Greetings,

Someone has said: "the totality of all that a Christian is and does is that of making Christ known and helping others respond to Him in love and gratitude. It is the sharing of God's loving, counseling and reconciling Word with those who hunger for physical food and for spiritual food."

This is the essence of a recent letter from Pastor Seo Ku Lee of Faith Baptist Church of Seoul, Korea:

Faith Baptist Church is growing in number and does a good job on the evangelical projects. Bro. Dae Suk Chon started a mission at Moon San, near Pan Moon Jeom (this is near the 38th). The mission was a Presbyterian Church but had no pastor for two years. He started a Bible Study and sowed the Gospel. The results—about 25 people are to be baptized during the New Year's Eve services. The Faith Baptist Church is the authorizing church.

Kyoung Ban Church plans to rebuild her church building. She plans to do so with her own ability. We need you to pray for her concerning this project.

Pastor So Hyun Chung, who pastors the Shin Nae Baptist Church, the first that I started in Korea wrote:

I spent five days in Taipei and two weeks in the Philippines. I met Brothers Henderson and Adams and stayed with Bro. Henderson for eight days. I went on visitation with Bro. Henderson and to his services three times. I also was with Bro. Adams for a service. I had a good trip with some good experiences.

This past month, being New Year's and the holiday season plus the unpredictable weather, travelling has been a bit slow. I did have the privilege of being with the Wharton Missionary Baptist Church of Wharton, West Virginia. This church has no pastor.

I have a few available slots between now and summer. If you'd like me to come and be with you, please let me know.

Too, the Lexington Baptist College is having her fourth annual Missions' Seminar the first week of March. That is, March 2-6; during the regular chapel services (10:15-11:00). Our Theme will be: "A Look at Some Cross Sectors in Missions." Come and be with us that week.

Early Sunday morning, (12:15 a.m.), I was awakened by over 30 of our young people singing "Happy Birthday" outside our bedroom window. Also, it and both services Sunday were taped on a video cassette and the tape was presented to me as a gift from the church. I really appreciated each manifestation of love expressed throughout the day and also each Christmas, and Birthday card we received from you. Do accept our thanks.

New Auditorium Begun . . . Judson Improving . . . Economy In Serious Condition . . .

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We thank God for the opportunity to give you an update of what God is doing here. We thank God for your interest and faithful support of this work.

The work on the new auditorium for Tabernacle Baptist Church is now underway. We have started the grading and digging for footers. The building plans have been sufficiently approved to allow us to begin. We are hoping that the Lord will enable us to complete the first phase of the building by July 4. Independence Day for the United States of America, coincides with the Organizational Anniversary of Tabernacle Baptist Church. Tabernacle Baptist Church will complete its 39th year of existence this coming July 4. We are planning a special evangelistic meeting for that week as well as a Seminar for the missionaries and pastors.

Teacher training is now underway for the beginning of a new Day School year. The beginning of our new school year is less than a month away. We have one of the best staffs in the history of our school. Out of 24 teachers, 20 are members of our church. We have always strictly maintained an all Baptist staff, but it is great to have this large group disciplined in our church.

Judson may be off of his crutches by the time you receive this letter. He is to have X-rays tomorrow to determine if this is a possibility. We thank God for your faithful prayer concerning this matter.

Dishon and his wife, the missionary couple supported by Tabernacle that we mentioned last month, have been blessed with a fine baby girl. Continue to pray for the church in the City of Porto Valho where they labor. This church,

originally a mission of Tabernacle Baptist Church, shows great promise.

We anticipate God continuing to do great things in this mission work. God answers prayer and we need you to pray with us if we are to see God's blessings in abundance. The economy of Brazil is in a terrible condition and is affecting our work tremendously. Prices are officially frozen; nevertheless, what we really have to pay (when items are available) has skyrocketed. The combination of low wages and high prices greatly limits our people's income. As a result of frozen prices many items are being held off of the market. We are having great difficulty in purchasing building materials.

This week, for the first time that I can remember in 32 years, the value of the dollar in exchange for Brazilian currency dropped 16%. This means that your mission dollars lose value in the exchange for Brazilian currency and again when items are purchased. This economic paradox will have great effect on the construction project. Please join us in "supplication with thanksgiving" concerning these matters:

1. Thank God for the very capable teaching staff. Ask God to intervene in the economy and government regulations making it possible for the Day School to stay.

2. Thank God for Judson's present recovery. Pray for his complete recovery.

3. Thank God that we have been able to begin the building of a much needed auditorium. Ask God to enable the workers to open doors for the purchase of materials and provide the money for its completion for use by July.

4. Thank God that He has given us wonderful opportunities to shine as lights in a dark world and ask God to enable us to remain faithful.

With God all things are possible!

Dear Brethren,

When I was closing my last letter I was on my way to the hospital here in Lima. I had another catheterization where the doctor tried to go up an artery to check for the blood circulation in my legs. After an hour and a half it proved to be unsuccessful. One of the most painful things I have ever gone through. I am back preaching, for which I am very thankful.

PROGRESSO - In my last letter I was telling about the work in Progresso. We have paid to get things fixed up for awhile but, because of the drug traffic and the growing of coca it is very dangerous to go there. There are dead people along the highway and no one wants to ask why or whom.

We may have to close the work there, the local pastors are advising me to stay away and let them handle it.

CHAVINILLO - We need to build a defense wall against the land slides there where we hope to build. We need \$4,000 to build the wall and put on a roof. The people have no place to meet. They have been meeting in a small room 10 by 12 feet and now the man is moving away.

I still have to go there to baptize at least 22 more. Chavinillo is one of the poorest places in Peru. WILL YOU HELP THEM?

I am still looking for land. Every day we go to look at least one piece of ground and so far we have come to a dead end street.

Last Sunday I went to preach and the brother that leads the music and helps in leading the services told us that his mother had just died. She died at 6:30 a.m. and he was there at 9:00 a.m. to open the building and fill his place. He led the music and I preached and we announced that we would have a special service at 6:00 p.m. for his mother. Again, he led the music and gave his testimony. He told how the Lord had saved him from a life of a drunk. He was run over in the streets by a car because he was drunk and sleeping in the street. He said, "But, thank God, I don't drink anymore, I don't smoke anymore." His lost family was there and he told them his mother was saved and not to weep over her because she was with the Lord.

Monday, we had the regular funeral at the church and again, Miguel led the singing and I preached. After the service we waited an hour and a half and the undertaker never showed up. So, we loaded the box (with the body), and I drove to the cemetery and there I preached again to a large crowd that had gathered there to the body before burial.

Please remember to look for wheelchairs, I need them to haul crippled people to church and back in the Van.

We are all doing well here and staying busy. Remember us as you pray and please give to Crains New Work. Land here is going to cost more than we planned to pay. We need to buy now, will you help us?

Dear Brethren,

We are back in Brazil but not back in Cuiaba as yet. We are here in Manaus and it looks like we will be here until the 20th of this month.

We left Lexington as planned on December 15, but were not permitted to leave Miami because the airlines, Loyds of Golivia, turned us back not accepting the proof we had showing that Carey did in fact have a permanent visa. The flight was cancelled and rescheduled for Friday the 19th and so our flight from Manaus to Cuiaba was also cancelled for the 16th.

The next day we went to the Brazilian consulate and they gave Carey a free tourist visa which they said he didn't need but was the only way we would be permitted to get on the plane.

We got away then on the 19th from Miami and arrived here in Manaus at 2:30 a.m. eastern standard time. However, we couldn't get a flight from here to Cuiaba until the 20th of January. When we arrived here and went through immigration, they only looked at the proof we had of Carey's visa and not the tourist visa.

While in Miami, Pastor Jim Washer and the First Baptist Church of Ojus put us up in their apartment they have for missionaries. Our thanks to them for their kindness to receive us and for all their help during the four days spent there in Miami.

Here in Manaus, I contacted Bro. Paul Hatcher and he came and helped us by taking us to the Bratcher home to leave our baggage, then took us

to breakfast at his home. Then we returned to the Bratchers to stay. We were with the H. Bratchers for two weeks but are now staying in the home of Bro. Robert Lunsford while he and his family have gone to the States. We thank Bro. Paul Hatcher for his kind help, and Bro. and Sister H. Bratcher for putting us up for so long. They were very helpful to us.

Now to report on where I've preached since writing last. First of all, I was privileged to attend most of the Thanksgiving Conference and hear some good preaching. We thank the Lord for the good offering. Secondly, I preached one more time at the Immanuel Baptist Church, Old Town, KY, where Bro. Jim Craft is the pastor. We were privileged to hold meetings and preach two different Sundays for this church. We thank God for these people and for their good faithful pastor. I also preached one more time for the South Lexington Baptist Church where Bro. Edward Overbey is pastor and where we have been members since returning to the States in 1985. Thirdly, since being here in Manaus, I have been busy preaching. I preached at the 14th of December Baptist Church where Bro. Asa Mark Bratcher is the pastor. I've preached 3 times at the Mauazinho congregation where Bro. H. Bratcher is pastor, and one time at the Memoria Baptist Church, which at this time is without a pastor. I have 4 more invitations before we are scheduled to leave the 20th for Cuiaba.

I want to thank all the pastors and churches for having us to preach during our time in the States and for your prayers, love, and offerings.

The time has come again for me to give an account of myself. So, here goes:

I spent New Year's Eve with the Logana Baptist Church of Nicholasville, Kentucky. We had a wonderful time with those dear folks and showed our VCR tape of Pucallpa. Bro. Joe Lloyd is their dear pastor.

On Sunday I was with the Riverview Baptist Church where Bro. Ed Fountain is pastor. We enjoyed the good fellowship there.

Last night, Wednesday the 28th, I was with the First Baptist Church of Alexandria, Ky. They surprised us with a reception after the service and gave my wife flowers and a great love offering. Brother Carl Morton is the pastor of this large and living church.

The work in Peru is as follows:

THE MISSION: Brother David Mendez called me the other day and said everything was proceeding normally, and that the attendance was still good. We are still looking to get an Electronic Keyboard, and a P.A. System for the work. Also we need funds to build a new building when we return. We have 1 1/2 acres of good ground but no funds to build. Mark your offerings: STANTON BUILDING FUND.

THE BIBLE INSTITUTE: It's on hold until we can get back and start teaching again. This is the key to future Baptist growth in Peru. We need to train national workers to reach out to their own

people. Before I die I hope to see a Baptist Church in every village, town, and City of Peru. Training the nationals is the way to make that vision come true. We need to take with us an overhead projector and 3 cases of VCR tapes for taping the Institute classes.

BAPTIST SCHOOL: It is summer vacation at this time. (The Peru school year is April 1 to December 20 every year.) Sister Mayfield says that things are kind of quiet now and that they are painting and fixing up some for the next school year. Remember to pray for Sister Mayfield as she is filling in for us in the grade school while we are home on furlough. She is doing a good job and we appreciate her so much. There are some things we would like to take back with us for the school: basketballs, volleyballs, nets used microscopes, used manual typewriters, and 5 personal computers, (Commodore, Atar, IBM, or others). The computers will be used for teaching in the high school area which will help us maintain our academic edge that we have on the State schools there in Peru.

GENERAL NEEDS: We hope to take back several used motorcycles to use in the work. We need two window air-conditioning units to take back and install. The air-conditioners are to combat the high humidity that we have in the jungle which is destructive to electronic equipment.

Mail Is Not Arriving In Manaus Area . . . Eight Professions of Faith at Mauazinho . . . Urgent and Immediate Need . . .

Dear Brethren,

As of today we still have not received the December Mission Sheet. We have not received thus far any written news concerning the Thanksgiving Conference.

We received an oral report from the Turners. We rejoiced when we learned that the Lord blessed with a record offering. We are hoping and waiting to know if any of you designated an offering for "Bratcher's Buildings." We thank you, Addyston Baptist Church, Brooksbury Fellowship and Glen's Creek Baptist Churches, for your designated offerings for our work in October. Please continue reading to know of a special and urgent need that we have now.

Last month's Mission Sheet letter was written and mailed from Itacoatiara. We continued our trip and visited the two missions beyond Itacoatiara - Estanilau and Vale do Paraíso - one night at each. On Friday, traveled for more than twelve hours to "Vila de Amatori." On Saturday night, services and a wedding at "Novo Remanso." Sunday, December 21st we celebrated the 6th anniversary of the New Jerusalem Baptist Mission. That morning I performed a wedding and then baptized Paulo Ribeiro Ramos - age 14. That night I preached to an estimated 300 people.

When we arrived home on Monday afternoon, who should open the gate to let us in but

missionary Richard Turner! He and Mrs. Turner and Danny and Carey had arrived a few days before. We have been blessed by their presence and his preaching among us.

We have been blessed at Mauazinho these first two Sundays of the new year with 89 and 87 in "Sunday Bible School." This week we are in a revival at Mauazinho Baptist Mission. Thus far we have had six boys and girls asking for baptism and an elderly couple converted. Last night Pastor Asa Mark Bratcher brought a bus load from the 14th of December Baptist Church. Our building was filled to overflowing - some 155 were present.

Just this past week our men reported at least one person saved at the mission at Sao Domingo.

A few weeks ago I took 3 of our young women to Cuaiaba to work in the church there where Dad is, and also to go to the University. Beth, Lucia, and Eunice were some of our most faithful helpers and will be missed. They should be assets to the church there. Two of them already have jobs. They are living with my parents.

I want to add an extra word of thanks to Central Baptist Church of Grenada, Mississippi for once again providing for our work. Also, to Demas and Brenda Brubacher and Karl Moyers for being so helpful while I was in the States.

Dear Brethren,

As mentioned in my letter last month, Mike did come and stayed with us just long enough to get a little rest and then was gone again taking his son Adam with him, but in exchange he left us the three young ladies that I also mentioned in my last letter. We have been pretty busy trying to get them settled in, to find jobs and get into a class to prepare for the entrance exams that are coming up next month. One of them already has a job, another the promise of one after the first of the year and the other is still looking. They are in class every night from 7:15 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. Thus far they have been a joy to us.

The work at the church is going along about the same with our attendance holding its own. We have had two professions of faith this month. One was a young lady with three children and the

other was a man of about fifty some years old. They both have been attending for about two months.

The plans for building a parsonage have been set aside, at least for the present due to the fact that most building supplies are in short supply due to the new economic system here in this country. There are shortages of most everything and it appears things will get worse before they get better, but we are not losing any weight over it, so it isn't as bad as I might make it sound. I just came back from the market and for the first time in about ten days I was able to buy meat and by taking whatever they had I was able to buy eight pounds. Milk has also been hard to find, but by going to several stores we were able to buy a ten day supply. Friday is market day and it takes about most of the day. Today the whole country went on a one day strike against the system, but it doesn't appear to have worked very well. Things will get better, when the Lord returns.
