LOOK AT THE FACTS!

1. We depend on our Thanksgiving Offering each year to supplement our monthly offering to carry on the mission work. The monthly offering alone can not take care of the monthly expenditures. This last year we ran out of Thanksgiving offering two months before Thanksgiving Offering Month. We had to depend on just the monthly offering alone for those last two months. Because of this, we had to cut expense money to our missionaries. We can't borrow to carry on the work. We live by faith! We can't use designated funds. We can only use them for what they were designated.
2. We had more in 1991 than in 1990. Yet, we had less in 1991 than in 1990. Both statements are true. The total offerings for 1991 were \$81.07 more than the offerings of 1990. Yet, we had less in 1991 in the regular funds. The total regular offerings for 1991 were \$12,523.15 less than 1990. Designated offerings for 1991 were more but regular offerings were less for 1991. When we consider inflation and other factors we see that regular fund expenses were greater than in 1990. We had less regular fund money in 1991 and it didn't go as far because of inflation and other factors.
3. Our missionaries are sound in doctrine, very dedicated, hard workers, and good stewards of the funds they receive. They do a lot with relatively little. They give heavily of their own funds and even get personal loans to do more. They deserve much more than they receive.
4. The administration of the funds received from the churches and individuals has been with what amounts to no overhead expenses. There were no salaries for administrators, no office expenses, etc. The expenses for sending the letters of the missionaries to you each month, the mailing of receipts and answering questions, long distance calls on their behalf, etc. are all expenses that the individual missionary would still have if he decided to go to the mission field without our help. If these expenses were added up and divided by 12 missionaries, then that would be about the cost he would have if he did all this on his own. This means we are good stewards of the funds and our overhead amounts to zero!
5. We need more funds for the regular fund which is also called the General Fund or Work Horse Fund. The solution is for each of us to give more. The missionaries and the BFM administrators can try to be more efficient but not much can be done to save in those areas. The solution is more general fund offerings.

Dear Friends,
So much has happened since I last wrote that I really don't know how to start. I guess I'll begin with that which is strongest in my mind. On January 26th I received a phone call from my youngest brother (there are six of us boys and two girls) informing me that my oldest brother had just been killed in a motorcycle accident. I understood the message mentally, but the emotional impact just wouldn't sink in. Our family is very close and I had never lost anyone really dear to me before. I'm sure that many of you have been through this experience before and can relate to what I'm saying.

Living a long way and being away for long periods of time causes us to lose the everyday fellowship of some of our loved ones, but it doesn't erase or eliminate that deep love and warm memories we have from lives spent together.
In some respects it has been easier for me than for the other members of my family because I'm already used to missing him. The memories that I have of "Rossie" (William Roy Wacaser III) are those of 10 to 20 years ago. These that my family have are from last month, last Christmas, and from his last birthday party (one week

before he died). I have heard some people say that in times of grief it makes no difference whether you are a Christian or not, that the pain and sense of loss is just the same. Well, I'm of the mind that whoever says that doesn't really know the Lord because it makes worlds of difference. My brother was a fairly dedicated Christian and to know that he is presently with our Lord and Savior gives me the profoundest peace that can be imagined. I do not grieve one bit for Rossie's loss, but for mine and my family's temporary loss of his fellowship.
Rossie's absence causes me to have an even stronger yearning for the return of Jesus. I can hardly wait to renew our fellowship, but more than that, my face to face fellowship with the One who is so kind as to give this type of hope.
I don't have much more space, but let me just mention a few other items:
One young man who was disciplined for immorality has repented and returned to active participation. He is bouncing with joy after being six months in misery and depression. Praise God!
Iolene and Roberto, the young couple who were recently married, are getting along great and work together very well as a missionary team.
We have had three adults to accept Christ as Savior since New Year's Day and we are seeing steady growth among our Missionary trainees.
May God bless you all for your love, prayer and faithful support.

Dear Brethren,
The first week of this month we held camp for over 50 young people. The road is closed, so we had to go by river to within 4 miles of camp. The rest of the trip was by Jeep and truck. The weather was pretty good. The rains didn't disrupt too many activities. As usual, we had good opportunities to tell them about Christ. Several are now coming to church and we are praying that they will be saved.
Last week was the dedication of the building at the mountains on the Moa River. Paul and his 2 older boys went with me on this trip. Our men put a few finishing touches on the building. We held 2 services (including the dedication service) with about 80 people in each. We still do not have a worker there, but we are continuing to encourage them to meet until God sees fit to send them a preacher.

On their way up the Moa River our other boat with preachers and workers were flagged at a little settlement. A man, almost too weak to talk, asked for food for his wife and 5 children. They had not eaten for days, since the father was unable to hunt or work.

They all had malaria. The wife and one of the children could not even get out of their hammocks, they were so ill and weak. Our men tried to convince the man to put his wife and children in a canoe and go downstream to our mission at Sao Salvador. Our local preacher, brother Moises could then take them to town. When our men came back downstream, the family was still there, worse than ever. They put the 7 and 12 other villagers in our boat and brought them to town. On the way they preached Christ to them and the whole family was saved. The woman said, "I'm so glad you told us about Jesus. I know that I am going to die and if you had not told me I know that I would have been lost." She and her little boy did die! Seven others of the 19 are still in the hospital here in Cruzeiro do Sul. We need more people preaching on the rivers. We also need a doctor! Where are the men and women from churches in America, willing to give their lives to save lives here?
I arrived back here in time to preach in my home church on Sunday night. We had a good crowd of over 450 and best of all 2 young men were saved.
Paul, Brenda and family are doing great. They are a blessing and a joy to be around. Pray for their ministry and adjustment.
God bless all of you and thanks for your prayers and financial support.

The church worked hard to share the gospel during this Christmas season. The gospel was presented in drama. The story beginning with God's creation, then the announcement of the Messiah by the holy prophets. Finally, how our redemption is made in Christ Jesus, born of a virgin, the sinless son of God, who died for our redemption, then rose again on the third day. He is the eternal king coming again to judge the unbelieving, but to take the believer to dwell forever with him in heaven. In the ten days preceding Christmas twenty-seven thousand persons had the opportunity to hear

Dear Brethren:

It's hard to believe we've been here 7 weeks. Time has gone by very quickly. The family seems to be adjusting just fine to our new life style and we're gradually settling into a routine. We'd like to thank all of you who have been praying for us.

It has been a very busy month. A lot has happened. Our container left Miami on Friday, March 20th and will take approximately 21 days to get to Manaus. Then we must wait for it to get through customs. I understand it can take as long as 2 months to clear customs. Please pray that things will go quickly and smoothly. We'd like to offer a special "thank you" to those churches who have contributed to help with our shipping costs. You'll never know how much we appreciate it.

We've enrolled David and Jonathan in the Christian school (Colegio Cristao Cruzeiro) so that they can learn not only to speak Portuguese, but to read and write it as well. We have always home-schooled our children so they are very excited about going to school. However, they don't like coming home and doing their other studies also. Lindsay is too old to go the Christian

school. They currently have only first and second grades, so she is going to start Portuguese lessons next week with the girl across the street from us. Brenda and I are continuing our studies with Mike as well as working with a cassette tape series.

The first week of March was "camp week". We left town on Saturday morning for a 2 hour boat ride down river to camp. We had a great time. Mike held services in the morning and evening with lots of singing and good teaching. As far as I know there were no decisions made at camp, but since then there have been several of the new young people coming to church and some have made professions of faith.

On the 13th, David, Jonathan and I went with Mike up the Moa River to dedicate a new church building. We were gone 3 days and it was a real adventure for the boys. Along the river they saw monkeys, toucans and parrots; they got to hike up a mountain through the jungle, swim in a large creek, bathe in a warm water spring, and eat deer and wild pig. I don't know any 6 or 8 year old boys who wouldn't enjoy all of that! It was also good for them to see how people live along the river. It helped them appreciate what God has given us.

I must end here. Please continue to remember us in your prayers.

WEST INDIES MISSION REPORT

March 3, 1992

Dear Pastors and Saints:

This year began on a high note. Our Bible Conference was a tremendous blessing and challenge. There were brethren from Jamaica, Puerto Rico, British Virgin Islands, U.S.V.I., St. Kitts, Dominica, Antigua, Trinidad, and Guyana. These islands cover a distance of about 3,000 miles.

Pastor and Mrs. Rex Hensley were with us on Jan. 29 - Feb. 1. The blessings of the messages are still bearing fruit. The men were challenged by Pastor Hensley and the ladies were taught by Mrs. Hensley, and the Bible College students experienced some interaction with Pastor Hensley. The highlight, however, was the Ladies' Seminar. The attendance was beyond expectation. Ladies came from other islands as well as St. John. We thank the Addyston Baptist Church for sending the Hensleys.

Our visitation efforts are bearing fruit. We now have eight home Bible studies, five welcomed shut-in services, and we have begun one children's class in another village, with two more scheduled to begin

later this month. The youths have embarked on a very ambitious ministry. Their goal is to reach 50 additional young people, to become much more involved in the church services, to have open air services at different locations on the island. So far, there is an increase of four in the youth fellowship. How we thank the Lord for our young people.

The Bible College continues to prepare these students for the ministry. At this present time, Brother Fred Jaggernauth is teaching Introduction to Sociology and Introduction to Philosophy. He is also teaching extension classes in Guyana. This summer he shall be going there to give the residential requirement and examinations. Our graduation is taking place on May 16, and we are privileged to have Dr. Demas Brubacher from Grenada, Mississippi.

The West Indies Mission Work continues to present its blessings as well as its headaches. However, the problems encountered were not with the work, but with a couple of the men. Nevertheless, it was all solved, and the name of Christ was not publicly dishonored. Letters from the missionaries continue to speak of the salvation of sinners. Thank you for your prayers and support.

We still have a long way to go, but we will get it done a little at a time as we can get to it. The Pastor and his family were here only a short time when we had our annual retreat with the Good Hope Baptist Church. The three days together gave them a very good opportunity to get acquainted with both churches. The retreat was good for all of us.
