On March 24th - a holiday - We had morning and afternoon services at the 14th of December Baptist Church. The church showed much love to me on my 62nd birthday! On the 5th of April after Prayer Meeting much love was shown to Marie on her 62nd birthday. The Lord truly blessed us both on our birthdays!

Friday and Saturday nights - March 17-18 Marie and I with Diogo Sousa (a young man of the church) spent the nights in the home of Pastor and Mrs. Marcondes Nogueira in Manacapuru. Friday night we attended and I led the Bible Study at the Zion Baptist Church - 14 present. The next night I preached the dedication service at a mission close to Manacapuru. Argemiro Miranda Leite is the pastor. Over 100 people were present - in or outside. Two men made professions of faith.

Sunday morning on the way back to Manaus we visited and I preached at the First Baptist Church of Iranduba. 29 were present. The church is without a pastor. That night we visited and I preached at the Canaa Baptist Mission here in Manaus. Jair Mendonca Pereira is the pastor. Some 45 were present.

Sunday morning - April 2nd we visited and I preached at the Nova Amanhecer Baptist Church. 35 of us were present. Francisco Assis dos Santos, the pastor wasn't present. That night I preached at the 14th Church. There were 229 present with 3 decisions. Last Sunday we were blessed again at the Church. 264 were present in Sunday Bible School and an estimated 220 that night. There were 7 professions of faith and two requests for baptism. We praise the Lord! The same night Asa Mark preached to est. 300 at the Chapada Baptist Church where Brother Wanderly Rodrigues Melo is the pastor. There were 5 professions of faith.

We are grateful to you - brethren, beloved of the Blessed Saviour for your prayers and offerings - regular and designated that you gave and give through B. F. M. May the Lord continue to help us all to be cheerful givers.

Since arriving in the United States, we have traveled more than 21,000 miles. Our hearts have been encouraged by the reception and the interest shown by the churches visited.

During the month of May we will be visiting churches in West Virginia, and in the month of June we will be visiting churches in the Detroit area.



OLD AGE WRINKLES. I tell Alta I prefer to refer to my wrinkles as expression and character lines. As people grow old their faces reveal a lot that the heart tries to conceal. There are different lines for smiles and frowns, for anger and forgiveness, for peace and fear, and for bitterness and sweetness of spirit. Lines caused by bitterness, anger, and fear have a tendency to deepen as life passes. Likewise, the lines which express joy, forgiveness, and peace, also, become more indelible. No one seems to be able to avoid the facial lines that tell much about how we have matured.

Churches, too, have personalities and facial lines that might be called "wrinkles." Maturity comes by the passing of the years, the gaining of knowledge and understanding. Maturity helps us make better choices if we have the right kind of lines. It does take time to reveal a man's desires and purpose in life.

Baptist Faith Missions has an existence old enough to reveal some character lines. I

like what I see in those lines. They reveal a good spirit in trying to reach the lost. They reveal good faith and fairness toward the missionaries. They reveal a stability and faith that genders confidence. They reveal the faithfulness of the missionaries who have worked hard and have produced results, good results in five countries.

The lines of Baptist Faith Missions reveal joy and contentment in what God has done, they reveal peace in the confidence that God will continue to bless, they reveal kindness and forgiveness where they have not always been understood.

No one bats a 1000%. No one is perfect. But, Baptist Faith Missions has a good batting average. Take a good look at the work that has been done, the number of churches that have been organized, the number of permanent missions in different cities, the number of nations where missionaries have been sent, the small number of missionaries that have left the field, the large percentage of missionaries who have been on the field for more than 15 years, and THE AMOUNT OF WORK DONE FOR THE AMOUNT OF MONEY SPENT ON EACH MISSIONARY. No one bats a 1000%, but from where I stand Baptist Faith Missions has a higher average than any mission work I know of.

Yes, the wrinkles on my face show a lot of things about my inner feelings and my attitudes. But, there is one thing you can read from my wrinkles: I AM GUNG HO FOR BAPTIST FAITH MISSIONS - the missionaries on the fields, the churches who chose to support faithfully, and the brethren who serve as directors.

Greetings in the precious name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

We always give thanks to God for you, making mention of you in our prayers. It is because of your prayers and financial assistance that we are able to assist many of the nationals to establish New Testament churches throughout the West Indies.

After the Spring Break our Bible College is in full gear. We are looking forward to the graduation with great anticipation. But until then (May 27), there is quite a lot of studying to be done.

Our plans for V. B. S. and summer camp are progressing on schedule. We have received five scholarships for summer camp (\$400.00). We need fifteen more. Also we received a small package with soaps, toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant (five of each). We appreciate this very much. The purpose of this camp is to reach neglected boys and girls in the virgin Islands with the Gospel, and to show them that people care.

We are glad to report that the loss of financial support to the West Indies Missions is gradually being made up. We are receiving \$150.00; \$650.00 is yet needed. How we praise the Lord for His goodness towards us. Brother Wayne Brickner just returned from a trip to Trinidad and Guyana. He spent some time with Bro. Almond and Bro. Punalall. While there he was able to fellowship with Bro. Nagaur and Bro. Abraham. All of these are in Guyana. In Trinidad, he spoke for Bro. Sookraj and Bro. Borosa.

The Lord is blessing us here. On Easter Sunday I had the privilege of baptizing ten, with over 300 present. This past Sunday morning there were five decisions, for which we praise Him. Also I have preached at several of the churches lately. Last month I was at the Mount of Olives Baptist Church, where Bro. Osvaldo Rodrigues is the pastor. Then on March the 12th, I preached at the Genzim Baptist Church, celebrating their 14th anniversary. Their young pastor, Bro. Edison Miranda is doing a good job there. Dear Brethren,

We just finished our first year back here in Mato Grosso. We had a Special service out in the Tijucal Mission to commemorate and to thank the Lord for the way He has blessed us in the work here. At this time I am covered up in work. We are now putting a roof over our temporary place of meeting in Tijucal. We already have about 40 people from that area who regularly come to our services here in town in our pick-up on Sunday mornings or on Sunday nights. We expect this to be a strong work when we get the building built.

As most already know Bro. Creiglow (Bobby) and I are involved in a joint work in a place called "Chacara dos Pinherios". I am in construction there also. We have in the electrical main and most of the brick, sand gravel, etc. near the site. We have to transfer it from the previous site which did not get approval for building a church. As I have stated previously, we have had stiff opposition. We should be close to having up the outside walls by our next letter. We had a 21 year old lady saved there Sunday night. One of the young preachers from our church is preaching there and is really

growing in the ministry. Several from the Tijucal area are helping out there in getting the work started.

The work here at the Boa Esperanca church is stable. We have some very good people who are grounded in the truth. Some of them seem to be grounded when it comes to go out and visit also. I am trying to encourage them to evangelize in the church community. We are still without a pastor here and I am filling in. I have been trying to cover 3 places until recently. I still do most of the visiting for the 3 places. Brethren, we need a missionary family here. Pray about this. The fields are truly white unto harvest. Cuiaba will double again in just a few years. It is becoming the "St. Louis" of the early "Go West" in the States. We have 2 railroads coming our way in the next 5 years which will industrialize this area and bring in hundreds of thousands of new people! Let's work to be prepared to evangelize these many souls. It is the Lord's work, but yours and my responsibility.

We are doing okay as far as health. Ursula is getting extensive dental work done. Michelle is doing much better after her ear surgery. I am feeling great except for being tired in the heat. The rain is about to stop and cooler weather should be near. We want to express our appreciation to all who remember us both through prayer and financial support.

The value has dropped so we will lose about thirty seven cents to the dollar on our salary, plus the building supplies will cost thirty seven cents to the dollar more. Pray for us - our protection and provisions as we prepare to return.

My wife Elizabeth, our daughter Melissa and I want to thank each church, pastor and people who have encouraged us and helped us. We also want to thank the directors of Baptist Faith Missions and supporting churches who give and work to make our ministry possible in Peru, South America.

As we face the prospect of leaving the Philippines on furlough, we realize the work has just begun: much more needs to be done. As the day of our departure nears, our hearts are filled with mixed emotions. Joy, as we anticipate being with our family and friends again to share the sweetness of life, that sweetness, that has made it so hard to be away. Homesickness can only be cured by being home. We have missed seeing the changes in our family; we now have four grandchildren. We have missed the sweet fellowship of all our friends. Many have given sacrificially that we and others could spread the gospel of Jesus Christ. So we are feeling joy as we look forward to soon being home with you. But as we are joyful, we are also mournful, because now we have loved ones here, so joy gives way to tears as we face the day of departing.

Ezra 3:11,13 "And they sang together by course in praising and giving thanks unto the Lord: Because he is good, for his mercy endureth forever toward Israel. And all the people shouted with a great shout,

when they praised the Lord, because the foundation of the house of the Lord was laid. This has been a busy month for June and me, traveling 3 Sundays to be in different churches.

Anajutuba - Sunday, March 19, we went to Anajutuba. I preached Sunday morning, also Sunday night. Sunday afternoon we went to visit a woman who is dying with cancer. We told her the sweet story about Jesus and she made a profession of faith; we had a good day in Anajutuba.

Faith Baptist Church - Turu - Sunday, March 26, we were with the Faith Baptist Church - Turu. They are without a pastor since Brother Silvester resigned and went to Peritoro. One of the lay preachers takes care of the services. We had a good time with them.

Peritoro Baptist Church - Sunday, April 2, June and I went to Peritoro Baptist Church. I preached Sunday afternoon in Coroata a town 34 kilometers from Peritoro. One sister from the church was in the hospital. Sunday night, Pastor Silvester baptized five and after I preached three

The past two Sundays I have been at New Hope Baptist Church. We had some problems with the pastor who was changing the order of services and some other things. The church stood firm and told the young man - It is like this or you can turn in your resignation. He told the church that he would maintain things as they were. We have had a better spirit in the church now, Psalms 133:1, "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity". April 13, I went to Gantanhede to visit our Mission there. The road is bad, only buses and trucks can pass; no let up in the rains. April 6, I went to Anil Mission; Roof is on the building, we have layed off the brick layer and his helper. We need funds for doors, windows, floor and plastering and also wiring. Help us if you can. P. Visas, A Brazilian Deputado (Federal Congressman) has been helping us with P. Visas. We received a letter on Saturday from the Justice Department in Brasilia wanting more papers. My lawyer took these papers to Brasilia and he will present them to the Justice Department. We have been waiting over four years for these Per. Visas. May God bless all is our prayer.

Our God has been doing so many great things for us that it is difficult to pick a best blessing to get this letter started with.

I'll begin with our quarterly preachers' meeting. This was held at the church at Moura-piranga. Brother Edimas is pastor. We had 32 preachers present. The reports from all around were good. The best result from this meeting was the working out of final details for the churches to work together in supporting full time missionaries. In the next few months we hope to have a couple of local men in the field full time. The meeting was closed with a service in the evening. There were over 300 present for this open air service.

The work in the interior has gone well. There has been a couple saved at Valquiria. The roof is on the building at Profeta.

We have had several more saved in the past few weeks. Most of these continue to be teens and young married people. We have also had several more requests for baptism.

A couple of weeks back I took the whole family with me on a trip up the Moa River. We held 3 services at the base of the mountains. There are now about 30 believers there. On the way back down stream we visited the congregation at Sao Salvador and the church at Peri-Peri. We were away for a week. All the work in the Moa River is going well. The churches at Peri-Peri, Maita and Japiim are working there and one of the major tributaries, the Rio Azul. All of us really enjoyed the mountains and streams. I think everyone's favorite place was a spring where the water is about body temperature and there is a pool in the rock that is big enough for the whole family to get into. We spent an hour or two there every day.
