Dear Brethren:

Last month, on the 9th of October (Lucy's birthday), I suffered a facial paralysis on the left side of my face. The doctor diagnosed it as "Bell's Palsy," and he is not sure what caused it. I have taken 42 shots, several other medications, and physical therapy sessions. As a result I have had to take it easy, and am just now returning gradually to full-time activity. The church members have been very gracious, as well as many other brothers and sisters in Christ who have shown their love by visits and prayer, etc. I preached last Sunday morning for the first time.

Despite my illness, the Lord has blessed us here. On October 11th, (Children's Day) there were well over 500 in Sunday School. The second Sunday of this month there were 432 and last Sunday 334. There have been several decisions during this

time but two Sundays ago the Church had to exclude 19 for several reasons.

Continue to pray for me, that I may soon be completely healed. The doctors have told me it will take time and patience. I appreciate the churches and brethren who have sent cards and letters. Thank you very much and I will soon try to answer each one. Do pray for Lucy as she has been such a help and encouragement to me during this time, but this has added an extra burden, so she needs your prayers that her health may hold up. The girls are well, except for minor colds, etc.

We trust the Lord will give you the best Thanksgiving Conference yet. Remember the Bratcher Building Fund, as we have many needs. There are so many buildings that need repairs, and new ones that need to be built, and the launch is having to have a major overhaul after sinking. Do pray and give so that the Lord's work here may go, grow, and glow, while He tarries.

### Building at Diamantina . . . Cooking for Workers . . . None Sick Yet . . . Situation Concerning Two Other Properties . . .

Dear Brethren,

We did get our building permit in Diamantina and when we had the digging about all done for the foundation we were informed that the property lines were all marked wrong and that we would have to move five feet in two different directions, so we lost about four days work. After starting all over things have gone very well and the foundation should be finished tomorrow. It is rather difficult building in this place and living in another 135 miles away, but we have rented a house there and spend the week there coming home to take care of the work here on the weekends. Last week the workers stayed there to work all day Saturday and I came home on Friday night to work all day Saturday on our van changing one of the heads. I am not doing much of the work on this building, I just try to keep them in materials and do most of the cooking. Just in case some of you may be worrying about my workers, since I am doing the

cooking, they all seem to be doing very well and none of them have been sick after two weeks of it.

The other two properties have not come through as yet and we are not expecting any more to be done about that until after the first of the year. The Catholics are giving us some problems on one of the properties and unless the Lord blesses in a special way we may not get it, but we are trying to leave it in His hands. Three of the five young men that we were counting on to help us in these new works have fallen by the wayside, but we are still trying to go forward with the work anyway.

The work here at the Good Hope Baptist Church is holding its own in attendance. Although we cannot get the members there it is growing with young people and children. We had one more young lady saved this month and several new folks attending. We have not heard anymore from the pastor in Manaus to know whether he will be coming to take over the pastorate of this church or not. We need him, but will wait upon the Lord.

We need your prayers now as much as ever, so please do not forget us.

## 40 Years Ordained to the Ministry . . . The Works are Growing . . . Report on Building of Alvaro de Carvalho . . .

Dear Friends,

Another great month has passed and by the time you read this letter another great year will have passed. If you look at the stock markets, the economic instability, the social conditions, and the world conditions you will not have much to rejoice over. If you have invested in the Lord's work in a serious way you will not only have motive to rejoice now but for all eternity.

This year marked 40 years since I was ordained to the ministry. This year (December 20) Alta and I will complete 40 wonderful years together in marriage. This year we completed 32 years of missions work in Brazil.

On December 13th the new building in the little city of Santa Terezinha was inaugurated with 62 persons present. This week we are having Bible School in the mornings and preaching services at night. Interest is growing as well as the crowds. We are expecting to see many saved before the end of the week. A young man in our church in Garca has been chosen by our church to take charge of this new work. His name is Rodney. Remember to

pray for him. His salary is being paid by the Baptist Church in Garca. This is the third mission pastor supported by our church.

Our third new building in the city of Alvaro de Carvalho is again underway. Walls are up about three and one-half feet high. All of the metal windows and doors are made. Hopefully, the building will be finished and ready for inaugurating in 1½ months. This will depend in part on you who read this letter. We have money on hand for about three weeks work. Need I say more?

This month there have been souls saved in almost all of the works. In Duartina (a 17 year old boy leading the services) there have been 6 professions of faith. In Garca there have been two young men (22 and 28 years old) saved.

Last week Odali and a group for our church held a Bible School in Lupercio. Three days there were 98 persons present each day. Several have been saved there this month.

God has given us a great year, but when our eyes behold what there is yet to be done and when we see the great doors open to thousands of cities, we must confess with bowed heads: we are only unprofitable servants. Our prayer is: Oh, Lord, time is growing short, undertake for us, fight our battles, give us grace to reach the unreached: the needy, the hurting, the lost who face an eternity in Hell.

## Difficult Trips Across the Andes to Take Care of the Lord's Work . . . Five Baptized in San Juan River . . .

Dear Brethren,

It seems that as soon as I finish one letter it is time to write another. In fact, this past year has come and gone and I don't know where. That reminds us that life is like a vapor, like a story that is told. So, it looks like whatever we want to do for the Lord we need to do it today. May we all be up and at it.

Last month I was on my way to Huanuco, so I will start from there. I left Lima at 7 a.m. and drove 10 hours across the Andes Mountains. The first five hours are a five hour climb where we come to a point over 15,000 feet above sea level. After arriving at the highest point, I drove three hours across the top and then two hours down to the valley of Huanuco.

I went there to check on the work in all of the missions and to help in the organization of the mission at Cunhuayun. When I arrived they told me that the Church had voted to change the date of the organization to January 5th. I arrived in Huanuco about 5 p.m.

The following morning, November 28th, the

Pastor and Deacon of the church of Huanuco went with me to Ayapiteg and Chavinillo. Chavinillo is 72 kms. which is about 45 miles. It takes four and a half hours to drive and about 6 hours by bus. Ayapiteg is about 11,300 feet above sea level and Chavinillo is about 10,700 feet above sea level.

The Pastor, Deacon and I slept on the floor of the van and needless to say, it was a long cold night. At five a.m. I gave up and called it a bad night in the life of a missionary.

Sunday morning I made two trips with the van taking the people from Ayapiteg and Chavinillo to the San Juan river where I baptized five adults, two from Ayapiteg and three from Chavinillo.

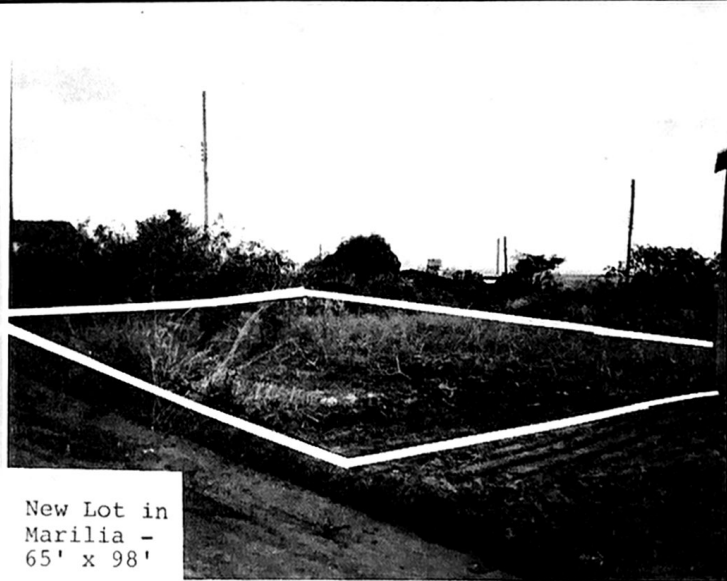
Sunday evening we left the brethren in Chavinillo and Ayapiteg and drove back to Huanuco arriving at 9:30 p.m.

Monday morning, we loaded up the van and after having the mechanic clean the carburetor and plugs we left for Lima at 2 p.m. arriving back in Lima at 1 a.m.

The work here in Ventanilla is about the same, we still do not have the title to the land. Tomorrow the advisor to the Christian Senator will eat dinner with us with all his family. I hope to have some news to tell you in our next mission letter.
