Dear Brethren:

Mrs. Bratcher and I are a long way away from where we were when on August 14th, I wrote and mailed the last month's Mission Sheet letter. We arrived from Manaus, Amazonas, Brazil, South America, in Miami, Florida on Sunday morning at 8:00 a.m. on the 6th of this month. Before we give you a report of our activities here in the U.S.A. we'll report on the work in Manaus and the Amazonas.

At 18:00 on the 21st of August, Marie (Mrs. Bratcher) Elizete, Marie Nazare and I left Manaus on the "Moises" - a commercial boat. (I am sad and sorry to have to report that our mission launch sank where it was docked. - no one was aboard. After a few days it was gotten out of the water and by now maybe, Asa Mark is having it repaired.) We arrived at the New Jerusalem Baptist Mission at midnight in the rain! Saturday night I preached to 71 people present. Sunday morning after a boat load of members arrived from two more of our missions, I preached to 120 people present. After the service I baptized seven in the river - all three of the missions were represented in the baptizing.

Thursday morning, August 27th, at 1:05 a.m., Asa Mark, Lucy, Marcia and Lucy Marie arrived from the U.S.A. Saturday night the church gave them a reception welcoming them back to Brazil. Sunday morning I preached at the 14th of December Baptist Church and then baptized four new believers and delivered the service and the pulpit to Pastor Asa Mark Bratcher who then led us in the celebration or observance of the Lord's Supper. That night I preached at a special service at the Mauazinho Baptist Mission.

Wednesday night - September 2nd - the Church had a special service bidding us farewell. Saturday night I performed a wedding at the church and then soon after midnight we left the house to go to the airport.

Monday, September 7th - I was the last speaker at the Labor Day Conference at the Grace Baptist Church, Fairborn, Ohio, Donald Foose, pastor.

Since then until today, we have visited and preached at the following churches: September 9th, Grace Baptist Church, Georgetown, KY. Bill Derossit, pastor; September 13th a.m., Glen's Creek Baptist Church, Versailles, KY, Ken Underthorpe, pastor. That p.m. found us at Meadthorpe, Lexington where Logan Wayne Hart is the beloved pastor. On September 16th we visited and I preached at Calvary Baptist Church, Richmond, KY, Bobby Greene is the interim pastor. Sunday morning, September 20th, Devondale, Lexington, John T. Thompson, pastor. That night Bryan Station Baptist Church, Alfred Gormley, pastor. Wednesday the 23rd we visited and I preached at the Broadway Baptist Church, Richmond, KY, where Don McWhorter is pastor. Yesterday morning I preached at the Broadway Baptist Church here in Lexington where C. Hoge Hockensmith is the pastor.

We thank Stephen and Saleth for all the help they have given us since we arrived. Stephen has been secretary and driver for us. We are also grateful to each church and pastor that has given us the opportunity to preach in their pulpit - especially are we grateful to the Glen's Creek Baptist Church for the food and furniture given or loaned to us. May the Lord bless each one of you, is our prayer.

We will be happy to be of service to any of you "brethren beloved of the Lord." We will be happy to preach and show slides of the work in Brazil. Our address is 2028 Dorset Drive, Lexington, KY 40504. Our telephone number is (606) 254-4205.

Dear Brethren,

I had to make another trip to Iquitos to send the cement mixer to Lima. I sent it by plane to keep from making a trip to Pucallpa and then sending the mixer by highway from Pucallpa to Lima. The cement mixer is here at my house and I am really thankful to have it to start the work in Ventanilla.

We were told that we would be able to pick up the title to the land in Ventanilla today, but, I went this morning and everybody there was on strike. At this moment about all of Peru is on strike. I will keep going back and keep trying to get the title to the land. One of the things that discourages missionaries is the constant waiting. We have been trying to get the title to this piece of ground for eight months.

I have the steel columns to build the wall across the front of the property as soon as I get the title. I do not want to invest any more money in the land until I have the title.

We are having regular services Sunday morning and night, Wednesday plus Saturday nights.

Last week someone stole part of the roof off of the building. We had services Saturday night and Sunday morning when we went back for Sunday School and Church it was gone.

I have worked several months trying to get a mistake on the title of our Dodge van corrected, it looks like I will get it done as soon as the office workers who are now on strike go back to work. I will have to make another trip to Iquitos to get it done, but it will be worth the trouble. When they

made out the title they put panel instead of van and 6 cylinders instead of 8. About every day the police were stopping me and asking for money or trying to take the van into the police pound.

Elizabeth is home at this time having tests for stomach pain, while she is there she wants to spend a few days with her father who is about blind and lives alone. In March he will be 92 years old. I know that it will be hard for her to leave him. I request your prayers for her and him.

Next week I have to make another trip to Huanuco and Tingo Maria. While I am there I want to go to Chavenillo, Ayapiteg and Cunayauan. The works there are going good except Ayapiteg. The work there is still going on but because of the bad testimony of one of the brothers, the work has gone down. We still have hopes that it will revive as we have some faithful brothers who are going there every weekend, Saturday and Sunday, preaching to the faithful who keep coming.

The church in Tingo Maria has recalled Alberto Fabian as pastor and he is back serving as their pastor.

All of the churches I work with are growing and most of the churches are starting new missions. This is the secret to missions. When we can get the Nationals reaching their own people.

I close with another plea for the work in Chavenillo. We still need the money to build. I know that some church could give the \$4,000.00 we need to build the protection walls and the building. I am ready to go to work; who will help us?

NEW BUILDING AT LUPERCIO INAUGURATED. On the 29th of August the new building in the city of Lupericio was used for the first time completely finished. There were 160 persons present. The building is lovely. On the next morning, Sunday, August 30, there were 54 persons in Sunday School and in the morning and night services we are having an average of about 35 per service. BUILDING AT SANTA TEREZINHA NEARS COMPLETION. The new auditorium at Santa

Terezinha is nearing completion. Windows and doors are in, stucco finish is being finished, most of wiring is installed, roof is finished. Maybe, by the next letter, I will be able to tell you it is all finished.

NEW BUILDING AT ALVARO DE CARVALAO. Work is temporarily stopped because builder is working at Santa Terezinha. However, the foundations are all in and ready for walls to go up. All the windows and doors are finished. Bricks are on the lot.

CAR SOLD FOR JUNK. Our new car (which was wrecked by a dope trafficker) was sold for \$1,000. The money has already been used in the new building at Santa Terezinha.

RADIO PROGRAM BEING DROPPED. On the 30th of September our last broadcast will be made. This will end five years of broadcasting in the city of Cornelio Procopio. This program has always been sustained by Alta and I, personally. With three buildings in progress and new places to be reached we feel the money can be better applied to these needs.

with 18 decisions, 9 professions of faith and 9 others by letter, baptism and rededication.

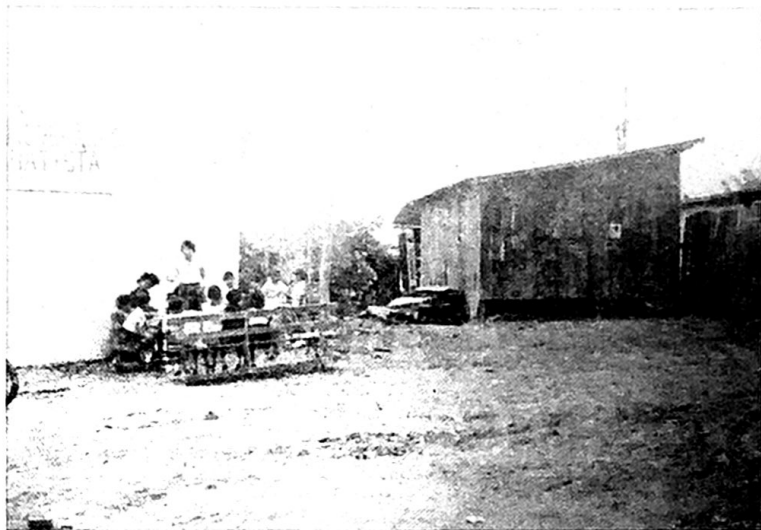
Do continue to pray for us as we strive to get back into the full swing of the work.

Visa Problem . . . Mountains of Papers to Fill Out . . . Souls Saved and More Building Planned . . .

Dear Brethren,

For a great door and effectual is opened unto me, and there are many adversaries. I Corinthians 16:9. June and I went to the Federal Police to get our new ID cards only to learn that the ID cards had been cancelled. We also learned that we have been in Brazil seven months illegally.

The Federal Police in January 1987 failed to inform us that we needed to ask for another year extension for our temporary Visas. Instead they took our old ID cards and asked Brasilia for new ones. The Justice Department in Brasilia turned us down and cancelled our Visas. I have gotten mountains of paper work together and sent it to Brasilia. They will not talk to us in Brasilia. Yesterday my lawyer and I turned in more paper work to Federal Police, Sao Luis, to be sent by them to Brasilia. And Brasilia will reopen our case for

review, turn us down and give us eight days to leave the country and also pay a fine, or they will grant us an extension for our temporary Visas. If all this fails we will have to leave the country, pay the fine and come back on Tourist Visas and then start the process all over again. Paul said, "Therefore I endure all things for the elect's sake." II Timothy 2:10a

We have had a good month with one saved at Cantanhede and one at New Hope Baptist. We have bought a house and lot at Cantanhede. I have one more lesson on *The Trail of Blood* at Anajatuba and also the pastor has asked that I teach a class on the woman's place in the church. We need to build benches at Cantanhede. We want to build a meeting house at Anil Mission and organize them into a church and build or finish an apartment at New Hope Baptist Church for the pastor to live in.

She is finding this hard to accept, so we do not know the outcome of this.

There have been several exciting events that happened in the last few weeks. One, as most of you heard on the news, was the August 28 attempted coup or military takeover of some officers and soldiers who are dissatisfied with the present government. There is still much unrest and the split in the military is giving the Communist Party an excellent opportunity to go forward in their effort to topple the government. The other event was the birth of the first child, a daughter, to my assistant's wife. Her arrival was almost a month

early and surprised us all, but we are thankful for the blessings of the Lord on this fine couple that the Lord has given us to assist in our work.

Please remember to pray for the Philippines that our President here will be given the wisdom that she needs in order to lead this country in the right way and be strong, so the communism will not be able to prevail.

The fighting experienced in the last coup attempt was not so far from where we live. When we went to an elevated level of our subdivision we could see the effects of the bombing and burning of part of the camp from where we live. One pastor friend of ours found a misguided 50 caliber bullet that had entered his church building, some 5 miles away from the target. A flying missile killed a man in the town where our church is located. This happened on my birthday. This was an exciting way to celebrate, not knowing for a while whose hands the control of the government would fall into. My church gave me a surprise birthday party, which was greatly enjoyed.

Please remember to pray for us and give as we work in this poverty stricken land. There are many problems a missionary has to face. We are happy to have the Hendersons serving here again, please pray for them also. Bro. Henderson is doing a great work. Many missionaries are having health problems, remember them also.

Thank you for giving so that we can remain in this field of service.
