THE 50TH YEAR

Through the past fifty years, Baptist Faith Missions has sought to achieve two objectives in its mission work. These objectives are (1) to support only men who are doctrinally sound and (2) to handle the offerings as good stewards of God.

The missionaries supported through BFM are doctrinally sound. They believe: (1) that the Bible is God's verbally inspired Word (2) that salvation is entirely by God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ. That salvation is of the Lord from election to glorification (3) that the kind of church Jesus began during His ministry was an assembly of scripturally baptized believers, a local visible body, which is like what we call a Baptist church today. That missionaries should be sent out by these kinds of churches to make disciples, baptize them and teach them to observe all things and then organize them into New Testament Baptist churches. (4) That Jesus is literally coming again to rule forever as King of Kings. That He will raise the believers' bodies and change them to the kind of body He has. This is just a brief summary of what the missionaries believe.

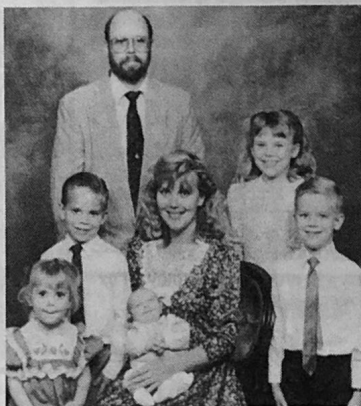
The offerings which are received for the missionaries and their work is handled honestly before all men. A public receipt is given for all offerings. The public receipt is put in the **Mission Sheets** each month. Each year there is an annual financial report made of all funds received and paid out during the year. It is gone over in a public meeting at the Spring Conference. All are invited to attend. A printed report can be received by all who request it.

The funds are not wasted but are carefully used for the purpose given. Almost all funds go to the Mission field. A very small amount is used to print the missionaries letters and pictures and send them to you in the **Mission Sheets** to promote the mission work. Some is used for postage, envelopes, etc. to send information to the missionaries about their offerings etc. All is used for the missionaries and their work.

The two objectives have been achieved over these past fifty years.

HOME MISSIONS REPORT

The home mission work of Baptist Faith Missions is "on line".

At the Thanksgiving Missions Conference the Directors of Baptist Faith Missions announced the implementation of a Home Missions Plan to advance the cause of Christ in the United States of America. Chosen from among the present directors of B.F.M. to direct this task were: Marvin Summers (Moderator and Treasurer), pastor of New Hope Baptist Church, Dearborn Heights, MI; Glenn Archer (Secretary), pastor of Richland Baptist Church, Livermore, KY; John M. Hatcher (Liaison to BFM), pastor of Emmanuel Baptist Church, Evansville, IN; and Carl Morton, pastor of First Baptist Church, Alexandria, KY. Additionally, three men not serving on the Board of Baptist Faith Missions will be chosen. The first of these, Roger McManus, pastor of First Baptist Church, Niles, IL has already accepted the responsibility of serving with us on the Home Mission Board.

History reveals the need of evangelism at home, as well as beyond our national borders. It is our desire to be used by the Lord to aid in the establishment of growing Baptist Churches in America. We believe that this is essential if we are going to be faithful in carrying out the Great Commission at home and abroad. We need to reach the enlarging population of the United States for its own sake and to provide manpower and

sustenance to reach other countries with the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ.

The past month has been full of interesting happenings. Our daughter, Kathy, was 33 years old on the 10th of February so we invited her and Odali and family to spend a week with us here in Ural. Grandson Odali came with us the week before. This is the first time he stayed with us without his family. Grandma and I enjoyed his visit very much. Grandma Alta played games with him and I began to teach him to play the flute. All went well until mom and dad arrived. After that, he traded the flute for the fishing pole. We had a great time together.

Marilia Building - Some of you have given faithfully to our New Works fund. The two buildings in planning are in Marilia and Cornelio Procopio. Since I am no longer pastor of the church in Garca, Odali is taking care of the construction of the building in Marilia. **WORK HAS BEGUN, PRAISE THE LORD!** This building will be a joint effort of funds from the New Works Fund and offerings that churches give to Odali. This is marvelous because the rise in prices have made our funds insufficient to finish the building. Hopefully, the building will be finished in about five months.

Yesterday, I received notice that we may receive a lot for building in Cornelio Procopio in a few days.

In Ural our Bible Hours on Saturdays and Sundays are gaining ground. Children

and young people are bringing their friends. Mothers are sending their children. One mother brought her two granddaughters because a mother told her that her four year old boy had changed so much that it was unbelievable. Yesterday, I was not feeling well. When we got home from service in Cornelio I went to bed instead of eating. At 1:45 p.m. I woke up with the sound of a little girl singing a chorus. She was at the front gate waiting for time to start - one hour and fifteen minutes before time. Another child asked, "What do they do in there?" "We sing, hear a Bible lesson, answer questions, play games, and get a piece of candy. You will like it, wait and see." As I awoke hearing that conversation I thought - I like that kind of advertisement!

In Cornelio Procopio we have two groups of young people who have Bible hours on Sunday afternoons in two different neighborhoods. One meets under a big tree. They have between 35 and 45 children each Sunday, including an eight year old boy who they carry to and from his house. The other group meet in the middle of a dead-end street. Sunday, I heard them talking about a plan where they could perhaps provide pieces of plastic for the children to sit on. This group has between 10 and 15 each week. Totalling all of our works, we have a total weekly attendance of 110 to 120.

Our house with a large room for meeting in Ural is progressing slowly. We cannot move our furniture until the house is completed and it looks like that will take another month or two. Pray for us. It is almost impossible for us to start in other cities until we are moved in.

Thank you for your prayers and your fellowship in the Gospel.

General News - The Stantonons are doing fine and are in good health. Leah and Josh start back to school next week - summer vacation is over! We are all looking forward to furlough in July. Pastors, if you wish to have me in your church, please let me know soon because the dates are starting to fill up and with so many supporting churches, I know I can't visit everyone. Please write or call me soon! We had a great visit from a good friend of ours this past month. Brother Ken Wallace, from the Bible Baptist Church in Harrisburg, Ill. came down for a week and then went over to Brazil to visit missionaries Mike Creiglow and Asa Mark Bratcher. We really enjoyed the time with Ken and thank the church for sending so many nice things with him (especially the "Snickers" bars!).

Jordan Mission - Lima - We are still enjoying the great blessings of the Lord here in this work. We are averaging 55 to 60 in each service. The spirit among the people is great. I baptized six two weeks ago (in the portable Baptistry tank we just built), three elderly ladies and three in their early twenties. Five have come to join by moving their membership. Others are to be baptized soon. Pastor Jorge Dianderas is doing a great job. He's a good preacher and has a pray for him and his family. We work together in this work, and the Lord has given us a real good spirit of cooperation. We call him "The

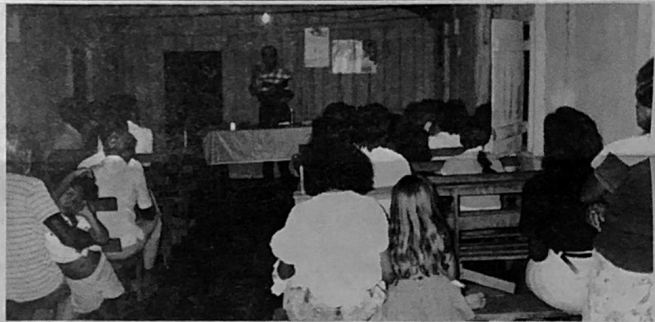

Pucallpa Baptist School - The school will be starting its 1991 school year on the 15th of March. We are expecting another record year this year. We will have 50 people on the payroll this year and still around 700 students. Its quite a work - you should come and and visit it sometime and see for yourself.

Another month has rapidly gone by us. We have been busy in the Lord's service not only in Manaus, but also in the interior.

Last month I gave a 3 night seminar on Homiletics at the Center of Theological Studies at Itacoatiara. Pastor Francisco de Assis Santos is in charge there. They have 22 students but almost 100 attended each night. Then after preaching at one of the churches there, the Mount of Olives Baptist Church, we left on the boat for the town of Urucura. There we considered several lots to begin a new work. I hope to go back there to finalize a deal

and take a worker, around the end of March. This small town of around 30,000 people is about 22 hours by boat from Manaus.

This month the highlight has been the visit of Brother Ken Wallace from the Bible Baptist Church of Harrisburg, Illinois. He has sure been a blessing to us and to the work. Thanks, dear Bible Baptist, for all the things sent. Brother Ken and I visited six of the churches on Sunday, at their request. Then Tuesday we left on a short 3 day trip to Itacoatiara by car, then by boat to Amatori, Parana da Eva, and Novo Remanso. Wednesday night there were over 80 present at New Jerusalem Baptist Church and 2 decisions.

Brother Ken is returning to the States early tomorrow morning. We will miss him.

Our grateful thanks to each church that continues to help us to carry on for the Lord here.

Dear Brethren,

This month's letter will share with you the happenings of the last 36 days. I delayed writing this month because Brother Ken Wallace who arrived on the 14th will be returning to the U.S.A. Bible Baptist Church, Harrisburg, Ill. on Sunday. Thus I plan to send this letter by him, for him to mail from Harrisburg. His visit has been a blessing to us and to the different churches he visited with Asa Mark.

On the 25th of January we celebrated the 35th birthday of one of our members - Lauro Sodre Melo Magalhaes - with a service that night at his house. An estimated 100 people heard my message. Our joy was limited, however, when the notice was given us just before the service began of the death of one of our elderly members - Dona Maria das Dores Freitas. This dear sister had suffered mentally for years and for the last few months of her life was blind. We rejoice that now she will suffer no more.

The 27th of January was a rainy Sunday. I preached at 9:00 at the Monte Horebe Baptist Church with the pastor present Levir Perea Merlo and then Marie and I drove to the 14th of December Baptist where only 94 people had faced the rain to be present.

On the following Thursday afternoon, Marie and I visited the home of Asa Marcos Miranda where the Church has a preaching point. They live in a new suburb of the city that is known as the "Multirao da Cidade Nova". There we had a short service that afternoon with some 16 present. Services are held there each Sunday morning and night in the open front porch of the two room small frame house where the family live. The house doesn't have electric lights yet. We have little to attract the people but the Word is being preached and quite often 60 people (mostly children) attend the Morning Worship services.

Marie and I did what so many of the believers do during "Carnival" - February 9-13th. We left the city and went on a "retiro". We went by bus on the 11th and returned on the 13th by bus. The owner of the "Retiro Espiritual Cristo Redentor" is a Baptist layman - Lucio Porto. There I preached to some 40 on Tuesday morning.

This last Sunday was the best of all the Sundays this year. That night I preached to an estimated 210 people present and two young people were saved and one young man made a rededication. Day before yesterday afternoon one of the young men of the church and I visited a widow woman with a large family who live in a slum section of the city. In the midst of poverty we were richly blessed because three of her children - two teenagers and a daughter 24 years old - all three made a profession of faith. We praise the Lord. We are running out of space, so we thank you dear saints of God for your offerings that you give to BFM regular fund and/or designated funds. May the Lord by His grace enable you to continue to do so. Brethren, pray for us.

Dear Brethren:

In my last mission letter I was on my way to Iquitos to check on the work and to help in any way possible to encourage the work there. I had a good trip and was able to help the following churches on their buildings: Fourth Baptist Church, Fifth Baptist Church, Esperanza Baptist Church, Mermosa Baptist Church, Good News Baptist Church, and the Second Baptist Church. The Brethren are really thankful and encouraged. One of the Pastors said that he thought that BFM had forgotten them. It was a blessing to see the Brethren encouraged and they all said many thanks to BFM for their extended hand at this time of financial crisis that they are all going through. Please pray for them.

I am also thankful for the new help since the first of January. Brother Alberto Fabian resigned his Church in Tingo Maria after serving there faithfully for 14 years. He is now working full time heading up our Bible Institute by Extension. We now have students studying here in Lima, Ventanilla,

Huanuco, Tingo Maria and Pucallpa. I have the names of sixty more from Pucallpa that want to study in our Institute by extension. I was not able to get to all of them as I should. He will take a big load off my shoulders.

We had planned to start building in San Bartolo this coming month. Some of the Brethren from the States were planning to come down and help, but, some have written and others have called saying that they thought it to be too dangerous at this time. I agree as we have a lot of demonstrations against the United States in the Gulf crisis. With the good news today that the war is over, we are hoping that everything here will improve. I will plan another time for the work on the building in San Bartolo. We still plan to start the services there next week. Monday we plan to build a temporary building for the preacher to live in and have services in. Pray for this new work.

This week I started the purchasing of 12 lots in the main part of the city of Ventanilla where we plan to start another work soon. Our goal is to start 5 new missions in this year - the 50th year of Baptist Faith Missions. I am sure that you all agree that we should be thankful for our Directors we have now and thankful for their dedication and service. Something else from my heart. Let us also be thankful for Hafford Overbey and Z.E. Clark who gave the best part of their lives. May our 50th year be the greatest yet.

Dear Brethren,

This has been a great month! We finally opened up our Sunday School at the Chacara dos Pinheiros work. We had 72 for the first Sunday and an average of 65 for the month. Over half of these are young people and adults which is encouraging. Our adult class has around 15 attending. We also had our first baptism service there. Many people from the community came, as few have seen a baptism outside of the Catholic Church. The house was full with people looking in the windows. We baptized 3 into the membership of the church that night.

This month I will be taking care of the Boa Esperanca Church while the pastor goes to visit his mother in the north of the country (2500 miles). Brother Creiglow will

take care of the Chacara work. If we don't find a National worker there, he probably will take care of it while we come home on furlough in July. We may leave the first part of June for West Kentucky so Ursula can get sooner to a doctor for her arthritis. Michelle will get out of kindergarten the end of May. We have much to do in the way of preparation with documents to get in order, furniture to store, etc. We are looking forward to seeing our friends and visiting churches. In our next letter we will give both our Brazilian address and my mother's address as we will be staying there for 4 or 5 weeks on our arrival in the States.

We are trying to fix up the house at the new work for a pastor's house. I am already starting to make preliminary plans for the next building project in Tijucal. We will share this with you when we are there. The Lord's work is never finished. The fields are white and the labourers are few. Remember us always in your prayers as well as all of your missionaries. This includes your own pastor. God bless all of you.

There is still a need for \$15,000 to complete the reconstruction. We need your help. Thanks to the Addyston Baptist Church for making it possible for a group of their young people to be with us for two weeks; one week for Vacation Bible School, and the

other week as counselors in our summer camp. Thanks to Pastor Rex Hensley. We need others to help us during the next six weeks.

Thanks for your faithful support of the West Indies Mission work. This is a mission endeavor of The Cruz Bay Baptist Church. We, with your help, are supporting twelve missionaries. Our church is a light house of the truth of the Word of God; the doctrines of Grace and the local Church being the distinctive features from all others around. And those that we support are men that believe these truths firmly and present them boldly, and pay for them dearly. Our Bible Conference is a means to highlight not only contemporary issues, but also rekindle these doctrines that the flames would burn on many of these islands, and would be passed along to others. Our Bible College is a tremendous means to this end.
