Dear Brothers and Sisters,

There is always something exciting going on around here. We thank the Lord for what He has enabled us to do.

This week we purchased another building for a mission. Our Church already has four of these missions going in various areas of our city. Because of the continuous growth of Manaus it is an ever expanding missions field. These missions are totally sponsored by Tabernacle Baptist Church, but your earlier investments in this work have helped make this producing church a reality. This new building will enable us to open a 5th mission. We are planning to begin services in it on Oct. 15.

With the Lord's help, we plan to buy another building next week. This is in the area that was at one time exclusively set apart for a leprosy colony. The city of Manaus has now grown out to this community which at one time was used to segregate lepers at some distance from town. We took the adults from Tabernacle as a group to help with one of these missions last week. We would like to do this at a different mission at least once each month.

The missions are staffed by seminary students. These students work to support themselves as they go to school. THEY GET NO AID OF ANY KIND TO PAY FOR THEIR SCHOOLING OR TO MEET THEIR DAILY NEEDS. Your gifts to the regular fund of Baptist Faith Missions and those designated to the Seminary of Manaus meet the cost of part of the Seminary teachers salaries. Come and see the work, if God enables you.

What a blessing to begin using the baptism in our new auditorium this past month. It is delightful to be able to have baptisms included in our regular services once again.

Among other things, as running the schools and pastoring, we have also been supervising the work of building a dam on the church camp. It will provide the camp with a lake for water supply, fish for food and recreation of campers. Last week we had a special camp with 65 of our Junior High students. This was the first time that we have used the camp in conjunction with the school ministry. As we have already mentioned in an earlier letter, we have seen a good number of our school students and parents saved this year.

The work is great! The dividends are out of this world!

Dear Brethren,

I mentioned last month that Bro. Candido would be filling in for me at Novo Diamantino while Betty and I would be in Cruzeiro do Sul. He asked me what I wanted him to do while we were gone and I told him that all I wanted was for him to fill the building and prepare Sunday school teachers to take care of that many people. Of course I was only teasing him, but he accepted it as a challenge. With special promotions, a lot of visitations and hard work they reached over 150 in the Sunday services. They took one of their busses to bring the people and that also helped a lot. As for the Sunday school teachers they did make one good step forward for us, but we already had that pretty well under way when they got there. They also had two professions of faith, a young married lady and a single young man.

The young man that was saved is the son of the first lady that made a profession of faith in this new work and I would like to share with you all, something that this

lady told us yesterday while we were visiting in her home. This lady's husband came with her to services just after she got saved and has not stopped coming since. He has not been saved as yet, but although before he was almost never home, being a truck driver, he now does his best to work his schedule so that he can be there. We have completed 5 months back on the field. Much has happened during this time. We have bought a lot to build a building, we have opened up a new work in a very needy community, and we have tried to be an encouragement to our Brazilian pastors. At this time we are trying to find 2 more workers. Pray that the Lord will give labourers unto the harvest.

I went to the doctor and found that I have a minor problem with cholesterol and a slight chemical imbalance. He put me on a diet and said I have to have a considerable amount of exercise in order to promote better circulation. I am walking and jogging for one hour each day and am beginning to feel better. We have gone 4 months without rain and the dust and heat is hard on everyone.

We had a young girl saved at the Chacara dos Pinheiro work this month.

We are also working with her parents. That work is slow partly due to opposition from the Pentecostals. But we are trying to visit 2 days a week there and to be faithful. At the Good Hope Baptist Church we had a young man saved yesterday. So we rejoice in this. I went to Diamantino yesterday to take a young preacher and wife. They are considering coming to help Bro. & Sis. Creiglow there. I was thrilled to see the way the work there is being blessed.

We have bought a 1960 F-100 Ford pickup truck. We are bringing about 25 to 30 people from the area we hope to build the building to the services at Good Hope church. Also, we use it to take workers to our 6:00 p.m. service at the new mission. We need to put on new rear leaf springs and do a complete brake job including rear drums and master cylinder. As I wrote in my last letter we have a real need for this kind of transportation. I have decided that we will try to make do with this vehicle. We could use some help on these repairs. Also, we need to put a cover over the back of it soon as it will soon begin to rain again.
