Peruvian Baptist Mission Supports Five Missionaries. . .

Dear Brethren:

Greetings to all the churches and special friends from our house here in Peru. November is election time here in Peru to elect the mayors of each town. It is a very important time for Peru. Please pray for the Lord to direct and help at a very critical time for all of us who serve the Lord in Peru.

The end of last month I went to Tingo Maria and preached two nights of the anniversary of Gethsemane Baptist Church. Friday night as I started to preach there was a lot of gun fire going on between the soldiers and the terrorists. The soldiers are based at the airport which is between the church and the city of Tingo Maria. The building was full each night. Friday night 5 came forward to follow the Lord in baptism.

Saturday morning Brother Alberto Fabian and I traveled to Huanuco by car to attend the meeting of our mission called Mision Bautista Oriente del Peru. We had a good meeting with the directors and agreed to send out two more missionary families. We now support 5 missionaries out of our

new mission and we plan to send out two more families when we meet November 14th.

The Mayor of Ventanilla has signed a letter stating that they no longer claim any right to our property in Ventanilla. This will permit our papers already presented to the city of Callao to continue to be processed. We should have the necessary papers to start building in Ventanilla very soon.

I have made several trips to the south of Lima where I plan to start a new work. Please pray with us about the town of San Bartola. Elizabeth and I will be going there in a few minutes after I finish this letter. We will need \$6,000.00 to buy the land. The people have a clear title and there will be very little problem to make the transfer to our Mission.

Today is a special day for Elizabeth and me. We were married 40 years ago today. We plan to go by the town, San Bartola, look at the land or lots and then continue on to the town of Ica. We plan to stay the night in Ica and return back to our home tomorrow. I thank the Lord for Elizabeth who has always been by my side as I have served the Lord.

Elizabeth and I want to thank Baptist Faith Missions, all the Directors and especially Brother Edward Overbey with whom we keep in contact about the work here in Peru. Yes, and a big thank you to our Pastor, Brother Jon Rule and our home church, Zion Missionary Baptist Church, Taylor, Michigan.

Dear Brethren:

This has been a month of the regular grind with many different types of activity. I have preached somewhere every Sunday and have preached four Friday nights at a preaching point of our church.

New Hope Baptist Church:

Several of us leave the church building on Saturday morning to go out into the poor suburbs near the church. We meet, witness, discuss the spiritual problems with these poor people. We leave a tract with them and invite them to our church. There were two professions of faith at the church this month.

Peritoro Baptist Church:

The church has built 20 new benches. I preached there on a Sunday night in October and all the new benches were filled. These people are very poor; they need to remove the rotten wood and replace it and recover their building. They have \$100.00 in this fund. I estimate it will take \$400.00 more. Will you pray? Will you help them?

Anajatuba Baptist Church:

I went there October 8 for Sunday night service. They need to fence their property with barbed wire. Pray for them that they will grow spiritually. They are faithful and have had two professions of faith this month.

Cantanheide Baptist Mission:

I went there for services on October 10. They have had two from another group to come and start attending their services. Time will tell if they will stick after hearing our doctrine.

Living Hope Baptist Church:

I visited the Igreja Batista Viva Esperanca church one time this month and they are enjoying their new building. I wish all of you could come and visit a church service with them. They would be so happy.

Our building projects have been put on hold until we pay the debt on the Living Hope Baptist Church which is \$700.00.

Pray for us that we might receive the necessary funds to finish these projects before we come home on furlough next year. You can help; first, by praying, second, by giving a special offering to our building fund.

The school year concludes at the end of November. We thank God for the blessings that He has provided in and through this ministry. The Camp held for school students October 6-9 was beneficial. A number of students accepted Christ as Saviour. Fifteen of these are now involved in a follow-up Bible Study.

During the past month I had the privilege of visiting the work in Porto Velho where our church is supporting a full-time worker. The work there is doing quite well.

This coming Friday we will be having an Adult Couples Retreat at the camp. 33 couples are enrolled.

I would like to ask all of you to pray for the political situation in Brazil. The presidential elections are to be held November 15. There are 26 parties with candidates. Most of these are socialist. Two of the three candidates with the greatest popularity are extreme leftist. If n one of the candidates achieves a majority of the votes, there will be a run-off election between the candidates with the largest number of votes. Pray that the Lord would be fit to maintain religious freedom.

The economic situation is bad. The inflation for the months of November and December is projected to be 75% per month. That works out (compounding monthly) to several thousand percent in a year. This places a tremendous burden on the people here as prices go up daily. It also adds to the chaos and political instability.

Brothers, as you read about conditions in the countries where our missionaries are serving, as well as throughout the world, let us remember to "redeem the time".

Jeremiah wrote: "The harvest is past, the summer is ended and we are not saved". Don't you think those are sad words? This weekend as we traveled to Cornelio and back, there were only two or three fields of wheat remaining to be harvested. This means here that summer is upon us, and it, too, will pass soon, and there are many millions that are not saved.

Our life style has been somewhat routine this past month, but there have been some exceptions to the routine. In the Garca church we had a three day conference with Miguel Fortes, the teacher from Manaus doing the preaching. The crowds were large and the messages were very good. Several persons trusted Christ as Saviour. I am teaching four days a

week in our seminary, and this leaves Odali free to work on the two buildings which are now in the beginning of construction. One he is building in Vera Cruz and the other is in the city of Cabralia Paulista.

Besides the work in Cornelio in the State of Parana, Alta and I have bought a small house for the purpose of having services and, also, for a place to live when we are there on the weekends. This house is in the city of Ural (pronounced oo-rye-ee).

On October 9, we built divisions for four Sunday School rooms in the building in Cornelio. There we have a good group of young people and we hope to increase our attendance from 40 to 75 by the end of the year.

There were three young people saved in Cornelio this month and there were three saved in Duartina.

Along with other duties, we are trying to get study materials written and put together so we can enlarge our outreach of teaching for those who cannot come to school. Thanks for your prayers and support.

Dear Brethren,

First of all, we share with you a report of the work and worship of the 14th of December Baptist Church where Marie and I are members and where I serve as pastor. The attendance at the Sunday Bible School continues under 300 most Sundays. Sunday, October 8th we had 329 present. At night we had 202 present with two professions of faith and one by letter. Sunday, October 1st we left the house at around 7:30 a.m. and drove to our Armondo Mendes Mission. There I performed a wedding ceremony and then preached to 130. Around 100 of the 130 present were children. Then we drove to the 14th of December Church where I preached the morning message.

Last Thursday (Oct. 12th) Ediberto, his wife, Maria do Carmo, Adelia, and Marie and I left Manaus by car, beginning our trip at 6:20 a.m. We drove some four hours to the Buzzard River. There Brother Secundino met us in his boat and took us (an hour and a half) to our Mission at Cana on the Urubu River. There at 17:00 I performed the wedding ceremony for Pedro Cunha de

Araujo and Valdeci Nunes dos Santos. We five slept that night in the church building and the next morning after an 8:00 a.m. service (13 of us present), we returned to the car and travelled on to Amajari by boat. There we discovered that the parsonage that we hoped would be if not finished, almost . . . had just the roof on. We preached to some 46 present. Pray for our evangelists and members in our missions in the interior. The mission lay-pastor at Amajari is Joao Botelho Toanama da Encarnacao. Saturday night and Sunday morning I preached at the New Jerusalem Baptist Church where I am the pastor. We had 71 in Sunday Bible School. That afternoon we returned to Novo Remanso where I preached to some 80 people present. We began the service at 18:10 and after services an visit in a home, began our trip to Manaus by car. We arrived at midnight.

We thank you, dear saints of the Saviour, for your help to us. We want you to continue to pray for us. Continue, please, to give to the regular fund and to Bratcher's buildings. Also continue to pray with me about our boat, the "Asa da Fe" that is needing some repairs before we can travel in it again. May the Lord put it in somebody's heart to designate a thousand dollars for Bratcher's boat repairs. Pray with me as to what the Lord would have us to do; repair it and keep it or repair it and sell it, or sell it in the condition it is in now. Brethren, pray for us and rest assured that we pray for you.

Dear Brethren,

Everything here is about the same as last month. Our work is doing real good with good interest on the part of the members. I made a quick trip to the States during this month. I had 3 skin tumors removed and they all tested out non-malignant. They have been bothering me for some time and I thought it best to get them taken care of. I had a good visit also with my folks while there. I was able to visit and preach in several churches while there too. Ursula kept things going in my absence.

I am greatly encouraged with some of the young men in our church. They are beginning to really take an active interest in the ministry of the church. They teach, preach, sing, and help organize the work. This is so important due to the fact that we have 3 works going and are short-handed. We are in prayer constantly for the Lord to send us help, but are thankful that the people here are so willing to help in the work.

After months of work and planning, our building at the Chacara dos Pinheiros is a reality. We feel the need to dedicate more time to this work. The church field there is needing to be worked. Ursula and I, over the course of the past year, have done considerable visiting and evangelization in that area. Our desire is to spend the next year in the work there. The problem is that the work at Boa Esperanca is without a pastor and we try to fill in there too. Since we can't be in two places at the same time, this causes a problem. Our third work in Tijucal for now is on Wednesday and Thursday nights and we bring them in the truck to the church in town on Sundays. I am getting ready to paint the temporary building out there. Somebody broke in out there and took some clothes of our young preacher boy who sleeps there.

The political situation here in Brazil is chaotic to say the least. Inflation is about out of control. It looks like the leftists have a good chance to take over the government. People are in an uproar. Little else is talked about here. I'll be glad when the election is over. Pray for Brazil. It seems that the whole world is in calamity. In these 2 weeks since that letter there have been 2 more young women saved and four others coming to confess sin or request baptism. It is not uncommon for me to close a service without giving a public invitation. However, I do let the hearers know that I or others of the church are ready to talk to them about their souls. We have had a very good response to this kind of invitation over the years.

One of the young women who was saved recently, first made her profession of faith in one of these private talks. To me it is encouraging and thrilling to see the Lord do this. It helps keep all of us humble and lets us know that the Lord is working in His own way and time.

One of our preachers, Brother Jose Bandeira, and his wife hold services on Sunday mornings at the state penitentiary. Two weeks ago there were 3 inmates who confessed sin and trusted Christ.

The pastor at Faith Baptist Church is Brother Gilberto. He led the church in a week long meeting centered around prayer. Our church took care of one of the services. Our people led the singing, played the instruments, sang special music and I did the preaching. The meeting was well attended. The church is doing pretty good.

For 3 years I had been praying that the Lord would make it possible for us to hire a tractor to do some more work at camp. The Lord opened that door last week. There are so few bulldozers around here that the price has been around \$250.00 per hour and even at this price it is almost impossible to get one. Last week I found out that the army was thinking about renting one of theirs. As soon as the gates were open to civilians I was there to talk to the commander. At first he wanted to put me off, but after a little extra persuasion gave the OK. It took the operator, one of my church members, and I a day to do the maintenance and some repairs. We then worked for 3 days. We worked from 5:00 AM to 7:00 PM each day and really got a lot done. The price was \$20.00 per hour! I am thanking God over and over!

May He bless you as much as He has blessed us and more.

Dear Brethren:

Greetings from the Crain family here in Lima, Peru. The condition here continues to get worse day by day. But, we have had four saved in the last month. The Lord has been blessing all of our works here in Lima and the mountains and the jungle. Souls are being saved in all of the missions and the work is growing.

We have made three trips to south of Lima where we are trying to buy a lot to start a new work about thirty minutes from where we live. I will be going to Ventanilla in a few minutes to see about getting the plans drawn for the Church building there.

This afternoon I will be going to Tingo Maria by plane to be in the anniversary of the Gethsemane Baptist Church. Sunday I will be in Huanuco with a meeting of all the Pastors to make plans for our summer camp and vacation Bible schools.

I am supposed to come back to Lima Monday afternoon and go by plane to Iquitos because of some problems there. Brother Sheridan Stanton is to meet me there.

Last month I went to Iquitos to help in

the ordination of the Pastor of the Fifth Baptist Church. There was a large turnout there and the following day I caught a plane to Tarapoto where I preached three times in the organization and the ordination of Brother Robert Bergerman.

Brother Robert Bergerman and his family went from Pucallpa to Tarapoto sixteen months ago to start a new work there and he has done a great job. He is a Peruvian who has preached several years and is well taught and prepared to Pastor. I am sending a picture of the building so you can see what has been done in a short time. He has not received any financial help from any one or any Church. His home church, the Faith Baptist Church, sent him out giving him authority to start the work, but without any financial help in any way. He is to be commended for doing an outstanding job. We organized the Church with 12 members and all adults. I will report more about this work from time to time.

We have been praying about an evangelistic team working to start new works and preach in special meetings. Two brothers from the Institute in Iquitos will be moving here the first of October to start a two week meeting in Ventanilla and then work out from here. This is part of the new Mission we have organized to reach out to new towns. Remember all these works in your prayers.

WEST INDIES MISSION REPORT

October 27th, 1989

Dear Pastor and Saints:

"It is because of the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not"(Lam. 3:22-23).

As we are going through the rubbish of what was once the camp, these words of God keep coming back to my mind. How uplifting! This promise brings praise and adoration to our sovereign God.

We have decided to rebuild two of the camp buildings this year. This would cost about \$12,000. We already have \$2,000 in pledges. It is my belief that we do all we can, before we seek help. In the case with the camp buildings, we just cannot rebuild without help (financial). We will do all the labor. We went to apply for this disaster grant, and were told that non-profit organizations do not have an income that could handle any additional expenses. Brethren, the favoritism, the politics of this so-called disaster aid, is unbelievable. For example, our car was damaged during the hurricane. I applied for a grant. The lady told me that since the car can still be driven, my case is not eligible for the grant. I have personally seen others with a lot less damage and received a lot more.
