The first couple at Novo Remanso was legally married in order to be baptized. I was very privileged to have as one of my traveling companions on this trip, Dr. Wesley Smith, pastor of the Kirby Road Baptist Church in Cincinnati, Ohio. He visited us for 10 days and conducted a Seminar at the Bible College, visited several of the churches in town and in the interior, and was a real blessing to us and to the work there. We want to express our thanks to him for coming and also to the Kirby Road Baptist Church for their part in sending him and for their support of our ministry in so many ways.

We arrived back in Manaus early Thursday morning, and Sunday morning I preached at the 17th of August Baptist Church. There were over 180 in Sunday School and they desperately need their new building they are trying to put a roof on now. Do pray for them and give as you can so that they may soon finish it. That night we said good-bye to the 14th of December Baptist Church, holding the Lord's Supper. The auditorium was full of those that

expressed their love for us and their wishes for a speedy return. We appreciate so much the love offering that they gave us and each way that Brother and Sister Harold Bratcher helped us getting ready to travel.

We left Manaus at 2:30 early Monday morning, and arrived in Miami at 8:30, and then on to Tampa, Florida where we were royally met by Brother Gilbert Casey. Sister Casey was not able to meet us because her mother had passed away on Saturday in Kentucky. We express our love and sympathy to the family that remains here on this earth, but are so grateful that Sister Johns is now much better off at the feet of Jesus; singing, learning and rejoicing in her now painless existence. When Sister Casey returned on Friday she treated us just as royally as Brother Casey had. Lucy and I also want to express our deepest appreciation to the dear ladies of the Northwest Baptist Church that kept food (delicious) on the table and in the refrigerator. It is hard to describe all that this dear church and pastor, Bro. William Botner, have done for us through the years and did this time. The first Sunday night home I preached there they gave us a wonderful love offering, and then the following Sunday night voted to buy a Dodge Van for us. It is in excellent shape and has been a real blessing. We will always remember and be grateful to our Lord for the way He has used His servants; the Caseys, the Botners, and each member of the Northwest Baptist Church to bless us and our ministry. Our deepest thanks to each individual and church mentioned in this letter and to those that monthly support us in any way.

Dear Brethren:

We are now back in Lima, Peru. Thanks to all who helped us to pack and helped with the many things that have to be done to return to the mission field.

We left Lexington, Ky. June the 8th, drove to Martin, Tenn. and visited Elizabeth's father. After taking her father out for dinner we departed again to Bessemer, Ala. It was a sad departure to leave her father who lives in a retirement center and is 93 years old.

In Bessemer, Ala. we stayed part of one day with our son Mike and his family and as always it was hard to leave. We left Mike's Friday evening and arrived in Sanford, Florida at the home of Ralph and Virginia Stanton. We rested about four hours and drove on to Miami where I preached Sunday A.M. and P.M. services for the First Baptist Church of Ojus, Florida.

Monday, June 12th, we took the Chevrolet Suburban to the Miami port and after spending all day we finally got permission to ship the car to Iquitos.

We made another trip back to Sanford,

Florida where we spent two or three days getting our trailer ready to ship.

June 22nd we were at the Miami airport ready for our trip back to Lima, Peru. We arrived at the airport two and a half hours early and as usual the plane was one hour and a half late. So, we were at the airport about 4 hours.

We arrived in Lima at 6:00 A.M. and in a short time we were through customs and on our way to our house. All day Friday it was cold and the sun never came out. Saturday the sun finally showed up and we had a nice day.

Saturday night we were at the mission at Ventanilla and it was a real blessing to see all the smiling, happy faces.

Sunday, June the 25th, was the anniversary of the mission at Ventanilla. We had services all day, beginning with Sunday school and preaching. After the preaching service the ladies cooked chicken and rice and there was enough for everyone. Our people had a great time of fellowship, playing games and eating. Sunday night I preached to a full house and it was really a great day. We all enjoyed ourselves and counted our blessings.

This week I have spent trying to get the van back in good running shape. I have been in several garages getting things done one at a time.

I want to thank all of the Churches and the Brethren who have helped and given to our expenses in shipping things and

Dear Brethren:

My lawyer called Brasilia and was informed that our papers for our permanent visas had been sent to the final point to be judged. We have sent telegrams asking information. We are waiting for their decision. This has been a busy month in our work. The doors and windows are installed at the Anil Mission. The electric is installed, the plastering is finished. We are going to have to spend quite a bit of money for floor tile, perhaps \$500.00 and also build some

benches. I estimate probably a \$1,000.00 to finish the building.

Cantanheide - June and I went there July 9 after S. S. at New Hope Baptist Church. I preached that night and then we drove back to Sao Luis. The big wooden bridge has fallen and we have to cross the river on a make shift bridge and if it rains no one will cross as the detour is only dirt without gravel, etc.

Peritoro - June and I were there for Sunday night services July 2, Brother Silvester baptized seven and then I preached; we returned to Sao Luis on Monday morning.

I am teaching a class on soul winning at the Anil Mission on Saturday night. June is teaching a music class there after I finish my class. June is also teaching a Music class on Wednesday night at New Hope Baptist Church after prayer meeting.

Dear Brethren,

We rejoice to be able to serve the Lord here in Brazil. We have completed 15 months since returning from furlough. The Lord has blessed us so much during this time. My health which was some what of a question mark has improved even more and the Lord has opened many doors for us. Ur-sula and I were thinking about this today. Your prayers and support have been so important in our being able to realize this endeavor.



If I seem to be a little overjoyed, it may be because we are about to finish the building in Chacara dos Pinheiros. We have had a great amount of opposition there from the priest and others which makes the victory sweeter. Five more souls have been saved there also. At least by the end of August we hope to begin to use the building. It still lacks a lot of painting and finishing which I personally want to do with help from the young people. We will send a picture of the building after we get it all painted. It has been very hard to keep the costs down this past 2 months

as prices have gone completely crazy since the price freeze was lifted. The finished price looks like it will be around \$8,500.00 for the lot, building, and church pews. Also we are putting a wall all around it which is very necessary here with all the small children who would break windows and dirty up the walls.

The work in Tijucal is holding steady. Last month there were 5 professions of faith there also. Some of the young people who are being saved are meeting a lot of opposition at home. We are trying to give them encouragement. Some of the older members of the church are helping to teach the basic truths to the new converts. The church at Boa Esperanca is holding up good in attendance this month with good numbers in both services on Sunday. We continue to need at least one worker in our work.

We have spent about \$5,400 on the Chacara dos Pinheiros work and the temporary building in Tijucal. We have the lot bought for the building in Tijucal. The church pews are already made for both works. We need to recuperate the \$5,400 in order to have sufficient for the second work to be established with building and house for the worker. Will you help us to be able to do this next year?

May God bless each one of you is our prayer. Pray for us.

Dear Friends,

On August 4th Alta and I will be flying from Lexington to Miami, and on August 6th we will be flying from Miami to Sao Paulo, Brazil and home. This trip will be the beginning of our 35th year as missionaries to Brazil. Thirty-five wonderful years!

This year has been a blessing to us as we visited churches and friends, some new, and some who have been our co-laborers during the past 34 years. During our stay in the States our bodies have been rested, and I think our minds have been rested and our spirits refreshed. Renewed interest on the part of some churches and pastors has been encouraging and hopefully their renewed interest will be contagious.

It would be unreal to say that we were thrilled with all we witnessed in our visits during the last 10 months. There are some who are really committed to missions and are sacrificial in their giving. But, in general, there is a giving of monetary offerings, while the commitment of lives is very rare in most churches. This lack of personal surrender and personal godliness is reflected in the fact that there are few young people in our churches who are committing their lives to the cause of Christ. Materialism and the emphasis on material gain and earthly possessions have eaten the spiritual life out of our lives. Our hearts are where or

Friends, on August 6th, the Lord willing, we will be flying back to Brazil with a record of baggage for the work: 20 musical instruments given by some of you, equipment for producing video study tapes and Bible programs for children and young people. Also, we fly back with hearts full of plans and goals to reach more people and develop more leadership than ever before.

After 34 years on the mission field and 43 in the ministry there are a couple of things I would like to say. It is great to be free in Christ from the bondage of sin and the bondage of sinners. God has made us brethren in Christ. We are all different just like any family. God did not make us hot dogs - all alike. We are all saved the same way, by the work of Christ, but we are individuals and different.

As we work in Brazil, perhaps you would not do things the way we do them. If you cannot agree with us, please love us. If you cannot give, please pray for us. If you do not like our work, please don't bad-mouth us. That will not help you and it might hurt the work we are trying to do, the best we know how, for the glory of our Heavenly Father.

Dear Brethren,

This Mission Sheet Month is a month of 37 days - June 8th to July 15th. Friday - June 9th at 9:10 a.m. Francisco Barbosa dos Santos, Pedro Cunha de Araujo, Marie (my beloved wife of almost 35 years) and I left Manaus aboard the "Asa da Fe", "Wing of Faith".

We traveled for several hours - stopping at New Jerusalem Church to pick up Evando and Elizete. We reached Colonia de Amatori at around 18:00. There we held services with our evangelist of the Mission Joao Botelho Toanama da Encarnacao. Some 60 persons were present. We spent the night there and then the next morning traveled to Rio Urubu. We arrived that afternoon and that night began a nine night revival. Evando preached the first night, Pedro the second and I the other nights. The Lord gave us some 12 decisions including one baptized and some four professions of faith. Our attendance ran from 52 the first night to 124 the last night. We've lost two families to the Assembly of God Church.

We left Rio Urubu Monday morning the 19th and reached New Jerusalem that night where we slept. Tuesday morning early we began our almost 11 hour trip to Manaus.

We were blessed during the next some 9 days that Pastor Wesley K. Smith of the Kirby Road Baptist Church of Cincinnati, Ohio was with us - teaching and preaching. I translated for him on Saturday night when

he preached at the 17th of August Baptist Church.

Sunday night, the 25th of June I preached at the 14th of December Baptist Church. Again on the following Sunday morning, I preached there and that night we were present at the church for the farewell service for Asa Mark, Lucinilda, Marcia and Lucy Marie. After services, we went to the airport to see them off. Thus they have left us to be with you in the U.S.A. during a year. Please pray for them and may they be a blessing to you! Give them an opportunity to be a blessing to you by inviting them to be with you in your church giving Asa Mark opportunity to preach and inform you of our work here.

Last Sunday our attendance was down at both services. Pray for us as again I serve alone as pastor of the 14th of December Baptist Church. On Sunday, July 23rd, we'll be celebrating the Church's 29th birthday. Today, July 15th Marie and I (I'm sure Asa Mark is remembering) are remembering that on this day in 1959 we arrived (we didn't know that Stephen was with us also). Brother and Mrs. John Hatcher brought us - and family. The words of "Amazing Grace" come to my memory - "Through many dangers, toils and snares, I (we) have already come - 'tis grace has brought me (us) safe thus far, and grace will lead me (us) home." Tomorrow, I'll be preaching on the subject - "After 30 years - Spies or Tourists or Pilgrims or Ambassadors?"

Pray that the Lord will give us many more years of service here in this fruitful field. Thank you for making it possible for us to complete 30 years as your missionaries here. Please continue to give to Harold Bratcher's funds and to the regular fund of B.F.M. as well. We will pray for you.

June 17, 1989

Dear Pastor and Saints:

We are all excited about Vacation Bible School which begins on Monday. It is such an opportunity to work with children to teach them the Word of God that is able to make them wise unto salvation. Our V.B.S. goes for one week.
