IMPORTANT DATES AND EVENTS (continued from last month) by Jim Orrick

- June 1978 Del Mayfield goes to be with the Lord. He had been a faithful missionary to Peru for 17 years, organizing churches, building buildings, and establishing the school at Pucallpa.
- Feb. 1979 Carver organizes his third church in Korea. The Faith Baptist Church has 72 charter members.
Hershael York spends the summer working with Harold Bratcher in Manaus, Brazil.
- July 1979 Douglas Gasque is our new missionary to Peru.
- May 1980 Francisco Santiago dies in Brazil. He had been saved under the ministry of Joseph Brandon in 1928 and was the first person Brandon baptized in Cruzeiro do Sul. He surrendered to preach in 1931, and had been a faithful pastor for many years. He was 96 years old when he died.
Louis Carver begins mission work in the Philippines.
- June 1980 Dana and Becky Adams accepted to go to the Philippines as missionaries.
- Feb. 1981 Carver organizes a church in the Philippines with 30 charter members.
- Nov. 1981 After 40 years of faithful service, H. H. Overbey retires as secretary of B.F.M. He is honored at the Thanksgiving Conference for his many years of service. Edward Overbey is the new secretary.
The offering for Nov. is \$102,054.65. The first time the monthly offering has been over \$100,000.00.
- May 1982 Sheridan and Anita Stanton are our new missionary family to Peru.
- June 1982 Bobby and Charlene Wacaser are our new missionaries to Brazil.
- Nov. 1984 Florence Calley goes to be with the Lord.
- March 1985 Paul Calley goes to be with the Lord. The Calleys were missionaries to Brazil in the 1950's. After returning to the States due to poor health, they served as missionaries in Northern Michigan where God used them to organize five Baptist Churches.
Ashland Avenue Baptist Church receives a request from church in the Philippines for someone to come and teach a series on "The Trail of Blood." They send Edward Overbey. While there he is able to visit our missionaries and see the work.
- June 1985 Ann Orrick goes to Brazil to spend the summer working with John and Alta Hatcher.
- Jan. 1986 George and June Bean return to Brazil as missionaries.
- April 1986 Zion Baptist Church, Taylor, MI gives a special offering of \$20,000 to help send the Beans and Hendersons to the mission field.
- Oct. 1986 The Wacasers move to Curitiba in Southern Brazil to begin work in a new state.
- Jan. 1991 Winter conference at Park Ridge Baptist Church, Gotha, FL in the interest of B.F.M. Speakers are Richard Adams, George Bean, Bobby Green, Rex Hensley, Roy Humble, Sentoma Jaggernauth, Emmanuel Jaggernauth, Roger McManus, James Miller, Edward Overbey, Ross Range, I.D. Riddick, Hollis Walter, Curtis Whaley, Paul Mullins, and Samaroo Sookraj. Douglas King is the host pastor.
- March 1991 Paul Creiglow is our new missionary to Brazil.
- April 1991 Brother James L. Hamilton goes to be with the Lord. He had been a director for many years, serving as treasurer for twenty-five years. He was a great friend to missionaries.

In the fifty year history of B.F.M. 32 families have served in five different countries. Thousands of people have been saved, many churches have been organized, buildings built, and nationals trained to reach their own people. Before he died H.B. Taylor said, "If it is God's will, the work in the great Amazon Valley will GO, AND GROW, AND GLOW." While the work is not as large as we would like, looking back we can say, "EBENEZER, HITHERTO THE LORD HATH HELPED US." Facing the future we can say, "JEHOVAH-JIREH, THE LORD WILL PROVIDE." Let us pray that until the Lord's return the work will continue to GO, AND GROW, AND GLOW.

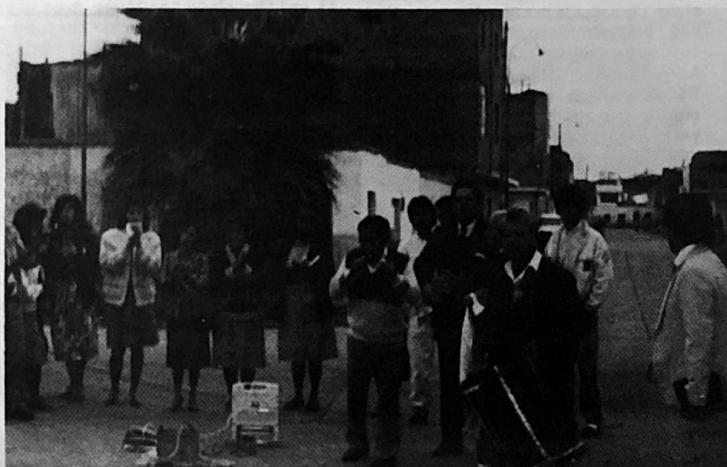
DON'T FORGET THE WORK HORSE FUND!!

During this Mission Sheet Month, besides the regular services at the Church (14th of December Baptist Church where I serve as pastor and where Marie, my wife, is an active member) we have held services in some five different homes. On the 27th of December Marie and I completed 37 years of married life. On the next day, I performed the wedding ceremony for a young couple at the Church. On the 3rd of January, Marie and I attended a wedding held at a home at 10:30 a.m. On the 30th of December, I held funeral services at the graveside of Brother Saturnino Jesus Farias. Brother Saturnino died at the age of 83. He was for many years a member of the Church. On the first day of January, I was asked to bring a message at a funeral home. The deceased was the father of one of our members. He was not a believer.

December 31st, Watch Night services at the Church. We began at 19:40 and finished at 24:00. An estimated 300 of us were still present to greet the New Year. During the service, I baptized 5 new believers and one was received by statement. Asa Mark led us in the celebration of the Lord's Supper. Sunday morning, December 28th, four youths made professions of faith.

Before concluding I must sound a negative note. More than one of the ones we are trying to win or regain for the cause were not filled with the Spirit during the holiday season (See Ephesians 5:18). There is much sin in the camp (See Joshua 7:10-13). January 7th our beloved fellow missionaries, John & Alta Hatcher ate dinner with us. January 10th, Prayer Meeting at the Church from 20:00 until almost 24:00. January 11th, special services, Missions Now, sponsored by the Brazilian Baptist Faith Missions, Asa Mark Bratcher, President. I'm sure he will present a more complete report.

We thank all of you who sent us Christmas cards and letters. Thank you, Mrs. Lossie Prewitt, Mrs. Edith Richardson, and Mrs. Madie Lee Moore, three widows, members of Newby Baptist Church, for your telephone call. May the Lord bless you all.

As the Lord leads, give to the regular fund and, if possible, to one of our projects or funds - poverty relief, new buildings, personal needs, etc. We are trying to cut down or reduce our expenses. Let us all pray and give and be super stewards for the Saviour. Pray for us.

Excitement and encouragement are the two key words for this letter. I've received updated news about our works in both Lima and Pucallpa.

In Lima, Brother Jorge Dianderas, our national pastor of the new mission work, wrote me a letter and informed me of the following:

1. Our attendance is averaging 75 to 80 in the three main services.
2. He has baptized 14 in the past three months.
3. They continue to hold street meetings each Sunday afternoon (picture in this mission sheet).
4. The new mission they started, after we left in July, is showing a lot of promise. (Our new mission has now started another mission! Praise the Lord! The vision is catching.)
5. A gospel quartet has formed in the work called the "Voices of Jordan".
6. The dear saints of the work there send their christian love to all the saints here that help make the work possible and especially to the brothers and sisters of the Jordan Missionary Baptist Church in Sanford, FL (our home church).
7. They continue to pray that God will stir hearts here in the States for the need of \$15,000.00 we need to purchase the property and to renovate a little. To date we

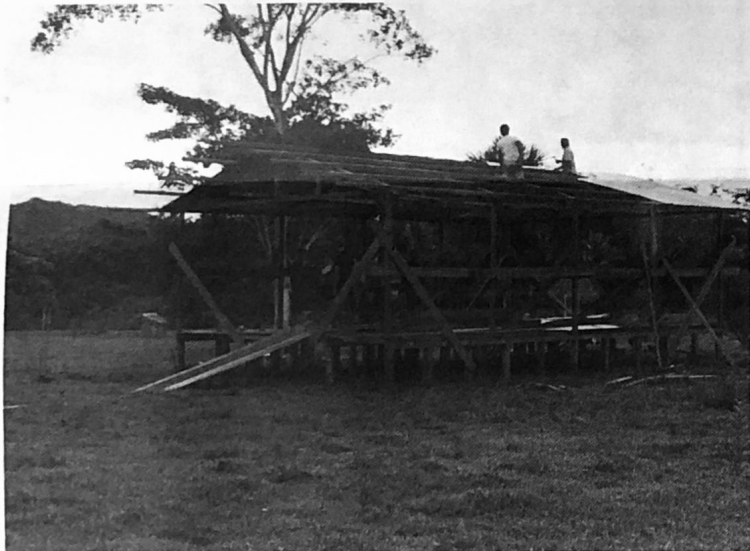
have received \$4,317.00 toward this most urgent fund. We must raise about \$10,000.00 more! Please pray and give as the Lord leads! This is not a rural property - it is in the city and the cost is high, but it is where the people are, so please give. Our goal is to have this work organized and with its own building within two years. We need your help!! I need to have this money with me when we return in July so we can start to build. Don't miss an opportunity like this to help!

I'm about out of space so I'll inform you about the great news in Pucallpa next month. All the works are going well and the Pucallpa Baptist School is doing great at this time.

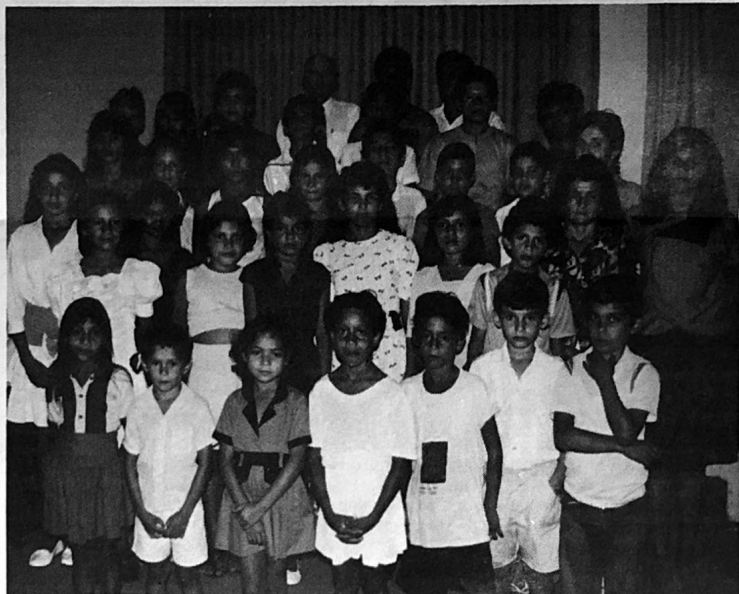

The month of December was a rather busy one. I preached a total of 17 times in 10 different churches (9 in Manaus and 1 in the interior). On Saturday, December 14th, Lucy, the girls, myself, Evangelist Eliberto and his family left Manaus by car travelling 3 hours to Novo Remanso. There we caught a small boat, traveled another hour and arrived at Parana da Eva. That night over 300 people heard the gospel as we celebrated the New Jerusalem Church's 3rd anniversary. Practically the whole community was present. Then after preaching twice on Sunday we returned to Manaus.

The last night of the year found us celebrating the Lord's Supper at our home church, the 14th of December Baptist Church. On Saturday, January the 4th, I had the privilege of celebrating my 36th birthday with, among other things, a delicious meal at Mom's. The Lord has been good to us during these years, and we count it the highest privilege to serve Him.

Last Saturday night, our churches here held their Missions Now Night. There were over 400 present, with a good spirit, good music and 3 short messages focusing on the past, present and future of BFM work in the Amazon Valley. So far we've only received about half our Missions offering, but hope to reach our goal by the end of the month. Everyone seems excited about the Institute. We plan to begin classes the 9th of March.

Dear Brethren,

January is not quite over yet and it seems like a year since my letter in December. The special services held over the holidays seem very remote now.

We had over 800 people present for the special program on December 25. The program the church put together was great. One woman was saved during this service. On the 31st, we held another special service with over 600 present. We took up an offering for the school project. Our goal was \$1,000 - the amount that came in was well over \$2,000.00.

One Sunday was spent with the congregation at Valquiria. There were 85 present for the service in the morning. Four people made professions of faith. After the service we went down to the river for a baptism. I baptized 18. Several of these were couples who have been saved for

some time, but were not legally married until just recently.

A couple of Sundays ago I was in Rio Branco to visit the work there. We had over 40 in the morning service and over 50 at night. Several of our members are traveling and yet attendance was up to the regular level. Three new members came by letter while I was there. We finished paying off the 2 front lots this month and have worked out a deal to pay off the back lot in 3 more payments. The congregation approved the building project. We hope to start soon. Two thousand bricks and the lumber for the trusses have already been donated. I am pleased with the progress that is being made. God is blessing in His time.

The church at Lagoinha is into her new brick building. The dedication service was on December 29. I wanted to be with them, but it didn't work out. The river was too low to go that way. The road is closed. I walked the first 7 miles and my man from camp was to meet me part way with the Jeep. He forgot the date, so I had to turn around and come back after a very long, hot wait.

May God bless all of you. Thank you for your prayers.

Dear Brethren:

This past month the church at the Chacara dos Pinheiros had to exclude four of its members for non-attendance. One of them had not attended any services since the organization last May and his son had only attended two or three times during that same period of time. The other two moved across town and told us they would not be back and would not ask for a letter. The attendance of our members has not been very good at all. Out of the twenty-two members, we only have about fifteen in any given service. We are having from twenty-five to forty non-members in each of our services including the mid-week service. Last Sunday night there were fifty-two present and only twelve members.

We have had to go only once or twice to Diamantino this past month and that has

been a big help to Betty and me. The young man who was to move there has not done so because he has had car trouble and, just as soon as we can get that taken care of, he and his family will be moving. We hope it will be this week. He went there by bus this past weekend.

Our school building is finished as far as we could go with what money we had. We were not able to build the bath rooms and, until the church there raises the money, they will have to use those of the church. We did buy some furniture to equip one room; school will start next month as planned. The School will start with kindergarten and first grade, adding a grade each year. Our seminary is already operating in one of the rooms and has been for some time.

We have a young pastor and his family coming from Sao Paulo next month, who will work with us in the work of the Chacara dos Pinheiros church, that we hope will be ready to take over as pastor by the time the Drapers return. If so, that will leave the Drapers free to start another work.

Please pray for us and the work.

Dear Brethren:

Last month I mentioned that we had a new church organized in the village of Paucar. This past month I was invited to help organize a new church out of Iquitos. I was not able to be present when this church was organized because of the cost of air travel. Also my health has hindered me from going on long river trips.

I am now in Detroit, Michigan going through various tests for my heart. Tests are being made at Harper Hospital. In Lima the doctor made several tests of my kidneys because of a swelling of my feet and legs. I have new cysts on my

kidneys, now on both kidneys. The doctor says he could take care of the kidneys in Lima, but said he would not touch me until my heart problem was solved. I should know Monday if they plan to operate or to treat by medication.

The Sunday before we left, I baptized 3; a mother about 35 yrs. old, a young man about 30 yrs. old, and a young lady about 17 yrs. old.

The walls are built around the property at Ventanilla - we finished the walls four days before we had to come home.

Please remember us in your prayers. This will be a very expensive time for us, and at a time we need to be back on the field.

Our new Institute in and out of Iquitos will begin with about 60 students. The Lord is blessing, souls are being saved in all the works. Keep praying and giving to the General Fund, so we may keep going with the message of Grace to the world.

One of the most profitable hours was the first evening when the leaders of 13 different mission points told something of their work.
