The Day School classes have now begun. With 750 students enrolled we are packed out. Wanda and one of the ladies from our church direct the work of the Day Schools. The new unit of Seminary classes for the coming year begins this coming weekend. Nearly all of the students from the previous unit of study have re-enrolled.

I had the privilege of visiting with the church at Boa Vista (800 miles north of Manaus) this past weekend. The Lord continues to bless that work. This was one of the first churches started by one of our Seminary

students after I began pastoring at Tabernacle. There were about 150 in attendance.

This is Carnival time in Brazil. The whole country goes wild for several days preceding "lent". The last hurrah before penance. A strong reminder that these millions of people need to know the Lord. Meanwhile, 160 of our church youth are returning today from a camp retreat. I will try to remember to report on the results next month.

Our church (Tabernacle Baptist) seems to be going well. We have an evangelistic meeting for young couples this coming Saturday. Each couple from the church brings an unsaved couple for a banquet and presentation of the gospel. This approach has been effective for us.

Dear Friends,

Missed you last month. Sorry! Will try to make that the last time. Now if you did not read last month's Mission Sheets, you will not know what I am talking about.

Fourteen years ago when Alta and I and Kathy moved south to Garca there was a long period of time that seemed to be very unproductive and almost stagnant. Now after those fruitful years in Garca we have begun to work in the State of Parana. We are now having a similar unproductive period. So, if in reading our letter you get the impression that things are going slow, we have the same feeling. However, God never fails, and we know that He will give us the same wonderful and productive experiences here that He has always given.

The house Alta and I have bought for living and beginning the work in Ural is now quite livable and we are in the process of building on a large room which will accommodate about 90 persons. Although we have not started services on a regular

schedule in Ural we have had three groups of people (neighbors) in for Bible studies. The interest shown by people in our neighborhood and persons with whom we meet is good.

We are living in our house in Ural on the weekends but, our principal work is with the congregation in Cornelio Procopio, 18 miles from Ural. Our Sunday School attendance has reached 80 but our average attendance is now 65. This month we are going to fix two more Sunday School rooms and hopefully, we will soon be averaging 80.

The young people at Cornelio have started a children's Bible hour in one of the areas of town and are having an average of 30 each Saturday afternoon. Pray for them. Their plan is to begin the same kind of work in other sections of town.

PLEASE PRAY. We need to begin work on the new building in Marilia as soon as possible. The problem at the moment is not financial. Pray the Lord will give us wisdom to use our time and energy so this building can be started. Pray, also, that we can get a lot and start to build in the city of Cornelio Procopio. AND, PRAY THAT THE LORD OF THE HARVEST WILL SEND LABORERS INTO THE FIELDS THAT ARE WHITE UNTO HARVEST.

Those who read what I write about will pray for us and will continue to give to the regular fund and/or the Harold Bratcher's funds (buildings, personal or poverty). Therefore, I trust that what I write will be an encouragement for them to continue to do.

The first Sunday (January 21st) it rained just before Sunday School time and our attendance was only 196. We had 240 that night. On the 25th of January I attended and assisted in the funeral services and burial of dear Brother Wilson Porfiro Cavalcante. Brother Wilson was our pilot on the first launch and a lay preacher.

Last Sunday we had 273 in Sunday Bible School and some 5 decisions after the sermon. That night we had 253 present and some 6 decisions besides some 20 rededications by our members. Francisco Assis dos Santos, pastor of the Monte das Oliveiras Baptist Church in Itacoatiara preached. If it doesn't rain Sunday I believe we will have 350 or more. Yesterday about a dozen of us were out in the "highways and byways" inviting them to come to the services Sunday.

These days we received a delayed Christmas box from the Glen's Creek Baptist Church of Versailles, Kentucky. Thank you Pastor Ken Underwood. Also thank you, Pastor J. Douglas King for your good letter. We appreciate your letters. We are praying for you and desire your prayers for us.

We have had a steady month. At Boa Esperanca church we are maintaining about 75 average in Sunday School. I have turned the adult class over to a young man whom I baptized in 1980. He is very capable. This lightens my load a little. At Tijucal we are still having the Thursday night Bible study in the homes. This is being taught by another young man of the church. In April I plan to start a Tuesday night Prayer & Bible Study service there. At the Chacara dos Pinheiros work we are having many visitors. We are waiting for the harvest. This is a hard place. Not even the Pentecostals have been able to get anything going there. Last Sunday night the lady next door to the church told me that she wants to come to the services but

is afraid to come. She is a "witch-doctor" and practices African voodoo-ism. She is afraid of the people in her group. Pray for her. This month I have been burdened for the many lost who we know and take to the services here. We are trying to be faithful to preach the word and are praying the Lord will open hearts.

We took a 3 day trip to Brasilia to get Michell's visa renewed last week. We were able to do it without having to miss any of our church services here. We have a man in the church who is preaching on Sunday nights at Boa Esperanca while I am preaching at the new work at the Chacara. He does a good job. He suffered a light heart attack and has high blood pressure. He is an over-the-road truck driver. His health is making it hard for him to do that kind of work. We are praying he will be able to find a job here in town so he can help out in the work.

We want to thank all of you for your support for us and for the work. May God richly bless each one.

Dear Friends,

I'll begin with an update on the new church at New Iguacu. The township has just recently been renamed as a city because of its rapid growth. In just two years its population went from 8,000 to 30,000. This makes our church a prime instrument for reaching thousands of barely settled people. As in the U.S. it is very difficult to introduce a new church in an older established city. In older cities many may not attend church regularly, but they consider themselves members or (at least) belonging to the church of their ancestors. When all this is shaken up by a move to another city, this unattachment causes many uncertainties. These people then become prime

prospects for acceptance of new ideas and new friendships. It is just at this level that we want to enter into their lives; to be real friends and especially to offer that which alone can take away their uncertainties; a personal relationship with Jesus.

The young man, Gilmar, is progressing steadily as pastor of this work. We believe that he will be used greatly of the Lord.

The ministry of home Bible studies is also producing good results. Two families, especially, are showing evidence of real spiritual growth. In one of these families we are hoping to see a sixteen year old boy dedicate his life to the ministry. He is very enthusiastic and disciplined in Bible study. Presently, he is a little confused by some doctrine that he learned at another church, but we trust that God will give him understanding and guidance as he continues to study the Word.

Pray with us that God may call him to serve in the ministry for we can always use some more laborers.

Dear Brethren,

There is so much to tell this month that I doubt that it will all fit into this letter. I will try to get in as much as possible.

Our New Year's eve service was a big success. We had over 500 present for a 3 hour service which lasted from 9:00 P.M. to after midnight. Six new Christians were baptized, the church observed the Lord's supper and we also took up a special offering. Our goal for this special offering was about \$500.00, but we ended up having over \$1,000.00. We are getting ready to buy a generator to fill in during the many power outages that we have here. The ladies served refreshments to everyone.

We are starting to have quite a bit of robbery around here now. The Jeep was stolen from in front of the house one night in the presence of over 30 witnesses. These people were in line all night to enroll their children in the public school across the street. Not one was willing to call us or testify! We got the Jeep back the next morning, but not without some damage. Then a couple of weeks ago our church treasurer came to talk to me about the small

amounts of money that have been coming in lately. It didn't take us long to figure out that someone had a key to the building and was getting into the offering box on Sunday nights. We decided not to tell anyone until we had caught the thief. On the following Sunday night Adam and I spent the night awake waiting, hidden inside the building. It was a long night, but sure enough the next morning early, we heard the thief come into the building, turn over the offering box and start to pull out the money. We jumped him, tied him up and then Adam called in the police. The man was a carpenter who had worked off and on for us here and had kept a copy of a key to a side door. I filed charges against him and he is already in the state pen. We have had a few threats from his family, but perhaps just threats and no real danger. The police said that we did the right thing the right way. The church was very appreciative. A little police work in the long list of activities of your missionary!

On January 13 the quarterly preachers' meeting was held at Malta. There were 48 workers present. We held 3 sessions: morning, afternoon, and night. All the mission projects of the churches are coming right along. The new boat for the ministry on the Moa River is just about ready. The church at Pentecostes has already started the new mission at Santa Luzia. We should have 2 full-time missionaries to work the Jurua River later this year.
