Dear Brethren,

This "Mission Sheet Month" - December 21st to January 16th - was a busy one.

During this period of time I performed 5 weddings - three at the church, one at the home of the bride, and one at our mission at Armond Mendes. One of the couples, a week after their wedding, was baptized with eight more during our watch-night service. Asa Mark helped me with the baptizing. One of the candidates requested that she be baptized by him, so he did. Then he held in his arms a teenaged crippled boy and thus helped me to baptize him.

On the 27th of December, Marie and I completed 37 years of married life together. The 4th of January was Asa Mark's 35th birthday. Whereas during these days the

church (the 14th of December Baptist Church) gained 13 new members - three by letter or statement and ten by baptism; she lost 11 - one by letter and 10 by exclusion.

During 1991 we hope and pray that it will be a better, more successful year than 1990 with more victories and less defeats with the church winning more lost people for Christ and baptizing them and "teaching them to observe all things" that Christ commanded us. Fewer losses by death (we just lost two by death so my prayer is that no member will die during 1991) and exclusion with more non-resident members asking for their letter to unite with another Baptist Church of like faith and order.

I am sorry to report that during these days Marie did not have a perfect attendance record at the services of the church like she usually does. The reason was sickness on her part. Last Sunday, however, she was back at her place as usual.

Sunday night the 6th of January we had our first graduation exercises of our home Bible studies. Some ten of our lay members conducted during five weeks Bible studies in some five different homes. We recognized and gave certificates to some thirty "graduates".

We started the new year off with a good attendance in Sunday Bible School - 326. Last Sunday, however, we were down to 238 with a few more attending the worship service.

As I am writing this letter, I am praying for peace. About an hour ago there appeared at our house two men from one of the radio stations here in Manaus. They gave me the opportunity to speak a few words over the radio about the conflict in Iraq. I was able to proclaim "Cristo - A Unica Esperanca", "Christ - Our only Hope." I trust that when you read this letter, the war will not have happened or will already be over.

We rejoice that the Lord continues to bless Baptist Faith Missions. We thank you, Directors, for the \$50 raise we received beginning this month of January. We thank you, churches and individuals that faithfully give to the regular fund as well as to the designated funds. We trust that throughout this year of 1991 you will continue to do the same. We need the prayers of those that love us in the Lord. May the Lord bless you is our prayer.

Plans For New Year . . . Begin Work on Christian School . . . Lord Gives a Revival . . .

Dear Brethren,

The new year has started very well for the work here. We had our watch night service with a big crowd. We finished the old year and began the new one in prayer. During the service a map was unveiled, which shows all of the west end of our state, with all the mission work that is under way right now. At this time we have 12 churches, 14 congregations and 15 preaching points. The map also shows the villages we plan to reach this year. Plans have already been made to build in 6 villages and put 2 more missionaries on full time. The plans to the school project were also presented during the final service of 1990. The first special offering was just over \$1,000.00.

The clearing of the school property was started a few days ago. The city gave us 3 hours of bulldozer work to begin the clearing. As the last few minutes of the work was being done, the commander of the army base sent us 2 more tractors to finish the work. He heard about the project and

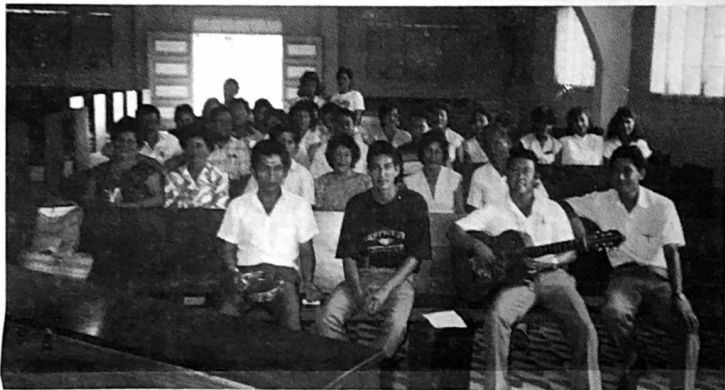
wanted to help, so he rushed the tractors out to keep things going. We did over \$3,000.00 worth of work without having to pay a penny. It is great to see how God works. In a few more days we will have the ground breaking ceremony. We just don't have the funds to build with. We do have faith that God will provide though. Last Saturday we had 15 men from our church working as volunteers at the property. The church here is very excited and the town is also very happy to know that the city of Cruzeiro do Sul will have a Christian school.

The first 2 Sundays of the year have been just great. Our attendance is growing again and the Lord has given us revival. The first Sunday of January there were 5 saved, 2 requests for baptism and 3 men who came confessing sin. Last Sunday 3 were saved, 3 requests for baptism and 2 coming by letter. Our Sunday School is working very well, with 8 big classes and 25 workers.

Last week we began classes for our preachers and workers again. There are 51 workers attending the 3 nightly classes. We have begun with Basic Theology, Homiletics and Church Administration. The classes will run for 3 months.

This is just a little of the good news from here.

We continue visitation, tracts giving, and soul winning this past month, but because of distance and some hindrances, we have a hard time inviting people to come to our place as we have a change in our plans. Few weeks ago I inquire temporary home Bible study in their areas and since I have prospect there I got two persons and one family for it so all in all I have three places (different) for Bible study but I arranged it for my convenience so that I have now only two different places for it at least twice a week. Lately with those faithful there in the compound (our home base) for a scheduled Bible study but due to rains and brownouts we don't make it. So far people in the compound were suffering from sickness, their children and also the adults Please continue pray for us.

Dear Brethren:

Greetings to you in the precious Name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

God continues to bless the work here in San Pablo City. I can really see the Lord's hand working in us.

Last month we had our Faith Promise Soul Winning Conference. The aim of this activity was to challenge our members to win more souls. For three consecutive nights we had more than 74 visitors and more than 42 were saved. At the end of our conference we had an attendance of 129. Our members made their commitments. Each one wrote on a card the number of souls they're going to win for the next 12 months. We have come up to a total number of 867 souls. We fervently pray that by God's abounding grace we'll be able to reach our goal.

Our Home Bible Studies are also becoming fruitful. I have 4 Home Bible Studies held every night. That's the only time members of the family are complete. In every home we are averaging 10-15 in

attendance. Souls are getting saved and now we have 20 candidates for baptism.

Our church is not yet a large one. Every Sunday we only average 20-30 in attendance, morning and evening, young people and adults. Actually, we have more than 60 members but more than half of them are inactive. I thank God so much because those who are remaining are the ones who are really working and serving God with faithfulness. Nevertheless, it is my vision as pastor to have the largest Baptist Church here in San Pablo City - all by God's grace and for His glory.

Our vision is really wide because we have a great God. I know God will give this to us according to his perfect will. May we request you to please include this in your prayers. We will be very happy to know you're praying for us.

Regards to all our brothers and sisters there. We extend our most profound and sincerest gratitude to you. May Hebrew 6:10 be of comfort to you.

I noticed that Satan has become very crafty after so many years of practice. Just when I thought I had figured out his schemes he changed his tactics.
