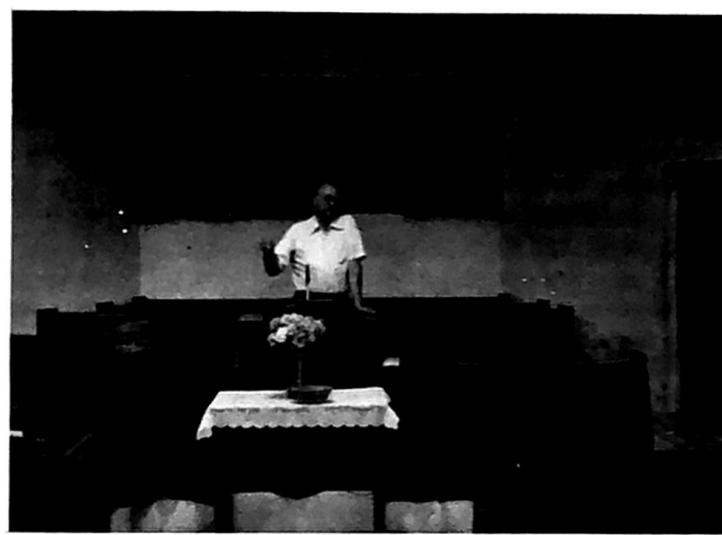

On November 15, Brazil's Independence Day, and this year their election day, our people from Duartina Mission, Galia Church and Garcia Church spent the day together here in Garcia. Dinner was supplied by all. There was plenty to eat. The day was spent in pleasant conversation by the older folk and there were lots of games for the children and young people. All of those present had been saved since coming to Garcia.

Wish there was space for me to tell you about Carlos, Rinaldo, Sergio, Carlitos, Hozanah, Adriano, Henrique, Itamar, Miriam, all young people who have been saved and baptized from the bus ministry in Vera Cruz. Besides these young people, many children and adults, also.

Sunday night two unwed mothers were saved. One has a boy, age 10, who comes on one of our busses. He is always here on Sunday morning. But, Sunday night he came and brought his mother and aunt. He brought them to the front of the church and seated them on the front seat. When I went to greet them he said, "Pastor, this is my mom." When the sermon was finished and the invitation was given the little boy had a saved mother and a saved aunt.

Our radio program continues in the city of Cornelio Procopio in the State of Parana. All of the persons there who have been saved or who have attended with the exception of a few have been reached through the broadcast. One young mother wrote, "We want the program to continue because it was through hearing the Bible on the program that my husband and I are now saved."

The Center of Theological Study and Evangelism is finishing the second semester. Classes are held three nights weekly here in Garcia.

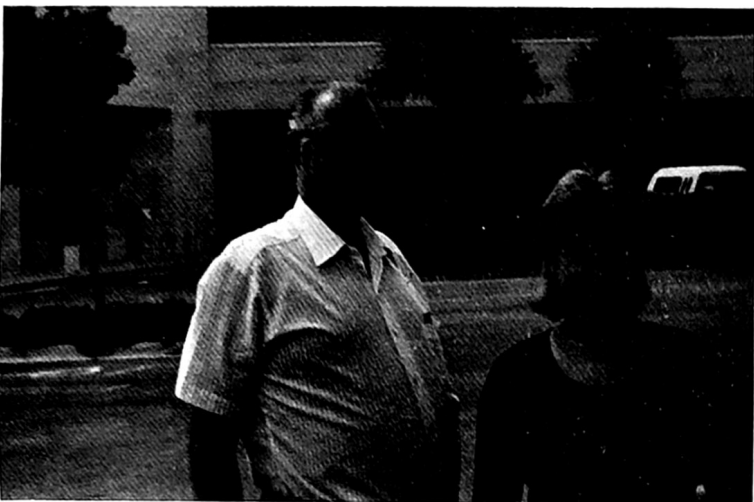

## Report On Mission Trip . . . Several Decisions For The Lord . . . Brother Miguel Ibernón's Wife Went To Be With The Lord

Dear Brethren,  
I quote from the October 17th Mission Sheet Letter: "Yesterday, Richard arrived to be with us some 10 days. He is from the San Jacinto Baptist Church, Amarillo, Texas. We will be leaving tomorrow to visit some of our missions in the interior."

We, (Mrs. Bratcher & I, Richard and our pilot - Francisco) left the day marked and arrived back in Manaus the following Thursday night the 24th. We held four services with the "Congregação Batista de Vila de Amatori" and I service on Tuesday night at the Novo Remanso mission and then one service with the New Jerusalem Baptist Mission on Wednesday night. The Lord blessed with some four decisions during the trip. The largest attendance was at the New Jerusalem mission - 81 present.

On Sunday, October 27th - I preached Sunday morning at the Mauzinho Baptist Mission and then that night, at the Maranata Regular Baptist Church, Raimundo Amaro, pastor.

Saturday afternoon, November 2nd a small group of us from the 14th of December Baptist Church held services at Joel's grave and then at Mis-

sionary E. A. Nelson's grave.

Sunday, November 3rd - both services Mauzinho and then Sunday, the 10th preached on Sunday morning at the 14th Church and then at Mau. Last Sunday morning I preached again at Mau. The Saturday night before and then Sunday night I preached at the Hope Baptist Church - A. Cantanhede Almeida, pastor.

Pastor Miguel Ibernón da Cruz sends his greetings to all of the directors of Baptist Faith Missions. A few days after he asked me to convey his greetings his wife of many years and after a lingering illness - died. Let us all continue to pray for this brother who for many years has been a faithful pastor.

Last Wednesday night we held services as usual at Mau. We had an unusual service. The attendance was down but there was rejoicing in heaven when an 28 year old man looking like the prodigal son made a profession of faith.

Dear Brethren  
Only one more report after this one and this year will be ending. Time flies by and we don't get nearly all done we want to do. But the Lord is never late in blessing us who are so unworthy. Our health is generally better. Do continue to remember the Drapers in your prayers. Also, my dad is in need of your prayers. He is still battling against cancer. But he already has the victory through Christ. For this we are thankful.

We have been truly blessed this month in the works. We finally got the problem in Peritoro settled over the church property. We now have a clear deed. We won a court case and received the rest of the brick necessary to finish the workers dwelling in Anajatuba, and were able to buy the brick to commence the building behind the church here in town. All of this is done without BFM funds. It doesn't add up to a lot of dollars, but is something special here. We are praying that the Lord will lay it on someone's heart to give toward the Anil Building Fund. We have about

\$3,000 in the fund, which is about a third of what we probably need to build the church building. We have been waiting for 3 years on this, but are not dismayed. We have a place to meet there, but it is small and when all the members come it is already full.

I made a trip to Parnaíba this past month. This is a needy place for a worker or missionary. All of the Baptist work there is very weak and fellowships with every other denomination on a church basis. Over 100,000 people without a true Baptist witness. We continue to pray that the Lord will intervene in the paperwork of the brethren who are awaiting their visas. Things seem to be at a standstill here for the moment. But prices keep going up every day.

Our prayer is that the Lord will give a good Thanksgiving Conference this year. God bless all of you.
