Dear Brethren:

Greetings from Lima, Peru and all at the Crains' house. At this time the Crains' house is full. We have a preacher and his wife and baby daughter from Iquitos with us plus a brother from Tingo Maria.

The Lord continues to bless here in all the works. The churches and missions are all growing in the jungle. We just finished a conference here in Lima with nine of our preachers and pastors. We kept all of them here at our house for a week. Elizabeth cooked day and night trying to keep food on the table for a hungry group of preachers who were always hungry. But, the Lord blessed and we have the work planned for the jungle and mountains for three months.

The churches and missions in the mountains are also growing. We have two new missions. One is about eight hours from Huanuco and four hours the other side of Chavenillo. The other mission is between Huanuco and Ambo. The mission eight hours from Huanuco is in a town called PACHAS; the mission between Huanuco and Ambo is called CHICCHUY; both are in the mountains. Our new mission that we organized to continue the work here in Peru now has seven missionaries that we support each month.

I am buying two new motorcycles to help keep the preachers going back and forth to take care of all the new works. I am buying two YAMAHA 100s, on the road and off the road type. The cost is \$860.00 in Miami, Florida for each one, plus about \$500.00 for shipping both of them. Brother James Washer found these at a good price for us. We are always calling on him for help in one way or another. I am really thankful for him and the First Baptist Church of Ojus.

I am still trying to buy land at San Bartolo. Please remember to pray for this town.

Would you help us with these things? They are urgent.

1. For the two motorcycles \$860.00 each, plus \$500.00 shipping.
2. \$5,000 to buy land at San Bartolo - the price was \$6,000 and the man came down \$1,000 on the price - now is a good time to buy.
3. The First Baptist Church of Ojus has a like new 1987 Ford Diesel 16 passenger - Cost \$25,000 or more - offered to me at a special price of \$12,500.00. It would last for the rest of my life here in Peru. Please pray about it. If I sold the old one I would still need \$7,000.00 to buy it.

Last Sunday we went over the 100 mark in Sunday School - 106 - thank the Lord. We are asking for 120 next Sunday. Melissa had 38 from 1-6 in her class.

Remember the Lord is able, and we are looking to him.

WHY I SUPPORT BAPTIST FAITH MISSIONS

Giving the " ... reason for the Hope that is in ..." us, as commanded in I Peter, surely applies primarily to our Salvation. Should we not, as well, be able to express assurance that the work we are doing for the Lord is meeting with His approval?

Supporting missionaries is certainly a primary responsibility in our walk with the Lord. We should do so wisely and with joy. That is why I support and lead our church to support missionaries through Baptist Faith Missions.

Baptist Faith Missions is efficient. Only missionaries receive a salary. All the directors donate their time and bear whatever expenses they incur to convene for directors meetings, etc.

Approved missionaries go to the field as soon as they meet government requirements. This avoids the expenses of deputation, which are great in terms of dollars and stress on the missionary family. Missionaries with Baptist Faith Missions are able to be on the field of service doing missionary work instead of raising funds.

Churches can send one check (designating as they please) to one location to support several excellent missionaries.

Missionaries working with Baptist Faith Missions go about their work efficiently. The number of Churches, Bible Colleges, Schools and similar ministries started by these missionaries which continue to operate with or without the missionary's help is a testament to this fact.

Baptist Faith Missions is Biblical. Missionaries are sent out by a local church and must work through one while on the field. These missionaries preach a pure Gospel. The established churches are independent. The missionaries are biblical in their doctrine. Nationals are accepted as brethren on equal standing. Churches started by missionaries show evidence of having received good training as they reproduce themselves.

Baptist Faith Missions gives missionaries great latitude. Missionaries are not assigned to a certain field. Missionaries are not restricted in the methods that they implement, as long as they are Biblical. In fact, Missionaries can work just about any way they please, as long as they are under a local church, behave responsibly and carry on Biblical Mission work.

Baptist Faith Missions is serious about the Great Commission. Baptist Faith Missions has been instrumental in starting or aiding the work of the Lord in Brazil, Peru, Honduras, Philippines, Korea, and several Caribbean islands. It appears that the Lord may be opening doors in other locations.

Baptist Faith Missions is not perfect. But, I do believe that its directors are "striving toward perfection". I heartily endorse and am thrilled with the opportunity of being a helper in this great work.

Dear Brethren:

This has been a month with many blessings upon us.

New Hope Baptist Church:

June and I have continued our classes with Mrs. Angelina. We are repairing, cleaning and painting the church building; we should finish next week. We want to start finishing the roof over the second half of the apartment that serves as the pastor's home.

Living Hope Baptist Church:

I have preached two Sunday nights at Living Hope. I attended services on December 7 and Brother Batista baptized two ten year old boys.

Anajatuba:

The pastor reports 9 professions of faith at Anajatuba Baptist Church. I plan a trip there soon to be in a service with them.

On December 8 there was an area wide one day retreat for the women of the Independent Baptist Churches of Maranhao. They came from Cantanhede, Anajatuba, Peritoto and the Sao Luis area. There were six churches represented and several mission points. June was asked to teach on the women's place in the home, the women's place in the church and the women's place in the world. June taught for four hours during the day, and that night the retreat ended with Brother Dempsey Henderson preaching to everybody about some important women in the Bible. All that went, report a good time in the Lord. I know the women from New Hope are still talking about

the good time they had. They met at one of the sister's homes with a big shaded yard.

Peritoto Baptist Church:

On December 15 the church celebrated 26 years of telling the world's greatest story that has ever been told, a story of Jesus that never grows old. This work was started by Missionary John Hatcher when he lived in Manaus, Amazonas. The Lord impressed Brother Hatcher to make a trip to Maranhao. He stopped at Peritoto, 240 kilometers from Sao Luis. He started a mission and left some folk baptized. Brother Hatcher went to the USA for a year of furlough. Pastors Sostenes and Santiago went to Peritoto for a three month visit. They organized the Peritoto Baptist Church (four charter members were present last night, many have already gone to be with the Lord.) Brother Sostenes resigned as pastor of the Zion Baptist Church, Manaus and he accepted the pastorate of the new church. He served as pastor for many years and then a lay member who had started preaching was called to pastor the church. Brother Ricardo served many years as pastor until his death, March 16, 1988. The church called Brother Silvester who is doing an outstanding job. Despite a heavy rainfall, the house was packed. A real good service! Also it was the pastor's birthday and the church surprised him with a special program at the end of the service.

I want to salute June and all the faithful wives of our Missionaries who have stood beside their husbands during the years. Leaving mothers, fathers and then, when their children are grown, leaving them to shift for themselves (as we say). Surely their rewards will be great.

Dear Brethren,

On the last day of September, 31 of our preachers from all around got together for our quarterly meeting. This meeting was held at the Igreja Batista da Biblia about 25 miles from town. The meeting was very productive. The 3 churches that are working on the Moa River are doing a good job, making a trip about every other month. All of us are going to help put up a building at the mountains by December. All of the churches are giving toward a new boat that is already under construction. The men took up an offering to buy a lot at Santa Luzia. This is a new place where the local church (Bible Baptist) will be starting a mission.

A few weeks ago Adam and I tried to go to Tarauaca. I was to hold a meeting for the church there. The town is about 150 miles east of here. We tried to go by road, but could not get through. We made it about 80 or 90 miles, when the mud bogs and rain caught us. It took us almost 8 hours just to get back as far as camp, which is still 22 miles from town. I finally made the trip by air taxi. The meeting with the church

there was good. We held 4 evening services and several other classes. It rained the first night, but from there on out the weather was great.

One of my best visits to the churches was with the First Baptist Church at Mancio Lima (Japiim). The pastor there was having some personal problems with which he needed some help. Besides preaching to the church, they asked me to baptize 14. All is well there now, with good attendance and an active mission work.

Here in town, we have had just a few more saved. We did have a baptism a couple of weeks ago. In this service there were 14 baptized. Thirteen of these are adults.

This week we finally got the city to donate 4 lots across the river where a new housing project is going up. We already have most of the materials to put up a building and will be starting work there soon. We did not buy the lots because they can't be bought, but must be given, since it is a government housing project. There are already hundreds of people living on the other side and we will be the first to get the gospel to them. We will also be the first religion there.

God continues His great blessings. May He bless you just as much. Thank you for all of your support in prayer and finances.

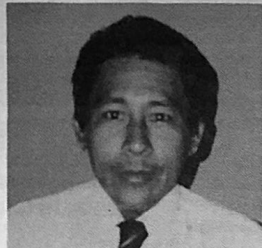

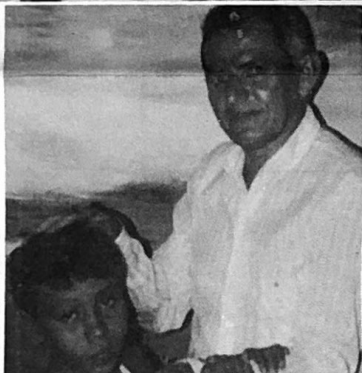

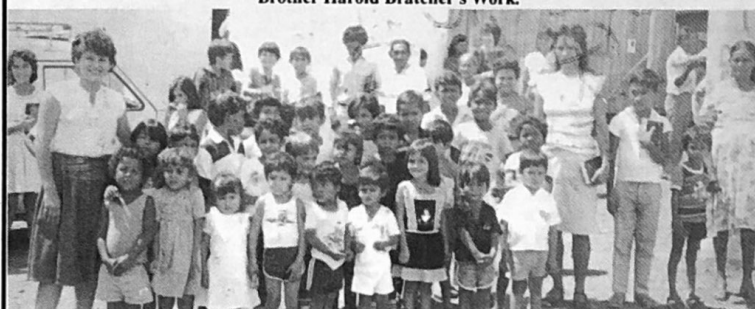

We have two more places where the work is preached each week. We have seen several souls saved. We have baptized many of these. Most continue to be faithful in the work. We performed two weddings, both this month, of young people who all were and are members of the church. Our blessings are more than we can number.

As we look toward the new year we have several goals as far as the work here is concerned. One of utmost importance is to find a good pastor for the Boa Esperanca Church. I don't believe I can maintain my present pace for much longer without some help. I am working in 3 works at the present time. Another goal is to start our regular Wednesday night service at Tijucala. I about have the temporary building in shape so we

Dear Pastor and Saints:

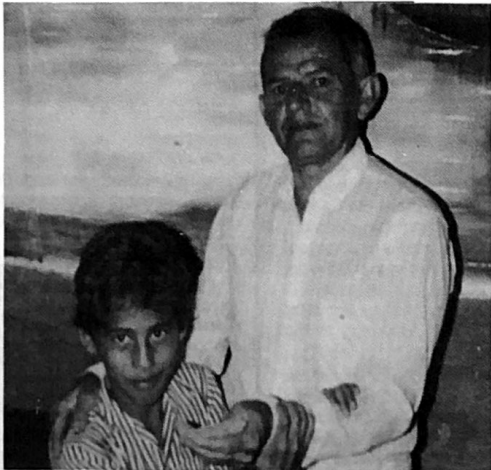
