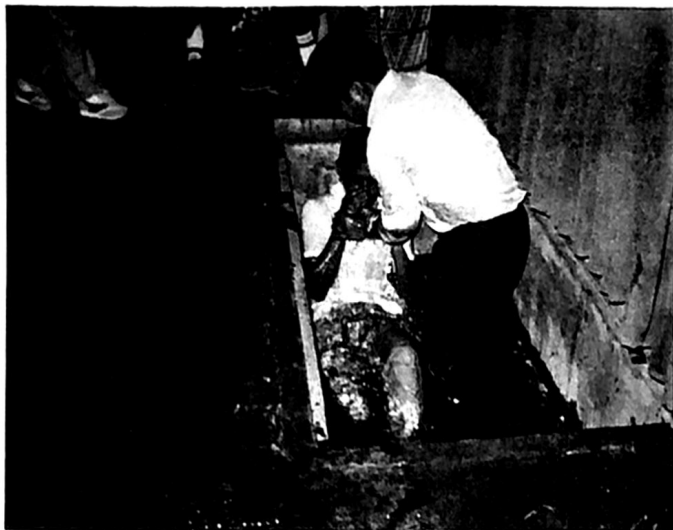

Dear Brethren,

In my last mission letter I was waiting to go to Pucallpa, Peru to receive the van and motor-cycles. One of the brethren and I left at noon and arrived in Pucallpa by bus eleven hours later. I unloaded the van and motorcycles after waiting four days. I sent the motorcycles by truck and we drove the Van to Huanuco.

We were thankful to have the Gasques visiting us over a week. We had a good time of fellowship. Their visit was too short a time.

Later I made a trip to Cunahuayun (near Paucar) to preach and see their new building site and the foundation of their new building. I preached to 52 people the same night.

They plan to finish their walls (adobe) by the 24th of September. Then we will need \$500.00 for the metal roof. Who will help us help them?

We now have two lots in Chavinillo 24 meters by 12 meters - 78 feet frontage by about 40 feet deep.

We have a new mission in a place called AYAPITEC. Last Sunday I went there and preached and we had three men who made professions of faith. After the service we went to the San Juan River and I baptized 20 which were mostly men and women. The water was so cold that it stopped the circulation in my legs causing my feet and ankles to swell to the size of a football. They have ten more to baptize as soon as they get legally married. They have been married by the Catholic Church but that is not legal in Peru. I will be going back to baptize again the first of November.

The people want to build there as soon as possible. We will need land and a roof and doors. Again who will help us?

I want to start a new mission in Acamayo, but I will need some church or some one to help with the expense of a lot, roof and doors. We have several Baptist families to start with. With your help, we can reach out farther. Will you Help us help them?

We have started a new work in Huacar since the terrorists have been driven out, we are meeting in a home. I would like to finish these buildings before we come home in December. Please help us to help them.

Dear Friends,

Thanks to all who expressed your sympathy on the death of my mother. She was a great mother and it is wonderful to know she is in Heaven.

This past week here in Garca a lady died of cancer and heart disease. Alta led her to the Lord about two weeks before she died. Can you imagine her arriving in Heaven? Perhaps as she comes into the presence of the Lord it is announced that another redeemed has arrived from the country of Brazil. You can be sure that if my mother or father were near enough to hear Brazil mentioned, they inquired if she knew John and Alta. What a thrill as she answered, "John and Alta, why it was Alta who taught me how to be saved!" It is no wonder that Daniel, the prophet wrote that those who win souls shall shine as the stars.

Let me tell you how God worked to save an entire family. Lucia is thirteen. She always comes to Sunday School and brings her two little sisters. They come on our bus that passes in front of their house. Lucia's father was a drunk and had not worked for over two years. One morning, Alexander, the fifteen year old boy who works on the bus Lucia rides, asked the church to pray for Lucia's sister who was to be operated on to remove a malignant brain tumor. We

began praying for her. In a few days she was taken to a city 150 miles away for the operation. Her mother and father stayed while there in the home of a family whose mother and four children had been saved through our work here in Garca. They took the man and his wife to church and they were saved. They have been faithful in attendance since returning. She is saved, happy, and improving. Her father is transformed and is building a house. He is a bricklayer and this is his first work in two years. Dear Brethren,

This past month has been a mixture of trials and blessings. For the last thirty days Peru has been in strikes, terrorism, rains and landslides. The government lowered the price of beef and chicken so, we have not had any in the last thirty days. I am tired of Tuna.

The first part of the month we were able to go back to Progresso and put the roof on the building. I came back a week later with sun blisters and mosquito bites. We built trusses and put on a metal roof. We have the material ordered to pour the base over the base that is there and material to make blocks to finish the building. We have not been able to take a group of men there to work due to the danger of the terrorists.

After getting back from Progresso I returned to Tingo Maria where I preached four days in the anniversary of the Inglesia Bautista Getsemani. We had large crowds and the Lord blessed in saving souls and dedication of lives. Alberto Fabian has done a great job as pastor. The church

is sending a preacher to work and live in Progresso. Also, they pay the salary of a young man that works in Las Palmas.

Monday I will be going to Cunayahuan to put the new roof on their building. I will be leaving in about an hour to go there to direct the building of the trusses.

Zion church still lacks a day to finish the walls and then we will be putting the roof on the building there.

The mission in Ayapitec will start on their adobe walls next week, they say they will have the walls ready for the roof in two weeks. Last month I baptized 20 there and I will return November 3rd to baptize about fifteen more. They will need help for a roof and doors who will help?

Chavinillo, we now have two lots and the brethren there want to build adobe walls but, they also will need a roof and doors and windows. Who will help?

October 22 James Washer, Charles Burgess and Roger Williams will be arriving here in Huanuco. We have meetings planned in all the churches. My health is much better, thank you for praying.

We had a good return trip to Brazil. After we left Hiddenite, N.C. that I wrote about in my last letter we spent one night with our daughter Brenda and her family and then the weekend in Florida where I preached for Brother Elgey Hornsby at the Jordan Baptist Church in the morning and for Brother Doug and the Parkridge Baptist Church that night. Our trip from there to Brazil was uneventful and while in Manaus I preached at one of the mission points that Brother Harold Bratcher is in charge of. We are thankful to the Harold Bratchers for taking us into their home for a few days while we were in Manaus.

While we were gone the pastor of the Faith Baptist Church in Varzea Grande was also gone helping out in another work in Galia, Sao Paulo. The church in their regular business meeting had a couple of brethren that arose to try to get rid of their pastor. After the meeting one of the members phoned the pastor and he returned to take care of the matter. One week later they had another meeting, but the pastor was not able to handle it, so he turned it over to me. When it came to a vote, even those who wanted to get rid of him voted for him to stay. The Pastor returned to Sao Paulo to finish the work he started there and asked me to help take care of the church until he returned.

The Good Hope Baptist Church that I have already been taking care of seems to be getting some "Good Hope". Last Sunday we had our best attendance since I took over this work. We had 48 in the morning service and 55 in the one at night. We have a goal to reach 80 to 100 in attendance within six months. We think the goal is realistic and we will need the prayers of all of you to reach this.

So many times here people depend on the American missionary and don't get too involved. In a few months we will start thinking about coming to the States. They need to get used to the idea of being without our presence.

Our mission here in Anil is continuing to have increased attendance. We had a youth rally at our facilities near the mission. It was a great success. Many young people heard the gospel and saw how young people can be Christians and still enjoy themselves.

I am trying to get used to using my new glasses. I

had never used them and am starting out with bifocals. I'm still stumbling along, but I guess I'll get used to them after awhile.

The work at Anajatuba is steady. The house for the worker has the walls up. I need to go there soon to look things over. Our work there has been slow to grow in number, but we are pleased with our work there. We just hope he doesn't get discouraged. The church in Sao Mateus is doing well. I haven't heard from the Peritoro church this month.
