Judson continues to improve. The Orthopedic doctor is expecting him to be sufficiently improved by February to set aside the crutches. He is due to have x-rays in January to verify the condition of the femur - hip joint. Judson has displayed good attitude throughout these past 15 months of confinement. Because of his confinement we have taught Judson at home. This has added to a busy schedule, but we are thankful for the opportunity to spend additional time with him during this important period of his life.

Tabernacle Baptist Church just recently completed the construction of a Chapel in the Sao Jose area of Manaus. This brings the total of Chapels built this year to three. We are grateful that the Lord sent the Lippert Family to work with us in the labor and oversight of these building projects. The chapels are used as evangelistic preaching points. These have replaced the bus ministry as the primary evangelistic thrust of our church. Once the buildings are up, the cost and maintenance

is much less than with buses. This factor is very important during this period of economic instability in Brazil.

The chapels are staffed with preachers and students from the Church and Seminary Training Program. This also gives us an excellent way to monitor and help new preachers and workers before they leave to work as missionaries in other areas. During the past days we have been privileged to have one of our former student couples with us.

Dishon and his wife, a missionary couple fully supported by Tabernacle, are in from their place of labor. They are doing an excellent job in the city of Porto Velho. The Lord has really blessed their faithful efforts. They are in Manaus for the birth of their first child. Both Dishon and his wife were saved and discipled in Tabernacle Baptist Church and trained in the Seminary Program. Your support has enabled us to train this couple. Workers like these are the means that we believe God will use to evangelize Brazil.

During the past year we have seen 7 students from the Church and Seminary go to labor in other states of Brazil. These have all gone to work in previously established churches or missions. The great need of mission work is for national leaders reaching out to reach and lead their own people. The goal of our church is to continue to reach and develop people to serve in the cause of Christ. Pray for us as we continue labor for the Lord during the coming year.

Thanks, once again, for surrendering yourselves to the Lord as co-laborers with us during the past year and former years of our ministry here in Brazil. May the Lord richly bless you.

Greetings:

This year is the last letter for 1986. Have we been good stewards of the year; with time, talent and money?

SOME FRUITFUL TIME THOUGHTS

Suppose your bank credited your account each morning with \$86,400 carried over no balance from day to day, and allowed you to keep no cash in your account. Then suppose that every evening the bank cancelled out whatever you failed to use during the day. All of us have such a bank. Its name is time. Every morning it credits us with 86,400 seconds. Every night it rules off as lost whatever time we have failed to invest for good during the day. If you fail to use the day's deposits the loss is yours. There is no going back with time--no drawing against tomorrow. You must live in the present. Invest it in order to deepen your life and your faith.

Would you believe that we shall have had 31,536,000 seconds to our account in 1986? I wonder how wisely our time was invested. As the year 1987 is approached, shall we determine to more wisely invest our time? Shall we not also more wisely invest our earthly possessions (Luke 16:8-12) in eternal things (missions; lost souls; God's Business)?

TAX REVISION and

CHARITABLE GIVING FOR 1987

No doubt many are wondering how the tax revision of 1986 will affect your deductions for giving.

Charitable gifts of cash: Deductible up to 50% of adjusted gross income for itemizers. 10% of taxable income for corporations.

Charitable gifts of non-cash appreciated property (securities, real estate etc.): deductible for full fair market value up to 20% of adjusted gross income for itemizers. Some high-income donors may owe minimum tax on the capital gain portion.

Charitable gifts of tangible personal property (art, jewelry, collections, etc.): if property use is related to charity's objectives, same deduction as for no-cash property above. If unrelated deduction is limited to original cost of property (its "basis").

Carryover Provision: If more than the deductible limit is given in one year, excess deductions may be claimed over the next five tax years, as long as you continue to itemize.

Dear Brethren,

In our last letter we were hoping to start our services last Sunday, but the house did not work out as we thought. I preached for a Baptist Missionary that lives near me Sunday morning and night.

Also, I have been working on trying to buy some land and after spending several days looking for the rightful owner, it was disappointing as we found out that he was asking \$26,780 for a lot 65 by 65 ft. - 4225 sq. ft. I knew that land would be high, but I never thought that small lot would cost that much. I have found some land further out of town - south of Lima and I will see about that land tomorrow.

We have been taking care of the Gasque baby, Sara Beth, and she is a sweet baby. She has been with us over three weeks and we will surely miss her when Brother Gasque comes back from Iquitos to get her.

Sister Ada Mayfield came from Pucallpa and spent a few days with us while doing some paper work here in Lima. We enjoyed her stay with us and shared some precious memories that we had with her and Brother Mayfield that is now with the Lord. Ada came back soon.

Last week I was busy getting our addresses changed on our carnets. You would think that you could do something like that in one day, but not in Lima. I was busy most of the last week getting it done and I went today and they told me to come back Friday and they would be ready. When that is done, most of our paper work will be done for two years.

This is now four days after starting this letter and during that time I thought that I had found a lot to start building on. Just before I agreed to buy the lot, I found out that there was a Baptist work started less than two blocks away. We need your

prayers so that we may know the Lords will and be able to find the land or building to start the work here in Lima. I know that it will cost money because everything is costly here in Lima, but Lima is where the people are.

Brother Bean touched on the problem in his mission letter. We are here as your missionaries and many times we have to wait until the churches decide to send the help that we need to get something done. Being so far away from you makes it hard to communicate and get the message over to you.

ANOTHER NEED: I have a van equipped to haul crippled people. I would like to start working with people who cannot move around normally. I need several wheel chairs. If you know of any sitting around and not being used, could you help us and let us know?

This week I have to make a trip to Progresso. I received a letter saying that the city was trying to take over our property. We have a house and a church building with proper papers made out to us. But I have to make the trip to find out what is the problem.

I also have to go to Chavinillo to baptize 22 people who have made professions of faith. I also have some to baptize in Ayapiteg.

All the work in Huancu Tingo Maria is going well. The Zion Baptist in Huancu are doing real well with their two missions. We will soon need another roof and doors, who will help? We need about \$1000 to buy the lumber for trusses, metal roof and doors. I am thankful for the interest the Peruvian Pastors are showing in mission work in Huancu and Tingo Maria.

Tomorrow, I will be going into the hospital for tests for blood circulation in the legs and also, tests for ulcers. Remember - don't forget to PRAY.

Dear Brethren,

The trials have been many lately, but the blessings have been many also. In November we baptized a lady named, Vicki, into the Zion Baptist Mission. She really stood faithful inspite of the persecution. The priest ordered her husband, a devout, fanatic Catholic, to whip his wife if she attended Zion Baptist Mission. This he did almost every time she attended the services. She continued inspite of the abuse.

This caused her husband to become more abusive. He attended our services to see what type of (brainwashing) system were using on people. He would come, fold his arms and mock as the Word of God was preached. On Sunday, November 30, the Lord put him under conviction, in the morning service he went home, got drunk, came back during the evening services and tried to disrupt our services. I might add the Catholic Church had a fiesta this day. That is where he got drunk. We talked with him, and explained we were praying for his salvation. His wife wept uncontrollably because she did not want to face another beating. We walked him home after the services and the church prayed for his salvation. Tuesday, December 2, we went to his home and God wonderfully saved this Saul of the Philippines. (Acts 9)

We pray as intensively, as he fought against the local church, that God will now use his salvation to raise up another Paul.

We are rejoicing over how God can overrule those who try to fight and oppose his work. We are looking forward by God's grace to organize this mission December 21, 1986 into a local church. Pray for this church, they have endured much persecution. How faithful they stand inspite of the persecution. We are averaging about 70 in at-

tendance. We have a membership of 41 with 20 more to be baptized December 14, 1986.

We have begun another mission outreach in Las Pinas. A family we won to the Lord in street preaching has offered the use of their home to start. We are starting our first Bible study December 6 in this area. Pray for Las Pinas. It has over 200,000 people and no Baptist Church. Pray that God will allow us to be used to raise up a local church in this region.

Pastor Soo Hyum Chung of the Shin Nea Baptist Church of Korea, was our guest for ten days. We enjoyed his fellowship, we introduced him to various pastors we know in the Philippines. We kept him busy going with us on our visitations and Bible studies. He was with us in Las Pinas area when the family accepted Christ as Savior. He said he was happy we were busy seeking to win the lost.

The Philippine Independent Baptist Seminary has 25 students enrolled. They need desks or tables. It will cost about \$20 per desk. Would you be willing to purchase one for the school? I know each missionary has needs. Our expenses for these different needs has to come from special designated offerings. That's why each missionary asks you to designate your special offerings for their special projects. Our expenses hinder us from doing more unless you make the funds available. Please, as the Lord leads, mark your offerings for Henderson's New Works or the Philippine Independent Baptist Seminary. Our expenses have been great, we need your offerings soon if we are to equip another mission with chairs, song books, building, (to be used in the formation of another local church). Many said let us know your needs, that is why I have stated our needs.

Phil. 4:19, we are claiming this promise as we face the great needs of proclaiming the gospel in this country.

Hello again from the Stanton Family. This letter is being written from the States once again. I returned from Peru after having been gone one month. I returned on December the 4th. It was a good trip and I was able to get everything taken care of that needed to be. The new mission work was down in attendance some, but that was to be expected. Sister Ada Mayfield is doing a good job in the school and has everything under control. She sends her love and holiday greetings to everyone.

The fall semester of Lexington Baptist College ended December 15, and will begin again on January 12th. We are looking forward to teaching Spanish again in the Spring semester. Pray for Lexington Baptist College; it is a great school, still teaching the truth of God's word and worthy of your support.

I have one urgent request for our mission work in Yarina-Cocha. We now have about 1 1/2 acres of ground for us to build on, but we desperately need to put a barbed wire fence around it until we can get back in June and start to build. The cost to level the property and put the fence around it will cost approximately, \$400,000. Sister Mayfield will have this work done for us but she needs the money to do it. Pray about it and give toward this project as the Lord leads you. But remember, it is urgent that we do this soon.

For those of you who are supporting some of our Baptist children by paying their tuition in our school in Pucallpa, please keep it up. However,

this year 1987, we have had to raise tuition to \$16.00 per month due to inflation. This is a 34% increase. Please consider an increase in your giving proportionately. Thanks.

In all the churches that I speak in and present our work in Peru, many people ask me what they can do to help us in the ways of supplies or equipment. The following is a list:

NEW MISSION WORK: P.A. System, Electronic Keyboard.

BIBLE INSTITUTE: Overhead Projector, 3 cases of blank VHS Video Cassettes.

BAPTIST SCHOOL: Volleyballs, basketballs, nets, used microscopes, and 5 Commodore 64 Computers for teaching.

PERSONAL: Used motorcycles for our mission helpers and myself.

I had the pleasure of being with the Faith Baptist Church of Waseon, Ohio on December the 14th. Brother Dan Walborn is their fine Pastor and a personal friend of mine. I really had a good time visiting and fellowshiping with them once again.

This is drawing near for the cut off date for accepting people for our summer mission tour. So you won't want to miss this trip, hurry and send in your deposit soon to reserve your place. Remember to send your pastor and his wife also!! My wife and I are looking forward to showing you the beautiful country and white mission fields of Peru! Until next month, may God bless as you remain faithful to Him.

Both are missions of the 14th of December Baptist Church of Manaus. The Lord willing, Friday night we'll again be at the Vila de Amatori Mission and Saturday night again at Novo Remanso. Sunday, we'll celebrate the 6th anniversary of the New Jerusalem Baptist Mission, Parana da Eva.

Saturday night, November 22nd, I preached at the 23rd of November Baptist Church there in Manaus. It was the dedication of their new church building and anniversary service as well. We were blessed seeing nine new believers baptized by Pastor Folha.

I visited two locations that Bro. Bobby has preaching points and he is trying to get buildings there to hold services in. I also visited The Garden of Olive Trees Baptist Church, Bro. Preaches In New Mission in Manaus . . . Five Decisions Made . . . Special Service at Joel's Grave . . . Very Special Need at Mauzinho . . .

Dear Brethren:

I have just finished reading my diary since the date of the last Mission Sheet letter to refresh my memory in preparation for the writing of this letter.

The work at Mauzinho continues to grow slowly. Sunday morning November 9th, we had 85 in Sunday Bible School. Last Sunday we dropped to 64. On a recent Friday night some nine of us met together for the purpose of seeking together the solution for us to have a better fellowship among us. I have preached at Mauzinho Baptist mission every Sunday morning and Sunday night (except one) and Wednesday night. On Sunday night - October 26th, I preached at a mission of one of the Independent Bible Baptist Churches of Manaus, at the Sao Jose de Operario No. 2 suburb. There were some 40 people present including one poor woman that after the service asked several of us our names. When asked what was her name she replied that she didn't know what was her name. Evidently she was drinking. Pray for her that she will soon come to know Him who has the "name that is above every name." Some five decisions were made. Brother Joao Ricardo dos Santos is the pastor of that new work.

On Sunday afternoon, November 2nd, I held services at Joel's grave in the Sao Joao Batista Cemetery. As usual, on that day, dedicated to the dead, I preached to the living concerning life eternal.

I am remembering that next Monday, (November 24th), the Thanksgiving Conference will begin. I am praying for the Lord to bless.

Pray for us that the Lord will continue to bless and revive our work here. Remember, that our needs are many. Permit me to share an urgent need with you. At Mauzinho we have three Sunday School classes. Two are now meeting in the church building and one outside. Dona Maria Livramento Lima Paes and her son and two girls that are staying with her are living in our Sunday School building. It is a very small house. Dona Maria's husband was killed by a truck on the 29th of August of last year. The mission helps her with a small offering each month. Her house was recently destroyed by a truck. The truck was of the same company whose truck killed her husband. She has not as yet received any help from the company. They had no place to go, so we are letting them live in the Sunday School building. Thus, the need to build or buy another house is now more urgent than ever. \$5,000 would solve the problem. Give to the "Bratcher Buildings."

Mrs. Bratcher (Marie) sends her greetings along with me that the Lord would grant to each one of you a most blessed 1987. Marie needs your prayers. She is almost always with me in the services and visits.

By faith we thank you already for your help to us.

Dear Brethren,

I got my ID card after nine months and about 50 trips to the Federal Police. I am to renew it in February. June did not get hers, she is to go back November 20 and maybe get hers.

New Hope Baptist Church - Sao Luis: We are thinking of opening up a New Work in Cantahede which is about 74 miles from Sao Luis. June and I drove there the other day to look around. Soon we are going with our young people to do a survey and an open air service. I estimate 3,000 people in the town and about 8-10 thousand living nearby.

Anil Mission: The pastor is sick, physically and mentally and heart problems and also diabetic. He has not been in the services in three weeks. I take care of the services on Thursday nights and two of our young preachers go there on Sunday and take care of the services. One Thursday night a young 21 year old man came for baptism.

Anajatuba: We excluded two there November 7 with two more names brought before the church and after they are visited and prayed over and if they have not come before the church repenting and asking forgiveness they will be excluded in 30 days. I have committed myself to this work at least one Friday night each month.

Peritoro: June and I went to Peritoro for Sunday Services November 2, it had been over eight years since I had been in a church service with them. As Pastor Ricardo, 81 years old, taught the SS lesson, I thought where will you be "George Bean" when you are 81 years old? Will you still be pastoring one of the Lord's churches? Bro. Ricardo needs help. He gets about \$16.00 per month pension, the church cannot help him much as they are few. Maybe some SS class or church would like to help him some each month. If so, send the offering marked Bro. Ricardo, and I will see that he gets it. We had good services and it was good to see many of our brethren again in Peritoro.

Sao Mateus: Bro. Sostenes the pastor at Sao Mateus has had to give up the church. He is 75 years old and in bad health. He has moved to Brasilia. He was back here in Maranhao and he and I went to Sao Mateus Thursday, November 13, for the business meeting of the church. I have committed myself there the 1st Thursday night of each month. They have called a young man to be interim pastor. The need continues to be great, with buildings to be built. We need saved, God called men, to preach the Gospel and work in this missions.

Pray for us and give as the Lord leads.
