Dear Brethren:

The bombing, killing, and blowing up of bridges and electrical towers continue here in Peru. Yesterday the army killed seventy terrorists near Tingo Maria.

The first election is over. Vargas Llosa whom most people thought would win, was ahead of all, but with thirty percent of all the votes. Now there has to be another election on June the third. It will be a close run-off. Inflation is running about 40% each month. Our trouble is that the dollar is not rising to keep up with the high rate of inflation. I know you wonder

what can we do. We must realize that souls are still lost, and need to be won at any cost.

Please pray for Elizabeth; she is now going through several tests and more to go through yet. They have found that she has an ulcer, high blood pressure and her kidneys are not clearing out or removing all the poisonous substances from the blood.

The brethren who go to the towns out of Huanuco and Tingo Maria have been asked by the policy to stay out of the towns where the terrorists have been hitting the hardest.

Our work is doing well in the area of Huanuco and Tingo Maria even with all the problems with the terrorists. I baptized two more into the work at Ventanilla.

I got back from Iquitos. The work there needs a missionary. Please pray and ask the Lord to send someone soon.

Dear Brethren,

What a month! I made a trip to 3 other cities looking for help in our work here. I preached in 15 places 22 times. Two precious souls were saved - one in Sao Paulo and the other in Fortaleza. In Maranhao several rededications were made. I had precious fellowship with both old and new acquaintances. It was a very good trip.

I'm not sure how fruitful it was yet in terms of finding workers. I have lined up two preachers who plan to come and visit our work here. At the present time I am trying to work in 3 places at the same time and am getting worn down. Pray for us that at least one worker will be sent by the Lord to help. That would help a lot.

I was in a very ugly car wreck in southern Brazil. The local pastor and I took a taxi from the bus station to his house. The taxi pulled out in front of another oncoming car and was hit broadside. Three were taken away in ambulances. But the pastor and I were not seriously hurt. Another evidence that the Lord is not through with

us yet. I thought my time had come. I got a couple of cracked ribs, but am about back to normal.

Ursula and Michelle are in West Kentucky. Michelle is already talking a little English. The school here has promised to try and have kindergarten classes for her this year. Also we just gained our 4th grandchild, a boy. All went well with both baby and mother. Ursula will be coming back the end of May. I'm batching right now. Makes you appreciate the cook!

When I arrived from 24 days of being away I was so encouraged to see the way the work here held up in our absence. I had left a schedule for the men of the church to conduct the services and all of them did a good job. Our attendance hardly changed while I was gone. If we can just get a good pastor for the church and free us to develop the two missions, I feel things will progress. I am confident that this will take place in the next few weeks.

We appreciate your letters and even a phone call comes in once in a while. Right now a small box of corn flakes is \$5.00 and a chocolate bar is a buck. We are sort of up against it with the change in the economy. I hope the new government is able to really make the necessary changes. Pray for the millions of lost souls here in Brazil. Also pray for the leaders of this gigantic country (almost 150 million people).

Dear Brethren,

About 2 weeks ago I went up the Moa River on a long (in miles) mission trip. On the short (in time) trip I was able to visit our brethren at the mountains and the church at Peri-Peri. Another young lady was saved at the mountains. The church at Peri-Peri is still doing fine and although it was raining on Sunday morning, there were 64 present. This trip was very different for me. I took along the judge and district attorney, who wanted to see the mountains. This gave me an excellent opportunity to tell them about Christ. They have both been friends of mine for some time and I had already had occasion to witness to the judge before. Adam was along too, so we all had a great time. We have another team working in the Moa this month. Preachers from Maita and Barao are visiting several villages in the new boat that the churches just bought and equipped.

We had 5 days of camp last month. This time we had 48 to go with us by river to our camp. This was the best group that we have ever had and the whole thing went as smooth as it could from departure to arrival. For one thing we had the most beautiful weather I have ever seen in the month of February. We had just one short rain and the rest of the time was sunny and breezy. We had two courses, with classes morning, afternoon and night. The singing was great. The meals were just as good. The sports and games were tops. I wish all of you could be in on some of these great times.

Brazil now has a new president, elected directly by the people. The very day he went into office he started a serious program to try to get our country's failing economy back on track. His plan stands a pretty good chance of working. We are sure hoping so. At this time it is hard for those of us who get our pay in dollars. The bottom has fallen out of the dollar market. This should be good for the country, but right now is a little rough sailing for us. This letter will cost over \$3.00 to mail to you. A gallon of gasoline is now costing us over \$6.00. That small, standard Chevy that Paul Hatcher told you about a month back was costing \$50,000.00. Today the same car would cost me over \$150,000.00! I'm glad it is furlough time!

Dear Friends in Christ:

I have been praying for the seminaries in the Philippines. This June we have our first graduates. Ten young men have studied and prepared themselves for the ministry. These young men, called of God, are ready to go and establish churches. The only problem is there is no money to help them. I have come up with an idea that could help each student for one year to establish a work. If we had \$70,000.00 dollars to open a trust fund, the interest from this amount could support 15 men for one year and the principle sum would never be touched. Just think - every year 15 young preachers could be funded for one year to establish a New Testament Baptist church. Perpetually. But to do this, I need 70 people to give \$1,000.00 or 140 people to give \$500.00. Surely this could be a reality. I am praying that God would lead you to give for

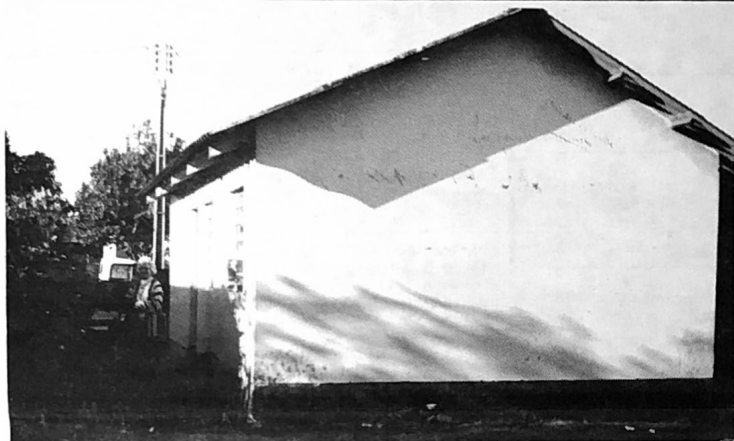
this. The Philippines have over 7,000 islands. There will be nearly 100 million people by the year 2,000, just 9 years away. Just think - in the next 10 years 150 young men could be supported as a missionary to reach this nation of people. Surely the amount is reasonable. The return is worthy of your support. Would you help me to establish this fund? I would hope by God's grace that I could start this account this year for these young preachers.

Will you pray about this and give as God would direct? Perhaps you can't give \$1,000 or \$500, but if God leads you to give, send what you can. A little can become a lot. If 7,000 people give \$10.00 (\$70,000), if 3,500 people gave \$20.00 (\$70,000), if 1,700 people gave \$45.00, we would exceed the amount. Dear Brothers and Sisters:

May this letter find each of you enjoying the Lord's blessings. The past month has been a busy, but fruitful one. This week we will be opening two more mission points in outlying areas of Manaus. These are in the communities of Petropolis and Cidade Nova. Both are very densely populated. This gives us a total of nine missions in and around the city of Manaus. That is about one work for each 200,000 people. The fields are ripe for harvest!

A new work is also being started in the community of Paricatuba on the River. We have two teams that will be traveling every weekend to do work on the Amazon. We hope to have more teams in a short while. Each of these teams will be dropped off on the way up river and then picked up on the way back, after they have done their work for the weekend. One trip per week will thus allow us to maintain four mission works.

The Camp has also been active this month. We began with a Couples Week with 42 married adults attending. The second week was for teens with 74 attending. The last week was for deaf with 32 attending.

The Bible Clubs all around town continue to average over 1,000 in attendance each week. These Bible Clubs have been the means of hundreds of young people being saved. They also provide a basis for the starting of new mission points.

I was recently appointed as a member of the State Board of Education. I'm trying to use this opportunity wisely.

The Lord willing, we will be arriving in the U.S. for a year of furlough on July 1. Pray for us as we transfer the work into the hands of others and relocate. I would like to speak in as many supporting churches as possible. If you are interested in having me at your church, call John Hatcher (812) 867-7066. He will be helping us set up an itinerary.

The trip to the mountains of the Moa River was a great success. The brethren there are now in gear to build their meeting place. Last month I reported that one young lady was saved. The other team from Malta that followed had 4 more saved. We also made the necessary arrangements to help a man who has been crazy for the past 20 years. He has been closed up in a little shed all this time. He tears all clothing off and sings to himself night and day. His parents are saved and are now very old. We are bringing him to town to then try to send him further along to get some kind of help for him. The judge who went along on the trip with me has become interested in the case and is helping out.

Last week I was in Cuiaba and Rio de Janeiro. It was quite an adventure trying to

travel in a country where nobody has money. Flights are cancelled right and left, and everything falls apart in a matter of minutes. We got Suzy's and Larissa's immigrant visas though and are now ready to go to the States for our furlough. Lord willing, we leave tomorrow for Manaus and the next day for the U.S.

This has been a good week for us at First Baptist Church. We had about 400 present in services on Sunday night. During that service I baptized a 15 year old lady into the fellowship of our church. Then last night we had over 400 for our Wednesday night service. It was certainly the best attended business meeting we have ever had! We also had Gospel preaching, another baptism (five more, including Adam's father and mother-in-law) and the Lord's supper. One more young lady was saved during this service.

April 12, 1990

Dear Pastor and Saints:

"To God be the Glory!" The miracle of God's grace in calling out His elect is always a mystery; however, sometimes you are left in complete amazement and adoration of our sovereign God. For example, Brother Sylvester Joseph who was added to the Cruz Bay Baptist Church a week ago by baptism is a case in point.

Brother Sylvester came from the island of Dominica (about 300 miles away) to visit relatives in the Virgin Islands. He ended up on St. John, and after visiting other churches, was present in one of our services. The Lord got a hold of him and saved him, and after some discussion and instruction, he was baptized.
