The Situation In Peru... The Real Need of Peru... Our Goals...

Dear Brethren:

In my last mission letter I had just returned from Peru. Let me give you a last minute report of Peru. Peru is suffering from massive foreign debt, government over-spending, corruption and many, many other problems. Peru is considered to be at the brink. Observers say the economic and political difficulties that the nation now faces have never been worse. The President's policies are proving disastrous. The government money is gone. Inflation is running 20,000 percent. Recession is severe. The government is losing ground to the communist guerrillas and talk of a military coup is in the air. Most of the people feel that the election will come before the military will do anything. Soviet advisers are in the country now handling the campaign for Barrantes who is the communist candidate.

But, what is Peru's greatest need? Their greatest need is for missionaries who preach the gospel of God's saving grace, to preach the message of Christ that will change people and nations. Many missionaries have already left and others are busy packing and selling and want to leave as soon as possible. According to a recent poll, two thirds of the Peruvians 14 to 17 years old wish they had been born anywhere else.

Just about every place I have gone people have said, why do you plan to go back to Peru? The answer is that our job is not finished yet. We have a job to finish and souls are dying and many have never heard the saving gospel of Jesus Christ.

Our goals are the same. First - to raise \$15,000 to build a building at VENTANILLA 40 feet wide and 80 feet deep.

Second - to send a four wheel drive vehicle back to Peru to use in the mountains where we have most of our work.

Third - to buy the land and build a building at ACAMAYO. Souls are being saved in all of our works. We have sound preachers who want to get the message out to every city and town possible. WILL YOU HELP? MANY HAVE ALREADY SAID THAT WE ALL SOUND LIKE BEGGARS. I plead with you to do all you can to help us reach out while there is still time.

Several churches are planning to give to the building at VENTANILLA and the property and building at ACAMAYO. My son Ricky has given a 1978 Chev. Suburban 4-wheel drive that we plan to fix up in good shape and ship back to Peru. It will cost \$2,800.00 to ship. We still have three months to reach the goal.

Since arriving back from Peru I have preached for First Baptist of Ojus, Florida, Park Ridge Baptist, Gotha; Harmony Baptist, Melbourne; Grace Baptist, Bradenton; Bible Baptist, Plant City and Grace Baptist, Fairmont, GA.

Report on Work Around Manaus... Latter Part of Month Makes a Mission Journey to Interior... 7 Day Meeting at Olinda with 8 Decisions...

Dear Brethren,

Of the four Sundays of this month's report, the first two we were in Manaus, the last two we were in the interior. During the days in Manaus, we made visits in homes and hospitals - performed a wedding ceremony - preached a funeral sermon for Maria Lima Gomes, 75 years old, a faithful member of the 14th of December Baptist Church. Sunday morning - Jan. 22 - preached at the 14th church and again Sunday night the 29th. Saturday night the 28th I preached the Anniversary Service at the Compensa II Baptist Church where Francisco Barbosa Freitas is the pastor. On Sunday morning the 29th, I preached to 30 people present at the Tancredo Neves mission of the church.

At 20:10 (6:10 p.m.) the 31st (9 hours behind time) we began our trip - 3 of us (Mrs. Bratcher, myself and our pilot Francisco Barbosa dos Santos). We traveled until 1:30 a.m., stopping at the New Jerusalem Baptist Church. The next morning we continued our trip with two more aboard - Evando & Elizete da Silva. We traveled on after two stops until about 20:30 when we stopped along the river for the night. We reached Nova Olinda do Norte at

around 10:00 and left there around noon. By 17:00 we arrived at Olinda. There during the next 7 days and nights we held services each morning at 8:00 and each night at 19:30. Each morning or afternoon we made visits in homes. Each visit was a short service. We were blessed with a total of 8 decisions - two asked for and received baptism - two made rededications and four made professions of faith - three in the services and an elderly, sick woman in her home. The smallest attendance was 13 the first night; the largest, 59 the last night.

Thursday night found us at the Nova Olinda Baptist Church. I preached to 44. Josue Pereira Martins is the pastor. Friday night I preached to 44 at the Colonia de Amatori Mission of the church. Saturday we traveled for about three hours on up the river toward Manaus to the New Jerusalem Baptist Church, Harold Bratcher, pastor. There I preached Saturday night and at both services on Sunday. We had 67 in Sunday School and Sunday night some 47 present and one rededication. The next morning we left at 5:25 and arrived in Manaus at 15:10.

We rejoice in the Lord that yesterday and today we have been able to help some of the pastors and churches in their needs due to the generosity of those of you who have so generously given to "Bratcher's funds" these last few months. May the Lord bless you is our prayer. Continue to give and to pray for us. We will be glad to hear from you. Our address is listed above. Dear Brethren,

This has been a very busy, but glorious month. Our new work in Tijucal got a boost when we were able to get a small house close to our lot where we hope to build at the end of the year. We hope to begin holding weekly services there in March. For the present most of the people there are coming in on our Gospel wagon (1960 Ford pick-up). We now have the top for it and brakes are better.

The work in Chacara dos Pinheros is really seeming to catch on right now. Our attendance is up; both in the children's Bible school and in the Sunday night service. Yesterday a 45 year old man told me he is about to become a Christian. He says he won't be able to resist much longer. It sounds as if the Holy Spirit may be working in his heart. We have been bogged down in our construction there because of red tape and the lack of closing the deal on the lot to build on. Today we closed the deal on a lot there. This is a joint project between Bro. Bobby Creiglow and I. We hope to begin to build there in March.

The Good Hope Baptist Church is doing better right now. Attendance is up and the people are encouraged. We had 5 first time visitors and 1 profession of faith

this last Sunday. Right now I am really overloaded. I do have some help from some of the young preachers here in the Seminary and also from the church. Please pray for our Seminary. It is now in its second semester. The students are enjoying the "Attributes of God" taught by Bro. Creiglow. Our church here is talking of starting a Christian School next year. We have enough qualified teachers if they have enough motivation and desire.

We just got back from a 3 day Camp with our church people. It was a glorious time. I preached 4 times on Bible Prophecy and then gave time for questions. The only complaint was that I didn't teach but 45 minutes at a time. It wasn't my preaching that attracted them so much, but the content and glorious future put forth in the Scriptures for God's people. It was all topped off by a 16 year old girl trusting Christ under heavy conviction at the end of the last service. I felt like shouting, but only the Pentecostals do that here. (And there---?) So much for all that. We also had a fun time in the afternoons pitching horseshoes, ping-pong, volley ball, etc. Everyone is already looking forward to next year.

Ursula fell and bruised her back and arm badly. She also is in the middle of a root canal. Also, we have to move tomorrow. As much as we have moved we should be used to it, but we're not. God bless all of you. Pray for us.

Report from the Field... Valuable Lessons Learned from 42 Years in the Ministry... Love and Loyalty...

Dear Friends,

There is not much for me to report from the mission field in Brazil since Alta and I are presently in the States. Letters and calls tell us that all is going well, for the most part. Souls are being saved and baptized, the weak are being encouraged, and our preachers are preaching and teaching.

After 42 years in the ministry, 33 years of mission work in Brazil and 9 years of pastoring before going to Brazil, it seems that something should have been learned that could help someone who might be seeking some answers in his life, that I have been seeking for a long time. It might be a help, that is, if by the grace of God, I have learned anything.

There were times in my life when I succeeded in making a complete fool of myself, as well as embarrassing family and friends. Maybe I could have avoided some of those moments had some older person who had my respect and confidence would have confidentially and lovingly taken me aside, and in love and confidence, "wised me up" concerning theological debates and Christian ethics. Now, if you do not know what Christian ethics means, here it is in a nutshell: Christian ethics is the behavior of a child of God patterned after the life actions and decisions of Jesus. When you ask the question: WHAT WOULD JESUS DO IF HE WERE IN MY PLACE?, and answer the

question honestly, you will find from the study of the life of Jesus know exactly what decision and what action you should take. Christian ethics is "to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God."

As I look back over my life with all its relationships, it seems that loyalty is perhaps the quality that most reflects Jesus in His relationship with men. Loyalty is the product of love. God's love is toward men and not to things. If we are filled with His love we will be loyal to Him and also to His children. The quality of loyalty is the number one quality needed in a missionary and it is the number one quality needed in Christians and churches who pledge their support to missionaries. Jesus was not loyal to a cause, He was loyal to a Person. He loved His Father and he loved persons.

Love cannot be separated from loyalty. Love and loyalty have to do with people, not things. I cannot be a good missionary unless I love and am loyal to the people to whom I minister. I cannot be a good missionary unless I love and am loyal to the persons who have made my ministry possible. Loyalty to Christ necessitates loyalty to one another. The success of reaching people with the gospel, baptizing persons who are saved, and teaching persons depends to a great degree on our loyalty to Him and to one another.

One of the greatest dangers among Baptist is the misuse of the freedom we have in Christ. Disloyalty is a danger from within that destroys our power with God and our love for men.

I think I have learned - to be like Christ I must have unfailing loyalty.

Although I have not been able to help much with the work at the Chacara dos Pinheiros to be able to give a first hand report, but I understand that work is doing well also. The Faith Baptist Church where we worked for several years continues to do very well under the leadership of Bro. Candodo. They are having good attendance and souls are being saved from time to time.

About two weeks ago I was able to rent a little house in Novo Diamantino and Betty and I have moved out of the church building into the house. We didn't have much to move, but we did furnish it with just enough

to get by, because we will be spending less and less time there. We are slowly working ourselves out of a job there. Pastor Carlos and his family are working out very well and the people seem to like them very much. This month we have had six or eight professions of faith there and the attendance is coming up a little almost every month. I mentioned that we would be spending less time there. This is so that when we leave in June for the States they will all be used to the idea of only having a Brazilian pastor. We plan to organize the congregation into a church on April 23 and at the same time ordain Bro. Carlos to the gospel ministry.

Our seminary is also going very well with from twelve to fifteen students that seem eager to learn. Our desire is that from now on we will be able to prepare enough from the churches in our area to take over the works that we already have started and also start new ones. I do not feel qualified to be teaching in this, but I do enjoy it once I get into it.

We still have a lot to do before June comes and that is not far away.

Persecution Opens the Eyes of a High School Teacher. . . Report on Missions at San Pablo and Solid Rock. . . Plan to Support National Workers. . .

Brethren:

After many months of sowing God's word in Antipolo, we are beginning to harvest. This past Sunday we had 100 in attendance, with a baptismal service following. Bro. Ruel Rule, a high school teacher at LaSalle High School, finally submitted to believers' baptism. Back in April 1988, he had made a profession of faith in Christ, but he would not renounce the Catholic church. What caused him to finally submit? God used the persecution we have endured to speak to him. Also, on January 29th the Roman Catholic bishops issued a pastoral letter which was printed on the front pages of the newspaper. The letter condemned foreign American missionaries and called us a sect and said we teach heresy. Bro. Rule said only love for Christ could motivate a preacher like me to continue on through the many trials we have faced there in Antipolo. So, God used the attacks by the Catholic bishops to speak to the hearts of His people. Affliction has motivated the people to take a stand upon the word of God. We praise God for the results we're seeing now as people respond to the Catholic church attacks.

willing to stand for the truth. We were happy to see seven new members baptized last month. We just want to praise God for his grace and faithfulness to us.

The Solid Rock Mission is averaging 15 to 20 adults every Sunday afternoon. It is located at the Solid Cement factory compound near Teresia, Rizal. Also, near the same area we have started two new preaching points. On February 5, 1989, we had an evangelistic service outside under a big tree. There were 58 in attendance with 18 professions of faith, all adults, from 20 to 80 years of age. This is a hard area to reach and the people are so poor; no one has been in the area with the gospel before.

Our seminary students are excited over the forming of a national mission board to help young national pastors who have been called of God to do mission work but, without the financing, have had a hard time. The B.C.P.I. (Baptist Church Planters Philippines, Inc.) is a new mission board that we are starting and we need your prayers and financial help to help these brethren to help themselves. We are still in the planning stages and will let you know more at a later time. We just ask that you pray for this new work.

This increases our ability to minister to the hearing impaired directly and through the saved deaf as they grow in the Lord and are able to help other deaf.

The Mission at Sao Sebastiao is now functioning. The first service had to be held in the street in front of the building we just bought

Dear Brethren,

In late December and early January we had some gains and some losses. For over a year now we have had a steady flow of people leaving Cruzeiro do Sul to live in other cities of Brazil where they can lead a better life. There are no jobs here and living is very expensive. There are few things to buy and what is available is more expensive than anywhere else. There is no chance for higher education either. Almost every week we have had people leaving from our church. Last month we lost 6 more and others are making plans to leave. This has been very discouraging. We lost 3 Sunday school teachers, a preacher and our Sunday school superintendent in the past 2 months. We have had some folks saved

along though. Just a few days ago another woman was saved who has been having a terrible bout with cancer.

The congregations in the interior are doing quite well. The mission at Guajara and the church at Sacado are being pastored by Brother Joao now. He is a young man who was saved at camp some years ago. I just performed his wedding a few weeks ago. He and his wife are traveling each week to take care of the work down river. They are getting ready to build a Sunday school room at Sacado and he is leading the church to resume the preaching point further down at Uniao.

I just got back from a fast trip to the U.S. I was there for 10 days re-purchasing the parts and equipment that were stolen. The folks at Central Baptist Church of Grenada, Mississippi really helped me to replace the things. The fellowship with the folks there and of course Brenda and Demas Brubacher was just what I needed. I was needing a break from my work here and they were the blessing I needed.

May God bless all of you and thanks for all of your prayers and support.
