Dear Brethren,

We send you greetings once again from Peru. Our Lord has given us another wonderful month with growth in most all the churches and missions. At the newly organized church in Santo Tomas, we are continuing the construction of the building and will be hosting the 8th annual Thanksgiving Conference from the 3rd to the 9th of August. We are expecting a minimum of 500 people in attendance during each day of the conference. There will be brethren from all over Peru present here in Iquitos for this event of teaching and preaching God's Word. We are anxiously looking forward to the Crains being here with us also. We expect many souls saved during the week of evangelism and preaching and many, many lives changed as a result of this conference. We are making every sacrifice possible to meet the needs that we will have in housing and feeding so many people for eight days, but as of now we fall short of what we will need. Please pray for our needs and if the Lord leads you to help in this give your special offering marked *Conference Peru*.

We have also been offered a piano that we would like to buy for the church, but it is well beyond our budget. It is \$1,200.00 and that to us is a great fortune. It would really be a pleasure to have a piano in the church at Santo Tomas. Maybe someone would like to help with this as a special donation or as a loan to be paid back in small monthly payments. Please let the Lord lead you to give.

This past month I also was in Lima renewing our

papers for residency here in Peru. While in Lima, I visited with the Bible Baptist Church and its pastor Fortunato Barrato. From there I went to Huanuco. Brother Crain had asked me to check on the work there. All is going well there. I preached at the Faith Baptist Church and also had lunch with the pastor and his family. The pastor is Carlos Estabridis. I also visited with the Zion Baptist Church Paucarbomba and the pastor Carlos Alberto Gonzales. I was also with the mission in Chavinillo and the pastor Juan Castro. I enjoyed visiting with each one of them.

The pastor of the Getsamani Baptist Church, Tingo Maria, was visiting in Huanuco. They had had some problems there, but thanks be to God, they have been settled. This pastor is Alberto Fabian.

While in Lima, I found out that it would be possible for another missionary to enter Peru, so if anyone feels led to come to Peru to do mission work, there is an opening and plenty of work to do.

On the 2nd of June, the Third Baptist Church had a special service. The pastor of the church, Daniel Castro, preached a very moving sermon about the importance of the churches working together to evangelize this area. It seemed as though all of the members of all the churches were present. It really thrills our hearts to see so many people, especially young people with so much desire and happiness to serve the Lord.

We had two professions of faith this last week at Divine Grace Baptist, Santo Tomas. Last night we had so many people in attendance that we needed more benches. We have been going early before each service to visit the families there and to witness to them about God's saving Grace.

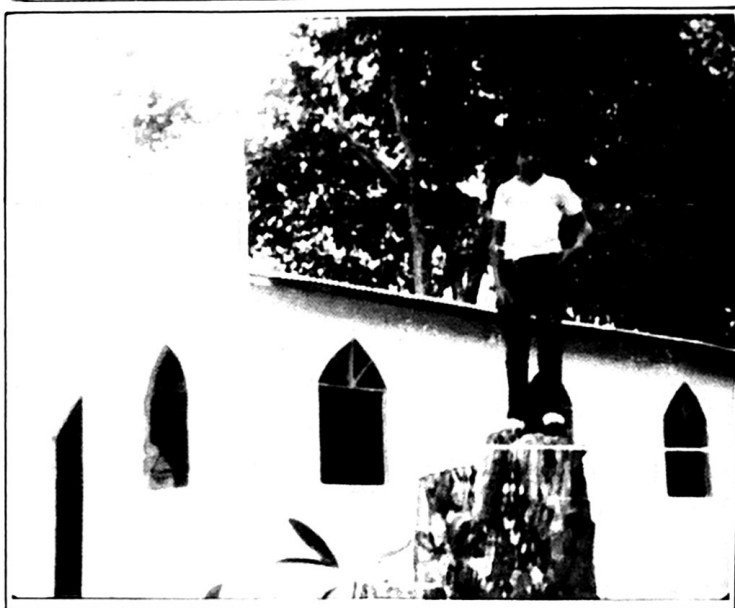

June 6th issue of PULSE, "Evangelical Missions Information Service," stated, "U.S. Church members are giving 10 cents per week to foreign missions."

You now have 16 missionary families with Baptist Faith Missions. The Hendersons left last Monday for the Philippines. Growth calls for more money.

Many of you have increased your giving regularly. Some of you have given special and large sums. Others of you have just recently had a special B.F.M. Founder's Service(s). It is hard to believe but, some have decreased or even dropped your support. We thank God for you who support and have such a concern for this, God's Work.

As it now stands, we need an additional \$5,000 monthly in the regular fund. A lot of money! Not really. How can you get it? Pastors, challenge your

members on an individual basis. Percentage giving or a set amount from the regular church treasury or mission's treasury is fine, BUT—what challenge is that to the individual member?

New Building At Valquirie . . . Visit Maita At Flood Time . . . Six Saved At Lagoinha

Dear Brethren,

There was so much to report last month that I was not able to give you all the news on all of our trips. Perhaps this letter will get us caught up.

As soon as the trip to the upper Jurua Mirim was finished I resumed my visits to the churches and congregations. The first week-end I was with the congregation at Valquirie, which is about 35 miles up the Jurua. The folks there have built their own building on a high bank overlooking the river. They covered it with aluminum roofing instead of thatch and painted it too. It can be seen for a mile down stream. One of our preachers, Brother Antonio Nery, takes care of this work and is there every other week. When he is not there one of the local men takes care of the services. They have a separate class for children on Sundays. In the regular service we had over 100 present.

The next week I was with the church at Maita.

This trip would usually be just routine, but because of the extraordinary flood it turned into a real adventure. There is a road to Maita, but with the river as high as it was I knew that the river would be over the road. I decided to go by boat. Four of our young people went with me. We encountered some un-exposed obstacles. The first was the bridge over the Moa River. The river was so high there wasn't enough clearance to get under and past. We took off the top and the engine cover, then asked some people who were on the bridge to get in the boat to weight it down enough to get by. It was still a struggle. Then when we got to the lake and saw that the church building was in the water and closed up! A man in a canoe told us that the church was meeting on terra firma over a mile in. I took the boat up the ditch beside the road, which was under 2 and 3 feet of water, almost to the meeting place! They had gathered over 170 people and the pastor was ready to preach all decked out in a suit in a government warehouse. Last week, a month later, I went back to visit them again. They were back in their own building with a huge crowd again and Brother Waldir in his suit. We went by Jeep this time and it was much easier.

I spent several days with the church at Lagoinha last month. I went with them on one of their local mission trips. At church on Sunday the crowds were excellent as usual: over 150. There were 6 adults saved in the morning and evening services. Two of the men were some of the last of our neighbors at camp who had not yet been saved, but that I had been praying for and witnessing to. The services were some of the most exciting that I have been in for a while. There were many tears of joy shed and plenty of hugging and rejoicing going on. You could tell that the members of the church had "invested heavily" in those souls.

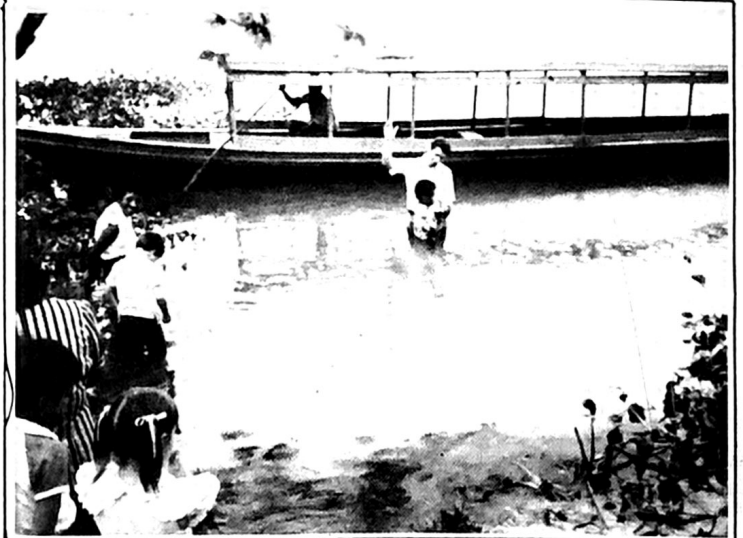
Life has been hectic, nevertheless there was still time to take one of our preachers, Brother Carlos Braga, to Cuiaba to hold a meeting at Boa Esperanca Baptist Church, where my father is working at this time. The meeting was good. Dad "made" me preach a couple of times. I also was privileged to preach on a Sunday night at Faith Baptist in Varzea Grande, where Brother Candido is pastor.

On the way back we stopped over in Manaus to buy parts and supplies for our work. While there we visited Chapada Baptist and Tabernacle Baptist.

It was refreshing to be able to visit my folks, Paul and David.

Home again now though and back at the grind, sweating up 2 or 3 shirts daily! Lord bless all of you and we thank Him for you all.

I don't remember if I mentioned last month that we baptized three more into the new work in Yarinacocha. We took a short boat trip to a beautiful site for the baptizing and while there the sky opened up and it started to pour down the rain. Well, we figured that we were there to get wet so we baptized in the pouring rain. It was a first for me, but the Lord blessed and we all had a good wet time.

Just yesterday the Lord answered our prayer for a new building site for our work in Yarinacocha. A lawyer friend of mine here came to the office of the school to see me and tell me that he felt led to give a piece of property to us in order to build. PRAISE THE LORD!!! We have close to 500 students this year from Kindergarten to high school. It is a large work full of opportunities. We are looking forward to seeing each one soon when we come home on furlough in a few months. We will be available for speaking engagements the first of August. Dear Brethren,

I never knew how much was involved in getting ready to move to another country. There are so many things you never think about if you're moving state to state, that is involved in going overseas. The cost that is involved almost is staggering just for the things you need to make a start, like towels, sheets, pots and pans, etc. We were informed by one company for 600 lbs that it would cost \$3000.00. This cost we felt was prohibitive. Pat and I had decided we would just go with what we could pack into four suitcases. But God always takes care of his servants. So while preaching at Zion Baptist Church, Brother Jon Rule, Pastor, in Taylor Michigan, I informed him of our plight. He immediately began to inform me he had a member of his church Debra Mastroeni, who was employed by Nippon Express. He was sure she could help. Brother Rule contacted her and from that point on arranged for us to meet with them. At first they informed us the cost would be \$1,500.00, we said praise the Lord. Then on Memorial

Day we traveled back to Michigan with our items to ship to the Philippines. On Tuesday Nippon Express informed us if we would ship by sea the cost would be \$378.00. God truly blessed, we praised Him. Also, we thank Brother Rule for all the time he devoted in the arrangements which he helped to secure for us. He saved us a lot of time and money.

Now we're setting things in order as we face the final preparations to leave June 23rd at 7:50 a.m. on our journey to the Philippines. Also, we want to thank all the churches who support B.F.M. so many of you have increased your offerings and by so doing, have made it possible for Brother Bean and us to leave now to our fields of service. We desire your prayers for us that God will sustain us thru the homesickness that I know we will experience. Again thank you pastors for making it possible for us to go to the Philippines.

Dear Brethren,

Before we returned to Brazil the church here voted to build a parsonage, but never got around getting started building. Before we could start building we have to build a place to keep building materials in, so we decided to close in a large area between the church and the wall for this. After we are finished with it for a storage building it can be used for another Sunday School room that we are already needing. Two weeks ago we got started on this and it should be finished soon. We have also bought some bricks and other materials for the house.

Along with trying to build the room at the church we have been trying to get the house we rented ready to move into. We now have it scrubbed and painted inside and are now in the process of buying furniture to get ready to move the last of this month. We bought a stove and had to order a refrigerator and washing machine. The refrigerator has already come, but we are still waiting for the washing machine. We also got the rest of our things out of storage and found that between the rats and the water much of it was pretty well ruined, but we have most of it cleaned up and are in the process of repairing what we can. We were also able to rent a phone, so next month I will try to remember to include our new phone number in my letter.

While in the States I tried to raise money for a bus, but without much success, so with what money I was able to raise and adding some to it two weeks ago

I bought a van. On the first Wednesday night we hit a record high for us of 49 people present. Our Sunday morning services are holding around 50 to 55 and our Sunday night service around 70 to 75.

The church received two by letter this month and had one young lady saved. We have had some visitors in almost every Sunday service. We are still looking for those families that will give us the stability we need, so continue to pray for us and the work here.

Dear Friends,

This has been a great month with showers of God's blessings. Last week another large diesel bus was purchased for \$2,300.

This morning a beautiful lot was purchased in the town of Lupercio. Size 65' x 130'. Cost: \$3,000 plus lawyer and court-house fees. Most important this month is that about 15 persons made professions of faith. Half of the people saved made professions of faith in the church services here in Garca. Our new (used) bus has to be reformed completely inside and painted on the outside. The Lord willing, this will be our second Mobile Auditorium. The cost will be close to \$3,000. Our present Mobile Auditorium went into the shop for a complete overhaul on the motor. Hopefully, it will be

back on the road by the end of the next week. Cost of the overhaul will run about \$1,000.

Another new item was added to our equipment here in Garca. We purchased a new Minolta copier. This has been needed for 10 years. Cost: over \$4,000. I can hear someone say, "Boy, that's high. Here in the States you can buy them a lot cheaper." Sorry, I am not in the States, and here you cannot buy them any cheaper. But, we praise the Lord for the equipment and hope that you will want to have a part in helping us pay for it.

On July 4th our Theology and Evangelism center finishes another semester of work. There are 11 persons attending and among them are the most dedicated persons I have had the privilege to work with.

Dear friends, please remember, presently, we are maintaining work regularly in seven cities, as well as one daily radio broadcast. Our church in Garca is paying salaries to four workers and pays for the bus fuel for four buses. A lot of people wonder how we do it and sometimes we wonder, too. We wonder why a lot of people do not give anything and why others give so little. Praise the Lord for those who give that others might hear and live.
