Dear Bros. & Sisters in Christ,

Praise the Lord! After two and a half years, Judson is off crutches. He will still undergo further checkups, but all seems to be well at this time. Judson is now 10 years old and has taken all this quite well.

On March 1 the new school year began. Preparation for this involved a two month remodeling program to make the facilities more efficient. This year the grade and middle school has 800 students. This is all we can handle running the schools one shift.

During the month of January, David and Penie Hatcher took a group of young people to western and southern Brazil to hold a series of evangelistic meetings. The first meeting was in Porto Velho, a mission work of Tabernacle Baptist Church. The second series was in Curitiba with Bobby and Charlene Wacaser. The third set of meetings was with my parents and Odali and Kathy Barros (my brother-in-law and sister) in the State of Sao Paulo. These were at Central Baptist Church in Garca and several missions and churches started out of that church.

The youth workers spent several months preparing for this mission project. They memorized verses and songs as well as raising funds. The Lord blessed with about 60 saved. They also worked with young believers to help them start growing.

During the days of "Carnaval" (Feb. 12-17) our church sponsored a retreat at the church camp to get our young people out of the influence of this wicked festival and provide a time of spiritual refurbishment for them. 29 of the 170 participants

were newly saved. On the first day of the retreat, David Hatcher was involved in a serious automobile accident that demolished his small pick-up truck. He was in the process of transporting young people from the river ferry to the camp. Fortunately, the accident occurred on a return trip when David was the only occupant. The Lord protected David. He escaped with lacerations and torn ligaments in his leg. It was a blessing to see a number of the lay people from church "jump" in and meet the needs of carrying on the camp ministry.

Continue to pray for us. We are thankful for your faithful support. May the Lord richly bless each of you.

## Rest in City with Great Spiritual Need . . . Other Needy Cities Revealed . . . Solemn Warning from Ezekiel . . . Two Buildings Planned . . . Please Help! . . .

Dear Friends,

I'm a little late with my letter to you this time. The truth is it seems like there has been more to do than usual. Alta and I felt so tired a few weeks ago that we took off five days, Monday through Friday, and went to a town up in the mountains. The climate was cooler, the scenery was beautiful, and the city was charming. We slept an average of 12-14 hours a day with a nap in the afternoon.

The new building in Alvaro de Carvalho is now roofed and the stucco walls on the inside are nearly finished. Hopefully, the building will be completed by the last of April or first part of May.

Now, coming back to our trip. There was one part of the trip that did not give us rest; may God never let us feel rested concerning the cities of people without salvation. The town we visited has a population of about 70,000. One little Baptist Church so unknown that we were not able to find it. We traveled through at least five other towns or cities with no Baptist Churches. One city has a population of over 125,000 and one Baptist Church with about 50 members.

We returned home determined, by God's help, to begin two new works in two other cities closer

home within the next month or so.

Presently, in our Bible classes we are studying the book of Ezekiel. Did you know it talks about the watchman with blood on his hands for not warning the people of the coming doom? No truth is so evident in the message of Ezekiel as the individual's responsibility before God. I do not want to have blood on my hands for not taking the Gospel to as many people and places as possible. Do you? I do not believe there is any doctrine or teaching in the Bible that I can hide behind to be free from this responsibility. If the people die in their sins they will be lost, but if we have not told them about Christ's salvation, their blood will be on our hands. There are a lot of good toilet soaps, and hand cleansers but there are not any that will be able to remove the blood off the hands of an unfaithful watchman.

Our next two buildings planned for building are in the cities of Marilia and Cornelio Procopio. We need at least \$100,000 for these two cities. The other two cities where we plan to begin work are Avilandia and Ocaucu (pronounced ol-cow-sue). To build buildings in these two places we will need at least \$50,000. No, believe me, I am not dreaming. These will become realities. Invest with us.

Dear Brethren,

Some say that "time flies." I think it is more likely that we "fly" through time. Time has its origin with God, as all things do. Time has a beginning and end. If this is so then we are just rushing through time. Either way you look at it I have flown through 40 years worth of time. Last Sunday was my 40th birthday. It doesn't bother me at all, but I know this makes many of you feel terrible! Many of you remember me as the young guy who was returning to the mission field just "yesterday." If this young guy is now 40, then . . . I thank my God for all the ways He has blessed me. Many men have said that when they reached 30 they noticed a definite decline. I can thank God that it didn't work that way with me and although I have no notion of the coming years, I still feel as good as when I was 20.

Since last writing you I have also celebrated 22 years in the ministry.

We just arrived from our first retreat at camp this year. We took a smaller group than usual this time. The man who takes care of our camp had a light stroke a couple of weeks earlier. I rushed up to get him in one of our boats, since the roads are

closed this time of year. He spent one night in the hospital then we brought him to our house for a week. I took him home at the time camp was to begin. Since he is still recovering we had a smaller group and a lower key camp this time around. It rained every day except the day we went and the day we returned. Nevertheless we had a good restful time and good Bible studies with the 30 who went.

There have been 3 saved at First Baptist Church this past month. Also, our Sunday School is back to functioning normally now that we have the new building finished. Attendance has also improved now that we are back on standard time. We have been struggling for 105 days with daylight saving time on the equator! Our folks here in Cruzeiro don't have much of an idea about keeping schedules and punctuality. Many of them wear watches, but don't look at them. They go by the sun and after all, everybody knows that church doesn't start until after dark! Our biggest attendance is Sunday night and we also have 2 mid-week services. With the extra hour of daylight during our rainy season we suffered low attendance.

I made a visit to the church at Santa Luzia this month. They are doing well, although they are being pushed around a little by the different Pentecostal groups.

More about trips next month. God bless you.

## Visitors from the States . . . Sick with Pneumonia . . . Works Going Well But Need More Space . . .

Dear Brethren:

Since my last missionary letter we have had several visitors from the States and here in Peru. First, Brother James Washer and Brother Morgan came from Miami, Florida and stayed about a week. After they left two girls from the Baptist Church in Huanuco came for two weeks. One of them, Edith Valverde, came for a medical check-up. They left on Monday and Brother Richard Adams and five other men came from Beatyville, Kentucky. They will be leaving in about 30 minutes to go back to the USA and will take this letter and mail it in the States.

During this time I have been very sick with bronchial pneumonia and I have had so much medicine that it feels like it is running out of my ears.

I have had to make three trips to Iquitos and will be going to Huanuco next Tuesday to see about the work in all the churches and missions.

All of the work in Tingo Maria, Huanuco and here in Lima are doing well. We still do not have our title for the land. I will be going to Callao

City Hall tomorrow and from there to Ventanillato to see if anything has been done that will allow us to start building. We sure need space for more Sunday School rooms. We have three classes out in the hot sun. We hope to start some classes in the homes of the members that live close by.

We are trying to help some of the pastors to get their children enrolled in school. Inflation here makes it really hard on them. The pastor in Aucayacu was not able to send his children to school last year because he did not have the money to buy the uniforms and shoes that are required. I sent him the money this week to buy the clothes for his three children to go to school this year. It cost about \$60.00 to buy the uniforms and notebooks for three children. Many of the pastors are suffering here who give their full time to preaching and working in the Lord's work. They expect that inflation will reach 348 percent this year. We have had two big increases in prices of everything in the last two months. Pray for us because these things hinder the work in every way.
