Dear Brethren,

The First Baptist Church of Manclo Lima held a weekend meeting earlier this month. The evangelist was Brother Wanderley, pastor of Chapada Baptist Church in Manaus. On the last night there were 8 professions of faith. This service was held at the Calvary Baptist Church a couple of miles down the road. It was an open air service. I don't know how many people were present, but I do know they had a huge crowd. This service was on Sunday night, so I wasn't there, but I did get to be with them on the previous night.

We have had 2 people saved here in town. Attendance has been great in our evening services, but low on Sunday mornings.

The pastor of Faith Baptist Church, Brother Francisco Nery, resigned this month and moved to Manaus. Two of his daughters have some serious health problems and he wanted to get them to a place

where they would have some help. This was another heavy blow to our work here. He has been one of our best pastors and a very reliable worker. One of the lay preachers is taking care of the church. I am teaching for them on Mondays and Thursdays.

The church at Lagoinha has been having some tough times of late. Brother Wilson, the elderly pastor, turned the pastorate over to a younger man, Brother Edy. Just a couple of weeks back this man's wife left him. He resigned.

The worker who takes care of the congregation at Campinas became charismatic and took about 80% of the members with him. There were around 150 baptized there, so that means a big loss. Some of our men are going there this week to see how things are.

I have been to visit the church at Manclo Lima twice over the past month. Also I went up river to visit the preaching point at Pucalpa and the congregation at Valquirie. All of these works are doing fine.

Sorry I had to report so much bad news this time. We all know that these things happen at times. It doesn't make it any easier to take though! Pray hard for our work here. As you all know, we are very isolated here, which makes it even easier to get discouraged.

Dear Brethren,

Greetings in His precious name! We have been very busy this month. We preached at 4 different places. We finished up last month at Good Hope. The new pastor and family arrived and we have been able to turn the work over to him. Pray for the Miguel Maia family. His wife is having some trouble adjusting to the new surroundings. Yes, even here in Brazil the people have culture shock when they move from one region to another.

We preached in the area we hope to build the building and a lady in her 30's was saved, for which we rejoice. Pray for us as we are now trying to get all the red-tape done so we can begin to build. The building site is in an area that is only beginning to be developed, but is next door to 3 other neighborhoods. One of which has many thousands of people and is a working class housing project. The other two have many thousands of some of the poorest people you can imagine. Many live in paper shacks, or black plastic stretched over some staves. I have been thinking recently about the situation. If we had an old worn out city bus we probably could bring hundreds every month in to hear the gospel. We don't have in our financial budget money or plans for this, but I keep remembering that the Lord said to go out into the byways and hedges and compel them to come in, in order that His house may be full. In the States we normally equate buses with gimmicks and kids. If a bus was used on a Sunday night in that area it would bring in mainly teenagers and adults. I don't know how many of them

would be saved, but if just one came to know Jesus the way you know him would it not be worth it all? Folks, I am not a high pressure gimmick preacher. Of late I have been having trouble staying encouraged. I get frustrated when I see so much that needs to be done and we do not have the means or faith to do it. I don't want to do anything out of the Lord's will, but I know it is His will to preach the Gospel to the lost multitudes here in Cuiaba. Pray with us that we will have the means and wisdom to do it God's way.

We opened up the new work at Chacara dos Pinheiros last week. We had 15 visitors from the neighborhood. Only 3 of them said they were believers. Last Sunday a man from Good Hope church preached there and we had 11 people from the area. This is a work that Bro. Bobby Creiglow and I are opening together. Between the both of us we hope to be able to carry it on along with the other works.

Right now I am taking care of the Faith Baptist Church in Varzea Grande. This is only for 2 weeks while the pastor is working at the work in Nova Diamantino. Bro. Creighlow has made a trip to the acre to talk to a Brazilian preacher about coming to take over the work in Nova Diamantino. One must be found in the coming months as the Creighlows will be due for furlough in 1989. We have a real need for workers here in Cuiaba. Pray that the Lord will raise up faithful men to carry on the work after we are gone.

Ursula, Michelle and I had to make a quick trip to Brasilia last week. It was very tiring and we all had the flu, but we were able to get the passports and visa we needed without any trouble. We spent 4 days on the road during a 6 day period. The Lord gave us journey mercies and we returned home thankful for His protection. May the Lord bless each one.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

The past month has been a busy and productive month. It is always a blessing to be able to see progress.

Last Saturday another mission building was dedicated in one of the suburbs of Manaus. This building is like the one that we built a couple of months ago. The building was prefabricated in the church's woodworking shop, which took about two days. Then the foundation and floor were put in on site. This took another two days. On Saturday, 15 men from Tabernacle Baptist Church assembled the building on location in about 6 hours. That evening the building was dedicated.



These missions are staffed by seminary students: A couple of preachers and a musician. Pastor Miguel oversees the missions and works "to polish up" the preachers working in them. Thus, people are reached and workers are trained. It is the goal of Tabernacle Baptist Church to open a new chapel every month.

We have also been busy writing curriculum and textbooks for our Kindergarten through 8 grades. The Lord just recently provided equipment to make this project feasible. The school has been an excellent means of reaching young people and their families with the gospel. Though the school is self-supporting we do need your prayers for this ministry.

We are now able to baptize in our new auditorium due to the completion of our new baptistry. During the last year we have had to continue baptizing in the baptistry of the old building. This meant moving from the new to the old auditorium after Sunday night service. Because of the limited capacity, not everyone was able to witness the baptisms. The Lord willing, tomorrow night we will baptize in the new baptistry for the first time.

Judson's most recent check-up indicates that his leg is quickly returning to normal. He has now been off crutches for 6 months after using them for two and a half years. We are thankful to God for this, and for your prayers on his behalf.

Dear Brethren,

I have talked to June several times and she is doing fine, but my mother-in-law, Mrs. Ellen Steele has fallen and broken her hip and has been in the hospital for some time now. Please pray for June's parents as they both are in poor health. June will be back Sept. 5, the Lord willing. As I wrote the July MS letter I was leaving for Cantanhede that day. I went with another member from our church and we stayed for 10 days; during the day we worked on the building and at night we had special services. I came back from there this morning as I had gone there last Wednesday and bought lumber for the roof. They were supposed to have sent the lumber Friday but the saw mill broke down, but they should send it tomorrow. O well, this is normal here. It is quite different from when I was in Beatty-

ville, Ky. and one of our members ran Gentry Mays Lumber Yard. I could call Brother Kenneth Isaacs and soon one of their trucks would be on the job. The walls are plastered at the apartment and the floors are being installed. I have to try to find some time to install the bath room.

I have been doing some remodeling work on the mission house in Filipin in my spare time but I must admit that work at the house has stopped due to time.

Peritoro - I talked to the pastor this morning and he said they had 58 in Sunday School and that many last night. That is good for there.

New Hope Baptist is doing good under the leadership of our pastor. One was baptized this month, one was called to preach and several made moves of different types.

Anil Mission - One was baptized, I went one Sunday night and served them the Lord's Supper. We are waiting on the plans so we can start their building. "So, likewise ye, when ye shall have done all those things which are commanded you, say, we are unprofitable servants; we have done that which was our duty." Luke 17:10.

Dear Brethren,
As you know by now we are here in the states and will be here till next June on our regular furlough time.

Since we have been home, I have preached in the following churches: First Baptist Church, Ojus, Fla., Manchester Baptist Temple, Manchester, Ky., South Irvine Baptist Church, Irvine, Ky., Bethany Baptist Church, Rushtown, Ohio, Zion Missionary Baptist Church, Taylor, Mich., Grace Baptist Church, Holly, Mich., Union Baptist Church, Lipscomb, Ala., Renaker Baptist Church, Renaker, Ky. Tonight, I begin a meeting Wednesday through Sunday with the Lynams Creek Baptist Church near Beattyville, Ky.

This week I finally saw my heart doctor. My problem is not my heart for which I am thankful. The doctor had blood tests made and found that my triglycerides-fat in the blood was 980. Normal is about 200, so, the fat in the blood made the blood thick like catsup causing my heart to overwork. I am now on medication and a strict diet to bring the triglycerides count down. That means no fats or sweets.

July 31, my oldest sister, Dorothy Layne went home to be with the Lord. She had been sick for some time being in and out of the hospital. I preached her funeral at Zion Missionary Baptist Church, Taylor Mich. Brother Elton Wilson assisted in the funeral. There was a very large crowd of people who came and heard the gospel in singing and preaching.

The two young preachers that are taking care of my work in Peru report that there have been 12 professions of faith in the Lima area and that souls have been saved in all the missions and churches.

I received a letter also from Carlos Gonzales who is pastor of the Zion Baptist Church in Muanuco saying that the building at Cancalla was ready for the roof that I had promised. I have sent the money and they should be in their new building by now. A new mission has been started at ACOMAYO a large farm town out from Muanuco. The Brethren have found a large lot 800 feet by 800. We would like to buy it. We need \$1,000.00. They say the lot is near the main plaza. Will you help us? \$1,000 for the land and \$1,000 for the roof and soon we will have another Church reaching out. Maybe one Church could buy the land and another could provide the roof. If you want me to come to your Church, contact me at the address above.

Dear Brethren,

Since Tuesday we are back in our house. It was six weeks that we spent at Asa Mark and family's house. The painting and repairing of the house continues. We thank you - those that gave for our house repairs and to the Bratcher's Buildings during July. By faith we thank you because we have not yet received our deposit letter this month. We repeat last month's request: "Please continue to give to the Bratcher Buildings and to the regular fund as well.

The most urgent need after the repairs on our home is a new building for the 17th of August Baptist Church here in Manaus. They have outgrown their small building." Proof I submit to you: On Sunday morning, July 31st Marie and I visited the church and I preached to 143 people present. The Lord blessed with some three professions of faith. Just recently Dr. (M.D.) Francisco Jesus Dias - pastor of Calvary Baptist Church shared with me that they have not been financially able to complete their new building. They need at least \$1,000 (One Thousand dollars) to do so. I promised him to inform you of their need.

On the 16th of July, Marie and I with around 60 members of the 14th of December Baptist Church went by boat six and half hours to the New Jerusalem Baptist Mission. There at 17:00 o'clock I performed the wedding ceremony for the evangelist of the

mission - the young man who lived with us last term - Ediberto Ribeiro da Silva and Maria do Carmo Santos da Silva. The next day I preached at both services. Sunday afternoon - 24th of July - I brought a short message at the home of Lourival Batista de Oliveira. Bro. Lounval went to be with the Lord that morning. That night I preached the anniversary message (28th) of the 14th of December Baptist Church. There were some 368 people present. The following Saturday night I brought the ordination message for Edison Rodrigues Miranda - pastor at Gerizim Baptist Church. Sunday night found us at the Aleixo Baptist Church - Joinaldo de Aguiar Maia, pastor. August 9th - I preached at the home of Zilmar Cardoso dos Santos - his birthday and then on to the church where I preached a funeral message for Dona Orminda Matos Moreira.

Sunday, August 14th Marie and I attended and I preached at both services at the mission of the church at the Armando Mendes suburb. We had 54 present in the morning and 70 people filled the benches in the small building to hear my message that night. They will soon need a larger building and more land, etc. There were two rededications made. Pray for Paulo Moises Correio de Melo, the young pastor there. Also pray for Marivaldo Alves Natario who will continue on as pastor of the 17th of August Baptist Church.

Again, thank you and pray for me. I am happy to report that I am some better of my stomach problems. Marie is not as well due to her rheumatism. Pray for her complete recovery. Pray for Asa Mark and I that we will be able to continue to work together in harmony and peace as co-pastors of the 14th of December Baptist Church.

Dear Brethren,

We still have not had any rain and the dust continues to increase. Perhaps within the next two months it will rain a little.

I worked a couple of days this month getting our water lines at the church hooked up to the city water system and within one week we got enough water to almost half fill the baptistry. We had our first baptism service planned for last Sunday, so we finished filling it by hauling water in barrels from our well at our house. Last Sunday night I baptized one lady into the fellowship of our congregation under the authority of the Faith Baptist church of Varzea Grande. We now have four men and five ladies on our membership roll. I think all of our members are tithers and we think before long the congregation will be able to support a national pastor full time and we are already looking for one. Our attendance is also up a little this month, but I am sorry to say that

we have not had any professions of faith. We have a young people's meeting each Saturday Night and although it is for young people, some adults and children come and of course we don't turn any away. One Saturday night I said to Betty that we might not have very many because several said for one reason or another they would not be going.
