



Time is going so fast here in Peru that it seems like I just finished writing my last mission letter. There is always somewhere I have to go or something I have to fix. The Dodge van has been stopping on us anywhere and when it gets good and ready. After going through over ten

going through over ten mechanics (who finally fixed it so it would not start), I found a mechanic today who knew what he was doing. A new electronic ignition control and about \$55.00 and we are rolling again. The President of Peru and his idea



President of Peru and his idea of no imports is driving everyone here about crazy. Trucks and busses are sitting along the roads broken down without parts or tires. Sometimes we have to look for a part for weeks, and then we find that the price is four times the price it should be.

Since writing I have been to Iquitos and Huanuco. I got back from Huanuco and I was able to get a lot of things done. I had a meeting with all the pastors where we talked about the work in general, and how we could do a better job reaching the small villages and towns around Huanuco. I took the pastors, wives and children to

restaurant where we had the second floor to our-

a restaurant where we had the second noor to our-selves. It was a good meeting.

I preached Sunday morning for the Church in Huanuco and Sunday night for Zion Baptist across the river from Huanuco in a place called Paucar-

the river from Huanuco in a place called Paucarbamba.

Sunday a.m. I preached on the subject "Real Salvation" or who can be saved. I preached about the thirsty, hungry, tired of sin and those who recognized that they were slaves of sin and in themselves they would stay that way. A woman about 35 years old came saying, "I know I am hungry, thirsty, tired of sins and I know I am a slave to sin and God has right to send me to hell." She said, "I want OUT and IN."
