Dear Brethren,

This month has been a busy one in two continents, but as usual, the Lord has been gracious and has blessed us beyond expectations.

The last Saturday of March I traveled to the interior town of Manacapuru (3 hours by ferry & car) to meet the pastor and members of the Zion Baptist Church. That afternoon around 80 of us left by boat for the interior village of Ressaca do Pesqueiro to dedicate the new building of the mission there. The mission requested that we baptize 5 and the national pastor, Brother Marcondes, baptized 3 for the church in Manacapuru. That night there were almost 200 people present (over 50 standing and on the outside). The Lord blessed with a wonderful service with 2 professions of faith. We finally arrived back in Manacapuru at 2 a.m. Then at 9 a.m., I preached at the special Easter service at the 1st Baptist Church at Manacapuru. As soon as the service was over, we drove back to Manaus, just in time to eat a late dinner and rest before services.



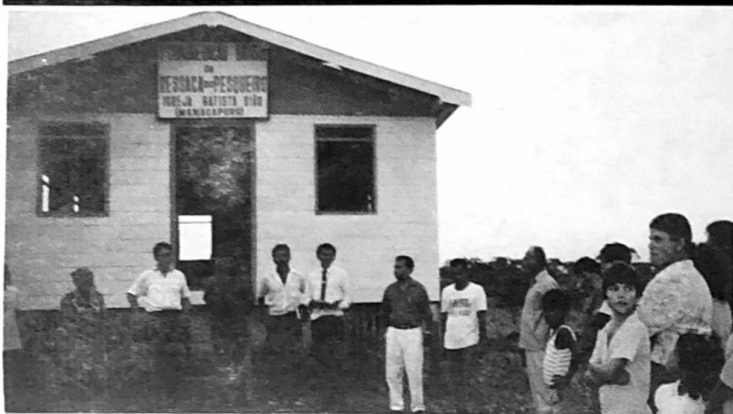

That night I preached at the Mount Carmel Baptist Church in town. Do pray for the people of the community of Ressaca do Pesqueiro. They are very poor financially, but because of the witness of the mission there many are now spiritually rich and will be much more soon during eternity. As soon as I arrived, they told me about a neighbor (a poor fisherman) that 2 weeks before had been attacked by a big alligator that tore off his leg. By the time they got him to Manaus, he was dead. The saddest part is that he was not saved. There are so many more like him that need to hear the gospel before it is too late.

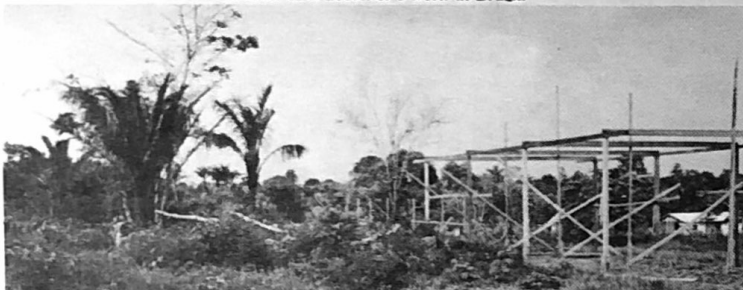
On Sunday, the 15th, I held the Lord's Supper at the Manacial Baptist Mission in the suburb of Armando Mendes. Then I rushed to preach at the morning worship service of the 14th of December Baptist Church. There were over 250 present and 4 decisions. That night I preached to about the same number, and the Lord blessed with 6 professions of faith. Thank you, Father! To You Be the Glory!

At midnight I left for the airport to catch the plane for the States, to spend two weeks to have my eyes checked out because of the infection, etc. I will be returning Monday the 29th, the Lord willing. Pray for us.

Dear Brethren:

On May 4, 1991 the congregation at the Chacara dos Pinheiros was organized into a Baptist church by that same name. I think there were twenty-six charter members. Brother Draper was called as pastor and I was called as interim pastor to serve until he returns or until they find a Brazilian pastor. Through the years I have been asked to help or have taken the lead in the organization of a good many churches, but this was the first time that I have had the honor of preaching the charge in the new church. This week we started a Sunday School teacher's training class and we have had a very good turnout for that. Even before the church was organized we started the long process of teaching them to observe all the things that He has taught us. A few of us meet every morning at 6:30 A.M. for prayer and Bible study before we start our regular day of work.

Yesterday we helped the Drapers store their furniture, since they had already

rented their house. They have moved into a furnished apartment and are tying all the loose ends together, getting ready to leave the first part of June. All of us here will miss them very much. We hope they will have a good furlough and that you all will help them see their plans for the future realized when they return next year.

We have been to Novo Diamantino once or twice this month. The church there has celebrated their second birthday as I mentioned in my letter last month. They are holding their own in attendance, but that is about all.

The semester of our seminary is about to end and, of the sixteen that were registered, we have fourteen still with us. We hope to add two more subjects this next semester. We are still waiting on our building permit and hope to start construction next Monday on the addition of our building. This time I do not plan to get involved very much in the construction. Pastor Candido will oversee all the work along with buying the materials and I rather imagine he will be able to do it with less expenses than I would be able to do it.

We desire your prayers as we try to lead this new church as well as our work with the seminary.

Our preachers met for another quarterly planning session at First Baptist Church of Mancio Lima the last Saturday of March. There were almost 40 workers present. The reports are all good. The new buildings that are being put up in several villages are coming right along. The one at Santa Luzia is finished and in use already. This work was started by Bible Baptist Church of Igarape Pentecostes. The lumber is being sawed for the building in the mountains at the headwaters of the Moa River. Much of the materials have also been purchased for the new work at Guarani. This is one of 2 new mission works of First Baptist Church of Mancio Lima.

This month I made a visit to the church at Mancio Lima to help them with a problem that popped up. The pastor had been getting a lot of criticism and decided to resign. I met with the elders and the pastor to help them get things worked out. Fortunately the elders are all backing the

pastor. Things seem to be fine now. Since then I went back to make a visit to one of their new mission points. This work is about 70 kilometers back in the jungle in a new settlement. They already have a building and about 25 baptized believers. There were over 50 in attendance the day I went. I am sending a picture of this new congregation. Remember that this work was started by our local workers and this was my first visit ever! That's what I call exciting.

There were 2 more mission teams on the Azul River and the Moa River this month. There were 6 more people saved.

We have had 2 more saved here at First Baptist Church.

I spent 10 days in Manaus, Cuiaba and Brasilia. We have started working on Paul Creiglow's visas. Pray that they will come through soon. I was in Cuiaba over the weekend. It was great to see my folks and the Drapers again. They had me preach at the new work at Chacara dos Pinheiros. The services were very enjoyable.

Our Christian school project is starting to take shape now. Some of the barriers have already been surpassed. We still do not have any funds to start building though. More about that another time.

Dear Brethren,

This will be our last letter from Brazil if all goes as planned. We are scheduled to get to the States on June 9th. We must first go through Rio de Janeiro to get our daughter's documentation done. Then we will go through Sao Paulo to catch the plane for Miami. We are going through Paraguay to save on the passage. Air fares have gone up a lot since our last trip home.

We finally organized the new church at Chacara dos Pinheiros. It was organized with 26 charter members. I was called as pastor and on my recommendation the church called Brother Bobby Creiglow to serve as pastor in our absence. We are sure thankful to have the Creiglows working in this new work. With their experience and abilities we can leave it in good hands. Pray for them as they labor there.

We baptized 3 more into the church there. The preaching point in Tijucal is about the same. We are praying about the possibility of inviting a young preacher from Sao Paulo to help Brother Creiglow. If he comes the first of the year it will maybe make it possible for a Sunday Bible School to be started there in addition to the Friday night preaching service.

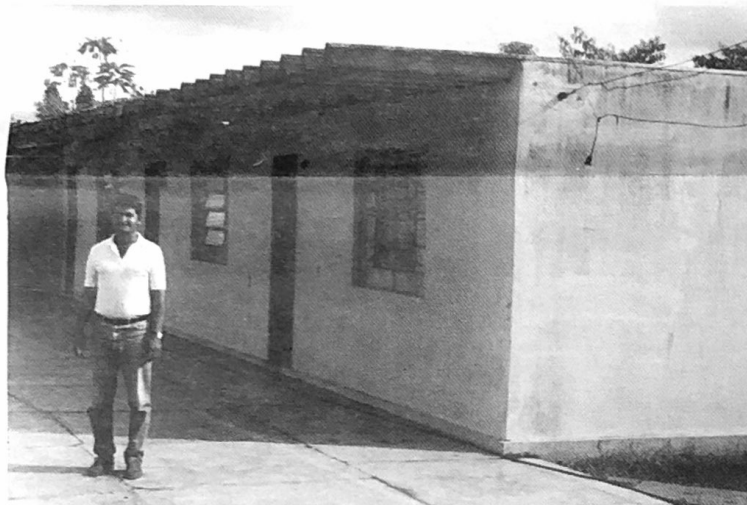

We plan on staying for 3 weeks or so in Western Kentucky to visit parents, children, and grandchildren. I have a new grandson whom I haven't yet seen. It will be a joy to see all of them. But to tell the truth we hate to leave the work and the brethren here. They have become almost like family to us. We are so thankful to have the privilege to serve the Lord in Brazil. In spite of the very hot climate here in Cuiaba we will miss it. We are thinking about moving up on the higher elevation outside of the city when we come back. There is a small town up there which has no Baptist work. After we get the work in Tijucal established it will probably be the next work we will open, the Lord willing. The climate there is much less hot than here in town. It is about 50 minutes away by car from Cuiaba. While we are there with you we will tell more about the work and the plans for the work here in Mato Grosso.

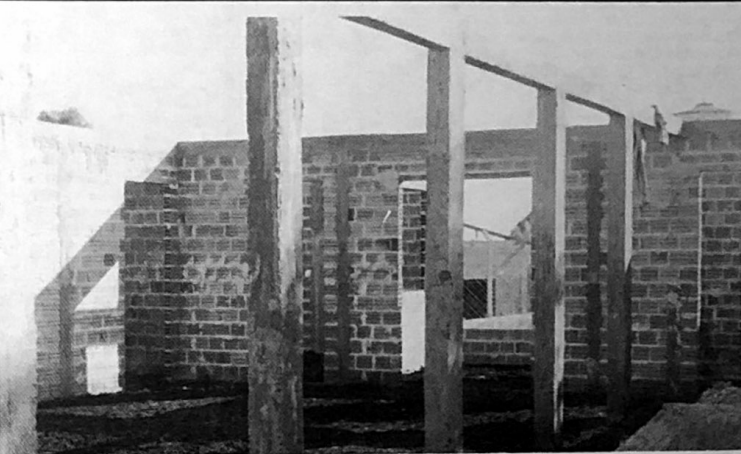

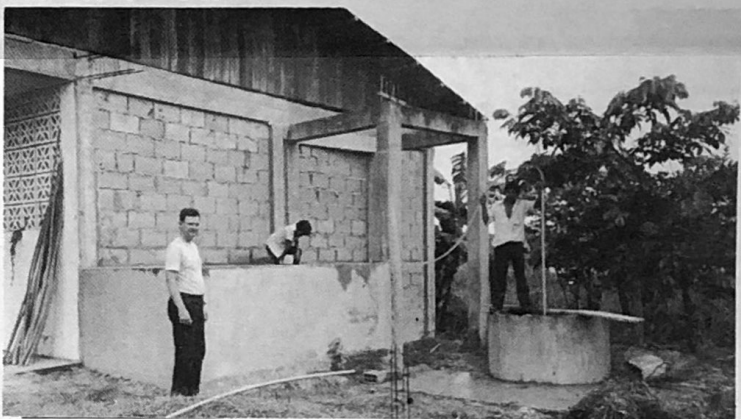
