THE 50TH YEAR

With this issue of **The Mission Sheets**, we begin our 50th year.

The first issue of **The Mission Sheets** came out in January of 1942. There was an appeal to help support Brother J. F. Brandon in Brazil. Eleven young people from the First Baptist Church of Wheaton, Ill. responded that first month with a total offering of \$14.00.

Four goals were set in that first issue. They were:

1. One hundred (100) young people giving twenty-five cents (25¢) or more a week to this mission work.
2. One hundred (100) young people praying definitely each day for this mission work.
3. One hundred (100) young people telling others about the mission work and letting them read about it.
4. One hundred (100) young people so burdened to see lost Brazilians saved, that they will pray so definitely and fervently about it, that the Lord will hear and answer, that the name of Jesus may be glorified and the lives of the young people built up in faith.

We had a good beginning!!

GOALS FOR 50TH YEAR

1. \$150,000.00 for our Thanksgiving Offering in 1991.
2. 50 new churches and individuals to give a Thanksgiving offering in 1991.
3. \$50,000.00 for our Founders month offering.
4. \$50,000.00 for our monthly offerings in 1991.
5. 50 new churches and individuals to begin supporting B.F.M. in 1991. We will need each director and the pastors of supporting churches to help us in locating and informing these new churches and individuals about our work.
6. 10 new missionary families in the next five years (sooner if possible).
7. 5 new fields in the next five years.

This can be done by either supporting native missionaries in new countries or by sending out American missionaries.

Dear Brethren,

This "Mission Sheet Month" - November 18 to December 20 - had five Sundays. The first four of the five was spent with the 14th of December Baptist Church where I serve as pastor. Last Sunday I preached at both services at the New Jerusalem Baptist Church, Parana da Eva. Marie and I left Manaus at noon last Friday on a passenger-commercial boat. After some seven hours of traveling, we arrived and I preached that night to 28 people present. The next night I preached to an estimated 150 people. Supper was served to all before the service. The church was celebrating her 2nd birthday.

Saturday night, November 24th, I performed the wedding ceremony for Adervan Paz da Silva and Maria Julita Ribeiro da Silva at their home. Their three small children were present. Eight days later Dona Maria Julita was received into the fellowship of the church by statement. Pray for Senhor Adervan who is not saved.

Thursday afternoon, December 13th, Marie and I showed the results of the exams passed by our heart doctor - Luiz Fernandes. We are happy to report that except for a minor kidney infection that Marie has, the rest normal. Pray that I'll not gain any more weight and that Marie will lose some.

Saturday night, December 8th, Marie and I arrived in the home of Dona Maria Pereira de Sousa, close to the church, to celebrate with a service her 87th birthday. Some twenty people were present awaiting our arrival to begin the service. Before we began the service I asked permission to

wash my hands. On my left hand I had blood - not mine, but the blood of a bandit. On our way to the service, the car broke down. We had to leave it and walk the rest of the way. It was on the way that we met a man running with several people behind. His head, face, hands and chest were covered with his blood. Evidently he had been beaten until he was bloody. When he saw us, he stopped and grabbed my hand saying: "socorre-me." (help me). I said to him that he needed to be taken to a hospital but that I was without a car to take him and on our way to a service. We passed by in front of a bar. I asked the men who were observing us to help him. One man indicated to me that he would take charge of the case. He then began to call the bandit dirty names asking him what he had done with his tape recorder he had stolen from him and began beating on him. As we left, the bandit had fallen - knocked down on the street. Pray for the bandit and the man who was beating on him as we left. Pray that we will be able to say truthfully as Paul said in Acts 20:26 "I declare unto you this day that I am clean of the blood of all men".

When you read this letter, we will already be well into the month of January of 1991. We thank you who stood by this year of 1990 with your prayers and offerings. We thank you who sent us Xmas cards and gifts. May the Lord bless you all during the New Year. We believe that you will continue to pray for us and help us with offerings designated for Harold Bratcher's buildings, new works, poverty relief, etc. I almost forgot that I should share some news with Homer Crain and Sheridan Stanton in Peru. Sunday, November 25 "o peruano Roberto Bergman" was present at both services of the church. He spent that week in Manaus on business. He informed us that his father, Roberto Bergerman Avendano, is pastor of 1st Iglesia Bautista de Tampo, Peru. He was a blessing to us and we trust we were a blessing to him.

Today, December 29th, they will be returning to the USA. Brother Al has preached for all of our services since his arrival. Great preaching and all our people have been blessed.

December 18th, Mark Grimes arrived from Lexington, Ky. Mark is Benjamin's father and will be here until January 2. Melissa and Mark plan to be married June 22 at the Zion Missionary Baptist Church in

Taylor, Michigan. Mark has been saved and is a member of South Lexington Baptist Church, Lexington, Ky. The Lord has surely taken care of that situation. He has been a blessing to the work here also.

December 18th, Sheridan Stanton, Al Malo and myself went to Pucallpa and we had a trip that we will not forget for a long time. We drove the 1987 Ford van pulling our trailer from Pucallpa to Lima. A group of men tried to take us and the van and trailer. After a long chase with a motorcycle and pick-up truck, we were able to outdistance them. After 15 hours driving on a road that is impossible to explain, we arrived in Tingo Maria where Elizabeth, Wanda and children, Mark Grimes, Melissa and Benjamin were waiting for us. They went to Tingo Maria by plane and came back to Lima with us. We were 15 hours arriving from Tingo Maria to Lima.

It is really great to have the Ford diesel here in Lima. Diesel fuel is about half the price of gasoline. More news next month.

The last semester of seminary classes finished the 29th of November. Our seminary in Garca will have its first graduation on the 19th of December with two students graduating.

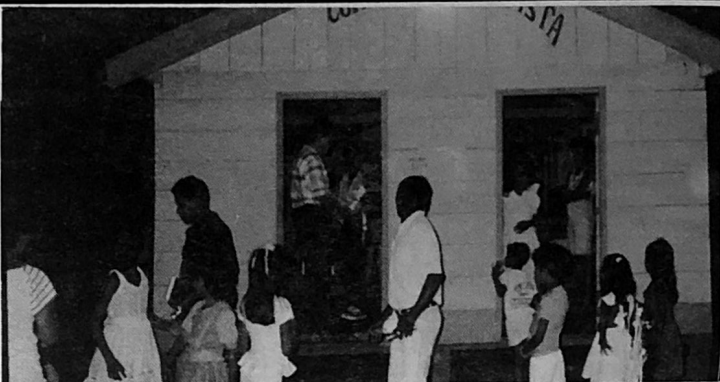
Our house in Urai is slowly taking shape and Alta and I hope to be able to

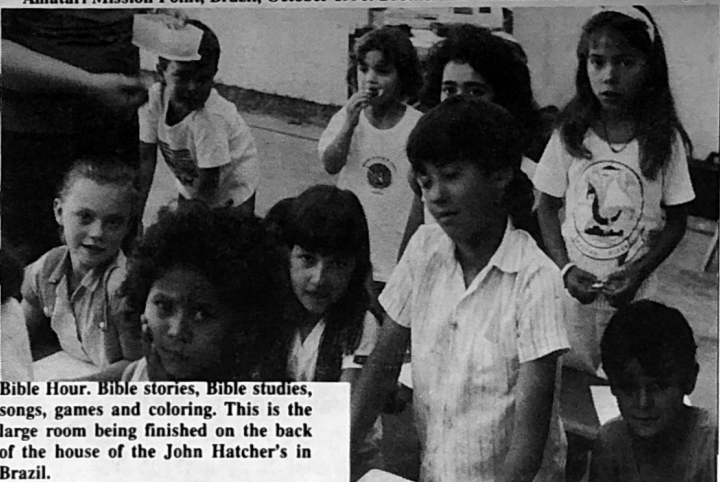

One teacher in Manaus who got saved told us that many times she ran past the front of our house with fear of being shot. The teachers at her school told the pupils they should run past because we were apt to shoot at them. In Galia they lied to the children and told them we would give them injections and take blood out of them.

This helps us to realize we are still in the battle, that we are on the right side, and that the victory will be the Lord's. Keep praying and give as the Lord lays the work on your heart.

Jordan Mission - Lima - We have seen three trust the Lord this past month and they were baptized on Sunday, the 23rd of December. PRAISE THE LORD!! One of these is a 73 year old lady! Several have rededicated their life to the Lord. Its just been blessing on top of blessing!! We are now running 50 to 60 in the services. The truth is, that we have no more room and are looking for a bigger place or some ground to build on. Pray about this and give as the Lord leads. I have never experienced a new work grow as fast as this one (the majority are adults, and not children!). After only five weeks of having services in this part of Lima, the attendance has been tremendous. Thanks to each and every one for your prayers and financial aid for this work, and for Baptist Faith Mission in general. If not for the Lord using you, we wouldn't be able to do the work we do! Thank you for your willingness to be used of the Lord.

Jordan Mission - Pucallpa - The work in Pucallpa is doing well. I was there this past week and they had 45 present in the morning service. The work there is a lot slower, but yet, sure and steady. Please remember to pray for Brother Daniel and his family, as he continues to labor there as pastor.

Pucallpa Baptist School - The school just finished its 1990 school year this past week. I was out there for all of the graduation exercises. Greetings from Cruzeiro do Sul. It has now been exactly one month since we left the States to return to our work and home here in Brazil. The return trip was one of the best we have ever had and we had no problems in customs.

The work here is in great shape. Brother Joao Vicente Jr. who filled in for me did a wonderful job. This was the first time that one of our local workers took over during one of my furloughs. I must say that he did a better job than any other who has ever helped out. The others did a good job, but this just went a lot smoother.

We did make it back to our home church for that Friday night prayer meeting, just as I had hoped we would. The church gave us a big reception (banquet included) and there were over 250 people present. All of our services have been well attended. On Sunday morning we have been having over

200 and in the evening services over 400.

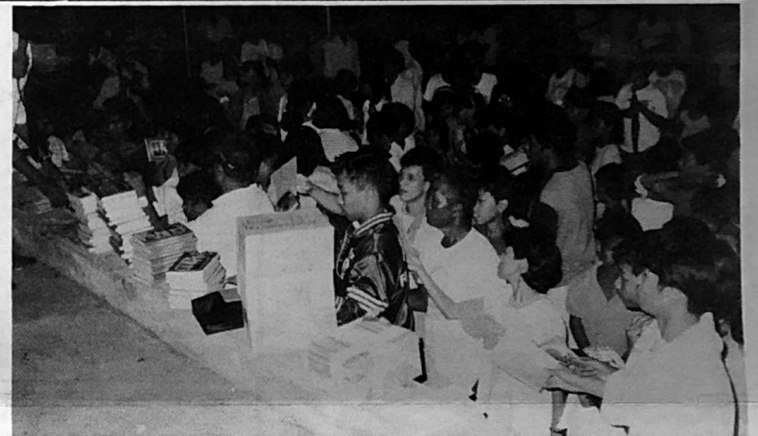
Since my return, two of our most faithful men have been killed suddenly and tragically. One was killed in a hunting accident and the other was hit by a truck. These 2 men were killed within a week of each other. On the other hand, we are having 2 weddings of young folks right here in our church. These 2 weddings are also within a week of each other. Also, Brother Joao and his wife, Miria, just had their first baby, a big boy named Judson.

Last Saturday we had our quarterly preachers meeting. There were over 40 present and a great spirit. We heard reports on the latest mission trips and made plans for more. Also we will be building 4 new church buildings in the coming months and by the middle of next year should have 2 more workers on full time.

We had four men on the last long trip up the Jurua River. They preached to 779 people and there were 71 professions of faith. Those who were saved on the first trip continued to be faithful to Christ.

Many good things are happening here and we are looking forward to great blessings. May God bless all of you.

October 27th, 1990

Dear Pastors and Saints:

Here in paradise (that's how the Virgin Islands are referred to) there are very serious problems, like any place else. However, the effect is a whole lot more disturbing when its close to you. On this very small island of St. John, planes are dropping off hundreds of pounds of dope; police have found grenades, guns and other ammunition in a house a few blocks from us; people have been shot from vehicles driving by; and there are lots of drug-related crimes.

What is there to rejoice about? First of all, God's grace has given his people a new life, a living hope, and a sure foundation to stand on - the Word of God. Secondly, God's grace has given us the sovereign God to trust in, and, to me, this makes all the difference in the world. Because I know that God is in control, we all can "sing unto God, sing praises unto the Lord".

We cease not to thank God for you brethren, because we know that we are in your prayers, that we may continue to preach the glorious gospel of Christ to the lost without fear, and teach the "whole counsel of God" to his people. Thank you for your financial support that makes it possible for me to give myself fully to the teaching and preaching not only in our churches, but also in homes where some of these drug dealers hang out, and teaching children in their various neighborhoods. There is much to do, and the worsening condition of our islands tells us that we need to work while it is day, carrying the Gospel to the young as well as to others.

When a Christian, or a church is built upon the Word of God, nothing can destroy the foundation of his faith. As I mentioned in my last letter, the charismatics were propagating their heresies; but praise be to our God, we as a church were NOT hindered or harmed in any way. As a matter of fact, we

are rejoicing in a renewed commitment to the "faith that was once delivered unto the saints". It is for all these reasons that we can rejoice in the face of violence, crime, and corruption. To God be the glory. Brother Emmanuel Jaggernauth
