Directions To Grace Baptist Church, 2920 Beaver Valley Road, Fairborn, Ohio:

From the north on I-75 to I-70, go east on I-70, 9 1/4 miles to I-675 (the only way you can go) six miles to Exit 20 which is Dayton-Yellow Springs Road (well marked on large signs). At the end of the exit ramp, turn left and go one mile to Beaver Valley Road. Turn left on Beaver Valley Road one mile to the church's driveway and turn left up the hill to the church parking lot.

From the north on I-71 to I-70, go west on I-70 to I-675 and south on I-675 the same as above directions.

From east to west on I-70, exit on I-675 and then same as directions above.

From the south on I-75 take I-675, from I-675 take Exit 20 - Dayton-Yellow Springs Road. Follow directions for Exit 20, I-675 above.

From US 35 (going west) take Route 68 in Xenia toward Yellow Springs. From Route 68 make a slight left on Route 235 to Fairborn. From 235 make a left turn at the first traffic light (Dayton-Yellow Springs Road, but it is not marked). Proceed to Beaver Valley Road and turn left. At the church sign and mailbox turn left up the hill to the church parking lot.

From US 35 (from west of Dayton going east) take I-675 north. Take Exit 20 - Dayton-Yellow Springs Road. Follow directions for Exit 20, I-675 above.

Dear Fellow Laborers:

You may recall that Tabernacle Baptist Church was involved in a special evangelistic thrust at the time of my last letter. Over a period of three weeks approximately 68 individuals made public professions of faith. Forty five of these are now in follow-up classes. Many of them will be baptized this coming Sunday.

The schools are back in session following the between semester break (the school year starts in March). The church and school staffs have visited in the homes of 60% of our students and family members who are unsaved.

A group of ten from our church returned with rejoicing from a recent river missions trip. Milton and Gloria, missionaries serving in our church took this team to three villages on the Amazon. They held Vacation Bible Schools during the day and evangelistic meetings in the evening. In the first village 16 people made professions of faith. The first day at the 2nd village was well attended, but due to pressure from a teacher of false doctrine few showed the second day. Contacts to the homes yielded a "we're not interested, move out" re-

sponse. The aluminum boat used with the houseboat was also taken at this village, but

God opens doors! A public school teacher from a neighboring village declared, "No one is telling me what to do!" This teacher opened up the school building where she teaches for meetings. Eleven more individuals were saved in this third village! Those who went are anticipating their next mission trip.

The Seminary classes continue to meet on Sundays, Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. Young preachers are working with supervision in the three missions of Tabernacle in the suburbs of Manaus.

Inflation in Brazil this last month was 21% per month. This compounds to an annual rate of inflation of 985%. Those who are math buffs might like to figure this out. All who have compassion, please pray for your Brazilian brothers in Christ. Salaries are adjusted every month. The political situation is volatile. Making ends meet on very small incomes is very difficult.

During the school break our family had the privilege of spending some time with my parents, John and Alta Hatcher. It had been five years since we were last able to be with them. The distance between us and them is nearly as great as between us and Miami, Florida. Brazil is indeed a great country with great needs. Pray for us as we labor here.

On Saturday June 24th Mane and I drove from Lexington, to Point Pleasant, W. Va. We spent two nights with the Richard Turner family. On Sunday I preached at both services at the River View Baptist Church where Bro. Turner is the pastor.

Pray for us. We both have some, we trust, just minor health problems. We are during the day with Asa Mark and family at their house. The last few nights we have slept in our house. Our house needs a new roof (the new roof is being put on) and a new paint job outside and inside and some work on the plumbing and electrical system as well. We are grateful to those who have helped us with offerings for this purpose. Please continue to give to the Bratcher Buildings and to the regular fund as well. The most urgent need after the repairs on our home is a new building for the 17th of August Baptist Church here in Manaus. They have outgrown their small building.

Brethren,

The three new missions are progressing. We thank God for his grace to this people and nation. Antipolo, seems to be the most difficult at present. We have had many professions of faith, but only a few are willing to stand for Christ, when ridiculed by the priest, family or neighbors. The Catholic church has been their Christianity for 400 years. We are the new church. When people begin to attend, the neighbors shame them for denying their tradition and family commitment to the Catholic Church.

One of our young converts has been stricken with a fever, caused by a mosquito bite. It is a very deadly disease. The young man is in the hospital in the intensive care. Please pray for him, his name is Samgee. Expectations look grim, but we have a powerful God. The priest has told people the young man became demon possessed because he attended our services. I am

glad the doctors reported the cause of his illness was a fever.

San Pablo is doing very well. Many of the converts saved during our evangelistic service are growing in the Lord. We will have more to baptize this month.

On July 01, we traveled to our newest work, Sta Cruz, Zambales. I thought we would either drown or be blown away. A typhoon hit, we faced mudslides, high water, and rockslides. The trip usually takes 8 hours to drive but it took us 11 hours one way. We were very tired. God blessed in the attendance even with the bad weather we had over 400. There were close to 100 decisions that night. Praise the Lord... This is the mining camp of 6,000 people. Many want to have regular services. But at this time I can not go more than two days a month. I can't find a pastor to go there because of the danger. The communist patrols and controls the area. Two weeks before we arrived the communist came into camp and burned one of the main administration buildings. There are many killings and gun fights in the area and this scares the pastors from all work in the area.

Please pray with us for our building fund and if God would lead you to help, we sure thank you. Little is much in the service of our Lord. Please mark your offering "Henderson's Building."

Dear Brethren,

I want to give you a short report of the work in Peru and tell you of the blessings of the Lord.

Paul Washer and Daniel Franz arrived in Lima, Peru to live in our house and take care of the work in Ventanilla while we are on furlough.

The second day after arriving they started Spanish classes. The second week they had a Bible class in our home and have won two young people to the Lord. They plan to continue the Thursday Bible classes plus take care of the work at Ventanilla Wed., Sat. and Sunday.

June 12th. Philip Prather arrived in Lima at the airport about 6 A.M. The same morning Philip spoke for us at Ventanilla and I translated. He talked about how to know we are saved, not because we are good, or because we keep the law but, all because of God's Grace.

June 15th. Philip and I left Lima to drive across the Andes Mts. One place was 15,800 feet above sea level; eleven hours later we arrived in Muanuco. The following day we visited Pucallpa for him to see the building and meet the people there. We also visited a village where a new work has been started by the Zion Baptist Church. The Church has won the family where they have been preaching. The whole family has been won and baptized.

The new Brother in Christ has given a lot in the main part of town to build a Church building. In a few weeks they will need a roof. They will need lumber to build trusses and metal roofing. The land is given and the people will build the walls out of adobe. Will you help them with a roof? Between \$800.00 and \$1,000.00 will help them have their own meeting place.

The following day (Friday) we left Muanuco about 6:30 a.m. and drove to Chavenillo where the brethren were busy building and they should have the building finished by the end of July. Thanks again to Zion Missionary Baptist Church, Taylor Michigan. Chavinillo is about 45 miles from Muanuco, but the roads are so bad that it takes over four hours to get there. We hope to have pictures of the building going up in the next news letter.

June 18th. We left Muanuco early in the morning arriving back in Lima for Philip to repack his suit case to catch his plane to fly to Pucallpa to be with the Stantons. We arrived back in Lima June 21st. While he was in Pucallpa I was busy getting our permits to leave June 23rd.

June 23rd. About 1 P.M., we left Lima. Many of the Brethren had traveled by bus to see us off. It was a surprise to see so many of them at the airport when we arrived. It was really a crying time for us all. They love us and we love them. Remember to Pray for Paul Washer and Daniel Franz who will be working with Brother Marolino the Peruvian preacher who has been working with me for two years.
