## Directions To Grace Baptist Church, 2920 Beaver Valley Road, Fairborn, Ohio:

From the north on I-75 to I-70, go east on I-70, 9¼ miles to I-675 (the only way you can go) six miles to Exit 20 which is Dayton-Yellow Springs Road (well marked on large signs). At the end of the exit ramp, turn left and go one mile to Beaver Valley Road. Turn left on Beaver Valley Road one mile to the church's driveway and turn left up the hill to the church parking lot.

From the north on I-71 to I-70, go west on I-70 to I-675 and south on I-675 the same as above directions.

From east to west on I-70, exit on I-675 and then same as directions above.

From the south on I-75 take I-675, from I-675 take Exit 20 - Dayton-Yellow Springs Road. Follow directions for Exit 20, I-675 above.

From US 35 (going west) take Route 68 in Xenia toward Yellow Springs. From Route 68 make a slight left on Route 235 to Fairborn. From 235 make a left turn at the first traffic light (Dayton-Yellow Springs Road, but it is not marked). Proceed to Beaver Valley Road and turn left. At the church sign and mailbox turn left up the hill to the church parking lot.

From US 35 (from west of Dayton going east) take I-675 north. Take Exit 20 - Dayton-Yellow Springs Road. Follow directions for Exit 20, I-675 above.

Services begin at 9:30 A.M. and end at 4:10 P.M. Supper will be served at 4:30 P.M.

## Report on Recent Trip to Brazil

Dear Bros. & Sisters in Christ,

I would like to share with other faithful supporters of Baptist Faith Missions some of the blessings that my family and I received during our recent visit to Brazil.

The primary purpose of my trip was to speak at special services of the Tabernacle Baptist Church. The services had the dual purpose of celebrating the completion of the church's 19th year and dedicating its new auditorium. The Lord made it possible for the family to go along as an additional blessing.

June 26-28, I preached in an evangelistic meeting at Porto Velho. This mission in the State of Rondonia is one of several missionary efforts of Tabernacle Church. During the meeting there were about 6 professions of faith. Dishon, the pastor, and his wife are fruit of the ministry of Tabernacle Baptist Church and the Seminary in Manaus under the direction of Paul and David Hatcher.

The Seminary in Manaus functions on weekends. When I was working in the seminary 13 years ago the classes were held at night. Students worked all day long and had a hard time staying awake. The present system is much more effective. Classes are held about 4 hours each Sunday. Students receive practical training in the church, mission points and Children's Clubs.

The Children's Clubs operate in many different areas of Manaus. They are held weekly in homes, yards, mission buildings, etc. Once each quarter all of the Clubs meet together at the Church location. The clubs function like a Sunday School class for children. The total average attendance each week is 517. During the first half of this year, 157 of these children have made professions of faith and 11 of them have already been baptized. Ivete, the Club Co-ordinator is a graduate of the Seminary.

The Seminary, started by missionary John A. Hatcher in 1956, now has graduates serving in 8 out of the 24 states of Brazil. There are presently 150 students enrolled in classes.

Another ministry which is quite effective is the primary and secondary school (elementary and junior high). The school always operates at its capacity of 750 students. All of the teachers are Baptist and all but 2 are members of Tabernacle Baptist Church. This school is self-supporting. It is Pastor Paul Hatcher's plan to re-open the High School and Teacher Training programs of the school which are presently on hold. These would be a great asset in training Christian leaders.

On Wednesday evening July 1, I had the privilege of preaching at the 14th of December Baptist Church where Bro. Harold Bratcher is pastor. Bro. Bratcher also works with a number of mission works in the interior of the State of Amazonas.

On July 4 and 5, I preached at the special services in the new auditorium of Tabernacle Baptist Church. There were approximately 900 in attendance on Sunday night. During the two nights 28 people made professions of faith. The new auditorium seats 1,500 and is very functional. Through creative design and volunteer labor the church has been able to build this structure for about \$30,000.00. The building is already paid for in full. I praise the Lord with the Church for this great blessing!

Tabernacle has an excellent way of getting new believers started off on the right foot. When a group of 20-30 adults have been saved they are taken to the Church Camp for a weekend retreat. They are given a crash course on the essentials of walking with the Lord. This also gives them an opportunity to develop friendships with other new believers and start the habit of personal devotions. These retreats take place about every 2 months.

While in Manaus I also preached at the Chapada Baptist Church. This church was organized through the efforts of Missionary John Hatcher in 1961. I was one of the founding members of this church (as a boy). Bro. Wallace York was a founding member and did mission work out of this church when he was a missionary in the Amazon. The church continues to thrive. When I was a boy, this church was "way out in the sticks." It is now in the middle of the booming metropolis of Manaus. The pastor of this church is also a graduate of the Seminary. While I was there, they started an extension Bible School for training leaders similar to the one at Tabernacle.

When my parents went to Manaus in 1955, the city of Manaus had a population of 80 thousand. Now, it has a population of one and a half million people. One of the impressive things about visiting Brazil is the multitudes. Crowds of people on streets, bus stations, subways, parks and crowded living quarters. Millions and millions of people who need to hear the gospel.

From Manaus we went to visit my parents and sister (Kathy) and her family, in the State of S. Paulo. Both of these families are doing a great job. Their work extends to 11 cities in the States of S. Paulo and Parana. The younger works are supported financially by the older churches and missions. An update of these works is in the July Mission Sheet.

## WHAT CAN WE DO?

1. Stay informed and pray for the missionaries on the field.
2. Prepare ourselves and our children in the Word of God.
3. By spreading the gospel where we live.
4. Ask God to raise up laborers and leaders from among us.
5. Give, while we have the opportunity.

## Many Have Come to Help . . . Brother Castro Preaches Revival . . . Several Saved . . . Outgrowing the Building . . . Thieves Steal \$1,750 . . . Good News and More Needs . . .

Dear Brethren,

Since my last mission letter many things have happened here. May 28, Paul Washer and his friend Daniel Franz from Texas, and Ada Mayfield arrived from Pucallpa. On June 2, Ruth Villasana from New York, and Melissa Thomas, Laura Synder and John Yancy from Texas also arrived. Ruth Villasana stayed for two weeks, but the rest of the group will remain until August 8th. They will be staying here with us and will be helping with the work in Ventanilla. Already we have been working on the property, digging footers for the foundation and leveling the ground in preparation for building. During the same time, Daniel Castro, his wife and son arrived. Brother Castro preached for a week and we had a full house every night. Everyone seemed to enjoy themselves. During this week of revival we had several saved and others came for Scriptural Baptism.

Since the Castro's left, Brother Paul Washer and John Yancy have been doing the preaching while I translate. Melissa Thomas and Laura Synder have been helping to teach the girls and small children.

Most of those old enough to understand the Gospel have made public professions of faith. Our problem is that we have used up all our available space and have no room for increased attendance. We have two classes which are held outside and the people sit on a large piece of plastic; the problem is that sometimes it rains. I have ordered lumber to build another building about 20ft by 50ft. I have benches made and ready to assemble (thanks to the Bryan Station Baptist Church of Lexington, Kentucky). Our lumber will be ready the 26th of July and we hope to have the floor poured and to be ready to build as soon as the lumber arrives.

All have not been blessings. We have experienced many trials also. When Bro. Castro came he brought about 20,000 Intis (750 dollars) and Bro. Jim Washer sent \$1,000 dollars in cash,

totaling \$1,750. While we were in church someone climbed over the wall, made his way through a second story window and stole the money. Our two front bedrooms were torn apart as though an earthquake had hit. As far as we know they were only looking for money and nothing else was taken. The following week the police caught a group who had broken into a house; they were armed with high-powered modern weapons. Many of the missionaries say, if we had come in while they were in the house, we probably would have been killed. I hate to report things like this but you need to know, so you will know how to pray for us. All the money will be hard to replace - plus we need money so badly at this time for the construction. We have tried to make the windows less vulnerable and have asked the owner to put up steel bars over the windows on the second floor also.

We have been having a lot of tire trouble as we cannot buy 15 inch tires here in Peru. I was finally able to purchase 16 inch rims, tires and tubes, so we now have four new truck tires for our van. Tomorrow I have to make a trip to Huanuco. We plan to leave here in the morning and drive (about 10 hours) across the Andes Mountains. If all goes well we should arrive in Huanuco about 6 p.m.

Let me close with good news. After we were robbed, I called Bro. Jim Washer and I really did not want to tell him that the money he had sent had been stolen, but I had to tell him. When he hung up the phone he said, "You can keep working and building because within a few days I will have our church send a check for \$3,000 to your mission to put into your account." God is so good!

Finally, we want to build the protection wall and finish the building at Chavinillo, the Brethren have no place to meet and they are now in the cold rainy season. We have two preachers who ride the motorcycles through the rain and mud each week to preach there and at Ayapite. The Lord is blessing at both places, but they need a place to meet where they can invite others to come and hear the message of God's saving grace. We need \$4,000 to do the work. Will you help?

Dear Brethren,

Our cool weather here has gone, at least for the present and it has been very hot for the past couple of weeks. The nights have been cool enough that we have not had to have fans to sleep and no one even talks about rain this time of the year.

Betty had been having pain in her leg for about a month and since it would not go away she thought he had better give in and go to the doctor. After several X-rays and blood tests it was discovered that she was lacking calcium in her system and over the next two months she will be taking a series of twenty-five shots before going back to the doctor. She is some better, but still limps some when she walks. Her heart problem seems to be under control for which we are thankful.

Last month I wrote about Ronaldo, the young man that works with me in this work, starting a Bible school on one of the streets near the church. That class is still doing well, although this week the attendance was down a little because measles are going through the neighborhood. Last Sunday he brought 19 of those kids to Sunday School.

The rest of the work of the church is going on about the same as usual. We are planning a meeting for the month of September with a young preacher from Manaus serving as evangelist with the hope that perhaps the young man might be a good prospect for the pastorate of the church. A judge that was saved under the ministry of Bro. Turner moved away without ever being baptized. When he moved away he was only a lawyer, but was made a judge soon after he returned to Cuiaba. He talked to me about baptism and when I did not give him a special invitation, when others were being baptized, he got rather put out with me, so I put his case before the church and we had a baptism just for him and he hasn't been back to church in over two months now. This kind of thing does not do much to animate me. I have been to visit him twice since his baptism.

The walls for the parsonage are now all up and the church is waiting for more money to come in before going on to the next phase. Some of the materials are already bought for the next step.

We trust you will make it an object of prayer for the missionary families that are having health problems.

We are also in a Stewardship campaign with a goal of Cz\$112,000.00 (one hundred and twelve thousand cruzados) given by the members to the church during this month. This amount is equal to around \$2,000.00 (two thousand dollars). We are happy to report that our attendance has increased - we are back over the 300 mark in Sunday School attendance. On the fourth Sunday of June - 340 present - the first Sunday in July - 320 and the last Sunday for this letter - 310. The fourth Sunday of June was "pastor's day." I was honored and praised by the church at both services. I accept the honor and praise as a challenge to be an even better pastor - shepherd to this beloved flock!

Sunday morning, July 5th, the church gained fourteen new members - 11 by baptism and three by letter. We thank the Lord!

Dear Friends,

June 28th, Calvary Baptist Church was organized into a local church with 28 charter members. The eldest member is 81 years old. The youngest is 22 years old. These precious folks have stood against intense persecution by the Catholics in their community. We praise God for raising up a church in the Trambo area of Las Pinas. We had over 500 professions of faith in this area but many deserted when the persecution started. But God gave some the courage and determination to stand the conflicts. These folks had backbones that agreed with their jawbones. We enjoyed seeing this new work, which was begun in January, call their officers, establish the articles of faith, and Baptist Church Covenant. Their eyes filled with tears as they repeated the church covenant. As they looked upon each other realizing at last their prayers were answered. They were now a church. Oh, the sweet fellowship we had as we recounted the history of the church. Some of the members told of their

conversion and God had strengthened them through the trials they had endured. This church is now existing because you cared and gave of your resources. They would love to thank you personally but since they can't, I do so for them. THANKS! to each of you for supporting missionaries of Baptist Faith Missions.

June 29th, I returned to the States. I have been so very ill for four months and can't seem to get well. The doctors were treating me but I was not getting well. I was taking so many drugs and medications that I must acknowledge that I got addicted to some of the pain killers. This affected me mentally. I need your prayers.
