We have an idea of the situation in North America. What about the four other countries where your B.F.M. Missionaries labor?

PULSE: 1-24-86:

Peru is fighting the drug traffic by destroying its Coca Crops. Coca farmers get from \$2,800. to \$3,200. an acre from Narcotics Makers for their crop. They get a one-time government payment of \$120. per acre from the government for turning themselves in.

Brazil, despite impressive economic gains, President Sarney remains a weak figure, without strong support in Congress and ignored by politicians scrambling to succeed him, even though three and a half years remain in his term.

South Korea, Student Activists and Political foes are feeling the wrath of President Chun. Protestors seem bent on Capitalizing on the country's economic woes. Chun wants to avoid an alliance of Oldline Political opponents and the middle class.

PULSE: 11-22-85:

Philippines, Reports from Washington say that both the Central Intelligence Agency and the Defense Intelligence Agency believe that President Ferdinand Marcos is losing his tight grip on the Philippines, and that only drastic reform can halt a plunge toward economic and political Chaos in the midst of fast-spreading Communist Rebellion.

TIME: 2-03-86:

Vice-Presidential candidate Salvador Laurel . . . is not alone in voicing the fear that Ferdinand Marcos will somehow rig the Feb. 07, elections to ensure his victory . . . 150,000 Filipinos are recruited to oversee each step of the elections. . . . the commission on Elections said that it would not allow . . . observers to come within 150 feet of polling places.

Need I say, our missionaries and the locals, need your prayers and concern in each of these countries?

Dr. Seo Ku Lee called from Korea a week or so back. He said things, as a whole, were doing well. The Kyoung Ban Pastor, Bro. Park, has been called as associate to Dr. Lee at the Faith Church in Seoul. Though Faith Church has but a make-shift type of a building, attendance is up. The Kyoung Ban Church called another pastor and seems to be doing well.

Mrs. Rebecca (Dana) Adams, is to undergo surgery today (1-29-86). I'm sure they would appreciate your prayers for her.

Dear Brethren,

January 17, 1986
We have begun a new year. Time marches on and so much still is not done. We have had a good

month. On New Year's Eve we had a good watch-night service with all of the men having opportunity to say a few words about how the Lord had blessed them. On the 23rd of December I preached at the church in Sao Mateus which is about 3 and one half hours away. We had a good service and I got home a little before daylight. The following night I spent in the hospital with an acute kidney blockage. The pain was almost unbearable, but the next day it was gone and hasn't given more trouble. Our daughter Michelle is having ear problems. Pray for us as we battle to take care of her.

I have many times asked that you brethren remember my dad in prayer due to his sickness with cancer. The Lord took him 5 days ago out of this wicked world and brought him into the glorious presence of Jesus Christ. We want to thank each one who has prayed and shown love toward him during this difficult time. Remember my mother who is left behind.

We had two members come back for reconciliation. They had been out of church for a long period of time. We pray that they will be faithful to the work and to the Lord. He has been preaching and singing for many years and his voice-box is about worn out. We haven't heard from the church in Peritoro this month. It is stable, but weak. Most of the members have died or moved away in the past 5 years.

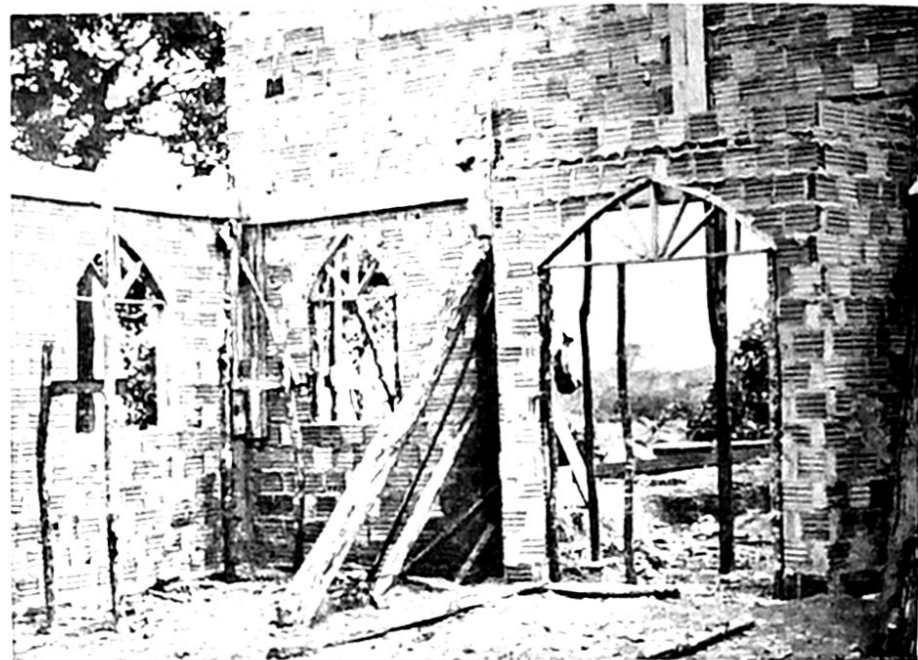

Report On Wanda's And Judson's Health . . . 120 In Christian Leadership Training . . . Building At Camp

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We are anticipating great blessings from the Lord as we begin another year of service for Him. This is the "gearing up" time for us. Sometimes it seems as we never "gear down".

Before going further I want to thank each of you who have prayed for Wanda's and Judson's health needs. We are grateful that God has provided medical expertise, but we know that all healing comes from our dear Father. Wanda is much better and recent X-rays indicate that Judson is recovering. The treatment for Judson's disease was 15 days in traction and 100 days in a body cast. He has done quite well during this period of immobilization. It now appears that he will be out of the cast in about 30 days. Please continue to pray for Him.

The Elementary program begins the new school year on February 18. We already have our capacity of 700 students enrolled. You may remember that we now only operate this school one shift daily rather than two, as in the past.

The Christian Leaders Training program now has 120 enrolled. We are very encouraged by the direction of this program. God has given us many good students.

February 8 - 12 is Camp Week for our church. This gives our young people the opportunity for spiritual reinforcement and training during a period of days when Satan has a "hayday" in Brazil. During this period of "Carnival" (feast of the flesh) we have a national "Mardi Gras". Through the special camp program this week becomes the Spiritual Highlight of the Year for our young people. We just recently completed two dorms, a dining hall and a Chapel at the Camp.

We are thankful that God has sent a new family to help us in our extensive building program this year. The Harry Lippert family arrived in Manaus last week. During this year Brother Lippert will be directing the construction of more buildings at the Camp and a new auditorium for Tabernacle Baptist Church. We are desperately in need of these buildings and we are thankful that God has sent the Lipperts to oversee this work.

Pray for us. We thank God for your faithfulness in prayers and financial support.

Dear Brethren,
It has now been 2 full months since we arrived back in Cruzeiro do Sul. I have been trying to catch up on a huge backlog of work. Some progress has been made, but much is yet to be done.

Attendance has been very low on Sunday mornings and folks are slow to arrive in the evening, although they do come in large numbers. This has been due mostly to trial of daylight savings time in Brazil. This is the first time for decades that they have used it and we still haven't figured out a way to get around it. Half of the population went ahead and made the change and the other half refused! Nevertheless, we have had a few saved almost every week. Last Sunday there were 2 and the Sunday before 3. Nine more were baptized in December.

I have visited the churches at Mancio Lima and Lagoinha. Both are doing very well. The church at Mancio Lima is preparing to build a new building for Sunday School. Two more families have been saved at Lagoinha and the church there is now having classes on Sunday morning.

We have placed a new worker at Rodrigues Alves. He is doing very well. There have been 4 saved there and the attendance has improved.

The mission at Valquirie has concluded the new building. One of our preachers, Brother Antonio Nery, is in charge there and goes there every 2 weeks. It is about 40 miles up river.

The church at Sacado, where Brother Carlos Braga is pastor, just celebrated another anniversary. They are doing well. The preachers there take care of the mission at Uniao.

Two more of our motors are down, awaiting parts. I pulled them off before they were completely ruined. We now have just one in operation. Pray that our parts and new equipment will arrive soon.

Report On River Trip To New Jerusalem And Mauzinho . . . Baptize 17 . . . Please Help Building Fund

Dear Brethren,

I wrote in my November letter that I would be writing in the next Mission Sheet letter about

marriages and baptisms which I'm thankful that I shall be able to write about them. I didn't know that also I would have to write about the death of two faithful and elderly members of the 14th of December Baptist Church.

On the 22nd of December we learned of the death of Jose Joaquim dos Passos - 72 years old. He died in the Chapot Prevost Hospital. On the morning of the 25th we went to visit the dear brother Joao de Sousa - age 96. He died just as we entered the house. Three short funeral services were held - two in the home (Asa Mark conducted one of the two) and one in the cemetery on the 26th.

On the 18th of December I left Manaus (Marie stayed with our new granddaughter at Asa Mark's house) aboard the launch. We held services that night at New Jerusalem and then the following night at Novo Remanso. Friday night found us at the Vila de Amajari Mission where I performed a wedding and then attended the reception. Saturday the 21st the New Jerusalem Baptist Mission celebrated her 5th anniversary. I performed two weddings that afternoon. Supper was then served to all present. That night the new building (still not complete) was used. 189 were counted inside the new building and some 67

on the outside. The next day, after the morning worship service, I baptized six. On the 24th, back in Manaus, I performed a wedding at the Mauzinho Mission.

On the 31st of December we held a combined service - the Mauzinho Mission with and at the 14th of December Baptist Church. There I preached and then baptized 11 from the Mission.

From the 4th to the 12th of this month we held revival services each night at the Mission with a different preacher each night. The Lord blessed us with good attendance. We pray that we will reap more results later.

We express our thanks to each church and individual who contributed to the regular fund and or designated a gift in November. May the Lord continue to bless as we all continue to contribute to Baptist Faith Missions.

The baptizing on December 22nd at the New Jerusalem Mission causes me to ask that you contribute for our new buildings so that we can put in a baptistry in the new building there. I had trouble in maintaining my footing while baptizing in the river there.

The Lord willing, Mrs. Bratcher and I will be leaving next week to spend some 10 days with the Buzzard River Baptist Mission.

Pray for us. May the Lord bless you in our prayer.
