### Anita and Children Moved to Lima. . . Threats and Dangers. . . School Enrollment Down. . .

Dear Friends:

Greetings from Peru. The worsening situation in Pucallpa has compelled me to move Anita and the children to Lima. The terrorist group "Sendero Luminoso" has definitely made its presence known in Pucallpa. Five times in the last four months bombs have gone off at the Ministry of Agriculture, a half block from our house. Gunfire is heard every night in the streets. The military now is in control and has declared "no guarantees" for anyone. This means there is no protection for the general population.



Crime has increased notably in the last six months. Our school has been broken into twice in the last two months; the first time the night watchman was held at knife-point.

June 14, a letter was slid under the entrance door of our security wall. It was a threat letter demanding money or "our lives". The letter was in the name of the "Peruvian Communist Party", (this is the official, political name of the "Sendero Luminoso"). It's doubtful that the letter is really from the "Senderos" because there are many small groups taking advantage of the situation by imitating the terrorist tactics. However, authentic or false, the letter was sent and a few threatening phone calls have followed.

I brought Anita and the children to Lima the first week of June; they've been here ever since. We are at this time looking

for a house to rent near the new school Leah and Joshua will be attending. This is an extra monthly expense but God has always provided for us, and we continue to put our trust in HIM. Leah and Joshua are excited about the new school and making new friends. Anita is a lot more calm and rested. I hope this change will be for only a year until things can return to normal in Pucallpa. In the meantime I fly back and forth every week to keep the works going.

Speaking of the works; they are all doing well. None seem to be growing much at this time but all are remaining constant and there appears to be a deeper, committed faith in the Lord being shown in all the churches. For that I praise the Lord.

The Pucallpa Baptist School is suffering some for a lack of students. Last year we finished with 700 students and last week we had only 590. That's 110 students less due to the situation here. Many families have moved to Lima and some have left the country. We charge a monthly tuition and fewer students means less income. However, the government has decreed salary increases of 30 and 40% every month since December. The budget is tight and a few months we've been one or two days late meeting the payroll, but the Lord always provides and we manage to pay. Please remember the school in your prayers.

Sorry to bring so much bad news; but there is good news. We are all in good health and excited about the change taking place in our lives at this point and also the new opportunity to get into a new work in or around Lima. Please remember the Stantons in your prayers. Until next month.

Although we are still having more rain than normal, our dry season has finally begun. We had a cold front, which brought in the season with perfectly clear skies and temperatures in the low 60's. This has helped our work here in town quite a bit. It made it possible to get most of our preachers in from the interior for our annual preachers' conference. It has also let us get our attendance back to normal.

The preachers' conference was the best that we have had to date. We had fewer men present, but they are all pulling together now and anxious to get a lot of work done. We only had 38 to attend this meeting, which is from 5 to 10 below normal. It is exciting to hear them share what has been done over the past months and plan new projects for the coming months. The churches are going to work together to build a boat for the longer river trips, put up a building at the mountains up the Moa River and help with a meeting place at a village called Santa Luzia near the church at Pentecostes. They are also considering supporting a full time worker at Rodrigues Alves. The highlight of our meeting though was to have my father-in-law, John Keltie, and my brother-in-law, Demas Brubacher here. Demas spoke to the men about the origin of Baptist work in this part of the world and Adam did the translation.

There have been 3 more saved here in Cruzeiro this month. Last week we had 2 more young men to be saved who were won by means of the witness of several of us in daily life.

church has already purchased property in another city and material for a new building is being prepared.

Plans are being made for the new building in the city of Marilia, a city of 150,000. Pray that God will supply our needs as the building progresses. Tomorrow, the Lord willing, Alta and I will be making our first trip to the city of Cornelio Procopio. Next week I will be traveling to Manaus to be a leadership conference. The 11th of September I will be starting classes in the seminary.

For those who gave musical instruments and money for such, you will rejoice with us to know that all arrived safely and we are waiting for a little time to get them all in use.

This has been a busy month with me working just about every free day at the Anil Mission building. We are putting the finishing touches on the building. We have a hard time keeping money exchanged and buying material. Brasil is suffering from 30 + per cent monthly inflation. We have set September 7 (Independence Day Brasil) to dedicate the new building and organize the Mission into a Church.

I made one trip to Cantanhede, August 10. We had an outside service at a home

that was the first home I stopped at over two years ago when we started the work there. A young lady (Baptist from another Church in Sao Luis) has married a young man from this home; she has started to attend the services of the Mission and after I preached she made a reconciliation.

I thought I could report that we have our personal visas by now. My lawyer called Brasilia and they will not give out information over the phone. He goes back to Brasilia tomorrow. I hope this will be the last time.

I want to thank those who have given special offerings to our New Work. After we finish the Anil Mission we want to cover the 2nd half of the apartment at New Hope Baptist Church. This is the parsonage. I want to cover a building at Cantanhede and cover the church building at Peritoro. The need is great.

Saturday, July 15th, around noon, I conducted funeral services for Dona Ester Shalom Benacon - the Jewish lady I wrote about a few months ago. That night I performed a wedding ceremony in a home. Sunday, the 16th of July, our Sunday School attendance was down to 192. However, we had 245 in the preaching service. That night we visited and I preached to some 70 at the Cenaculo Baptist Church where Mauri Melo is the pastor.

Sunday, the 23rd of July, the church celebrated her 29th birthday. Services were held continually throughout the day finishing at 21:00. The Church began the church year with 634 members and finished with 637. The report shows 79 baptisms. Our losses included 37 given letters to organize the New Jerusalem Baptist Church - Parana da Eva. We lost some 41 by exclusion - 9 by death. 117 members are in our 6 missions.

Last Sunday was "Father's Day" in Brazil. We were blessed with a large number of fathers as well as mothers and sons and daughters present. We had 327 present in Sunday Bible School - the largest attendance in some weeks.

We have not reported to you, faithful friends, any outstanding victories, but the Lord has blessed as always. Marie had to miss some of the services because of illness, but at this writing she is going strong again.

You pastors can be a blessing to us as well as gain a blessing and be a blessing to Asa Mark if you will keep him busy preaching in the churches while they are in the U.S.A. on furlough.

Continue to pray for us and contribute to the Bratcher funds and to the regular funds.

We made a trip to Diamantino to help out in a Vacation Bible School this month. It was tiring but fruitful. There were almost 100 young people in all the sessions and a big turnout on Saturday night for the closing service. We got home in time to get 2 hours of sleep before starting our day on Sunday.

We are still working on the building at the Chacara dos Pinheiros. The man who is doing the heavy construction went on another job and only returned yesterday to finish up our work. I have been sanding the 20 church pews and getting them ready for the final varnish. I varnished 6 of them today. We plan to have our opening service there on September 9th. I am still trying to find a way to take care of this work better. We are trying to find someone to preach at the Boa Esperanca Church on Sunday nights so we can dedicate a few months in this new work which we feel is vital at this time.

The work at Tijucal is still in the initial phase. Two of our young men at the church are conducting Bible classes there each Thursday night with good attendance and are themselves growing as well. We plan to do some work on our temporary building there as soon as we get finished with the new building. Hopefully it will make it possible to better serve the church field there. Oh, how we need an American family (at least we think we do). Pray that the Lord will give us at least one new worker that can carry part of the load. "The fields are white unto the harvest, but the laborers are few."

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

May this find you enjoying the Lord's blessings. When I wrote the last letter we were preparing for special evangelistic services. God blessed these. Attendance for the three night meeting progressed from 400 to 800. 68 individuals made professions of faith. We have also been encouraged by many professions of faith during the past two months.

The Saturday Children's Clubs are really going well. These are now being held at 52 locations in town. This past Saturday the total attendance in the club meetings was over 1,000. The chapels (missions) are also doing well. The couples fellowship at Tabernacle recently completed a round of all of the missions, visiting the services at one of these each week. This proved to be a delightful blessing for the couples from Tabernacle as well as the mission congregations.

One of the congregations was really struggling. The three workers were working hard, but there didn't seem to be much outward evidence of results. Three weeks ago the couples met with this congregation. The building was so full of people from the community that most of those from the couples' fellowship had to stand on the outside of the building for the entire service. A 17 year old preacher, who is one of the workers at this congregation, brought an excellent message. 7 adults and several children made professions of faith. Sunday, I baptized 14 new believers from the missions.

On August 28 - September 3, Tabernacle will be hosting a Pastors' and Workers' Conference at the camp for all of the leaders and workers who have gone out from Tabernacle. They are coming from the 7 states of Brazil where they work. Seventy workers are planning to be here. All are paying their own way except two who are still being supported by the church and one pastor who asks the church to help him. Some are coming from distances as great as from the east coast to west coast of the United States. Tabernacle will be meeting all of their needs.

We believe that this time of fellowship will be a great encouragement to those who are working so far apart. We plan to start a newspaper to be sent every 3 months to keep everyone updated on what is happening in other locations.

Many of these missionaries have started or plan to start Bible Colleges and Training Centers to develop leaders. We want to develop a network so we can work together in these projects. By working together all can give and receive better training. We are very excited about the potential of this development.

Pray for us. Give as God enables you. We have recently had some large expenses from purchasing and shipping printing equipment. If you are able to designate some extra giving for the Seminary (Paul Hatcher's work), now would be a good time. Don't take away from your regular giving or supporting the regular fund. We simply believe that God provides extra income when there are real needs.

May the Lord of Glory who "is able to do exceeding, abundantly, above all that we ask or think" encourage you in your service for Him.

## The Agony of Peru . . . Report on the Different Works . . . Many Needs . . . Man Travels a Long Distance to be Saved . . .

Dear Brethren:

Everything here in Peru is about the same. Terrorism, killing, robbing, blowing up bridges and electric towers are daily happenings here.

Brother Alberto Fabian came last week from Tingo Maria and the Brethren there are going through a terrible time. Besides all the terrorism, the inflation is driving them to the wall. The people are spending everything they earn on food, leaving nothing for clothing, medicine and other needs.

Ventanilla - It is winter time here and the people are suffering because of the regular causes plus the cold and sickness that comes with the cold weather. Every week we have to help with medicine and food. The government is working there trying to put in water and sewers, but the government is broke and at this time everything is at a stand still. They have all the deep trenches dug to put in the sewers and water but all we have at this time is deep trenches left open that cause even greater danger.

We now have plans presented to the city showing what we plan to do. We still don't have the title. They say we need to present three more things to the city and then they will give us the title. Please pray with us about this.

Chavinillo - As I mentioned before, the terrorists have driven our preacher out of the town and have warned the people not to have any more services there. The Brethren have gone back to having regular services, but the Brother and his family are back in Huanuco. Albert Fabian has advised me that they now have another Brother who has gone back there and now plans to move there. The whole State of Huanuco has been declared a state of emergency and the American Embassy says that it should be off limits to Americans. I have been trying to get space on a plane ever since I have been here. I may be able to go next week.

Acamayo - is a jungle town out of Huanuco where we have a work started but the terrorists have taken over the town and services there have been put on the back burner at this time. As soon as it is safe to return we will be going back in.

Cunahuayn - They have outgrown their building and have built a larger building using the roof of the old building and adding to it. They should be in the new building by now.

Paucar - The work in Paucar is growing and we may be able to organize the work into a Church in the near future.

Cancalla - is doing well and they have regular services with a Brother from the Zion Baptist giving his time and paying his own way there to carry on the work.

We need motorcycles for the Brethren to be able to go and get back to their homes and be able to work at their regular jobs on Monday. We plan to bring one from Miami in about 45 days. If any church would like to help buy another one, please give and mark your offering for this purpose.

We have a new mission between Huanuco and Tingo Maria. I was asked to go there and preach July 16 - 20th, but I could not get a seat on the plane.

I got back from Iquitos last week and I am to go back August 31 to help ordain the new pastor of the Fifth Baptist Church. The Fifth Baptist Church has a new building and the Church is really growing. Please pray for us as the demand and the need for us to reach out is so great.

I have been asked to preach and have seminars at several churches. I will be going to Tarapoto to help organize the First Baptist Church in the State of San Martin. While there the pastor of the new church will also be ordained. September 10-17 I have been invited to go to Cajamarca to speak in a conference and be with Paul and Ann Mullings. September 28-30 I will be preaching the anniversary of the Gethsemane Baptist Church in Tingo Maria.

We plan another meeting at Ventanilla the second week in October. Please pray for this meeting. Last night we had a full building and the work is growing.

Again, we want to thank every one who has helped and prayed for the work here in Peru. We pray that God will bless each of you as you reach out with the gospel news around the world.

A man came all the way from Ventanilla today to our house wanting to be saved - by bus for 2-1/2 hours. After talking to him for about 1-1/2 hours, he was gloriously saved. This is what keeps me going. Praise the Lord!

REPORT FROM THE WEST INDIES

Greetings in the precious Name of Christ our Lord and Saviour!

Yesterday we concluded seven wonderful days of Vacation Bible School. Our lowest attendance was one hundred and thirty and our highest attendance was two hundred and five. A lot of hard work went into this to make it the success it was. It was well planned and organized by the leader and by the workers in the Sunday School department.
