### WHY WE SUPPORT BAPTIST FAITH MISSIONS

For more than forty years and during the ministries of eight different pastors, Richland Baptist Church has supported the missionaries of Baptist Faith Missions. From the days of Brother Joe Brandon until the present we have found no reason not to continue their support.

All the missionaries with Baptist Faith Missions are reaching the lost of other lands with the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. They have been practical in adapting means and methods to accomplish this purpose, but have remained true to Biblical principles.

The missionaries of Baptist Faith Missions have remained true to the doctrinal position of Baptists. The same doctrines Brother Brandon preached are being preached by Brother John Hatcher, Harold Bratcher, and all the others. These men do not preach or practice one thing on the field and something else in the states. With B.F.M. what you see is what you get.

When problems have developed through the years, they have not been hidden from the churches. Problems have been dealt with speedily and in Christian love.

Mission money is used for mission work. In many mission programs the bulk of mission money is absorbed in administration. While some cost for administration is inevitable, it is not right for the lion's share of mission money to be used for buildings, equipment, and personnel here at home. With Baptist Faith Missions, mission money is used for mission work.

Baptist Faith Missions allows a church to sense a continuity in its missions' program. Often a church changes pastors and the church's mission program goes out the door with that pastor. Missionaries are left holding the bag, and churches are left to wonder if the mission program was really important after all. With Baptist Faith Missions, changes in administration at particular churches do not affect the mission programs of all the churches. Sometimes the largest supporters feel led to drop support; but, though this may hurt for a while, the work goes on going, and growing, and glowing for the Lord.

### RETIREMENT FUND

A fund has been established for our missionaries when they retire. Several of our missionaries are in their 60's. Even though B.F.M. has no age when a missionary must retire, the time will come when they will feel led to retire. At that time we want to be able to help those who have served so long and so faithfully for the Lord.

Dear Brethren:

Greetings again from Peru and all from the Crain's house.

The last of April I flew back to the states to buy the 1987 Ford van and other supplies we need here in the work. Our children helped me get a special on Northwest Air Lines and I was able to fly to Detroit to visit our children there. I preached one Sunday a.m. and p.m. for my home church Zion Missionary Baptist Church Taylor, Michigan and had a great time of fellowship visiting with my pastor and family.

I drove my daughter Nora's car to Lexington, Ky. to talk with Brother Edward Overbey about the work here in Peru. The following day I drove to Rushtown, Ohio and preached for my son-in-law, Al Malo who is pastor of Bethany Baptist Church there.

The following morning I preached for the Carr Baptist Church in Kentucky. I enjoyed a good time of fellowship with Pastor Bob Allard and Brother Grooms and family. Sunday night, I drove to Ironton, Ohio and preached for Storms Creek Baptist Church. After church enjoyed pizza with Brother and Sister Orrick.

May 9th I flew back to Orlando, Florida where Brother Douglas King picked me up. After a short visit with his family, then back to the airport to go to Birmingham, Alabama and on to Paducah, Kentucky. I drove to

McKenzie, Tennessee to visit my father-in-law and to check and see how he was doing at his new retirement home. From there I drove to Camden, Tennessee and spent the night with Edsel and Shirley Watson. The next day I preached for Harmony Baptist Church. I had dinner with the new pastor, Brother Sheets (not spelled that way, but pronounced like that).

I stayed with Brother Ralph and Sister Virginia Stanton of Sanford, Florida for about two weeks. I preached for Jordan Baptist Church, Sanford; Emmanuel Baptist Church, Melbourne; Park Ridge in Gotha; Bible Baptist, Plant City and Grace Baptist Church of Bradenton.

I loaded the van with used clothing from the First Baptist Church of Ojus (where I stayed and preached several times) and Grace Baptist Church of Bradenton, Florida. The inflation is so high the people spend all they earn trying to feed the family.

June 23rd and 24th we are having the anniversary of the Mission at Ventanilla. The Brethren from Tingo Maria and Huanaco will be with us to preach. While they are here we will have a meeting of our mission formed to reach new towns in the mountains and Jungle. Since our last mission letter a new Mission has been started in the mountains, out of Huanaco, Peru. More about this new work in the my next mission letter.

## New Pastor Arrives for Boa Esperanca Baptist Church ... Plans for Building at Chacara dos Pinheiros ... Need for \$6,500 to Finish ...

Dear Brethren,

My wife and daughter got back alright. I was sure glad to see them and Michelle is speaking English a mile a minute. I already have her a place reserved for kindergarten at the Wickcliffe School.

This has been another busy month. The new pastor at the Boa Esperanca church is getting settled in. He is living in our temporary church building at Tijucal until a lady who is building a house who is a member of the church moves out of the parsonage of the church. Everyone seems to like him. This makes it easier for us to give more attention to the other two works.

I am getting ready to build a small building behind the church building at the Chacara dos Pinheiros work. Most of the material will be paid for by the people, but some will have to come out of my building fund. We need more Sunday School rooms there. This work is not growing by leaps and bounds but we knew it would be that way due to the strong catholic influence in the community. The Lord has given this work a special place in my heart. We have suffered many setbacks there. But that just

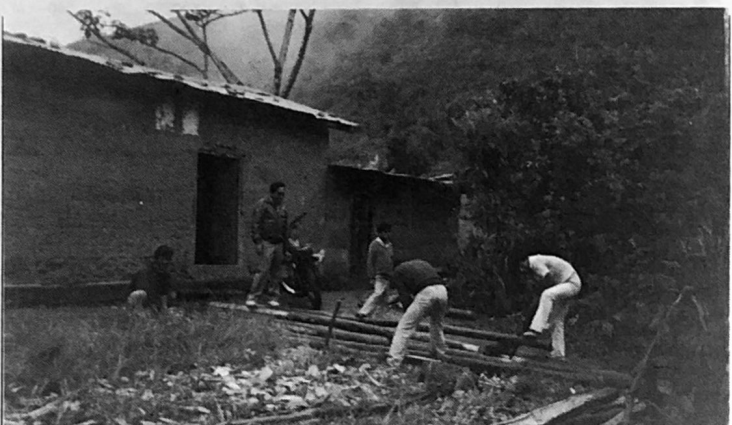
makes it more precious and us more determined. Yesterday I took the benches to the Tijucal work. I am getting ready to open up services there on a regular basis. Up to now I have been forced to just have "special services" due to the work load at people's houses, etc. On occasion we have held services at the house we have there for the temporary building. We now have installed lights and are ready to begin there. I am starting to work on the paperwork for our lot out there. I want to build a wall around it this year and start making plans for the construction.

Our situation is this: We have about \$6,700 in our building fund. I am needing to spend about \$1,000 at the Chacara for Sunday School rooms. I will spend at least \$2,000 to put the wall around the lot in Tijucal and get the building permit and plan drawn up for the building. This leaves me about \$3,700. At today's prices I need at least \$6,500 more (Six thousand and five hundred dollars) to put up a building out there. In other words I am \$6,500 short. I will have to build two levels because the lot is not big. It is sloping and this will make it feasible to put the Sunday School rooms below the auditorium. This church will serve about 50,000 people when the projects that are springing up fill up. Most are poor people. They need your help in order to have a decent place to worship. Will you help?

Pray for us! I hope this request reaches you before the 24th of July. On that day the 14th of December Baptist Church will celebrate her thirtieth anniversary of her organization. Asa Mark Bratcher, who should arrive with wife Lucy and the girls, will be our speaker that night. We have set several goals to reach before that night - 300 members present on the day of the members, July 1st - 30 professions of faith and 30 other decisions - CR\$ 300,000.00 (\$3,500.00) - and 30 Bibles given to the first 30 members who mail us a letter requesting a Bible.

This Mission Sheet month we spent here in Manaus except for a trip to Itacoatiara some 200 miles away. We went by bus on a Friday (25th of May) and returned the next day. That Friday night I preached to about 60 at a special service held at the Theological Center. Pastor Francisco Assis dos Santos is the pastor of Mount of Olives Baptist Church and Director of the Center.

During these days I've preached each Sunday and Wednesday night at the Church. The attendance has varied from a low of 222 to a high of 316 in Sunday Bible School.

Last Thursday (June 14th) many of the members of our church were made sad because of the death of an eight year old boy who drowned. His mother was a member of the 14th Church until a few years ago. One of his grandmothers and several uncles and aunts are members. I performed the wedding ceremony for the parents of the deceased some years ago. At midnight a group of us held a service at the church of the family - the Shining Light Regular Baptist Church. Pray for Raimundo Benvindo Mariano and Irene Feitosa Mariano. The death of Adaias brought sad memories of our Joel Harold Bratcher who left us on the 17th of August of 1971. Mark that day on your calendar, please, to pray for us and the 17th of August Baptist Church.

Here in Brazil Valentine's Day is not celebrated but June 12th is "O Dia dos Namorados" - Sweetheart's Day. I borrow a Brazilian expression and declare to Hattie Marie Moore Bratcher - my wife of 35 years: "Tu es minha eterna namorada" - Thou art my eternal namorada, or rather sweetheart!

We thank you beloved for your interest, prayers and offerings. Please continue to read our M.S. letters and to pray and give. We promise you that we shall continue to buffet our body, beat ourselves black and blue to keep ourselves under subjection as we preach the gospel to the lost of this land of Brasil.

FERNAN DIAS

Fernan Dias is a lazy little village about 20 miles from Garca. Maybe I should say a tired little village. Fernan Dias belongs to the township of Galia. The Baptist church of Galia was organized on the same day as the Baptist church in Garca. Although very small and weak, the church in Galia began a mission work in Fernan Dias. For three years the members went each Sunday afternoon with their pastor to hold services. They preached in the street or under the shade of a tree. With offerings given for new works I bought a house for their services.

Suely, the sister of Jose (you may remember he is paralyzed from the waist down) has been the main strength of the work in Fernan Dias. During the last year she and her boyfriend have been taking care of the work. Suely visits the homes, invites the children and directs the children's work. On May 21, we had a special program in Fernan Dias.

When we arrived in Fernan Dias the little wooden house was opened and swept and preparations were made for the program scheduled at 7:30 p.m. The house is old and little. It measures nine feet by twelve feet. There are four wooden benches, two doors and two windows. The star of the program was Ruby Moyers from Grace Baptist Church in Warren, Michigan. While some went up and down the dusty streets inviting, Ruby and I sat on a concrete bench in front of the Catholic church, and just across the street from the wooden mission house. As we were making little gifts for the children

who would attend, several children, ages seven to twelve, gathered around. We had made about 15 balloon apples and one little girl, Fernanda, said, "What are you making so many for - there won't be that many." But, Ruby continued to make balloon apples.

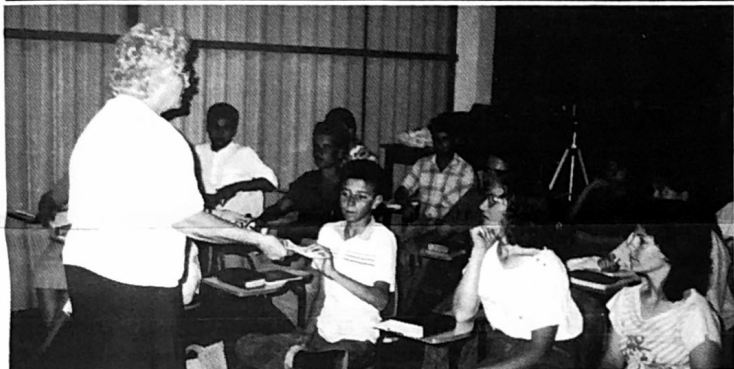
At seven o'clock there were 30 children in the building waiting for time to begin. Three of the four benches were filled. To keep control of the children we sang choruses until 7:30. By that time every bench was filled and about thirty were standing. Still they came. Ruby Moyers presented a program to 160 persons, over 100 inside (jammed and packed) and 60 on the outside. The gospel was preached to more children at one time at that service than any time in the history of that little village. Several trusted Christ as Saviour.

Why did 160 persons appear in such a short time? First, because the testimony of Suely is known by the entire village and they like what they see in her life. Second, Ruby Moyers is a dedicated Christian with a burden for children. Third, because some of you have been faithful in praying and supporting the work here.

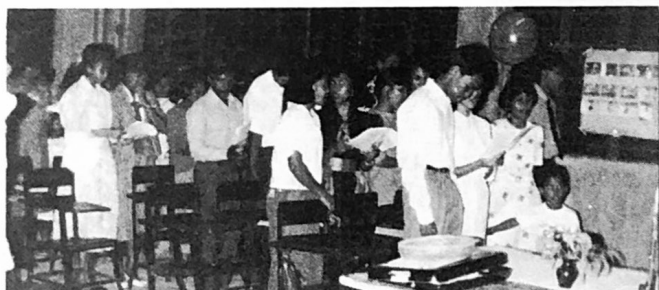
Ruby Moyers was with us for twenty days and she presented 29 programs in schools, Sunday Schools and missions. There were 70 present in Urai for the first program and an average of 65 in the other three programs. In Cornelio at the three programs there were 30, 79 and 80; in Alvaro de Carvalho there were 150. All of the other places and programs had large crowds. The gospel was presented in the schools and children were urged to give their lives to Jesus Christ. Several teachers were touched who had never heard and made inquiries about the Gospel and about our work.

The doors are open wide, the harvest is white. Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the fields. Give your lives, give your children, give your money for the greatest investment that exists.

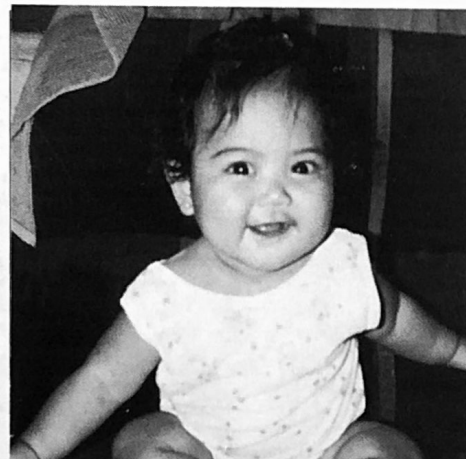

Dear Pastor and Saints:

The Lord has given us the most wonderful opportunity of working with about 50 senior citizens from St. Thomas-St. John. This group will be part of our summer camp program. They will be coming to live at our facilities for a week at the end of our session for boys and girls. Of this number, about 25 will sleep overnight, while those from St. John will join them at 8:00 a.m. each morning and leave at 6:00 p.m. each evening.

The Administrator met with me yesterday, and asked if we were interested. Brethren, this aspect of ministering has been on my heart for many years. We do now have a limited work among senior citizens, but this offer was God-sent, and if this works out, it will become part of their yearly activities.

I have been on many previous occasions among these folks to offer invocations or benedictions, and now we are handed this opportunity. I told the administrator YES, knowing that we would need your help. It would cost about \$6,000.00 to operate this program for two weeks. Please help us in this endeavor to reach these people with the Gospel of Christ, and to teach them the Word of God. This is the first time ever that this offer was made to any religious group, and our camp was chosen from among all the other groups. Please help us. I am sending out 25 copies of this letter to all the churches that support this work, and also individuals.
