### Begin Support for National Workers in Korea and the West Indies

For some time the Directors have been praying and considering a way to help more of our national brethren to do mission work. During the Thanksgiving Conference, the Directors voted to go ahead with this. If you would like to help those in Korea and the West Indies to do mission work, please designate an offering. We encourage you to not take away from giving to our American missionaries but to give more to help our national workers.

Before the conference, Brother Summers and Brother Hamilton went to the West Indies to see the work first hand. Their letter of recommendation follows. We will be giving reports on the Korean work and West Indies work regularly in the near future.

### Report of Summers, Hamilton Trip to Virgin Islands

On Thursday, September 22nd I left Detroit for a flight to Miami where I met Brother James Hamilton and we then travelled together on to Cruz Bay, St. John in the U. S. Virgin Islands.

The purpose of this trip was to meet with Pastor Emmanuel Jaggernauth of the Cruz Bay Baptist Church and director of the West Indies Mission Fund for several discussion periods regarding Baptist Faith Missions becoming involved in helping raise support for a number of missionaries in the Caribbean. These sessions went well and we left St. John on Monday, September 26th feeling that all the major points of the proposed plan had been sufficiently discussed, questions had been asked and answered from both sides and there was a general belief that the two groups could have a working relationship that would benefit all concerned and more importantly, honor the Lord.

The final decision regarding this project will be made at the Thanksgiving Conference, but the Executive Committee of BFM agreed on the Friday following our return to begin immediately accepting and dispensing offerings designated to the West Indies Mission Fund.

The West Indies Mission Fund has Emmanuel Jaggernauth of St. John as director, with Samuel Liburd and Melville Samuel of St. John, Sentoma Jaggernauth of Trinidad and Vincent Duncan of Jamaica making up the rest of this mission agency. This group will make the final decision of where any money we send (outside of designated funds) will go. At this point their plans are to support a number of native pastors/missionaries in the West Indies, the U. S. Virgin Islands and South America. They are presently supporting four in Jamaica, two in the British Virgin Islands, four in Trinidad, three in the U. S. Virgin Islands, two in Guyana, South America, as well as the Virgin Islands School of Theology on St. John. Offerings may now be sent to Baptist Faith Missions for any of these, or the school. A complete list can be mailed to anyone interested.

This trip to St. John was one of more than a dozen I have made there in the past 12-14 years. It was Brother Hamilton's first visit. We saw some of the beauty of the islands, preached every day but one, taught 2 classes each in the Virgin Islands School of Theology and were wonderfully hosted in the home of Emmanuel and Merle Jaggernauth. Wayne and Olean Brickner took us on a partial tour of the island, for which we are grateful. The Brickners are there helping Brother Jaggernauth in the school.

I can personally recommend the West Indies Mission Fund and the missionaries receiving support through it, as well as the Cruz Bay Baptist Church and the Virgin Islands School of Theology and Pastor Emmanuel Jaggernauth. I can do so without reservation. Brother Hamilton has now been there and based on what he observed and learned while there joins me in a total support of this project for BFM. One of our newest directors of BFM, Bro. Doug King, has also been there many times and gives his total support to the work also.

If you have any questions I hope you will ask them. We will be glad to answer them. Churches may begin to send offerings immediately. Please make this new support, rather than taking from the general fund offerings of BFM. We cannot afford that.

Dear Co-Laborers in Christ,

I want to begin this letter by commending the Twelve-Ryan Baptist Church, Wallace York, Pastor, and New Hope Baptist Church, Marvin Summers, Pastor, for the outstanding job they did in sponsoring the Thirty-Fourth Thanksgiving Conference. It was the best conference in every way which I have attended in 28 years.

During that conference while meeting with the Directors of Baptist Faith Mission and after much prayer and soul searching, I submitted my resignation as Missionary to the Philippines. I have spent 7 glorious years of ministering to the Filipino people. My resignation was accepted by the directors who informed me that I may finish my furlough, which will expire at the end of May of '89. My reason for resigning was due to a medical

problem, known as chemical deficiency, which is presently being treated through proper medication. The nature of this problem is biological in nature and may be aggravated by undue stress. Thus my doctor recommended that I accept a ministry stateside to reduce stress. My family and I covet your prayers for us as we wait upon the Lord who has promised us that after He has tested us, "we shall come forth as gold." Job 23:10

In closing I want to share with you an update report from Pastor Palma, who is now in charge of our church in the Philippines. "My wife and I are still rejoicing with the souls saved during our church's 4th anniversary. There were more than 20 rededications and 15 souls professed to be saved. ## The River Has Come Back Up . . . Brother Sebastiao Takes Vacation To Do Mission Work . . . Concerned About Lack of Concern by Some Brazilian Brethren for Missions . . .

Dear Brethren,

Last month I told you how the river was lower than ever before. It only took a couple of weeks and a few rains to turn that around. The river has come up over 3 feet and is still coming up. The barges that bring in everything that is sold in our stores are finally arriving. River travel has improved.

Brother Sebastiao, one of our local missionaries, is taking his vacation to spend with the congregation at Profeta. During this month he will be teaching the young believers there and helping to build the building. Profeta is one of our missions up river. He and two or three others take care of this mission and the others at Valquinia, Luzeiro and Pucalpa.

There has been one more lady saved at Santa Rosa. The crowds in these larger villages have been fair, but have been hurt some by the political campaigns. Unfortunately we will be having elections for three

years in a row. Nevertheless three of our preachers and their families have continued to visit Santa Rosa, Sao Pedro, Santo Antonio and Sao Domingos, each week.

We have had just one more saved here in town at First Baptist Church. Our evening crowds have been good and still low on Sunday mornings.

Faith Baptist Church is still without a pastor. I am still teaching there 2 nights a week and helping out as much as I can.

I am concerned about the apparent lack of concern for missions in our other churches at this time. Many of them have made a practice of loading up a truck or boat to go visit other churches on a week end. Yet they say they are not able to make mission trips. One of our bigger churches, pretty well-off financially, is just 2 miles from a large village with no Baptist work. For the past 5 years I have tried to persuade the pastor to start a work there. The church has members with trucks and cars and the road is paved, yet no action was taken. Now a Protestant group has started a work there. Pray for us, brethren. You may have seen similar situations in your country and if so, can appreciate my concern.

It has been a year now that we started working on trying to get property in Novo Diamantino. The land was donated by the city along with a building permit and since

so many get property like this to sell they would not give us a deed for it until the building was up. After the building is built we were to pay about \$100.00 for the deed. This is city election year and month. Several months ago a politician told me that we would not even have to pay the one hundred

dollars and that he would take care of everything. Well, I did not keep running after him, so another told me about a month ago that there had been nothing done about it, but that he would take care of it. I did not run after him either. One night last week he called a meeting of all the people in the area that were waiting on their deeds, but since it was a political meeting, I did not go. One of the ladies of our congregation was there to get her deed and said the deed to

our property was one of the first presented, but since I was not there he asked her to bring it to me. He said also that he was very happy to be able to give the property and deed to the church and if the city had not had the property to give he would have bought it with his own money and given it to the church. I doubt that he would have done that, but I was glad to get the free publicity. Well, it isn't all good news. The man that used to own this property, and says he still does, is also running for office and says if he is not elected he will tear all the houses down that are on his property. I am not too much worried about that.

A couple of months ago I wrote about a man who has been coming to our services telling his lost mother that the best thing that ever happened in their lives was that building of the Baptist church in front of their house. He was saved this month completing the entire family of five. This family is being a real blessing to us. We also had an eight year old boy saved this month. In part, because of the political meetings our attendance has not been too good this month. Today is election day, so we hope things will get better.

As you pray, remember us before the Lord that we might be faithful.

This has been an average month. We are still working in 3 different works. This keeps us busy, but we don't mind that. All is going about the same as last month. We are continuing to have opposition at the Chacara dos Pinheiros work. But we feel it is the Lord's will for us to be there, so we are trying to be faithful. In fact we are making plans to build a small building there. We hope to begin in the next three weeks. It will be 9 meters x 12 meters and will have 2 School rooms and the auditorium. As soon as we get it completed and have a Brazilian worker there, we plan to build in Tijucal where we already have a lot bought. We may not have sufficient to do both, but we feel the Lord will provide. Our goal is to have both of these works with buildings and Brazilian workers within the next 12 months. If it is the Lord's will, it can be done even though it is a lot to expect.

I am teaching the adult Sunday school class at the Good Hope Baptist Church each week. The regular teacher changed jobs and for now has to work on Sundays. We are still teaching the Bible Class at the Faith Baptist Church in Varzea Grande at the Seminary.
