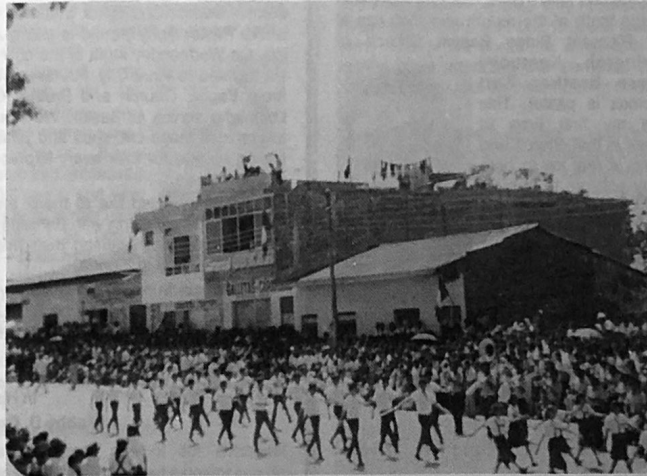

The Bible College classes are going well. We have classes on Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday with practical training on Saturday. The Church and Missions are doing well. We are making arrangements for providing a building for the Mission in the State of Bahia this year. My brother, John, and his wife are planning on helping in this work in June.

The text books for the lower grades that Wanda has been working on are now complete. This is quite an accomplishment.

During the last of December and the beginning of January our family had the blessing of visiting Dad, Mom, Odali and Kathy and their family in the State of Sao Paulo. The time spent there was encouraging and restful. We had the privilege of

visiting the Church in Garca where Odali pastors. The Church and its Missions are seeing fruits of God's blessings.

We visited the work in Cornelio Procopio in the State of Parana, one of the works Dad and Mom are working on now. What a delight to see the Lord's hand at work in other places.

Wanda and I also spent some time with Bobby and Charlene Wacaser. They were kicking off their new work. We held special evangelistic meetings while there. Pray for the Wacasers and their labors in this new work.

Pray for the country of Brazil. The new President of Brazil is strongly in favor of private enterprise and a free market. We think this is a good direction, but he must convince the Congress. The economy is crazy. In U.S. dollars the price of a car about the size of a Chevrolet Celebrity with no options is \$50,000.00. A slice of pizza is \$1.00 and the least expensive student armchair desk we can purchase is \$98.00. Many companies are raising salaries every day and paying daily to simplify bookkeeping.

Thank you for your faithful prayers and financial support. We praise God for your co-laboring with us.

Pastor Marivaldo just now informed me that, with this offering that reached them from you through us, they will be able to get the roof on. Brother Marivaldo is praising the Lord and thanking us all.

We have some more good news for you. We were blessed by a visit and ministry of Stephen (our youngest son) and his wife, Saleth. During the some 19 days they were with us, Stephen preached several times in several different churches. May the Lord bless them in their ministry at the Bethel Baptist Church, Williams, Indiana.

The first Sunday of the new year we were blessed at the 14th of December Baptist Church with an attendance of 348 in Sunday Bible School. We were also blessed by the message of Mrs. Jim (Irene) Orrick and daughter Ann. Both Mrs. Orrick and Ann participated in the Sunday School classes.

It had been taken out of the water but is in a very, very bad condition. Maybe the motor will still function - we don't know yet.

Now for some more good news! During our watch night service I baptized 14 and we received four by restoration and four by letter. Over 300 of us welcomed the New Year.

May the Lord bless each one of you throughout this year of 1990. Pray for us and as the Lord leads, give to the regular fund and to Harold Bratcher's buildings. We rejoice knowing that the Thanksgiving offering was another large one. Thank you, Lord, and thank you - the Lord's people.

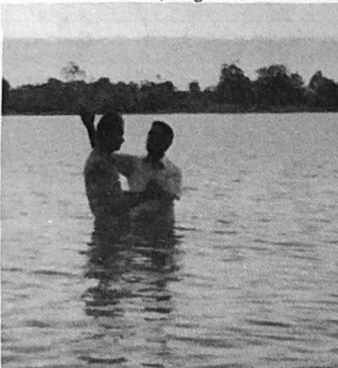

Very Difficult Times In Peru . . . Inflation Is Hurting Greatly . . . Thanks to All Who Helped So Much During the Greatest Shock of Our Lives . . . Many Blessings In The Work . . .

Dear Brethren:

Greetings from Crain's house here in Lima, Peru. Many things have happened since our last letter. The things that happened in Panama and the position the President of Peru has taken again the United States have touched all of our lives here in Peru. Two weeks ago the highest ranking general and political person ever to be killed by the terrorists was killed as he was parking his car here in Lima. Twenty-five thousand people were arrested and detained. The police and soldiers were everywhere stopping cars and checking the people's documents.

The newspaper showed this morning that we are now losing 53 percent of the buying power of our dollars, which means we are losing 53 percent of our salary to inflation. This not only hurts us as missionaries but also it costs 53 percent more to buy building materials and to build. Pray with us that this will change for the better. Most people say that this will continue until the new government takes over on the 28th of July. We have been running in the red the last few months in spite of tightening the belt wherever possible.

We thank everyone who has called or sent letters of encouragement for their continued support and prayers for the greatest shock of our lives. While we were in the states, Melissa, our daughter, was deceived by a young man whom she met in school. He also attended many of the church services with us wherever we went. She came to us crying and told us what had happened. The young man acknowledges that he is the father of the baby, but so far has not helped in any way financially. He has

promised to pay for child support but, up to now, has done nothing. Now his family phone has been disconnected and we have no contact with him. January the ninth, Benjamin Aaron was born weighing 9 pounds two ounces. Melissa has asked our home church to forgive her for any part or blame she had in the case. Our home church, the Zion Missionary Baptist Church of Taylor, Michigan has voted to forgive her. I want to thank our Pastor, Brother Jon Rule, for standing by us and reaching out his arms in love and compassion. Thank you brethren who called and offered to take Melissa in your homes and share our burden with us. Melissa also thanks you for all your expressions of love. She also went before the Mission here in Ventanilla and the people all wept with us and have voted that she continue to serve as teacher of her large class of children.

I want to thank the First Baptist Church of Ojus, Florida and our home church, Zion Baptist Church, for giving \$3,000.00 each to buy the land at San Bartolo. The lots have been purchased with a deposit until the titles are checked out by a lawyer and we will have all transferred by the first of February.

Our churches had a great camp meeting last week with over one hundred and fifty present. They had the camp meeting at Huanuco and are all planning to have even a greater one next year. Several were saved and over 15 surrendered to preach and to dedicate their lives in the service of the Lord.

The Lord continues to bless in the salvation of souls and all their missions and churches are growing. I will be going to Iquitos Feb. 26-28 to preach and help organize a new church which will be organized on the authority of the Fifth Baptist Church of Iquitos. After I get back from Iquitos we will begin a revival meeting at Ventanilla and then I will be going to Tingo Maria and Huanuco to be with the Churches and Missions there. Thank you for making our ministry possible here in Peru.

Our teams that go to Santa Rosa and Santo Antonio have been at a standstill since the bridge over the Moa River is out. It is being repaired and we hope that it will be ready soon.

Over the past few weeks another family has been saved, one by one. About five years ago one of the girls was saved and little later one of her sisters. The first girl married the mayor's son. They now live in Rio Granco where he is studying law. My son Adam married the other sister earlier this year. Since then other members of the family have started to attend some of our services and I have been able to witness to them individually. Three of the girls have

been saved and just a couple of weeks ago Mom and Dad made their professions of faith. Adam and Suzy have a baby girl named Larissa Anne. We had all of our family together for dinner this week and it was a real joy.

The second trip up river for the run off of the presidential election was a success. The river was as low as it ever gets in the summer time. The problem is that we are not in the summer time. The river has not been this low at this time of year for at least fifty years and it may never have been this way. The more conservative of the 2 candidates won the election.

Three weeks ago I was back to visit the church at Pentecostes. We had over 100 present on a Saturday night for the ordination of the pastor, Brother Oslas. It rained cats and dogs late that afternoon and made it difficult to get there. We started the service an hour late, but it worked out fine. The preacher did an admirable job with his answers during the interrogation. It was thrilling to hear him tell how he learned to read and write because of his call to the ministry!

May God bless all of you as we begin a new year and a new decade. Thanks for your prayers and support.

Probably a good missionary would have taken a flashlight. I did not take one. It still was a good service. After we finish the roof at the apartment we want to rework the roof at the Peritoro Baptist Church.

Thanks to those who have given to our new work funds. It looks like with your help I will be able to finish all of my projects before coming home on furlough, the last of April. June and I are very tired after four years in this heat; it takes its toll on you. May God bless all is our prayer.
