June 15th. Phillip and I left Lima to drive across the Andes Mts. One place was 15,800 feet above sea level; eleven hours later we arrived in Muanuco. 


there by our next mission letter. I am looking forward to Pastor Miquel Maia's return so I can better concentrate on the new works
