The Thanksgiving Offering

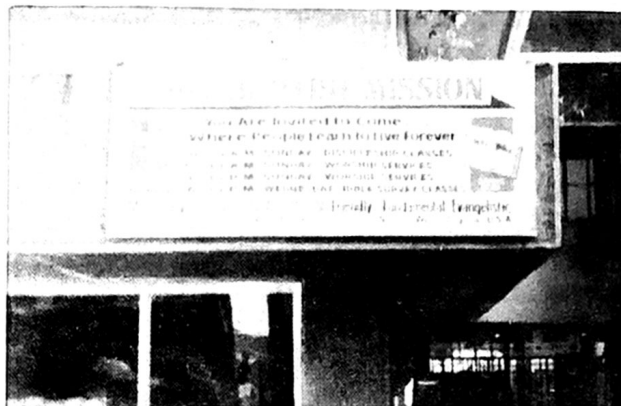

Work Begun in Paranaque . . . Great Persecution . . . Many Make Professions . . . Needs Revealed

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
We have begun a mission in Paranaque. We are averaging over twenty in each service.

We have had many to accept the gospel message. But the priest of the Catholic Church has really hindered the work. The priest has had a field day in attacking us. He told the children we would feed them to the alligators as part of our worship service. But praise the Lord the children continue to attend. He has followed us around in different disguises seizing the tracts we pass out. He has warned the people if they attend the services at Zion Baptist Mission, he will be writing their names down and will excommunicate them. Also, he has employed some hoodlums to disrupt the services. But God continues to bless with people making professions at almost every service. We have seen over one hundred make professions, some in home Bible studies and others in the mission. Some have been scared off by the priest. But thank God we have some willing to face the persecution, to attend and learn more of God's Word. They are willing to face verbal attacks by the priest and those the priest uses to attack them.

Yes, the priest has even used parents to forbid their children to attend. One little girl 11-years-old, told me, "Mom told me don't go to that Baptist Mission. But through the pastor, I told Mom, at Zion Baptist Mission I have learned to trust in

Jesus, please don't make me stop going. Finally my mom said I can go but she won't, because it would cause too many problems." Yes, this young girl comes faithfully even though she is ridiculed at the Catholic School. She is willing to take a stand when many adults will not, they cower to the threats and quit attending. We still trust God will raise up a church here in this city of over 400,000. This is a catholic stronghold. It seems we're either facing the communist or the Roman Catholic Church as the opposition, wherever we strive to labor. We will be having our first Baptismal Services the last Sunday in October. Pray for the converts that God will bless their obedience as they follow the Lord in believer's baptism in spite of the threats being made. I know by the opposition we face, God is testing us and the people of this area. I pray God will raise up a group of people willing to endure all things for the elect's sake, that this will be one of many Baptist Churches in the years to come in this community. Brethren, you said to inform you of our needs. We have spent a lot of our own personal money to get this mission started. We are trusting in God to help in keeping it open and for the expenses. Will some of you please help with our needs? The people need Bibles and the other needs of operating this work until the Lord adds the people that can financially support it. We are hoping to open another mission as soon as the Lord provides our needs. If you can help, please mark your offerings for Henderson's New Works. God bless all of you. (Romans 15:30)

The White's Report on Mission Trip

Brother Overbey,

Our Lord God blessed Joanne and I with the privilege of visiting some of his work and his dear servants in the country of Brazil, South America from August 27 - September 21, 1986. Here is a little summary of our trip.

On August 27th, we left Lexington arriving in Manaus, Brazil August 28th. Brothers Odali Barros, Harold and Asa Mark Bratcher met us at the airport and took us to Brother Paul and Sister Wanda Hatchers. We stayed three days with Paul and Wanda - visiting the Tabernacle Baptist Church, school, and camp.

On August 30th, we left along with Brother Odali and flew to Porto Velho and I preached at a church out of Tabernacle Baptist Church with Odali interpreting.

On August 31st, we left Porto Velho going to Rio Branco in order to catch a plane for Cruzeiro Do Sol where Brother Mike and Sister Beverly Creiglow minister. On September 1st we arrived in Cruzeiro Do Sol with Brother Mike and Sister Beverly meeting us.

On September 2nd, we visited the Church Camp and helped install a roof on one building.

On September 3rd, we visited several of Mike's works with Odali preaching that night. On September 4th, all were sick - virus.

On September 5th, we were in Cuiaba where Brother Bobby and Sister Betty Creiglow minister.

On September 6th, we visited some of the work.

On September 7th, I preached in two of the churches with Brother Odali interpreting.

On September 8th, we went to Rio for a day.

On September 9th, we arrived in Garca where Brother John and Sister Acton Hatcher minister. One of their members moved out of her house and turned it over to us, as Odali's wife Kathy and three children were staying with the Hatchers.

On September 10th, we visited some of the work in three different towns and also saw the mobile auditorium that was modified from a bus which is wisely used in starting new work.

I preached that in the church at Garca with Odali interpreting.

On September 11th, we helped paint Odali and Kathy's house in Vera Cruz where they will begin their first work. We caught a sleeper overnight bus to Sao Paulo.

On September 12th, left Sao Paulo at 9:15 p.m. for Sao Luis where Brother George and Sister June Bean minister.

On September 13th, arrived in Sao Luis at 2:00 a.m. and were met by the Beans. We visited some of the work.

On September 14th, I preached at New Hope Baptist Church in the morning with Brother Bean interpreting.

I preached at Faith Baptist Church in the evening service with Brother Bean interpreting. Two men made a profession of faith. Brother Bean baptized three (3) adults at the beginning of the service.

On September 15th, we visited some mission points close to town.

On September 16th, we visited some works in other towns, one of which had an 81 year old pastor who was teaching a class on the Trail of Blood, Alien Baptist by Brother Nivens, and P. T. Simmons Book on Bible Doctrine.

On September 17th, we preached at prayer meeting service at New Hope with Brother Bean interpreting. We later caught a plane to Manaus.

On September 18th, we arrived in Manaus at 4:30 a.m. met by Brother Harold Bratcher. We visited the Fourteenth of December Baptist Church where Asa Mark Bratcher is pastor.

Dear Friends,

We have arrived in Southern Brazil and have begun our new work. God blessed wonderfully in our trip and finding a new home.

We have been holding services in our home and will continue to do so until we can find or build a building. At our first meeting we had 13 unsaved visitors from our neighborhood. We shared the gospel with them and hope to see them trust Christ as their Savior. Our first contact in this city (a young man) shows a strong interest in learning more about our beliefs and how to have a personal relationship with Christ. This seems a bit strange because he is a communist from a Jewish family (which is

Catholic). We are praying that God will open his heart to trust Christ.

At present we are severely limited in the extent of our meetings because of the lack of a proper meeting place. Our home serves fine for friendship meetings with our neighbors, but doesn't allow for any large evangelization outreach. We are planning to have a week of evangelistic meetings in the near future, but we must have an auditorium prepared. We have found an excellent building that would serve the purpose but we don't have the funds to buy it at present. As the Lord lays it upon your heart help us to obtain a place where we can preach the gospel to the lost in Southern Brazil.

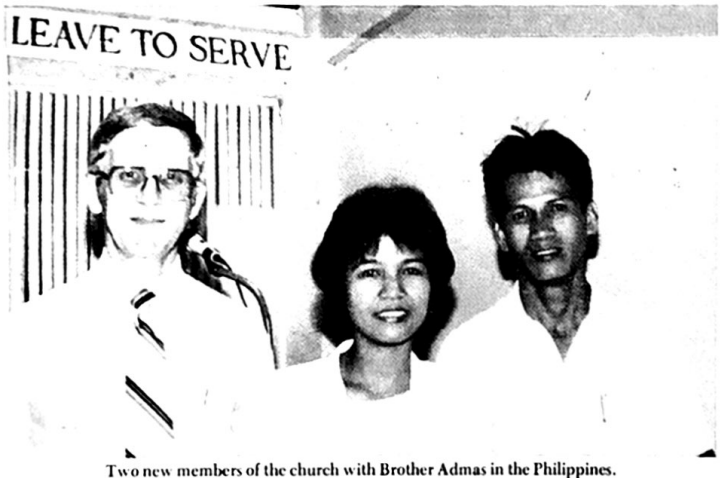

Trip to Mission Points on the Launch . . . Gun Battle at Mauzinho . . . Special Prayer Requests

Dear Brethren,

Friday morning, September 26th, I left Manaus aboard the Mission Launch - "Jack II." Mrs. Bratcher (Marie) had to stay behind this time. That night I preached to 28 at the Novo Remanso Baptist Mission. Saturday, all day, was spent with the New Jerusalem Baptist Mission. The occasion was the dedication of their new church building - temple or house of prayer. Appreciation was expressed during the service to all of you in the U.S.A. who helped through your offerings and prayers to make the new building a reality. Supper was served to all who attended. More than 300 people were fed. That night I preached to 280. The Lord gave us two decisions (one rededication and 1 profession of faith). Sunday morning after an early service (6:00-6:30 a.m.) we traveled to "Vila de Amatari." There I preached to 43 at an early service and then by traveling all night we arrived home early Monday morning.

Wednesday night - October 1st - we went to Mauzinho for Prayer Meeting. Our attendance was down - 43 present. I was almost through with the message when two policemen in uniform walked in and attended the rest of the service. They had evidently been summoned by one of the members thinking that another one of the members (a widow) needed their help. She didn't.

While the policemen were talking in front of the building and only three of us were still inside, behold a robber passed by! The policemen ordered him to halt! He answered with bullets - one of which wounded a neighbor's dog and another bullet of the bandit entered the church building - hit the back of a bench and then after passing by under my chin - fell to the floor. We did the same as a precaution - but by that time the duel between the cops and the robber was already over. The robber escaped and according to last Sunday's paper is still assaulting as the leader of a gang. Pray for the salvation of the criminal. His name is Jeremias. Pray for the police of Mauzinho as well. Pray for our open air services on Fridays, night, October 12th - 27 present. It rained!

Brethren, pray for us and continue to give to the regular fund and to "Bratcher's Buildings" which including all the churches and missions we have helped are not a few. Some one remarked after examining the bullet marks in the building, that if we had a brick building it would give us more protection against the bullets. Pray and give that we might be able to construct any future buildings out of bricks.

May the Lord bless each one of you during the Thanksgiving Conference. We will be praying for you. Brethren pray for us.

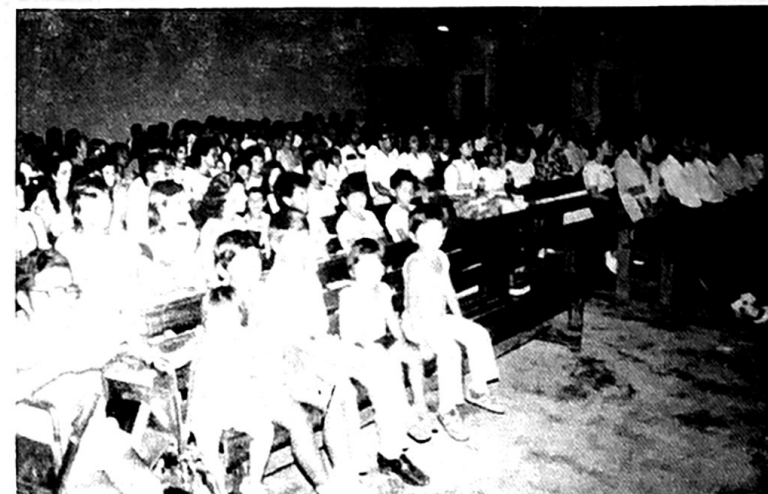
No one can understand or know the pressure that is on a missionary unless it is his wife or another missionary. It takes a considerable amount of time just to secure the necessities of life. Milk, eggs, cheese and meat are in shortage here. You buy these things when you can find them. We recently did some construction work at church. Here you try to find the material you need and then get it delivered. I spent many hours just trying to get everything we needed to do the job. I bought a Volkswagen bus from Brother Draper before he went home and put it in the garage for a new paint job and cut out the rusted parts, the man promised it in 45 days. I finally got it out in 4 months and 10 days with me looking for and buying the needed parts. I have been trying to get the bus transferred to my name for three days now and I finally had to get a dispatcher to do this as there is so much corruption in the Department of

Transit that I personally could not get this done. After two more days I got it transferred and tagged for a year. We have pressure on us when there is so much to do and no funds to do it. As I wrote last month we have two construction projects stopped because we have no more funds to work on them. Only the strong can take it and then sometimes we go under. June and I try to counterattack by walking and running for one hour each morning and we are also driven to our knees in prayer to call upon the Lord of Lords. We have had a good month in all our works this month. I visited Anajatuba Friday night and they are enlarging their meeting house with them doing the work and buying most of the materials. They want to organize in December and they want their building ready. I visited the mission at Anil Thursday night and they are down as the pastor is spending too much time with his business and the is going down. New Hope Baptist has started having one week each month in prayer meetings at the church. We have had three to come forward reconciling with the Lord. One man came yesterday and reconciled who had been disciplined by the church many years ago. Pray for us as we labor. Give your offerings to B.F.M. and to Bean Buildings.

Land Purchased at Alvar de Carvalho . . . Construction Begun in Lupercio Plan Works in Two New Towns

Last month, land was purchased in the town of Lupercio. Last week land was purchased in the town of Alvaro de Carvalho. Construction has begun in Lupercio. Regular work is now being maintained in 7 cities. The new work in Alvaro de Carvalho makes 8. By the end of October, the Lord willing, we plan to have work in the towns of Santa Terezinha and Alvinlandia. These two towns will make a total of 10 being reached with the Gospel through the New Works in Sao Paulo.

This week, work was started on the construction in Lupercio. The lot has been leveled off, stumps rooted out, water connected and tomorrow the installation for electricity will be made. The concrete mixer is on the lot, and the Lord willing, digging for the footers will start next week. This building will be 32' x 52' with an auditorium that will seat 100 people, two

classrooms that can be used for extra auditorium space, and two toilets.

The same size building will be built on the lot in the town of Alvaro de Carvalho. Friends, your financial help is needed to build these buildings. The Lord will provide one way or another but, perhaps you are in a position to help in a very special way.
